Alan Stout sets his sights on the record

Alan Stout of Mountain Home AR is the clear leader in the Barry Crane Top 500, the race to win more masterpoints than any other ACBL member during 2005. Through July 18, he had won 1766.16 points for the year and was more than 600 points ahead of the closest contender, who happens to be his frequent partner, Don Stack of Kansas City MO.



Those impressive point totals make Stout a favorite in the contest, but he has greater ambitions than just winning the trophy. His goal is to break the record of 3584.26 points set by Jim Barrow in 1999. As of July 18, he was just 46 points behind Barrow's total in mid-July 1999.

Stout has had some spectacularly successful weeks so far. He won more than 100 points at three different regionals – Wilmington DE (Feb. 21-27), Oklahoma City OK (May 9-15) and Jackson MS (June 6-12). His best tournament was the Pittsburgh NABC in March, where he won 147.20 points. That included 75 points for placing second in the NABC Mixed Pairs with partner Lynn Deas.

Through Sunday, Stout had won 36.11 points in Atlanta, including 32.06 for placing 3/4 in the top bracket of the Gatlinburg KO Teams. His team placed 10th overall in yesterday's Senior Swiss for another 26.67 points.

Stout's friend and partner, Don Stack, has set up a web site that tracks Stout's progress: www.geocities.com/donstacker

Earlier this week, Stout spoke with the Daily Bulletin staff about his strategies for winning and the physical, mental and emotional demands of his campaign:

You're past the halfway point in the year. What do you tell people who ask you what this has been like?

Four words: "You have no idea.." It's really hard to describe the experience, and it's much more difficult than I expected. It's a mental and emotional roller coaster, with peaks and valleys every day.

What's your travel schedule?

I'll be playing 44 weeks this year, 18 sessions per week, three sessions per day in tournaments in 25 states. I also have three tournaments "in mothballs" that I'll add to the schedule if I need them to win or break the record. My budget can't

Murphy team wins Senior Swiss

The team captained by Jim Murphy went into the final day of the Senior Swiss Teams standing 32nd out of 45 teams. They had a big afternoon session and worked their way up to second by the break, then moved up to first after the fifth round.

Lights, camera. . .

Mini-Spingolds enter round of 16

Sixteen teams are left in both the 0-5000 and 0-1500 Mini-Spingolds. Fifty-one teams entered the 0-5000 and 34 teams entered the 0-1500 event. Matches will conclude Saturday.

Movin' on up

Attendance at the 2005 Summer NABC took another leap Tuesday. Through the 3 p.m. sessions, table count was 7820.5. The projected final total is 13,300.

Then came two small losses, but they didn't give up. They scored 18 out of 30 victory points in the final round to win by VPs.

Murphy, of Chesapeake VA, is a retired programming analyst for the U.S. Navy. This is his first national win, which made him a Grand Life Master.

"I have 14,300 total points, and I was starting to think the national win was never going to happen," said Murphy. "It sure feels great."

This was the sixth national win for Murphy's teammate, Gene Freed, a physician from Los Angeles. Freed won the gold medal in the first Senior Bowl in Paris in 2001. He will be the non-playing captain of the USA II Senior Team at the world championships in Estoril, Portugal.

The other members of the team are Jerry Bare, a traffic-control expert in Los Angeles, and Mike Savage, a bridge director in Los Angeles. This is the second national win for Bare and the first for Savage.

Meltzer falls in Spingold

The #5-seeded team captained by Rose Meltzer (Peter Weichsel, Alan Sontag, Kyle Larsen, Bart Bramley, Mark Feldman) lost twice on Tuesday and was eliminated from the Spingold Knockout Teams.

Playing in a four-way match, Meltzer lost in the afternoon to the original #42 seed (Rick Binder, David Becher, Alan Watson and William Braucher). In the evening, Meltzer lost to the #19 seed (Mark Gordon, Pratap Rajakhyaksha, Steve Landen, Jaggy Shivdasani, Mark Molson and Winthrop Allegaert).

The top seeds prevailed in all other matches that had reported results. The only match in doubt

per week, three sessions per day in tournaments in 25 states. I also have three tournaments “in mothballs” that I’ll add to the schedule if I need them to win or break the record. My budget can’t afford plane tickets, so I drive almost everywhere, sometimes 1000 miles between tournaments. I’ll be away from home for 108 days in a row between June 6 and September 12.

You must be pretty tired of hotel rooms.

