## 'Lucky man' makes a rare tournament stop

Frank Stewart figures he has made two good decisions in his life – marrying his wife, Charlotte, and turning his bridge energy from playing to writing about the game.



Few would argue with that notion, considering that Stewart is one of the best-known bridge writers in the world. Besides his monthly contribution to the ACBL Bridge Bulletin, Stewart is also the author of 19 bridge books and a syndicated bridge column that appears in dozens of newspapers with circulation in the millions.

"I'm really a lucky man," says Stewart, who drove to Atlanta from his home in western Alabama to speak to the American Bridge Teachers Association and to give a lecture to the newcomers at the 2005 Summer NABC. "I get to do something I like to do."

Stewart says the start of his career as a bridge writer was pure serendipity.

A native of Georgia who grew up in Alabama, Stewart learned bridge while studying at the University of Alabama. Just before he was drafted into the U.S. Army in 1968, he discovered duplicate.

## Changes come in GNT, NAP rules

If you're planning on playing in the Grand National Teams or North American Pairs in 2006 and beyond, be aware that changes are coming.

In Denver, the ACBL Board of Directors will vote on changes that, according to GNT Committee Chair Harriette Buckman, are aimed at "restoring the integrity of the grassroots events."

Said Buckman, "The new guidelines will be in place by Denver."

Buckman's committee was charged with developing a firmer policy for determining residency, establishing and implementing a process for enforcement of residency requirements and communicating the changes to the membership.

In November, when the board meets in Denver, the body will consider the following legislation pertaining to GNT and NAP participants:

1. A clear statement of the ACBL definition of residency.
2. Requirements for validation of residency.
3. A credentials committee of the ACBL board to review residency challenges and approve requests for residency verification.

4. Mandatory penalties for violations.

"There have been abuses in the interpretation of residency," Buckman said, "and the committee did consider simply recommending getting rid of the events."

In the end, she said, the committee opted to recommend changes. "It's coming," she said, "and we're not backing down."

## Bridge is cool? You bet! Just ask the Simpson firm

If you're among those who lament the aging of the ACBL membership, take heart. Christopher Simpson is here.

You don't have to spend much time with the president of Simpson Communications LLC to find yourself with a renewed sense of optimism for the future of duplicate. "We think the stars are lining up for bridge right now," he says.

The Simpson company has been hired by the ACBL to help create more interest in bridge among the younger generation. On Aug. 16, a major part of the company's efforts will go live. It's [www.bridgeiscool.com](http://www.bridgeiscool.com), a web site just for young people aimed at building a bridge community among them. It will feature mini-bridge, bridge, video, lots of data and links to

other bridge sites.

The web site is just part of the effort, however. The Simpson company – with offices in Williamsburg VA, Washington DC and Chicago – will also be building alliances with 14 national organizations, including the YMCA and the Girl Scouts, to get them to help introduce bridge to young people.

There will also be traditional marketing efforts such as tee shirt and wrist band giveaways.

Simpson and Chris Turner, the company vice president of marketing, made a presentation on their efforts to the full ACBL Board of Directors earlier in the week.

The company was hired on the initiative of

### Atlanta Transportation

Atlanta has outstanding public transportation. MARTA rail service is available with 15-minute service from the airport to the Hyatt. The MARTA rail stops at the Peachtree Center station, which is underneath the Hyatt with an escalator ride to the hotel. The cost is \$1.75 for one-way fare with free transfer, but the real deal is in unlimited-ride convention passes, \$11 for specific five-day periods or \$23 for 12 days, July 20-31. Special MARTA pass packages (for rail or bus) are available at any RideStore cashier.

All MARTA stations and rapid rail cars are fully accessible to handicapped and elderly passengers. Special MARTA L-vans have lifts for easy boarding and safety belts for securing wheelchairs. Routes are established in response to individual requests and door-to-door service is provided. One-way handicap

fare is \$3.50. Required attendants ride at no additional cost. Also, there are 150 bus routes to locations such as sports venues, Underground, Omni, Lenox, and the Arts Center.

Train service is reliable from about 5 a.m. to 1 a.m. daily.

### Entertainment room

Here are a couple of things you should know about the Entertainment Room in Hanover Hall: Sections C and D are open as a player lounge all days and nights except for Monday afternoon, July 25. There is a juke box for your listening pleasure.

