



Top seeds survive scares in Spingold

The team captained by Nick Nickell moved to the second round of the Spingold Knockout Teams despite losing a match in a three-way battle. Two other seeded teams, those led by Jeff Wolfson (#6) and Edgar Kaplan (#8), also survived losses in three-way matches.

Nickell's team, winners of the last four Spingolds, lost by 17 to the #87 seed, led by David Metcalf, but won their other match by 87 to advance. For more on the Metcalf upset, see page 5.

The highest seed to fall on the opening day of the event was the #14 seed, captained by Sheila Ekeblad. They lost both matches in the three-way, one by 48 IMPs, the other by 2. Ekeblad was playing with husband Russ, George Steiner, Geoff Hampson and Eric Greco.

Most of the other top seeds, including the teams captained by Jimmy Cayne, Richard Schwartz and Grant Baze, breezed through opening day.

The powerhouse Wolfson team was in trouble at the halfway point in their three-way match. They were down by 55 to one team and 18 to another. In the third quarter, however, their combined score against both opponents was 97-0.

Still going strong

Monday was an attendance surprise -- it proved to be the biggest day of the tournament so far. There were 578 tables in play in the afternoon, the largest session to that point. But it was even bigger in the evening -- 587 tables.

That brought the four-day total to 4886, 804 tables ahead of Albuquerque 1982.

Brash young Canadians challenge big shots in Spingold Knockout

It all started at the Toronto regional in March. Young Gavin Wolpert and Charles Halasi of Toronto met Erin Anderson of Regina SK. A plot was hatched by the three 14-year-olds.

"We decided to play in Albuquerque," said Wolpert. "We wanted to play against really good people."

With 16-year-old Josh Heller of Toronto as a fourth -- bringing the total age of the team to 58 -- the youngsters on Monday found themselves right where they wanted to be. They were playing in the Spingold Knockout Teams and facing one of the biggest names in bridge -- Eddie Kantar, teamed with Billy Miller, Wafik Abdou, Wayne Stuart, Michael Shuster and Venkatrao Koneru.

Remarkably, the youngsters were down only 24 at the halfway point of the

match and feeling pretty good about it.

Kantar was impressed after playing against Wolpert and Heller.

"They're really nice kids," he said. "And they can play. They're actually very competent players."

Abdou was also complimentary: "They're very polite, and they've got some nice moves." Stuart agreed: "One of them stiffed a king against me, and he did it smoothly."

Anderson, who will be in the ninth grade this fall, said she and her teammates like to play against pros. "We like to get good boards off them."

Wolpert, Canada's youngest Life Master, said the team -- seeded No. 102 -- was hoping to draw the No. 1-seeded Nick Nickell team.

"We wanted to see if we could live up

The team captained by Patricia Cayne, which included two world champions -- Jacqui Mitchell and Amalya Kearse, plus Karen Allison -- lost to an all-New England quartet. The victors were Carole Weinstein-Gorse, Margie Sullivan, Mary Savko and Kamla Chawla.

Jan Martel, Judi Cody, Lynne Feldman, Carlyn Steiner, Florence Rotman and Barbara Hamman, seeded 11th, also ran into problems. They were defeated by Jane Segal, Judy Kay, Eunice Portnoy and Jacqueline Sincoff.

Carol Pincus, Marcia Masterson, Broma Lou Reed, Janet Daling, Judy Randel and Florine Walters also are looking for some other game today. They were conquered by Judy Elbogen, Teddy Robins, Patricia Elms and Madie Brice. ELBOGEN is now the #12 seed.

Teams captained by Joan Remy Moore and Nadine Wood, both of whom are members of the ACBL Board of Directors, didn't make the second round. MOORE's #14 position was taken over by the Rebecca Clough squad, and WOOD's #15 seed now belongs to the Ginny Schuett team.

Sixteen teams remain in the running. The event will run through Friday, with head-to-head 64-board matches all the way.

