Canadians climb back to win GNT-B

Four excited Canadians from British Columbia put their heads together to check their scores, and about a minute later they were leaping and cavorting as they celebrated their victory in Flight B of the Grand National Teams. The representatives of District 19 trailed District 14 (Kansas-Missouri) throughout the first three quarters, but a strong finish earned them a 17-IMP triumph.

The victors were Insa Fricker and Tai Eng of Richmond plus Gilbert Lambert of White Rock and Mike Moffatt of Surrey. They defeated John Turner and Ralph Russo, Kansas City; Mark DeGarcia, Columbia MO, and David Shipman, Olathe KS.

"We were desperate in that last quarter," said Eng. But they began to think they

Florida defends GNT-A title

Joseph Shay and his powerful teammates from District 9 (Florida) started slow but came on like gangbusters over the final three quarters to successfully defend their Grand National Teams Flight A championship. Playing with Shay were Eric Rodwell, Jeff Meckstroth, Michael Seamon and Robert Levin.

They defeated a powerful District 22 team (California), 176-108. Playing for California were Rose Johnson-Meltzer, Peter Weichsel, Ron Smith, Kyle Larsen, Chip Martel and Lew Stansby. Smith was inadvertently omitted in yesterday's Daily Bulletin writeup.

Just about all bridge players have heard of Rodwell, Meckstroth, Seamon and Levin, but Shay is less well known. "I want you to know that Joe played very well," said Rodwell. "He was especially strong in the semifinals and the final. On several occasions when Jeff and I slipped a little, he picked us up."

Even though this was Meckstroth's fourth win in this event – three in the past four years – he said, "It always feel good when you win." Levin and Seamon also have won three of the past four years.

California took an 11-point lead in the first quarter, but Florida romped in the second quarter, 65-17. From that point on California never made a real challenge.

District 13 players have dominated the Grand National Teams Flight C contest for the past two years, and they added another victory last night when a group of Chicago-area players narrowly defeated a New England-based District 25 squad by the score of 140-138.

The winners are Marian Kowalewski, Pavel Boruta and Robert Boruta, of Chicago, Michael Omielski of Bensonville IL, Eugenisz Babiarz of Glendale Heights IL and Zbigniew Muszynski of Roselle IL.

They defeated Barry Margolin of Arlington MA, Suresh Adina of Somerville MA, Leo Zelevinsky of Quincy MA and Otis Bricker of Attleboro MA.

District 13's captain, Muszynski, was also a member of the winning GNT-C team from the Chicago NABC in 1998.

The winners subsidized their trip to the NABC with the help of sponsors. They sported red-and-white striped shirts featuring a logo from Sophie's

Mignocchi opened the ♠Q to dummy's ace, and not unnaturally declarer attempted a ruffing finesse against the ♠K, discarding a club from hand. This lost, of course, and Mignocchi switched to the ♣10. Declarer thought about this for a few moments, but finally he called for the king. Declarer cashed two rounds of trumps, ending in dummy, then led the ♠10, pitching his last club. But Mignocchi had the last defensive trump and he ruffed. He got out with the ♣A, ruffed, but declarer eventually had to try diamonds, and when the ace was over the king he had to lose two diamonds and suffer a one-trick set.

Mignocchi led a low spade to the 10, jack and ace, and declarer went after diamonds. When he discovered the unfortunate break on the second diamond, he transferred his attention to clubs, and Prosnitz rose to the occasion by putting up his king. Prosnitz switched back to spades, ducked to the queen. Mignocchi cleared the suit. Declarer won and cashed the ♣A, carefully noting the fall of the 10 from the South. He was sure Prosnitz had started with the king-queen-10 as the result of this series of plays, so he led a third club – and the roof fell in. Prosnitz was able to cash TWO clubs and a spade to set a contract where declarer started with 10 top tricks.

Defenses to 1NT

At this NABC, in General Convention Chart events, the Board of Directors has voted to allow constructive defenses to 1NT openings, even when those defenses do not contain a known suit. In order to help players counter these methods successfully, the tournament is making available copies of an article on the subject, written by Marinesa Letizia, that appeared previously in the ACBL *Bridge Bulletin*. Look for "Counter-Defense to Interference vs. 1NT Opener" in the rooms where General Convention Chart events are played.

A tricky business

Suit preference on defense is always a tricky business. Tempo issues also play a part. Consider this deal from the first qualifying session of the Life Master Pairs.

