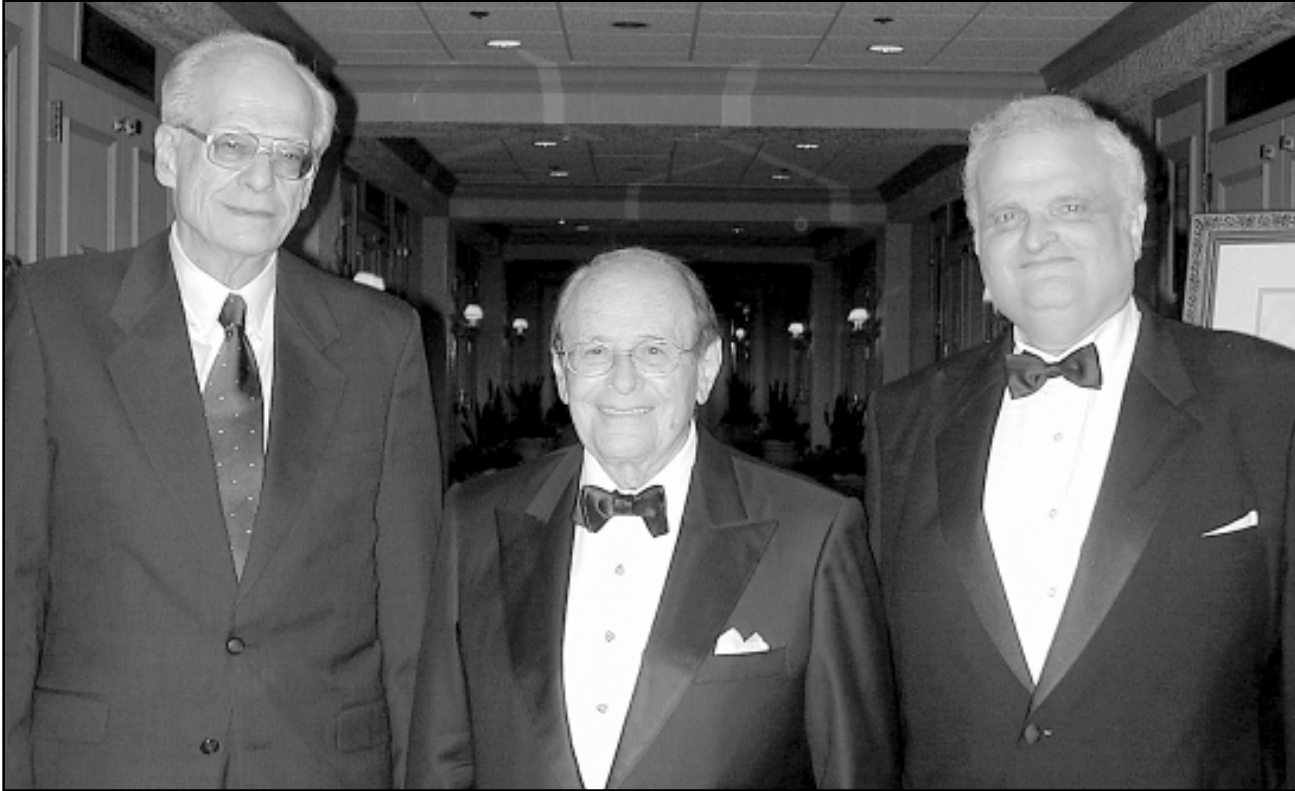

7 all-time greats inducted into ACBL Hall of Fame

Seven all-time greats were inducted into the ACBL Hall of Fame at the annual Hall of Fame banquet last night. Joining the 48 stars already in the Hall were George Rosenkranz, Sidney Lazard and Ira Rubin, who were on hand for the ceremony, and deceased members Lou Bluhm, Harry Fishbein, Charles Solomon and Meyer Schleifer.

Once again David Ezekiel of Bermuda was outstanding as the master of ceremonies. He introduced each presenter who in turn introduced the new Hall member.

Lou Bluhm

The first presenter, Tom Sanders, was visibly emotional as he recalled his happy days with Lou Bluhm. "I've thought a lot about Lou in the past 10 years," he said. "Sometimes I fantasized about how things might have turned out had he not been taken from us in the prime of his life. Other times, like tonight, I think about what it was that set Lou apart from other bridge players.

"I could never imagine a more perfect partner. Have you ever had a partner who seemed to always make the right play? I remember so many times on defense thinking, 'Lou, if you have such-and-such card, you'd better play it now or they're going to make this hand.' Then I'd glance down at the table and there would be that very card.

