



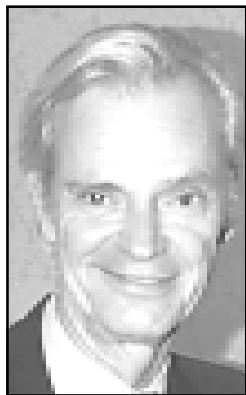

Mohan takes lead in *Player of the Year* race



With his victory in the Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs, John Mohan of St. Croix, Virgin Islands, has taken the lead in the 1999 *Player of the Year* contest.

The *Player of the Year* title goes to that player who earns the most platinum points --- given for high finishes in nationally-rated events --- in a calendar year. Mohan currently leads the race with 742.78 platinum points. Currently in second place is Sam Lev of New York NY with 684.22 points. Lev and Mohan won the Life Master Pairs at the Summer NABC in San Antonio earlier this year.

Longtime partners Jeff Meckstroth and Eric Rodwell occupy the third- and fourth-place positions with 670.69 and 653.35 platinum points respectively.

Meckstroth, a member of the powerful sextet captained by Nick Nickell, can still win the contest if his team significantly outperforms Mohan's in this weekend's Reisinger Board-a-Match. Lev, who is a teammate of Mohan, cannot surpass him in total points, nor can Rodwell overtake Meckstroth in the contest for the same reason.

Jill Meyers could also theoretically win the *POY* race, if her team were to win the Reisinger while the other leaders were to make an early exit.

Attendance revives

The table count Friday climbed back over 1000 after the expected drop that took place on the Thanksgiving holiday. The 1126.5 tables in play yesterday raises the overall total to date to 11,042.5 tables. Chances are the tournament total won't quite reach 13,000, but the turnouts throughout have been higher than anticipated.

Italians lead Reisinger Teams

Twenty-six teams advanced to today's semifinal rounds in the Reisinger Board-a-Match teams.

The Italian team of Maria Teresa Lavazza, Giorgio Duboin, Guido Ferarro, Noberto Bocchi and Dano DeFalco led the field of qualifiers with 36 wins. Bart Bramley and Sidney Lazard, members of the winning 1997 team, teamed up with Bobby Wolff and Dan Morse to finish the qualifier in second place with 35 points.

The defending champion squad of Rita Shugart, Andrew Robson, Tony Forrester and Geir Helgemo are in third with 34.5.



A familiar face to regular NABC attendees, National Tournament Director Tom Quinlan — known to many simply as 'TQ' — will be cutting back on his own regular NABC attendance. Quinlan, who has been a tournament director for 35 years and a director at North American Bridge Championships for 25 years, was a Director-in-Charge for the NABCs from 1987-1998. Quinlan announced his plans to retire from full-time status earlier this year. A UC Berkeley graduate, Quinlan and wife Janice Nakao, live in San Mateo CA.



Meyers leads in Herman Trophy race

At each of the three annual North American Bridge Championships, ACBL awards a trophy to the player who earns the most masterpoints at that NABC.

In the Spring it awards the Mott-Smith Trophy, in the Summer it's the Fishbein Trophy and in the Fall, ACBL awards the Lou Herman Trophy for the best individual performance by a player.

With the weekend events yet to play, Jill Meyers of Santa Monica CA is leading the Herman Trophy contest here in Boston with more than 300 masterpoints to her credit so far. The bulk of Meyers' points have come from the Women's Board-a-Match Teams and the Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs, both of which she has won.

Last year's winner was Eric Rodwell, who earned 328.59 masterpoints at the Fall NABC in Orlando.

At the 1996 Fall NABC in San Francisco, Michael Rosenberg set the record for the most masterpoints won during the Fall championships, racking up an impressive 445.77 masterpoints.

The third-place squad contains the father-son duo of Hemant and Justin Lall who are playing with Rhoda Walsh and Brenda Bryant. They qualified with a score of 120.

As chairman of SCA Corporation, the world's top bridge player, Bob Hamman, insures million-dollar promotions at sporting events. Many of you will remember the "ATT Million Dollar Shoot-out", held during half-time of a recent NBA Final. The contestant, a seventy-something Floridian, attempted five shots from the top of the key, the last one for a cool million simoleons. Bob had a tense moment after the retired geriatric nailed the first of his five 25-footers; fortunately for the fortunes of SCA his next four shots fell errant, assuring a nice profit for the firm.