Section E is also a player lounge but with a television and DVD player.

# JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

## How do I pick what to play in?

If you are at the start of your bridge career, a 0-5 point player, or even 0-20, the Intermediate/Newcomer playing area is probably where you should stay.

You will find stratified events every day of this tournament, including free play for 0-5 players on Friday, July 22, at any session, and a special Bridge Plus+ event on Saturday, July 23, at 10 a.m.

Look at the schedule for any day, and you will always see stratified events in the 299er area. When you buy your entry, tell the selling director which one of you has more masterpoints. There may be several available events, and within each one you will be placed in the appropriate stratum.

You are always welcome to choose a game with a higher top limit, but don't try to play up to a higher stratum. You will be playing in a mixed field, probably of three strata. If you are in the bottom strat but score higher than players from the higher groups, you receive masterpoints from the higher strats.

One opportunity you may not have had in your home club is to play in Swiss teams. Team games are scheduled as an alternative to pairs 18 times during the 10 days of the NABC. Take advantage of the partnership desk for the I/N area to team up with another pair. Make sure you arrive at least half an hour before game time if you need help. An even better way to get a team is to ask a pair you've enjoyed meeting while you play. Even if they're not available, they'll be thrilled to be asked.

The moving around and scoring for Swiss teams are different from the pairs games we're all used to. You will be assigned a home table for your North-South pair. Your East-West pair will go to a companion table.

Usually, the tables are paired by sections: A/B, C/D, E/F and so on. If, for example, North-South are assigned to table 4 in section B, their East-West teammates will go to A4. You play a set number of boards in each match (often six or seven).

One person from each pair should be sure to keep an accurate score. After you have played the full set of boards, make sure your opponents agree with you on the results, and reunite as a team at the North-South table.

You compare scores with your teammates and record the IMPs — plus, minus or tie for each board. If you've never done this before and need help, just call for a director. It's not hard once you've had a little practice, but you should get your scores figured in a timely manner so as not to delay others.



The winning teams turn in the results, and very soon you will get a new seating assignment to do it all over again! But this time you will be computer-matched to a team that has a score similar to yours. Teams are popular because they seem more sociable, the atmosphere is more relaxed than in a pairs game, and you win some masterpoints even if you win only one match. Give it a try.

You can even decide to leave the I/N area and play in an open stratified game—just remember that the top of the bottom strat will be much higher: Top of "C" in the open events is 750.

## Thinking bridge

**Opening lead:** ♣K

**Bidding commentary:** East's double of the 2♣ Stayman response is a lead-directing double. It is also a penalty double. At this level it promises five or six clubs headed by three of the top five, or two of the top three honors. Lead-directing doubles at the four level or higher (Blackwood responses, cuebids) do not require length in the suit, just strength; K-Q-x (x) or K-J-x (x) are just fine. After the double, South shows a four-card major if he has one. Lacking a major, South rebids 2♦ to deny a club stopper and passes to show one. South can also redouble to show four or five strong clubs, such as A-J-10-x (x). North can pass the redoubled with a suitable hand. Excitement!

**Lead commentary:** After a lead directing double, opening leads are no-brainers. Even

with a void the doubled suit should be led.

**Defensive commentary:** East overtakes the ♣K in case it is a singleton. Rule of Life No. 1: Do not signal partner encouragement if you can afford to overtake. After overtaking, East scores three club tricks, but what does East do for an encore? East sees 12 HCP in dummy to go along with at least 15 in declarer's hand giving the bad guys 27 HCP, minimum. This leaves the good guys with 13 HCP. East has 10 HCP, so the most West can have is three and he has led the ♣K! East does not have to think very hard to know what partner has left.

**Further defensive commentary:** Rule of Life No. 2: When there are no tricks coming from

the side suits, think ruff-sluff. If East leads a fourth club and West uppercuts dummy with the ♠7, driving out the S10, East's ♠K 9 8 promotes to the setting trick. Bravo, East.

## National 199er Pairs

Make your plans to play in the National 199er Pairs, limited to players with fewer than 200 masterpoints. It will be played Thursday, July 28, at 10 a.m. and 3 p.m.

The event will consist of two sessions. Overall awards are part red and part gold. You could get your start on that precious Life Master card in this event.