Yes, but I book apartment-style accommodations in most cities, so it’s a little more home-like. I rarely stay at the tournament site. My choice is an extended-stay hotel with a kitchenette. When I get to town on Monday, I go to the grocery store to stock up for the week and I eat almost all my meals in my room.

What’s your overall strategy for the year?

I spent 14 months planning this. I’m convinced that good organization is responsible for about half the masterpoints – scheduling the right tournaments, lining up good teammates, playing in the right events. I play on six-man teams and we enter every available knockout event because that’s where the masterpoints are.

No pair games?

Very few. I actually love matchpoint events, but not this year. At pairs, you’re on the edge of success or failure on every hand. Team play is less stressful and offers opportunities to sit out and rest.

Do you have a favorite regional?

Yes, Tunica, Mississippi. And unfortunately, I’m not even going to play there this year. My travel and partnership arrangements worked out better for the regional in Fort Wayne, Indiana for that week.

How do the 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. start times work out for you?

It’s not my preferred schedule. If I were playing just two sessions a day, I’d probably like being able to finish early and have the evening off for dinner and rest. But playing three sessions a day, I’d really rather play knockouts in the morning instead of so late in the evening.

How do you conserve your energy?

I try to stick to a routine. I get up an hour and a half before the first session, I eat light meals and I use the lunch and dinner hours to rest. I also try to compress my day by sitting out the first half of morning matches and the last half of evening matches whenever possible. I do, however, like to be in for the second half of a “money round” or final KO match because that’s when my adrenaline is highest. Swiss Teams are a little more tiring. I have to play all the matches because unlike the KOs, the Swiss masterpoint awards are reduced for sitouts. My teammates have been great about accommodating that schedule.

Do you do anything special to stay mentally sharp?

I’ve learned to conserve my brain power by putting put my mind on “autopilot” for routine hands. When a tough decision comes up, though, I have to be ready to shift into a higher gear. I feel like I have to stay at or near my mental peak every day.

I also try to avoid talking about bridge hands. When I’m away from the table, just about the last thing I want to hear from anyone is “I have a hand for you ...”

What point-winning pace have you set for yourself?

My goal for a typical regional week is to win 80 points. A “bad” regional for me is 60 points, and I can get pretty down after one of those weeks.

Do you ever get up in the morning and think you’d rather have a root canal than play another session?

Yes, often. But if my team wins a few matches, the feeling goes away and I’m ready to go again.

So what do you do for fun?

There’s no time for fun this year. Even when I

Ruling the Game

Played Cards — part 3

Law 46A says that declarer must clearly state both the suit and the rank of a card called from dummy. If declarer fails to do so, Law 46B details the consequences.

The director should be aware of the parenthetical clause in Law 46B that states that the restrictions enumerated later apply except when declarer’s different intention is incontrovertible. Failure to take this segment into account may cause the director to err in making some rulings. Whether the intention was incontrovertible or not is a matter of judgment.

It is worth noting that directors need to be alert to situations where an apparent inadvertency is actually an instance of the declarer thinking ahead, i.e., calling a card to the current trick that he really intends to play to a subsequent trick. For example, declarer has led his singleton to dummy’s ace-king of an off suit, intending to take a pitch before drawing trumps. Unfortunately, before playing both of dummy’s high cards, he calls for a trump. This call was not inadvertent. Declarer intended the call, and should not be allowed to change it.

The idea of intent also applies to Law 45C4B, Correction of an Inadvertent Designation. Declarer is entitled to change the call of a card played from dummy, but only if he does so without pause for thought and his first call was unintended. For example, say declarer holds the A-x-x in a suit in his hand and leads low towards the dummy’s Q-x, calling for the queen. He then notices that his LHO has played the king. Declarer must not be allowed to change his call no matter how quickly he changes it. His first call was not inadvertent.

The following applies to an incomplete designation of a card to be played:

1. If declarer calls for a suit, but not a rank, as in “play a spade,” he is deemed to have called for the lowest spade.

2. If he calls “high” or words of like import, he is deemed to have called the highest card. In fourth seat, he is deemed to have called the lowest winning card of the suit indicated. If he says “win it” or words of like import, he is deemed to have called the lowest winning card. If he calls “low” or words of like import, he is deemed to have called the lowest card of the suit designated.

3. If declarer designates a rank but not a suit, in leading he is deemed to have continued the suit in which dummy won the preceding trick as long as there is a card of that rank in that suit that can be played. In all other cases, declarer must play a card from the dummy of the rank designated if he can do so. If there are two or more cards that can legally be played, declarer must designate which one was intended.