In a sense North-South had done well to reach 4♠ not 3NT, where minus 200 was the usual result. Jeff Aker did well as East to lead the ♦5 (third and fifth), and I cashed the ♦A-K on which Jeff followed in perfect tempo with the 4. The question is three-fold: Is the ♦4 from 5-4 doubleton? (Answer: probably not unless North is playing a very deep game.) Is the ♦4 simply confirming the count? (Answer: probably not – this information is unlikely to be relevant to partner.) Or is the ♦4 suit preference? The sight of dummy makes a club shift possible, and I think, if you trust your partner, you should shift to the ♣K. Plus 100 was only a 70% board because of the accidents to North-South pairs in 3NT. However, in our section, six of the eight pairs who played in spades made 10 or more tricks.

It is always frustrating to go all the way down the path to success, then fall at the final step, as in the following board from the second qualifying session.

We reached 6♠, which looks excellent on a diamond lead. Our opponents, playing normal signals, followed enthusiastically in diamonds, and I took a little care after drawing two rounds of trump. If I drew a third round, I would be very short of entries to dummy. If West ducked the ♥A I might run out of entries to set up the hearts for two club discards. So I led a low heart from dummy after drawing only two rounds of trumps.

When West produced the ace after a moment's thought, I thoughtlessly followed with the 4, not contemplating the possibility of a 5-1 split. Of course West did not know his partner had a third trump – but would I really have bid this way with ♦ two low diamonds. After some thought West played a second diamond and I was home. But once West had indicated he had more than one heart, I should have unblocked the ♥K. Now the defense would have had a tough problem and you could sympathize more with West's getting it wrong.

An interesting matchpoint situation came up on the

following board from the second qualifying session.

Most Easts opened 2♠ and played it there. Consider the line in this contract on the predictable lead of a top trump. The majority of the field won and unblocked the clubs to pitch a diamond on the ♣K. Eventually declarer lost two trumps and a diamond plus the heart at trick 13 to score plus 140.

The matchpoint aficionados spotted the book line. Duck the first trump and South will surely play a club (a diamond shift is just too tough). Win the ♣A and cash the trump ace. Now cross to the ♥A, pitch a heart (!), not a diamond, on the ♣K. Then play the ♥K, ruff a heart, and give up the high trump. You still have the ♦A as an entry to the two heart winners in dummy for plus 200 and an 80% board.

Avoiding the endplay?

Geoff Hampson found a very neat line in a contract where he had already stolen most of the matchpoints. Hampson was playing with partner Perry Johnson.

It takes a heart ruff to hold North-South to nine tricks in spades, so Hampson was due to score very well anyway in 3♣. But Hampson found his way to more than his nine tricks after the defense started with three rounds of diamonds. He had already formulated the idea that North had the ♠A since South had passed initially and had already shown up with the ♦A K.

So Hampson ruffed the third round of diamonds, drew one round of trumps, played the ♥A K and ruffed a heart. He then crossed to a high trump in his hand to lead the ♠K! North thought Hampson held:

♠K Q 10 ♥K x x ♦x x ♣A K J 10 x.

Since North was reduced to spades and a heart at this point, he ducked to avoid the endplay. (Maybe he should have known that Hampson would have upgraded this hand out of a 14-16 INT!) But you have to get out of bed early to be up before Hampson. Plus 130 was worth nearly all the matchpoints.

He remembers Goren and Ozzie

Craig Brockman, the young man who does the excellent layout work for your Daily Bulletins, was telling his cousin Bob Shalen about his work with bridge. Craig doesn't play, but he enjoys being around bridge players. Bob surprised him by coming up with good stories about his personal dealings with two of the game's greatest – Oswald Jacoby and Charles Goren.

Here's the Ozzie tale, entitled "I should have taken the check."

"In 1946 or '47, I attended my first meeting of the Society of Actuaries at the Greenbriar in West Virginia, having become a fellow of the society by completing the exams that year. Oswald Jacoby, who was an older man and also a fellow, was at the meeting and was invited by John Larus, president of the society and of Connecticut General Life, to be his partner in a before-dinner rubber or two. Another young actuary, Alex Mutch, was drafted to perform against the seniors, and because of Jacoby's reputation our table was quickly surrounded by a crowd of about 50 standing kibitzers. After a venturesome overcall at the two level by Jacoby, he was doubled and set 3 tricks vulnerable, which accounted for most of the 1100 points by which we won. Standard stakes in actuaries' bridge games at the time were a nickel a hundred, so Jacoby and Larus owed me and Alex 55 cents each.

"Now comes the punch line. Jacoby offered to pay me by check if I would agree not to cash it. I wish I had accepted his offer, but with all those people watching, I felt I had to say 'No thanks, I'll take the cash.' Everybody makes mistakes."

And now the Goren tale.