He was stationed in Korea during his Army hitch and became a regular at the bridge club in Seoul. Despite the fact that he had only about three ACBL masterpoints, he ended up playing in the Far Eastern Bridge Championships (to select a representative to the world championships) representing Korea. His teammates were another GI, an Air Force sergeant and an American who was a naturalized Korean citizen.

Remarkably, the team finished in the middle of the pack, and Stewart regrets to this day that he had no awareness at the time of what he was experiencing. "I wish I could go back," he says, "and do it again."

Back home after being discharged from the Army, Stewart worked at bridge to make his living, "grinding out \$20 bridge lessons."

One day, he recalls, a student asked if Stewart could put together worksheet from the lessons. He soon had produced about 90 of the worksheets.

At the time, he says, he had a "vague idea" of becoming a bridge writer, "mostly because I thought some of the writers were getting older."

The key move for Stewart was his decision in 1978 to send an article – "a piece of fluff," he says – to the Bridge World magazine. The piece was published, so he sent another. It, too, was printed. "They liked my stuff," Stewart says. "They didn't know exactly why, but they liked it."

His first Bridge Bulletin article was published in August of 1981. Two years later, Henry Francis, then editor of the Bridge Bulletin, offered Stewart a job. He started in 1984 and worked for the ACBL until 1989, moving to Fayette AL, where his wife, Charlotte, grew up. It's in western Alabama about 40 miles north of Tuscaloosa.

Stewart credits his tenure with the ACBL for opening the door to the syndicated column. Alfred Sheinwold was a regular Bridge Bulletin contributor, and Stewart edited his articles. They developed a relationship which led to Stewart's collaborating with Sheinwold on the latter's daily bridge column, now syndicated by the Tribune Media Syndicate.

In 1986, Sheinwold had heart surgery and his syndicate became concerned that there was no successor in case Sheinwold's health took a drastic turn for the worse. Sheinwold enlisted Stewart to help with the column. "I think maybe he thought he could work with me," says Stewart.

The two worked together for 11 years until Sheinwold's death in 1997, at which point Stewart took over the column. "I learned a lot from him," says Stewart, "and I'm doing my best to uphold his standard."

These days, Stewart almost never plays bridge, preferring a quiet life at home in Fayette with Charlotte and their adopted daughter, Bessie, who will turn 5 in November. They got her when she was two days old. Now 58, Stewart says he enjoys fatherhood, allowing that "it will either add 10 years to my life or put me in an early grave."

Atlanta was something of a homecoming for Stewart, who attended his first NABC in Atlanta in the spring of 1971. In the Thursday evening game, he and former protege Doug Levene of Birmingham AL did quite well, posting a 66.67% game to finish a half point out of first in the Educational Foundation Stratified Open Pairs.

"I've had a great time, re-establishing contact with people I haven't seen in a long time," he said just before departing, "but now I'm going back to my little world."

The Grosvenor Coup struck Steve Beatty of Bothell WA on Board 24 of the first session of the Life Master Pairs.

Beatty, South, declared 3♣ after an uncontested auction. The opening lead was the ♥Q. Beatty won this with dummy's ace and cashed the ♥K, discarding a diamond. He next cashed the ♠A and ♠K, ruffed a spade in dummy, and ruffed a heart back to his hand. When he now led his last spade, West discarded instead of ruffing with the ♣10.

That was the play that led to Beatty's undoing. He ruffed the spade in dummy and led the ♣9. When East followed low, Beatty took the "marked" finesse into West's ♣10, and the Grosvenor Coup had claimed another victim.

## Ruling the Game

### The trouble with psychs — part 2

This article offers advice to club managers and directors on handling psychs. Remember that one of the few things that a club must agree to do in obtaining an ACBL sanction to run games is agree to follow the Laws of Duplicate Contract Bridge. Law 40 permits psychs, so clubs cannot simply prohibit them. Here are some suggestions, however, for dealing with this vexing topic.

#### 1. Education

- Educate the victims. The best way to combat psychs at the table is to trust partner. When there seem to be 50 high-card points in the deck, always assume that partner has his or her calls.

- Educate the perpetrators. It is perfectly okay for pairs to do everything legal in an attempt to win when playing in a sectional. In a club game, however, a more relaxed atmosphere should be encouraged. A top pair should not have to psych against pairs with considerably less experience. Encourage them to "play it straight," a tactic which will result in a friendlier atmosphere and help the less experienced pairs improve and can even lead to the mentoring of the newer pairs. The top pairs will still win most of the time. Suggest to them that psyching against weaker pairs in a club game should be viewed as unsportsmanlike.