"Lou played the game with aplomb and self assurance, and with the imagination of a skillful novelist. When things went wrong, as they invariably do, Lou was unflappable. He was unflappable in bridge, in his work and in his life."

(Tom's tribute to Lou was very touching. We do not have sufficient room to carry the entire piece today, but we will try to run it in its entirety later on in the tournament. Tom was very moved throughout – it was a very emotional experience for him.)

Bluhm was the first, and only, recipient of the ACBL's Distinguished Player Award. He had an outstanding record in tournament play – third in the World Mixed Pairs in 1978, winner of the Cavendish Invitation in 1981, and victor in many North American championships, including the Reisinger, the Spingold (2), the Vanderbilt (2) and the Blue Ribbon Pairs.

When Bluhm died in 1990, Frank Stewart wrote in *The Bridge Bulletin*, "Nobody commanded more respect than The Bloomer. When you came to his table, it was a little like being in church – you tried a little

Defending champs seek GNT-A repeat

The Grand National Teams Flight A defending champions are going strong in their effort to repeat. District 9 (Florida), captained by Joseph Shay will lead his team against District 13 (Illinois) in one of today's semifinal matches. Playing with Shay are Michael Seamon, Robert Levin, Eric Rodwell and Jeff Meckstroth. Gary Cohler, captain of District 13, plays with Jeff Mandell, William Doroshov, Bart Bramley and Walter Schafer.

The other semifinal will pit a powerful District 21 (central and northern California) team captained by Rose Meltzer against a fast-closing District 4 team (Pennsylvania) captained by Stephen Goldstein. Playing with Meltzer are Peter Weichsel, Ron Smith, Kyle Larsen, Lew Stansby and Chip Martel. Also on the District 4 team are Joseph Livezey, Connie Goldberg, Danny Sprung, Jo Ann Sprung and Harold Mouser.

In yesterday's play, District 4, down by 25 at the half and by 17 after three quarters, came back solidly over the last 16 boards to score a 143-108 victory over District 22 (southern California). Florida, however, led from start to finish, increasing a 30-point halftime lead

to 62, 141-79.

District 13 also led all the way, but it was reasonably close all the way. They defeated District 6 (Washington area), 132-112. District 21 trailed District 25 (New England) by 15 at the half, then came on strong in the third quarter to move ahead by 17. The New Englanders held their foes even over the last set of boards, but that wasn't good enough – District 21 was the winner, 133-118.

harder to play the game as it was meant to be played, to observe decorum, to apply Lou's Olympian standard of ethics."

Harry Fishbein

Alan Truscott, well-known bridge columnist for *The New York Times* and an outstanding international player in his own right, was the presenter for Harry Fishbein. "Fishy was one of the most colorful men ever to play this game," said Alan. "Especially those berets that he was always wearing."

Fishbein wasn't always a bridge player, Truscott pointed out. He once was a professional basketball player. No, he didn't make millions – it was more like \$5 a night. Once he started playing bridge back in the days of the auction form of the game, he became an expert. Then contract came on the scene, and it wasn't long before he was an expert in this form of the game as well. He represented the United States in the 1959 Bermuda Bowl and was non-playing captain of the American team in the 1960 World Team Olympiad.

He won 17 North American championships including five Vanderbilts and two consecutive victories in the Life Master Pairs. Fishbein was ACBL treasurer for four years. He also was the ACBL's Honorary Member in 1966. He invented a convention for handling preemptive bids, but eventually even he decided to stop using it.

Charles Solomon

Presenter Bobby Wolff, himself a member of the Hall of Fame, described Charles Solomon as an icon of bridge. Wolff told of Solomon's many achievements at the North American level that led up to his being elected the first president of the World Bridge Federation. It was interesting to hear one former WBF president introduce another WBF president into the Hall of Fame.

Wolff recalled an amusing phone call he received from Oswald Jacoby during World War II. "We're closing in on the Solomons," said Ozzie – and of course Wolff thought he was talking about the Solomon Islands. But he wasn't – he meant that he was gaining on Solomon in the masterpoint race.

Solomon was outstanding on several bridge fronts – as a player, an administrator, a writer and a teacher. He was a bridge columnist for more than 30 years. But he wasn't alone – his wife Peggy was by his side throughout his career. His favorite partners were Peggy and Harry Fishbein.

At the table, he won the Reisinger three straight times. Altogether he won 12 North American championships.

Perhaps he received his highest accolade from Edgar Kaplan, who wrote in 1996, "You might call Charlie the father of the WBF."