"In June, 1945, while I was in the naval hospital at Pearl Harbor recovering from wounds suffered when our destroyer was hit by a kamikaze. A couple of my friends from the Prudential who were stationed at Pearl came to visit and brought me a gift of Goren's *Better Bridge for Better Players*. I read it quite carefully, and having no better way to spend my time, wrote the author to the effect that one of the hands in the chapter on opening leads could still be made even with his recommended opening lead by means of a squeeze in the club suit. At the same time, I pointed out that Florence Osborne's column in the *Tribune* seemed to be using many of the hands in his book.

"I received a hand-written reply a few days later thanking me and saying (1) that in the next edition of the book he would put the jack of clubs in the other defender's hand, which would eliminate the squeeze, and (2) that Florence had been using a lot of his stuff without attribution, and he would have to speak to her about it.

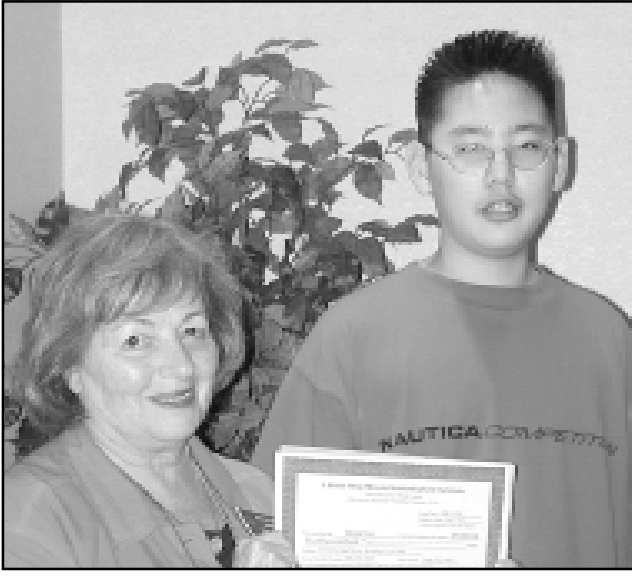
"Unfortunately, both the book and the Dear Lieutenant letter, which I valued, were lost in one of our dozen or so moves during the ensuing 50 years."

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had a chance on the second board when they cashed six clubs against a 3NT contract. It looked even better three boards later when they made a spade game at one table while their opponents played in hearts and went down a trick at the other table. Board 24 was wild – two of the players had eight-card suits. District 14 took a save against 7♣ and went down four for minus 800. This looked good until it was discovered that the grand slam in clubs would be set a trick.

On the next-to-last board, it was District 14 that was desperate. They bid an aggressive notrump game, but the Canadians found the defense to beat it. And that was the end – the Canadians were champions.

Fricker and Eng have been playing together for about five years – “I saw a pretty lady five years ago and I had to play with her,” said Eng, a control systems analyst. Fricker, a secretary, and Eng play Standard American.

Lambert and Moffatt, who play two-over-one game force, have been partners for only a year. Lambert, who owns two bridge clubs and likes to play golf, put the team together. However, Moffatt, a heavy equipment machine operator, was the team captain.

In the other room, the lead of the ♠A followed by a heart shift allowed declarer to take 11 tricks after winning in hand and playing the ♦A Q. Plus 650.

Brachman also led the ♠A, but shifted to the ♣10, showing zero or two higher honors, and Passell overtook with the queen.

Declarer won the ace, and crossed to the ♥A to take the diamond finesse. Brachman won and underled his ♣K J to Passell's ♣9 to let him cash the ♠K for down one.

District 13 led throughout the 64-board contest. After winning the first quarter 32–19, they increased their lead by halftime to 18 IMPs. The third quarter saw them expand the lead to 25 IMPs, but District 25 mounted a furious rally in the last set of 16 boards to make the final result extremely close. Although the New Englanders topped District 13 56–33 in the last set, however, it wasn't enough to erase the gap. District 13 won by 2 IMPs to take the GNT–C crown.

East led the ♠Q. From the auction and the opening lead, Rosenberg could be reasonably sure that East held six spades headed by the Q–J–10 (or 9). This means West had to have the top clubs and the ♥K to open the bidding. The position of the ♥J is not clear, however, so it would be dangerous for declarer to attack the suit himself. Rosenberg found a way to avoid a guess in the heart suit.

The opening lead was won perforce in dummy, and declarer called for a low club. West won the queen (East followed with the 8) and played a second spade. Rosenberg won the king, cashed four rounds of diamonds and continued with the ♣J, smothering East's ♣10. West was now endplayed into underleading his ♥K. Making four was an excellent result.