Friends, family pay homage to Henry Francis

In a career spanning several decades, Henry Francis has touched countless bridge players in countless ways -- as a reporter, editor and friend.

On Monday, many of those people gathered at the Hyatt to honor Francis, who retired June 13 as executive editor of the ACBL *Bridge Bulletin* after 25 years on the job. His service, of course, includes many years as a tournament director before he took over the magazine.

The occasion was the Goodwill meeting, directed as always by ACBL's Goodwill Chairman, Aileen Osofsky, one of Francis's biggest fans. In fact, when she started the Henry Francis portion of the program, she commented that her one regret was that she couldn't call on him, as she has done so often, to help emcee.

The outpouring of love and affection for Francis, including an emotional tribute from his wife Dorothy, clearly touched the man who put his imprint on the *Bridge Bulletin* and made it the most outstanding bridge publication in the world.

"They sounded as if they meant it," Francis said of the parade of speakers who addressed the gathering.

There was no doubt the accolades were

sincere.

ACBL President Howard Piltch, a New Englander, knew Francis when he lived in the Boston area. Piltch recalled that Francis, originally from Malden, was "the first director to crack my knuckles."

Said Piltch: "What do you say about a man who embodies everything you believe in? Henry, I still think of you as the same kid from Malden who traveled the world and learned to change and to love. Thanks for everything."

Alan Truscott, bridge editor of *The New York Times* and a longtime associate of Francis, said he has no doubt that Francis's retirement years will not be idle ones.

"Henry is always very busy and usually trying to do more than one thing at a time," Truscott said.

Before joining the ACBL, Francis was an editor at the now-defunct Boston *Herald Traveler*. "There were many higher paying jobs Henry could have taken," said Truscott, "but he went to the ACBL, which was very advantageous to us."

Truscott and Francis have met at dozens of world championships. This year, the

to their standards," said Anderson.

This was the next deal. Kantar was playing with Koneru.

Kantar led the ♥10 and as Wolpert was putting down the dummy, he said to Kantar, "I would guess your distribution faster on the last hand than you would guess my distribution on this one." With that, he slapped the eight-bagger down on the table.

Heller ended up making six for plus 650 and a 5-IMP gain.

Although behind at the break, the young players weren't deterred -- and they weren't playing in the Spingold just as a lark. They're serious players.

"We did a lot better than we expected," said Wolpert.

The youngsters didn't fare as well in the second half of their match, losing 207-105, but they weren't down about it.

Said Heller: "We had a good time." □

Slotkin Lab receives \$5000 Charity grant

The ACBL Charity Foundation has approved a \$5000 grant to the ACBL/Jay Slotkin Lab for ALS Research at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine.

Slotkin, ACBL's 1996 Goodwill Member of the Year, suffers from amyotrophic lateral sclerosis, also known as Lou Gehrig's disease. The ALS Research Lab was established as part of the Jay Slotkin Fund for Neuromuscular Research at Johns Hopkins. The focus of this effort includes research, clinical services and experimental trials testing new treatments for ALS. Approximately 250 patients are treated annually.

Despite the ravages of ALS, Slotkin has been an active member of the Washington Bridge League. Known as "Doctor Double," the former periodontal surgeon has been an inspiration to many others with chronic diseases.

The foundation's officers are Carol Sanders, president; Jim Zimmerman, vice president; Virgil V. Anderson Jr., Joan DeWitt McKean and Glenn Smith. Don Moeller is secretary-treasurer.

Truscotts (including wife Dorothy) and the Francis will travel to Tunisia for the world championships, with a stop in Egypt on the way. "I can't wait," said Truscott, "to see Henry riding on a camel."

Roy G. Green, the chief executive officer of the ACBL, told the group that long before he took the reins at Headquarters, "I considered Henry Francis synonymous with bridge. At ACBL Headquarters, I learned to know Henry as a man dedicated to bridge, to getting the job done, to getting the story and making the deadlines. Henry Francis is a great credit to the ACBL and to bridge. Henry Francis is my friend."