George Rosenkranz

"His accomplishments in the world of bridge are monumental as a player, a captain, a theorist, an administrator and an author" was the way Henry Francis began his introduction of George Rosenkranz. Francis, who as the long-time editor of *The Bridge Bulletin* had a 35-year history of friendship with Rosenkranz, called George "a doctor of humanity."

Francis pointed out that Rosenkranz is famous throughout the world not so much for his bridge expertise as for the major part he played in developing the birth control pill. Rosenkranz also has made major contributions in the areas of cortisone and steroid hormones.

Rosenkranz was the winner of the Blackwood Award as a player who has made outstanding contributions to the game away from the table. But he has

done all right at the table as well – 11 North American championships including at least one victory in each of the four major team championships.

But here is why George won this award – ACBL Honorary Member 1990, Goodwill Ambassador for both the WBF and the ACBL, a member of the National Laws Commission since 1977, captain of many Mexican teams in international competition, author of many books including the "Godfrey" series, inventor of the Romex bidding system as well as the Rosenkranz Redouble and the Dynamic Notrump.

Two sons, two daughters-in-law and three grandchildren joined his wife Edith to watch his induction into the Hall. He paid high tribute to his wife for the way she has stood beside him through all the years. He also praised his mentor, the late John Gerber.

Sidney Lazard

Bart Bramley, one of the brightest stars in the ACBL firmament, was very emotional as he stated, "My two greatest partners are being inducted into the Hall of Fame tonight. I agree with everything Tommy Sanders said about Lou Bluhm. And now my present partner is joining the greats."

"Lazard's record goes way back and carries through to today – he won the Reisinger in 1960 and he did it again in 1997. He was strong in the old days and he still is. He is a bridge scientist – he studies the game at its deepest level. Not only is he a man of great character – he is a great character."

Lazard expressed a heavy heart as he told what it's been like recently as he lost his wife, his son and his mother. He plans to sponsor a Sportsmanship Award honoring them.

He also had high words of praise for Gerber as his mentor.

Sidney has been at the top level of bridge for a very long time – he won the Spingold in 1958. He has won 12 North American championships, including five victories in the Master Mixed Teams. He placed second and third in his two Bermuda Bowl appearances.

Meyer Schleifer

Don Krauss, well-known internationalist, introduced Meyer Schleifer, winner of the von Zedtwitz Award. This award recognizes contributions to bridge through bridge-playing expertise.

"Meyer was an exceptional player. Both Bob Hamman and Eddie Kantar felt very comfortable whenever Meyer, as their partner, was declaring a hand – he would get it right. We supported him financially at the local clubs when we placed against him.

Bridge wasn't his first game, Krauss pointed out. Meyer took up chess at age 12, and when he was 16 he actually drew a game against the great Capablanca. He didn't take up bridge until he was 26, but he was a natural at the game. Included among his major victories was a win in the Life Master Pairs in 1966.

Ira Rubin

Gail Greenberg, a superb woman bridge player with many world championships to her credit, called Ira Rubin one of the greatest experts – certainly technically the best.

Rubin is one of the all-time great theorists of the game. He invented many of the methods now routinely used by players all over the world. He also worked on many other major ideas with other stars. He has been playing bridge since he was seven years old – he learned in German! He developed a very strong partnership with Vic Mitchell, a man for whom he had the highest respect.

ABTA names Book, Software awards

Eddie Kantar's Lessons Book IV was named the Book of the Year by the American Bridge Teachers Association at their banquet last evening. The ABTA annually recognizes excellence in the field of instructional bridge writing in a variety of categories.

In the Newcomer/Intermediate category, Audrey Grant's new mini-series *Improving Your Judgment — Opening the Bidding* received the Book of the Year honor.

In the Software category, the popular *Play Bridge with Larry Cohen: Life Master Pairs, Day 1* was the winner. A special citation was awarded to Ed Marzo, the creator of Dealmaster and Dealmaster Pro for his contributions to bridge education. Also, Fred Gitelman (Bridge Base) was honored as Software Designer of the Year.

For the Best Teacher Tip of 2000, Leslie Shafer of Silver Springs MD was the winner of the ABTA Apple Basket Award. Shafer is part-owner and manager of the Washington (D.C.) Bridge Center, as well as the editor of the *ABTA Quarterly*.

The ABTA also named its Master Teachers of the Year: James Awalt, Alexander AR; Kathleen Brown, Wichita Falls TX; Jane Burns, Greenwich CT; Natalie Rosenstock, Boynton Beach FL; and Betty Starzec, Sugar Land TX. Master Teachers are recognized for their experience teaching bridge, knowledge of the game, and support of their fellow instructors.