Smoking

In need of a miracle

In the Grand National Teams Flight A semifinal battle between District 4 (Pennsylvania) and District 21 (California), District 21 trailed by 41 IMPs going into the last quarter. The California-based squad rallied in the last set, however, outscoring their opponents 65-11 to advance to the final.

This deal, declared by Peter Weichsel, was part of that comeback. Weichsel was playing with partner Kyle Larsen.

Yes, Weichsel bid 3NT on the same values he announced with his 1NT bid, but when you're down 41 IMPs with only 16 boards to play, you can't afford to worry about things like that. His play, however, justified his aggressiveness.

East led the ♥6 and Weichsel called for dummy's king. East won the ace and continued with the ♥J, won by declarer's queen. With only one heart, two diamonds, two spades and a club, Weichsel needed three more tricks. So he played a low spade at trick three, and inserted the 9 when East played low. When that held the trick, he called for a low club from dummy. Note the club position. Declarer can't allow West to regain the lead to run the heart suit, so he must hope that West holds a doubleton that includes the 8. East will be forced to overtake the trick on the first round of the suit. When declarer wins the return and plays another low club from dummy, he can cover whatever high club West produces and play another club to clear the suit. In this manner, West is never able to gain the lead.

When you are desperate, you have to play for what you need. With both spade honors onside and the clubs favorably arranged, Weichsel brought home the miraculous contract. Plus 600. This was an 11-IMP pickup when Weichsel's teammates went down one in 2♠ at the other table for minus 100.

Zero Tolerance in L.A.

At the Barrington Bridge Club in Los Angeles, Zero Tolerance offenders have a choice: take a vacation from the club for a month or perform community service. The idea was co-owner E' Anne Conaway's, according to Alan LeBendig, the other co-owner.

If an offender opts for community service, he must call the club, show up for the game and play with whomever the club selects. There's an additional detail: "They have to make sure their partner enjoys the game," says LeBendig. "We've turned around some of the bad actors, and the other players have noticed."

Boyd started with his top diamonds, Robinson showing three. Then Boyd switched to the ♣Q!

Declarer won this and ruffed a club, Robinson contributing the king! Declarer went after trumps, cashing the ace and playing a second. Happy to get the 2-2 break. He won the ♠K switch and ruffed a spade to his hand. Everything to this point indicated that Boyd, West, had the ♣J, so declarer decided that the right way to set up his clubs was to pass the 10, finessing against West. Imagine his surprise when Robinson produced the jack to defeat the contract.

Calling the Director

Call the who ...? The Director! It's okay to call the director. If fact, if you don't, you may lose your right to call him later if you are damaged.

The director is the one who sold you an entry, the one who passed out the boards, the one who passed out the hand records and said, "Duplicate, please." The director is the one who organizes the players and the boards so that everything runs smoothly at the right time, the right speed and the right direction.

The director is the one you need help from if and when an irregularity happens at your table. The director gives rulings pertaining to the "Laws of Duplicate Contract Bridge."

In order for the conditions of the game to be fair, everyone has to follow the same rules. The director is familiar with these rules and is responsible for seeing that they are correctly applied.

The director is also the one who calls the rounds when it is time for you to meet your new opponents. The director puts the results of each board into the computer and posts the computer print-out of results after each session.

When you need a director, raise your hand and call out "Director, please" -- loudly enough for him to hear but not so loudly that it disturbs the other players. When the director arrives at your table, he will listen to what happened and explain the provision of the Laws that pertain to the irregularity.

Irregularities that may happen at your table for which you must call the director: a lead out of turn, an insufficient bid, a revoke, a card missing from a hand, a bid or pass out of turn, failure to Alert an artificial bid, changes of call, disagreements of tricks won, claims with trumps outstanding or disputed claims, bidding errors, etc.

The Director is your friend. Do not hesitate to call him or her. In fact, if you don't call the Director, you may have lost the right to call him later when you discover you have been damaged.

Board member shows he can play, too

When Steinberg got the ♣4 opening lead, he didn't want to risk letting it run to his jack so he rose with the ace. He led a spade to the ace, noting the fall of the 10 from West. He continued with a spade finessing the ♠J. When he discovered he couldn't run the suit, he next tried diamonds, cashing the ace and king. He followed with the ♥A and a heart to the king so he could see if diamonds split when he cashed the queen. He was happy to see that they did in fact break 3-3. The last diamond forced East to submit to a squeeze – as he followed to trick 11 he couldn't hold his guard in both black suits. He held onto the ♠Q and sluffed a club, and now Steinberg took the 13th trick with the ♣9.
