Breed-Quinn take LM Women's title

The Texas-based duo of Mildred Breed and Shawn Quinn posted a 60% final session to win the Life Master Women's Pairs.

For Breed, of Bryan TX, this is her fifth NABC victory. She also has a world championship in the 1997 Venice Cup in Tunisia.

This is Quinn's 11th NABC title. Her two world titles were in the 1996 Women's Olympiad in Rhodes, Greece, and the 1998 Women's World Pairs Championships in Lille, France.

"She was great!" said a pleased Quinn about her partner's performance in the contest.

Breed was equally complementary of Quinn's play.

"We're both fairly aggressive, but Shawn is more so. She's always in the game, which is exactly what you want in a partner."

In second place by some 26 matchpoints were Nell Cahn of Shreveport LA and Ellen Siebert of Fort Lauderdale FL.

Cahn previously won this event in 1988. Her other NABC victory came in 1991 in the Women's Knockouts. Cahn was also a member of the winning Venice Cup squad in Yokohama in 1991.

For Siebert, it was her first second-place finish in a national event.

Junior Corps inducts two new members

Junior players attended the Junior Day dinner last night that featured the induction of two new members into the ACBL Junior Corps. The inductees were Brandon Carpenter of White House TX and Jenni Hartsman of Atlanta GA.

Aileen Osofsky, chairman of the ACBL Goodwill Committee, welcomed the attendees, as did ACBL CEO David Silber who addressed the group.

"You are the future of our game," said Silber, who went on to congratulate members of the Junior program for their dedication to the game.

G.S. Jade Barrett, who has served as coach and mentor of U.S. Junior teams and has been a driving force in support of the ACBL Junior program, announced the donation of \$1200 to the ACBL Education Department by the North American Youth Bridge Foundation, of which he is the chairman. This is the third grant made by the group in support of Junior related programs. This year's gift is earmarked for the annual Junior Bridge Camp. Barrett attended the dinner with wife, Karen, who is also a director of NAYBF.

Soloway, Catlett snatch LM Open victory

Paul Soloway and Steve Catlett won the Life Master Open Pairs, narrowly edging defending champions Lew and Joanna Stansby. Soloway and Catlett shadowed the Stansbys, who led the event from the qualifying session to the penultimate round of the final, and unleashed a giant last round to take the top spot.

Soloway, of Mill Creek WA, has dozens of NABC championships and is a three-time world champion. He is the all-time ACBL masterpoint leader with more than 52,000 masterpoints. For partner Steve Catlett, however, it was a first-time NABC victory.

"I used to play quite a bit in Mid-Atlantic events, but I took a 12-year layoff from bridge," said Catlett of Richmond VA. "When I returned, I started playing with Bobby Goldman and Paul. Bridge is similar to golf --- to improve your game, it's best to play with the top players. If all bridge players could avail themselves of playing with a professional it would dramatically improve their game."

For the Stansbys, the near-miss was disappointing but it further enhanced their reputation as one of the toughest husband-wife duos in top-level pair events. They won the 1998 LM Open, and were second in both the 1991 Open Pairs and in the 1997 North American Open Pairs.

New Yorkers top Non-LM Pairs

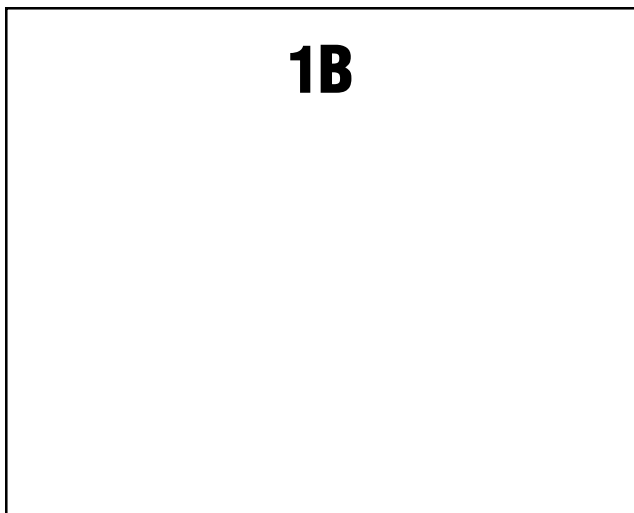
Igor Savchenko and Aviv Shahaf, originally of Moldova (formerly part of Russia) and Israel, scored a tight win in the Non-Life Master Pairs. In fact they were in second place as they awaited the result of a

late play. They had the better of it on the late play, so they edged Andy Latto of Foxboro MA and Lawrence Latto of Arlington VA, 392.2 to 390.74. Saeko Hisayama of Cliffside Park NJ and Noriko Kobe of Fort Lee NJ had a chance until the late play -- they finished third with 390.45.