- Define for everyone what a psych actually is — a gross misstatement of either the strength or the shape of one's hand made with the intention of misleading the opponents.

#### 2. Policy implementation

- Require that all psychs be reported — twice. Once by the victims and once by the offenders. A notice to this effect should be posted in the club's playing area. All directors in the club should be aware of the policy and its purpose — to increase everyone's enjoyment of the game.

- Set up a log book to be used by the directors to record psychs.

- Have your directors keep your log book up to date.

#### 3. Policy enforcement

- Be consistent! If pairs fail to comply with your regulations in reporting of psychs committed by their side, assess a penalty against the pairs in the games in which the psychs occur. You will have to do this only once or twice for perpetrators to know that you mean business.

- If a pair seems to have an implied agreement to psych, they need to get an adjusted score and/or a procedural penalty. This can be done completely within the laws. (The law that applies when adjusting a score is 40C.)

- Follow up on reports of excessive, frivolous or unsportsmanlike psychic activity. Penalize the offenders where appropriate.

- Speak to frequent offenders. If you can't persuade them to clean up their act, place them on probation or suspend them from your club. If you are suspending a player from your club, you must do this by letter, and a copy of the letter must be sent to the ACBL Club Department. Unlike other bodies of the ABCL such as units and districts, a conduct committee is not required.

Mike Passell found the winning line of play when he and partner Eddie Wold bid this thin slam in an early match in the Grand National Teams Championship flight.

West, Steve Weinstein, led a low heart. With only eight top tricks, Passell, South, had little choice but to finesse, and the ♥10 won. He led a diamond to the ace to repeat the heart finesse, and now had to develop two more tricks. The odds were poor for finding them in clubs (he'd need a 3-3 break and the ♣K in the West hand), so he decided to go for a minor-suit endplay.

Passell cashed two more hearts, pitching a club and a spade from his hand, then cashed the ♠AK and the ♦KQ. He led a low diamond to East, Bobby Levin, who had to lead a club. Passell won the last three tricks with the ♣Q, ♣A and the long diamond.

That was a 13-IMP pickup for the Passell-Wold team, since the contract at the other table was 3NT.

## Bridge is cool

Linda Granell, ACBL's director of marketing.

She said that after joining the ACBL two years ago, it became obvious to her that growth in ACBL's Junior membership had stagnated. The effort to introduce bridge in schools was in the same situation.

"We have lost a generation of bridge players," Granell said, "and it was clear it was time to embark on a program to reach thousands if not millions of young people."

Granell solicited proposals from firms that specialize in education marketing. Before making a proposal, the Simpson company did their own research to see if the effort could be successful.

Preliminary research among young people revealed that 90% play cards of some type, although only 2% said they play bridge. Simpson also discovered that among young people, bridge is perceived as old-fashioned, complex and "not fun."

That may sound discouraging, but when young people who were surveyed were asked which in a list of card games they would be interested in learning, bridge came out on top. Simpson was convinced that bridge has a future as an interest for young people.

"There appears," said Simpson, "to be almost a pent-up demand (for bridge)."

Simpson's efforts going forward will be to position bridge as being, fun, hip and cool.

Granell and Simpson believe they have achieved a coup of sorts in getting on the agenda for next year's convention of the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics. Roughly 17,000 members of the organization will gather in St. Louis in April, and Kitty Bethe, one of ACBL's top players and teachers, will present a workshop on introducing bridge into math curricula.

Simpson's survey among math teachers revealed that 37% would favor teaching bridge as part of math classes if they thought it would help young people learn math and social skills.

Interestingly, the burgeoning interest in poker, even among young people, is seen as a positive development for bridge. Said Simpson: "A large segment of society wants to encourage cards for young people with no gambling." That would be bridge, of course.

Granell cautions that the efforts of the Simpson company are not designed to produce an instant surge in ACBL membership, nor is that expected.

"We want young people to have bridge in their futures," said Granell, who views herself as an example of how it's supposed to work. She learned bridge at home as a youngster but took some time off from the game to tend to family and career development. Now she's back and playing regularly.

Simpson believes the elements for success are there. "We just need to connect all the dots."