Kathie Wei-Sender, the official Ambassador of Bridge, said that when she first knew Francis, "I hated him." Wei-Sender explained that at the time she was trying to become a writer and Francis was her editor. "He kept telling me all my mistakes," Wei-Sender said.

Finally, Wei-Sender went to Francis and asked him to be her teacher. "I'm still a lousy writer," Wei-Sender said, "but he tried to teach me."

Wei-Sender credited Francis with helping the Chinese learn about doing daily bulletins for their tournaments, and she said she hopes to enlist Francis's aid in writing a book.

"I won't miss Henry, though," Wei-Sender said, "because he's still going to be here."

Dorothy Francis praised her husband for his steadfast loyalty and devotion. "Henry has taught me a lot," Dorothy said. "He's been my Rex Harrison. He's taught me a lot about me. He is the fairest, most objective, sweetest -- sometimes cranky -- person I've ever known.

"About three years ago, we had a major crisis in our family. It's wonderful to know someone is there for you, as Henry was."

Brent Manley, who succeeded Francis as executive editor of the *Bridge Bulletin*, praised his former boss and thanked him for his friendship and fairness. Manley also read a poem composed by Francis's son Bill, who was a surprise guest at a retirement party for Francis in Memphis June 11.

Osofsky also read messages from Sue Emery, retired former *Bridge Bulletin* editor, and from Richard Oshlag, who worked on the magazine in its early years.

Said Emery, "I would love to be there to give you a big bear hug. I miss you so much."

Oshlag worked for the ACBL when Headquarters was in Greenwich CT. Oshlag said that when it was announced that Francis, a newspaperman, had been hired as the new executive editor of the *Bridge Bulletin*, the consensus was that "he'll never make it in the magazine world." Oshlag's message made it clear he no longer agrees with that assessment. "You've made the *Bridge Bulletin* a first-class act."

The Goodwill meeting began with District Director Bob Wingard recognizing NABC Chairpersons Judy Gucker and Gloria Kriegshauser for their outstanding work.

Wei-Sender introduced four bridge players from China who are visiting Albuquerque for the tournament.

Osofsky praised the Zero Tolerance program established by the Toronto unit and related that the ACBL Board of Governors has approved a motion endorsing the principles of the program.

When Osofsky introduced Green, who announced last week that he will retire as CEO in the near future, the CEO received a rousing ovation.

Oh, those spots

Bridge is such a fascinating game in part because you can never tell when something unusual might happen with even the most innocuous hand. On this deal from the final of the top bracket of the Charity Knockout Teams, one of the defenders made a subtle error that came back to haunt him in a big way. Malcolm Brachman, playing with Mike Passell, brought home a grand slam that should have gone down.

West led a low heart, and East discarded a diamond. Brachman had 12 top tricks and few prospects for a 13th unless a squeeze materialized.

Hoping for the best, Brachman ran off all his trumps. East was fearful of discarding a spade because of dummy's imposing spots. If, for example, Brachman had a singleton spade, he would be able to ruff out East's spade honors and establish his 13th trick. East was equally leery of throwing clubs, so he discarded more diamonds as Brachman kept playing hearts.

Everything would have been all right if West had discarded one diamond and his three low spades, but he let go of a low club -- and it was curtains for the defense. The club discard by West transferred sole responsibility for guarding clubs to East, who was subjected to a black-suit squeeze in the end. Brachman chalked up plus 1510. The ♣7 was his 13th trick.

After hearing that the deal was reported as a "fun hand," Brachman remarked, "It wasn't fun until the 13th trick."

This is a hand that no doubt will be used in bridge publications all over the world -- it is that bizarre. It comes from a knockout match.

Declarer won the opening club lead with dummy's queen. Based on the fact that West, Jeff Miller, had long clubs, he took the right position in spades -- he won the ace and finessed the 10. After cashing the king he came back to hand with the ♥A and cashed the ♠Q -- and everybody discarded! This was very puzzling -- where was the jack of spades?