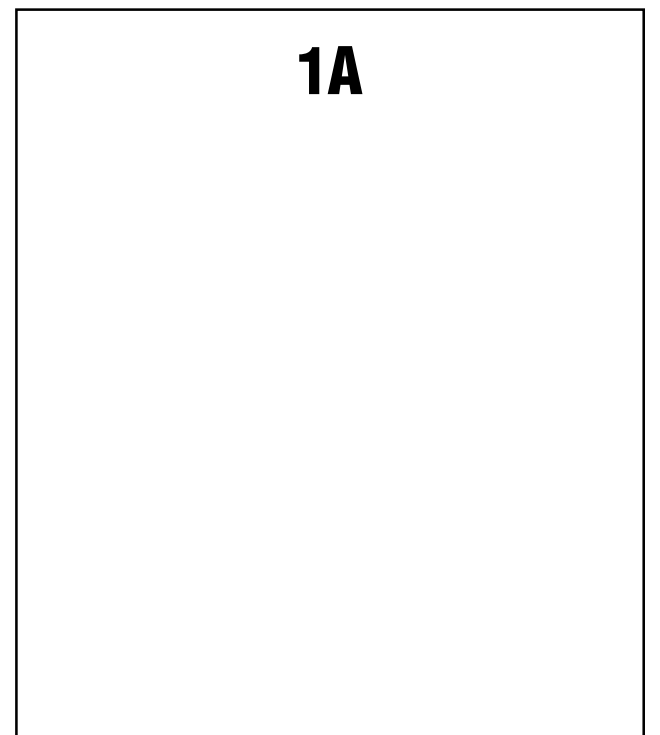
Savchenko and Shahaf were opponents in a New York regional, and Shahaf made a diamond slam on a neat squeeze. Savchenko liked Shahaf's style and aggressiveness, so he asked him to play. That was the start of a solid partnership. They play once a week at the Culbertson Bridge Club, where Savchenko is a part-time director.

They call their bidding system the Unassuming Club -- it's very much like the Polish Club except that they play a weak notrump.

Lawrence Latto plays under a major handicap. He can see his own cards, but he can't see what is played on the table. He has to have the cards called to him and memorize them as they are played. But he enjoyed very much the opportunity to play with his son and do so well.

Goodwill Committee to honor its tenth Member of Year

The 10th annual Goodwill Member of the Year will be announced at tomorrow afternoon's Goodwill reception (5 p.m. in the Staffordshire Room at the Westin). Chairman Aileen Osofsky will make the announcement.

Osofsky inaugurated the award in 1990 to honor the ACBL member whose actions and philosophy embody the principles of goodwill: a promoter of bridge, a courteous and friendly opponent, and a gentle and considerate partner.

A special presentation was made in 1995 when Dr. Jay Slotkin, Washington DC, was named an Honorary Goodwill Member because of the inspiration he had been to bridge players everywhere. Slotkin, a periodontist and former runner, became totally paralyzed by Lou Gehrig's Disease but managed to play bridge with the aid of a nurse. The nurse made his bids and played for him, based on his eye movements.

Osofsky called Slotkin before that year's meeting. "I called him to tell him our committee had decided to give him a special award as "the most inspirational player in the world of bridge," said Osofsky. Slotkin of course could not reply, but his nurse said she could tell by his eyes that he was delighted. He spelled out his reply: "Thank you so much. It means so much to me."

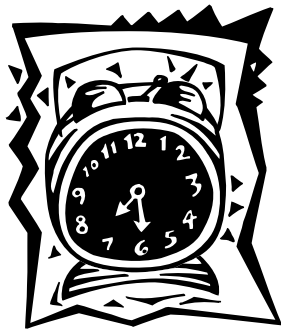

Retek led a heart to Wilkinson's jack and Lasut's king. Lasut, who has been a regular in world championship competition since the Seventies, cashed ♠ KA spades, then finessed the 9 after Wilkinson followed the second spade with the jack. On the third and fourth round of spades, Wilkinson discarded a club and a diamond. Lasut led the ♦10 to the jack and ace and then got out of his hand with a heart. Wilkinson was able to take four heart tricks but then was forced to lead away from his ♣K and present Lasut with his game.

Boston standard time

Alert! Alert! Boston standard time: Beginning Friday, evening sessions will begin at 7:30 p.m. This is a change from previously-published schedules. Challenging hand

This was a challenging competitive deal for North-South.

Board 14 ♠ Q
Dlr: East ♥ A K Q 5 2
Vul: None ♦ Q 8 5

If the auction started 1♣-1♥ by East-West, North was not really worth a 2♥ overcall. When East rebid 1♠, West could close North out by raising to 2♠. However, if West passes, North-South might get their act together and play 3♥.

Imagine defending 2♠ as North. What should you do after winning the ♥A at the first trick? The answer is that you need to shift to the ♠Q at once! If you play a second heart, declarer gets a crossruff going, and by ruffing the fourth heart with the ♠A he actually emerges with nine tricks.

But if North shifts to the ♠Q at the second trick, South gets the lead in diamonds (or by ruffing the third round of clubs) and gets to play two more rounds of trumps to hold declarer to seven tricks.

Multi-talented Levy to perform Sunday evening

Concert pianist David Levy, who will perform here Sunday after the evening session, is not only very good as a musical artist, but as a bridge player as well.

Levy, 34, hails from Manchester England, but currently resides near Cannes France. He studied music in Manchester, Paris and Germany, and has performed primarily in Europe, notably Germany and France. He was also recently invited to play in the U.S. with the Philadelphia orchestra. Levy also has made several recordings from radio performances in Europe.

But Levy is not only remarkable at the piano, but at the bridge table as well.

"I really prefer rubber bridge," said Levy who, despite this admission, finished second the Life Master Open Pairs qualifier Friday with partner and fellow-Brit Mike Goldsmith of Manchester.

Levy, who is visiting the U.S. to play in the NABC, noted that bridge and music have similarities.

"Both are ways of communicating," said Levy, who is scheduled to perform at 11:30 p.m. in the America Ballroom, fourth floor, at the Westin. (*Time and place are subject to change.*)

Hurd started playing bridge a couple of years ago during difficult times, and she credits bridge with helping her through the tough times. MARY LEARNED of Harwich MA became a Life Master by placing in a knockout team event.

RALPH and BARBARA PETERSON both became Life Master in the Bracketed Knockout Teams.