Last month, Bob treated Kansas City shoppers to \$400,000 worth of free appliances when the Kansas City Chiefs shut out the San Diego Chargers. Expensive, but a good bet for SCA: yesterday's 21-0 Thanksgiving victory for the Dallas Cowboys over the Miami Dolphins was only the third NFL shutout of the year.

Back in the mid-Sixties, Bob flew up from LA each week to teach a bridge seminar in San Francisco. Kyle Larsen, my partner against Bob on this deal from the second final session of the Blue Ribbon Pairs -- and a teenager at the time -- was one of his students.

Air George

George Krizel came to America from Russia 20 years ago. He became a successful businessman selling electronic cash registers. He constantly modified his business as computers became state of the art. He was 51 before he ever played bridge.

His wife Rita introduced him to the game last year. Just before Christmas George wandered into his local bridge center, the Bensalem Bridge Club in Bensalem PA, just outside of Philadelphia. The director and owner of the club, Kathy Seehousen, brought George to my table and told him to watch me. I was giving a "playing lesson", and it is always a pleasure to have a kibitzer, especially one who can't recognize my mistakes.

George was hooked. He learned a lot about the game that night. He played with anyone with whom Kathy could fix him up for five months. He then told me he was ready to take lessons. He told me he wanted to play every convention he had ever heard about. I refused and made him play Standard American with only Stayman, Blackwood and negative doubles for two months. I told him that conventions

The bidding was straightforward; I made a light takeout double after Don Krauss raised 1♠ to two; not-vulnerable and holding a singleton spade, I treat their auction as forcing. Bob, with extra spade length, re-raised to three, which ended the bidding. Kyle, holding a likely trump control, found the killing lead of his small doubleton club.

From my point of view it was possible to play one or two rounds of clubs and shift to a diamond to build a trick for partner's hypothetical king, but I decided my best chance for tricks was in the trump suit, so I played three rounds of clubs, partly to kill one of dummy's potential winners in that suit.

Bob, to his subsequent chagrin, began to read the cards. "Glubok doubled as a passed hand," he thought, "Gotta play him for a singleton spade. Maybe I should ruff with the ace and lead up to dummy. No, what if Kyle flies with the king of trumps and crosses to the ace of diamonds and they play a fourth club to promote the jack of spades. No, can't happen, that would give the kid an opening bid."

So Bob ruffed with the ace and ran the 7, losing to my singleton jack. Playing me for a small singleton rather than the singleton jack, Bob figured he was a 2-1 favorite.

"Two-to-one favorites don't always hit," I might have reminded the SCA Chairman. "You want a sure thing? Stick to insuring those 60-footers from the opposing foul line." (Over the decade that SCA has conducted that particular promotion, randomly selected audience contestants at basketball games attempting that shot are one for 1300, ka-ching....)

The slam wasn't a great one, but was destined to make on the lead of the ♣Q. After East wins the ♣A and leads a heart, declarer can win in hand, lead a spade dummy's ♠K and then finesse the ♠8 on the way back (using the Rule of Restricted Choice). Back to dummy with the ♥Q, and another spade finesse to draw all of East's trumps. A diamond to dummy reveals the bad split, so declarer comes back to the South hand with a heart and takes the diamond finesse . . . voila!

That, of course, is without Audrey's double. The double of a freely-bid slam is typically played as a "Lightner double", asking for an unusual lead . . . dummy's first bid suit, for example. Not without a little trepidation, I led a diamond. Audrey ruffed and took the ♣A. Down one . . . and a potential loss had been turned into a win on the board.

A good read

Dave Treadwell read the position nicely here.

He played 3NT as West after opening 2NT and would have been struggling on a heart lead. But on a diamond lead he took the jack with the ace and guessed to lead three rounds of spades. South should encourage a heart shift but actually chose to signal for diamonds. North dutifully played the intellectual ♦10 on the off chance that it might pin the singleton 9. Treadwell covered and the defense cashed their two diamonds before exiting with the ♣J. Now what is the defense to do? If North overtakes, Treadwell can play three rounds of clubs to endplay South. When North ducked the ♣J, Treadwell relied on a 3-3 break in clubs to make his nine tricks.

If North shifts to a heart at trick five, Treadwell can still make by playing South for both red kings and executing a strip-squeeze. It is not easy to do this however.

take away judgment.

I finally submitted to his constant badgering, and in July I added Jacoby and Texas Transfer Bids to the card because he said he already played them with everyone. I told him he would make three mistakes in the first week. I was wrong! He made four mistakes on the first day! I wrote down every one of them in a journal which I call the Krizel Kronicle. This 80-page notebook contains all of our structure notes and many hands where George committed elementary errors. "You learn from your mistakes," I told him.