Suddenly Dr. Mohan noticed the jack in his hand and announced that he had failed to follow suit. The director was called, and he allowed Dr. Mohan to replace his diamond discard with the ♠J -- but the diamond had to remain on the table as a penalty card.

Miller had discarded a club on the second spade, a heart on the third and his singleton diamond on the fourth.

One of the options offered to declarer concerning the penalty card was to demand or forbid the lead of a diamond by partner if he should gain the lead while the penalty card was still on the table. Under such circumstances, the offender has the right to return the penalty card to his hand.

Well, the declarer thought he saw a way to increase his tricks -- every IMP counts, you know. So he called for a CLUB!!

Miller took his ace, and declarer said, "I demand that you lead a diamond!"

"I understand what you're saying," said Miller, "but I don't have any diamonds." And he quickly cashed five clubs to set the cold contract.

Is this what's known as a revoking development?

The rabbi's coup

Two rabbis, Leonard Helman of Santa Fe and Richard Margolis of Melbourne FL, played together in the Life Master Pairs and got all the way to the final. They finished 32nd -- a creditable performance considering that 450 pairs of Life Masters entered the event. To the best of our knowledge, this was the first time a pair of clergymen reached the final of the Life Master Pairs.

On Board 11, the next-to-last board of the final round, the rabbis picked up the following hand:

Margolis won the opening spade lead and led the ♥10. South won the jack and shifted to a trump. Margolis won with the jack and made the key play -- he finessed the ♣9 to give himself an extra entry. He ruffed a heart and cashed the trump ace. He crossed to dummy with the ♣A and drew the rest of the trumps with the king and 10. Then he led a club to his hand and claimed -- sort of a declarer reversal in contrast to the usual dummy reversal. Making six diamonds was an absolute top -- and it moved the rabbis all the way from 34th to 32nd.

The Facts: 3♣ made four, plus 130 for N-S. North asked about the 1♠ Alert and was told it promised at least three hearts and said nothing about spades. When North asked what the difference was between bidding 1♠ or 2♥, he was told that 1♠ showed a better hand (4 to 7 points) than a 2♥ bid did. Before the opening lead was made E-W clarified that with three-card heart support and zero points, West was required to bid.

The Director was called after the opening lead was made and the dummy was put down. The Director ruled the E-W agreement had not been explained properly. During the twelfth round the Director informed both pairs that the result would be changed to Average Plus for N-S and Average Minus for E-W.

The Appeal: E-W appealed the Director's ruling. North, South and East attended the Committee. East stated that he did not believe that N-S should be entitled to a double shot for a good board because they had failed to bid 3NT.

North stated that had he known the West hand could be as weak as it was he would have bid 3♣. He chose to bid 2♣ because he thought his partner's hand could not produce enough for game with the opening bid and raise. North stated that it was not known that West had to bid with any hand containing three-card heart support until the opening lead was made.

The Committee determined that the E-W partnership agreement was that any hand with three-card heart support had to bid and that 1♠, 2♣ or 2♦ all showed heart support, 4 to 7 points, indicated a lead preference but did not promise length in the suit bid. 2♥ would have been weaker.

The Committee Decision: The Committee decided that misinformation was present and had likely affected the N-S result. With a full explanation, North may have chosen a 3♣ bid and South would likely have bid 3NT. Since it was also likely that nine tricks would be taken, the Committee changed the contract for both sides to 3NT made three, plus 600 for N-S.

The Committee decided to educate E-W about their obligations regarding full and complete disclosure of partnership agreements rather than retain the deposit. E-W were also warned that psyching this conventional agreement was not permissible.

The Committee did not agree that N-S had taken a double shot at a good result because they could not

possibly know what the full E-W agreement was from the information they had been given at the table.

The Facts: 2♠ made three, plus 140 for E/W. West fumbled with the Pass card and then bid 2♣. The Director ruled that the table result would stand because the fumble did not suggest the 2♠ bid over any other alternative.