4. If declarer designates a card that is not in dummy, that call is void, and declarer may designate any legal card.

5. If declarer indicates a play without designating either a suit or rank as by saying “play anything” or words of like import, either defender may designate the play from dummy.

Be a friend

Mary elopes

In this deal from the Senior Swiss Teams, Mary Oshlag played skillfully to overcome a bad trump split and help her squad to a 13-IMP gain in a match they won by a single IMP. She was playing with her husband, Richard.

With no spade stopper, Mary opted for the 10-trick game in hearts.

West got the defense off to the best start, leading the ♥10, which was covered all around.

Mary won the ♥K and got out of her hand with a low spade. East won and continued with a low heart. Mary won with the ace, ruffed a spade, then cashed three rounds of clubs. She then played the ♦A and a diamond to the king, leaving this position:

Mary had eight tricks in and a master trump, but she needed one more trick. When she led the ♦6 from dummy, she put herself in position to “elope” with her low trump (elopement as a bridge term was coined by the late Geza Ottlik). Just check out what happens to East. If he discarded the ♠K, Mary would make her ♥2 immediately with a diamond ruff. East therefore ruffed in with the ♥5. Instead of overruffing, Mary discarded her losing spade. Now East again faced a Hobson’s choice – let Mary use her ♥2 to ruff a spade, or exit with a heart, at which point Mary would win with the 9 and play the good ♣J, forcing East to use his last trump. She would get the ♥2 by ruffing a spade at the end for the game going trick.

At the other table, West did not enter the auction, so South ended in 3NT, down two on the spade lead.

He should have tried breadcrumbs

Barbara also is a past president of Tennessee Valley Unit 165 and of the Mid-Atlantic. She co-chaired the Gatlinburg regional for six years before moving to Atlanta in 1992. She is a middle school media specialist, and before classes, she teaches bridge to sixth-, seventh- and eighth-graders. Several of them are new ACBL members.

Mike Becker showed me this deal from the first round of the Spingold Teams. Partnering Richard Schwartz, Becker played 4♠ as South on this deal:

Becker received the ♥5 lead to the ♥Q, ♥K and ♥A and immediately led the ♣9 from hand.

West won and returned a trump. Becker won in dummy and led to the ♣Q. West won the ♣K and led another trump to prevent declarer from ruffing two clubs.

With this defense, the contract appears to depend on the diamond finesse, but Becker found a way to improve his chances. He won the second trump in hand, cashed the ♥J and ruffed a heart. He then ruffed a club with his last trump, ruffed another heart in dummy and drew the last trump. This was the ending:

Becker had stripped out all the hearts so he could lead safely exit with the ♣7, pitching a diamond from his hand. West won and was endplayed, but even if East had held the last club, the contract would still have come down to nothing worse than the diamond finesse.

Gartaganis took a 76-37 lead at the half, but Hollman came back to tie the match at 123-123 after 32 boards. The Gartaganis team advanced, winning a late appeal after the playoff.

It is called 6-card key card and can be used when a partnership bids and raises two suits or when one of them has opened 1NT and the other shown two suits.

Here, Bare was able to bid slam, despite a combined holding of 24 HCP because of South's fitting cards. Making 6♥ was an 11 IMP pickup.

Convention card reminder

• Each player must have an ACBL convention card filled out and on the table. Please note that other types of convention cards, such as the WBF convention card or homemade cards that do not sufficiently resemble the ACBL convention card, are not acceptable substitutes.

• Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

What's behind those names?

Bracketed knockouts are the No. 1 reason for the ongoing popularity of Mid-Atlantic regionals. our tournaments. Morning KOs, prime time KOs, compact KOs, dinner bell KOs, late-night compact KOs . . . no one offers more. So each knockout is named after one of our District 7 regional sites, or another locale for a specific reason listed below.

Also, we are paying tribute to those players who gained fame and admiration within our borders. Various side game series bear the names of past bridge giants. (If you notice that Margaret Wagar of Atlanta is not included, that's because the ACBL already has the Wagar Women's Knockouts in Summer NABCs.)

Here's what's behind the names, in chronological order.

Atlanta KOs: Your hosts, of course, and usually the site of the ACBL's largest Labor Day regional. This year, however, the Atlanta Regional will be even more festive, running Dec. 26 through Jan. 1, including a big New Year's Eve party.

Lou Bluhm Side Game Series: For those who played tournament bridge in the Seventies and Eighties, you know that no one better exemplified our game than Lou Bluhm. He was one of this country's leading players, winning numerous NABC pair and team titles. But Lou might best be remembered as a player whose ethics and professionalism were beyond reproach. A member of the ACBL Hall of Fame, he won the first ACBL Distinguished Player Award — an award that was created because of Lou. He died in 1990.