By the end of October George had accumulated more than 50 masterpoints. He won most of these at the Bensalem club and the Shore Bridge Club, owned and directed by Martin DeBruin. George constantly thanked both directors for their help and support. He recently placed in a Flight B event at a section and got his first silver points.

George asked me to play with him at the Boston NABC. We took a commuter shuttle from Trenton NJ to Boston for the first weekend. On Sunday we played in the Fast Open Pairs and had a 70.5% game in the second session to win the event. George went from 0 to 25.7 gold points in less than six hours.

We had to make the 6 p.m. flight so we rushed out of the Marriott right after the game. George really didn't need the airplane to get home though. His feet never touched the ground.

When Phillip Alder first bid notrump, then supported diamonds, then raised spades, Horton was just about sure that none of Alder's strength was concentrated in hearts -- hence the slam bid. He ruffed the opening heart lead and felt quite good about his chances. However, when he led a trump, he was not happy to see North show out. He took the club finesse through the opening bidder, took two top trumps and the ♠A, then cashed the ♠K, hoping for a singleton honor with South. Down came the jack, so Horton finessed the ♠9, got back to his hand with a heart ruff and took another spade finesse to pick up the suit and score up his slam. The only trick for the defense was the trump jack.

An unlikely game

Haig Tchamitch of Phoenix AZ found himself in an unlikely game contract on this deal from the Thursday night pair event. But this was not a particularly unusual experience for Tchamitch, as any of his partners will attest.

A 1♠ overcall on that North hand? "I had to," said Tchamitch. "I wasn't good enough to overcall 2♣." So be it. Who can blame Andrea Hayman for leaping to game with her fine hand?

But it turned out that nobody had to be blamed. Right! Tchamitch made it!

East got off to the unfortunate opening lead of the ♣A, which Tchamitch ruffed. He figured West had a good reason to double spades, so he led the trump 7, covered by the 8. He called for the 9 and won the trick. He used dummy's last trump, the king, to ruff a club and lead a diamond. West went up with the ace and continued the suit to Tchamitch's king. From the bidding, Tchamitch was quite convinced that West's hand was totally balanced, so he tried three rounds of hearts, and everyone followed. He ruffed a diamond for his ninth trick, then led a club that guaranteed a trick with the ♠Q to make his game.

Kit as North reached 4NT after a heavily contested auction.

On a heart lead declarer needs the club suit to produce three tricks. No problem! Win the ♥A, cross to a diamond, take one more top diamond to find West with shortage and then play East for the ♣Q-10 or the ♣K-10 by leading up to the jack, then playing accordingly. Plus 430 was a fine result for Woolsey.

South, my nephew Jason Feldman (and son of Mark "The Flash" Feldman), overtook partner's opening ♣J lead with his queen. True to his father's heritage, it took him "only" about five minutes to switch to a heart. Finis! The contract was beaten.

On any other defense, declarer could lead the ♠A, then a spade to the 10. Eventually he could discard a heart on the ♠Q.

Jason's reasoning was that West, declarer, vulnerable vs. not with a hole in diamonds and a sure club loser, had to have the major-suit aces. So trying for a spade ruff would expose the position.

For a terrific Junior of 20, this was an impressive piece of reasoning.

"It's a bidder's game," said a laughing Catlett as he explained how he and Soloway arrived at the combined 16-HCP game.

"Not everyone would agree with my responsive double, but we clearly didn't belong in 4♥, so I bid 4♠," he said.

North led the ♦A and seeing nothing more attractive, continued with the ♦K. Catlett ruffed in dummy and called for a low spade: 9, 4, queen. The defense persisted with a third round of diamonds and Catlett again ruffed in dummy and called for a low spade. When South produced the 10, Catlett decided that North had started with ♠K-Q for his 3NT call, so he went up with the ace dropping North's king.

Since clubs were 3-3 with the king onside, Catlett was able to establish the long club in dummy for a heart pitch. Plus 620 was worth all the matchpoints.

The Facts: 5♠ made five, plus 650 for N/S. The Director was called before the opening lead was faced when South disclosed that there had been a failure to Alert. North said that he believed the 2♦ bid to be a two-over-one game force. West told the Director that he thought South had used the failure to Alert as unauthorized information and had failed to bid the hand as if the 2♦ bid had been Alerted. He also stated that he might have taken action over an artificial 2♦ bid. The Director ruled that there was no violation of Law 16 and that South had not bid inappropriately. The Director allowed the table result to stand.