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling. South, East and West appeared before the Committee.

On the first board of the round, the auction came fairly quickly to West, who was still distracted by a bad result on the previous round. He somewhat absent-mindedly reached to the front part of the bid box and fingered the Pass card, lifting it a bit, but not out of the box. East said he could not see which card West fingered. West

asked about the range of the 1NT bid. The 2♣ bid was natural. South maintained that pass was a logical alternative for East and that the infraction should limit East's choice of bids.

The Committee Decision: The Committee believed West's statement that his actions with the bid box were those of a player who had not yet considered his bid. This was an infraction. Acting in such a way may transmit considerable information.

The Committee evaluated the infraction, the information, and East's action. The Committee believed the infraction was bad. The information transmitted by the infraction, however, was minimal. The Committee and the players agreed the 2♣ bid was clear-cut. If fingering the Pass card suggested bidding over 2♣, then West's hand did not comport well with that suggestion.

The Committee decided the information conveyed by the infraction was incidental and not substantive. The Committee allowed the table result, 2♠ made three, plus 140 for E/W to stand. The Committee was ambivalent about whether this type of decision should be based on the quality of the 2♠ bid. 2♠ was a good bid and had a

very good matchpoint rationale to support it.

There was some division within the Committee about whether 2♠ would have been allowed if the unauthorized information present was more substantial. The standards for permitting such a bid are high.

The Facts: 6♥ made six, plus 980 for E/W. The opening lead was a low diamond. The 4♣ bid required an immediate Alert. After the announcement and prior to the opening lead South told the Director that he would have made a lead-directing double of 4♣ had he known it was artificial.

The Director ruled that the auction was unusual enough that South should have asked about the 4♣ bid if his call depended on knowing the meaning of the bid. The Director ruled (Law 40C) there was no damage and allowed the table result to stand.

(Note: The Directors made their ruling based on their understanding that the opening bid had been 2♥. The Directors pointed out that their ruling was more likely to have been in favor of the non-offenders if their understanding of the auction had been correct.)

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling. North, South, and East appeared before the Committee. South stated that after the 4♣ bid he paused briefly and waited for an Alert from the opponents. The N/S agreement was that if 4♣ was natural, double would

have been takeout and if 4♣ was artificial, double would have been lead directing. South felt uncomfortable about the possibility of asking, finding out the bid was natural and then passing. South stated he would have doubled had he been told 4♣ was artificial. He was not sure if the Laws placed him in jeopardy for asking the meaning of a call that had not been Alerted in this situation. He was unsure to what degree he was required to protect himself.

East stated if South had doubled 4♣, West would have passed denying first or second-round club control (they were not playing DOPI because they were using



a five-step system to show zero, one or two keycards). East further stated that she would then not bid slam because she would now have known that a club would be led and an ace was missing.

The Committee Decision: The Committee unanimously agreed that there had been a failure to Alert the 4♣ bid. In order to determine if there was damage as a consequence of the infraction, the Committee had to decide if South was required to protect himself. The Committee was divided on this issue. One member believed South should have asked about the meaning of 4♣ if he needed to know. One member believed the pause to wait for a possible Alert met his obligation. Three members believed it was reasonable for South to assume the bid was natural (his clubs were just bad enough that this was possible). The Committee therefore decided that there was damage as a consequence of the infraction.

The Committee decided that South would have doubled a properly Alerted 4♣ bid. The Committee thought it was probable a slam would be bid. If West had seven hearts and diamonds were favorable, 6♥ would be a reasonable contract. After analyzing the play, the Committee decided the best line of play to make the contract would be: ♣A, ♥K, heart to the ace, diamond to the queen, diamond ruffed by South, ♠A, spade. Unfortunately, this would have led to down three. The Committee changed the contract to 6♥ down three, which was plus 150 for N/S.