Coastal Georgia KOs: Unit 202 covers an eastern swath of the state and has been host to regionals in Augusta, Jekyll Island and Savannah, most recently last October at Jekyll.

Chuck Whidden Side Game Series: A behind-the-scenes pioneer in many aspects of the game, Chuck was best known as the Mid-Atlantic's first web master. He was a tireless, unselfish worker who sought no recognition. After Chuck's death in 2003, his wife, Kathy, said that Chuck was most proud of being voted the Georgia State Unit Sportsman of the Year. Kathy, an award-winning director, retired this year . . . although she is overseeing the information desk at this tournament.

Gatlinburg KOs: ACBL regional record-setter for four consecutive years. Is a 10,000 table regional possible?

Knoxville KOs: The center of Unit 165, which hosts Gatlinburg every year and provides many of the volunteers. Knoxville also runs two of the district's larger sectionals each year in the city-owned bridge center.

Bernard Warshauer Side Game Series: Bernard, a well-known judge from Sumter SC, was a five-term district director, from 1979 until 1994. He served in various other volunteer and administrative positions and was a member of the ACBL Goodwill Committee. Bernard died in 1998.

Columbia KOs: The Mid-Atlantic holds a regional in Columbia every three to six years, and the hosts always do a great job. We return Oct. 16–22, 2006.

Charlotte KOs: The last Charlotte Regional was 10 years ago — when, as this year, there was an Atlanta NABC and the Labor Day regional landed in Charlotte. We've got a great new site for the Aug. 30–Sept. 5 tournament, one we already have booked for autumn 2007.

Morganton KOs: Eldon and Susie Clayman moved here in 1992, set up a bridge club in the basement of their home, and put this foothills town on the bridge map. The unit has fewer than 250 members, yet hosts four sectionals a year — averaging close to 300 tables each — with unparalleled hospitality.

Hilton Head KOs: Always one of our most popular sites, and it will be one of the ACBL's largest regionals next year. Schedule your midwinter respite for Feb. 6–12.

Bobby McMahan Side Game Series: A past District 7 president and our district director from 1994 until his death in 1997, Bobby was a longtime force in South Carolina bridge. A skilled player, teacher and goodwill ambassador, he was one of our most outgoing and popular officials.

Myrtle Beach KOs: Ever since our last regional in 1999, one of the most asked questions has been, "When are we going back?" The answer: Dec. 5–11. A brand-new Marriott property on the beach is our venue, and we'll return for the 2008 and 2010 New Year's regionals.

Washington Side Game Series: The nation's capital is the District 6 capital, too. The next NABC is Summer 2009.

Macon KOs: The most active bridge group in Unit 114 outside Atlanta is 90 miles south. Two open and one non-LM sectional are run each year at the new clubhouse, the product of fund-raising and generosity in the bridge community earlier this decade.

Raleigh KOs: Our Memorial Day regional in even-number years, and it's always the largest in the ACBL. Next: May 23–29, 2006.

Jerry Machlin Side Game Series: Jerry is identified with District 6, but as the founding father of the Mid-Atlantic Bridge Conference, he also had a great impact on District 7. Jerry, a longtime and colorful director, died in 1997.

Cape Fear KOs: Regionals in February of odd-number years are held in downtown Wilmington, a fun and easy-to-get-around site. Next: Feb. 19–25, 2007.

Greenville KOs: District 7's most recent regional (June) was in downtown Greenville, close to the geographical center of our district. We return June 11–17, 2007.

Nashville KOs: A tip of the hat to District 10, which reciprocates with District 7 in advertising, publicity and fund-raising. Our neighbors have contributed to hospitality here, just as District 7 is contributing to hospitality at the Summer 2007 NABC in Nashville.

Chattanooga KOs: One of our infrequent but reliable regional sites. Next visit to the Choo Choo is Dec. 1–7, 2008.

Billy Woodson Side Game Series: Best known around the Charlotte area, Billy is a former Mid-Atlantic president and was our district director from 1973 until 1979. He served as special consultant to the ACBL one year and is in the South Carolina bridge hall of fame. He is inventor of the Woodson Two-Way No-Trump.

Charleston Strati-Flighted Swiss Teams: The site of our inaugural New Year's regional in 2003, Charleston instantly became the ACBL's most popular. Attendance soared this year, and we'll be back to ring in 2007 and 2009.