The Appeal: E/W appealed the Director's ruling and West did not attend the hearing. E/W believed that if South had bid 5♥ over 5♣, North would have bid 6♠ (and gone down) because he thought 2♦ was natural and game-forcing. North stated that he had not noticed South's original pass until she disclosed the failure to Alert. He said he thought South had overbid her hand and was trying to sign off with 5♠. North said his 2NT bid showed "12 to 19, no, 12+." When asked if he would have opened 2NT with 21 HCP he replied that he would open 1♠, not 2NT. He also said that if South had bid 5♥ over 5♣ he would have bid 6♠ and that a 5♥ bid by South would not have denied the ♦K.

The Panel Decision: All three experts believed that 5♥ was a logical alternative to South's 5♠ bid because of North's statement that his 1♠ bid could have shown up to 21 HCP. Since North said he thought South had a two-over-one forcing to game hand and he would have bid 6♠ had South bid 5♥, the Panel had to change the contract to 6♠ down one, plus 100 for E/W (Laws 16A and 73F1).

The Facts: 3NT made seven, plus 720 for E/W. The opening lead was the ♠4 to the 8, 9 and jack. West then led the ♥J to the 4, 10 (declarer had called for the king), and 3. The ♣9, 10, and queen were played to the next trick when North asked declarer how she had gotten to dummy. West said with the ♥K, but of course, the ♥K was still in the dummy. The Director ruled that since both sides had played to the next trick, trick two stood as played.

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling and said that since West had called for the ♥K, dummy must play it. East said he was not paying attention and merely grabbed the wrong card.

The Panel Decision: Law 45D says a misplay by dummy must be corrected if attention is drawn to the error before a member of each side has played to the next trick. Law 53A states, "Any lead faced out of turn . . . becomes a correct lead . . . if the player next in rotation plays to the irregular lead." Since at least three players (and maybe all four) had played to trick three, dummy's misplay to trick two could no longer be corrected. Since South accepted declarer's lead from the wrong hand, trick three stood as played. The Panel allowed the table result to stand. Since this appeal was a matter of law, and that had been explained to N/S, the Panel decided that the appeal lacked merit. The Panel did not assess an Appeal Without Merit Penalty Point because it seemed N/S had suffered an injustice.

The Facts: 6♣ made seven, plus 1390 for N/S. The Director was called at the end of the hand. North's 3♠ bid was questioned. South said he had no idea what it was. North had intended it as asking for a spade stopper and did not so volunteer this information before the opening lead. North claimed that she had been told at this tournament by a Director that she could not correct misinformation by partner. East said he would have led the ♠A if he had been properly informed. The Director ruled that there had been misinformation and awarded one trick to the defenders. The contract was changed to 6♣ made six, plus 1370 for N/S.

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling. North said she intended 3♠ as a request for further information about South's hand. South reiterated that he had no idea what the bid was. N/S play together about three times per month but South has only 130 masterpoints. He had never heard of a cuebid asking for a stopper in the opponents' suit. East said he would have led the ♠A had he known North was asking for a spade stopper.

The Panel Decision: One expert consulted said there was no difference in the information if North had volunteered the correct explanation. The cuebid was uninformative. The other expert consulted said that the ♠A was the standout lead as South was known to have a diamond suit that would provide discards for North. The Panel therefore allowed the table result to stand.

After the forcing-notrump, North got to describe his black two-suiter. Mohan, East, led the ♦Q: 4, 8, 3. Since the queen held the trick, Mohan knew that Meyers had started with ♦A-10-8, and declarer with a singleton. He switched to the ♣9, a suit-preference signal in their methods, indicating a high spade. Declarer ducked in dummy, and Meyers won the king.

She dutifully returned a spade. Declarer played the jack and Mohan won his singleton king. He now exited with a low heart.

Declarer rose with the king in order to finesse in spades. Apparently, however, declarer changed his mind, since when he called for a low spade from dummy he went up with the ace. Mohan ruffed and the rest is brutal.

A heart return was ruffed by Meyer, who now played a club, removing the last trump from dummy. Declarer ruffed a diamond in hand and faced a miserable situation. He extracted the last trump from Meyers but was now forced to lead a spade into jaws of Meyers' spade holding. She won and played the ♦A, which declarer ruffed. He was forced to lead yet another spade to her, however, and so finished down four, minus 400.