Dissenting Opinion: (Ron Gerard). South was required to protect his side by asking about the meaning of 4♣. His hand suggested that 4♣ was not natural and he was considering making a lead-directing double that depended on the non-natural meaning of 4♣. In fact, bridge logic would also suggest that 4♣ was not natural, since it is unlikely to get out of partner's suit without bidding game. Since South did not inquire about the meaning of 4♣, he cannot get a second chance to do so because of the failure to Alert.

At this level, players should know that they do not transmit unauthorized information by asking questions because the Laws do not allow partner to take advantage of that information. However, E/W should not profit from their failure to Alert. The result should have been N/S minus 980, E/W minus 150.

The Poles' aggressive bidding style came back to haunt them in a big way. Rosenberg cashed his top hearts (Bates throwing a low club on the second one) and played the ♥J for Bates to ruff.

The ♠Q came back, taken by Rosenberg with the ace. Rosenberg played the ♥5, ruffed by Lasocki with dummy's ♦J, which had dire consequences. Bates overruffed with the queen and Lasocki won the ♦A.

He played a club to the ace and followed with the club finesse. Rosenberg won and gave Bates a club ruff. Bates still had another trump trick coming, making it plus 800 for North-South -- a 12-IMP gain.

• The first McConnell Cup Women's Teams world championship produced a close match with the victory going to Marinesa Letizia, Judi Radin, Sue Picus, Jillian Blanchard and Rozanne Pollack.

The win prompted a jubilant Radin to shout, "I've got all four!" She is the only woman to have won all four women's events on the WBF calendar: the 1978 Women's Pairs, the 1984 World Women's Team Olympiad, the 1987 Venice Cup and the 1994 McConnell Cup.

LETIZIA claimed a 119-114 win over Sally Woolsey, Karen Allison, JoAnne Casen, Dori Cohen, Joann Glasson and JoAnn Sprung.

• Gloria Kriegshauser and Judy Gucker, co-chairs of the 1997 NABC, were also active in 1994. Kriegshauser was the local committee chairman and Gucker was in charge of player registration.

"Instead of the Southwest, this tournament encompassed the entire world," Kriegshauser said then. "No question, it's been an exciting time."

• Paul and Linda Lewis played against a very good team in a second-round match in the Rosenblum Cup Teams. One of their opponents played a deal particularly well and was making remarks that -- while said in a friendly way -- could easily have been interpreted as male chauvinism. Then came this deal:

World Open Teams may draw record field

The first-ever transnational World Championship Open Teams will take place in Hammamet, Tunisia, starting Oct. 27. This may prove to be the most popular event in the history of world bridge.

Players all over the world are putting teams together and making travel arrangements. Teams can be made up of players from one country, two countries or several countries -- no restrictions.

Members of Bermuda Bowl and Venice Cup teams eliminated in the round-robins of these events will be able to compete in the Open Teams from the start. The Bermuda Bowl (open) and Venice Cup (women's) competitions, each of which requires advance qualification, will begin Oct. 18 and conclude Nov. 1. Special arrangements have been made to enable players eliminated in the quarterfinals of the Bermuda Bowl and Venice Cup to join the Open Teams on the second day, with an appropriate carryover.

All teams will play four 10-board matches a day from Monday through Thursday, and either four or eight teams will qualify for the knockout playoffs. Teams that fail to qualify will play an additional two matches on Friday for placings.

If more than 20 teams made up of seniors enter, there will be a separate senior event. If there are fewer, there will be a special senior category within the Open Teams. There also will be special categories for all-woman and mixed teams as long as a sufficient number of such teams enter.

Special drop-in rules have been formulated for teams whose rosters include players still in the Ber-

muda Bowl or Venice Cup.

Highly artificial conventions will NOT be allowed.

Those interested in competing should contact the ACBL and make their wishes known no later than Aug. 15. The entry fee is \$600 per team. All entries are subject to WBF accreditation.

The headquarters site is a magnificent hotel with price levels ranging from budget to luxury.

In the spirit of the previous banter, Paul turned to his opponent and said, "This is how the women play."