Cell phones restrictions enacted

At its meetings this week, the ACBL Board of Directors voted to restrict the use of cell phones and other similar equipment. The Board passed the following policy, effective immediately: "Except for health-related equipment or by permission of the Director-in-Charge of the tournament or event, cell phones, audible pagers, and similar electronic equipment may not be operated or operable in the playing area during a session of play at NABCs. All other ACBL tournament sponsors are strongly encouraged to adopt this policy."

Mohan and Lev defend Life Master Pairs title

John Mohan and Sam Lev, who scored tops on the first and last boards of the final session to win the Life Master Pairs last year in San Antonio, are back to defend their title. The win was a key to Mohan's victory in the 1999 *Player of the Year* contest. The title is awarded to the player who wins the most masterpoints in nationally rated events.

Mohan and Lev played against Michael Rosenberg and Steve Weinstein on this key deal in last year's final:

After Lev invited the heart game, Mohan signed off in 3♥. This rode around to Rosenberg who bid one more club. Lev stuck with his decision to pass up the possible heart game and doubled.

The defenders took two diamonds, a spade and a heart for plus 200, worth practically all the matchpoints.

The Life Master Pairs is a six-session event with two qualifying, two semifinal and two final sessions. At stake is the Von Zedtwitz Gold Cup, donated by Waldemar von Zedtwitz in 1930. The first winners: were von Zedtwitz and P. Hal Sims.

The trophy was initially contested by master players who had qualified by winning a national championship. It was then a four-session event, and the field was limited to 64 players so that a complete movement could be played.

The trophy was originally presented on the basis that three wins by one player would secure him outright possession of the trophy. This feat was achieved by Howard Schenken in 1934. (Schenken won in 1931 and 1933 with David Burnstine and in 1934 with Richard Frey. He also won in 1941 with Merwyn Maier and in 1943 with John Crawford.)

The cup, put back into competition by the donor, was stolen in 1954 while in the possession of John Hubbell, who held the LM Pairs title. The theft followed a television appearance during which Hubbell had exhibited the trophy and given the address of his bridge club where the cup was normally displayed.

The trophy was never recovered and the present cup is an exact replica.

Women have been occasional winners in the LM Pairs -- Helen Sobel, playing with Charles Goren, won in 1942 and 1958; Ruth Gilbert and Leo Roet, 1949; Helen and Morris Portugal, 1960; Dorothy Truscott and B. Jay Becker, 1964; Hermine Baron and Meyer Schleifer, 1966, and Barbara Rappaport and Al Roth, 1971 and 1972.

Mary Jane Farrell and Marilyn Johnson are the first -- and only -- women's partnership to win the event. Their victory came in 1978.

The record score for the event belongs to S. Garton Churchill and Cecil Head, who won in 1948 -- scoring 65% as an average for four sessions and 77.4% in a single session.

"We handle everything from broken bones to ton-sillectomies," added Brubaker.

"CHOC has an outpatient clinic and community outreach programs that include three mobile health clinics for the under-served kids in our community. We also sponsor Clinica CHOC Para Niños in Santa Ana to promote our services in the Latino community. There are many parents in the area who don't understand that they can receive our services even without insurance."

Earlier this year, the board of trustees of the ACBL Charity Foundation named the American Parkinson Disease Association as the Charity of the Year. The APDA was presented with a \$100,000 check at the Spring NABC in Cincinnati.

Defenses to 1NT

At this NABC, in General Convention Chart events, the Board of Directors has voted to allow constructive defenses to 1NT openings, even when those defenses do not contain a known suit. In order to help players counter these methods successfully, the tournament is making available copies of an article on the subject, written by Marinesa Letizia, that appeared previously in the ACBL *Bridge Bulletin*. Look for "Counter-Defense to Interference vs. 1NT Opener" in the rooms where General Convention Chart events are played.

If you wish to play in the Spingold Knockout Teams or the Wagar Knockout Teams, you must register by 7:30 p.m. Sunday, August 13. You may sign up with Steve Bates in the Marriott Marquis Ballroom.

Bidding Box Alerts and Announcements

When using bidding boxes, ACBL requires that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time. When making an announcement, use the announcement word -- such as "transfer" -- and tap the Alert strip at the same time. A player who Alerts or announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or announcement has been made.

Smoking

The state of California strictly enforces its smoking ordinances. Players are reminded to observe rules regarding the restricted smoking areas. ACBL regulations already ban smoking in the playing area as well as in the main entrances and exits to the playing area.
