Fatal error

Melih Ozdil and Shaya Levitt played together in the Open Swiss Teams, and Ozdil had the opportunity for a double endplay to bring home his game.

Dlr: West ♠ 7 4

West led the ♠A and followed with the ♠K and a third round of the suit, leaving East with the high spade (declarer discarded a low heart from dummy on the third round of spades).

Ozdil was in hand and carefully advanced the ♣10, covered by the queen and ace. The sight of the ♣8 from East was good news to Ozdil.

Ozdil then played a diamond to his queen and West's ace, and West exited with a spade, the natural and instinctive play, but a fatal one. A low club gives up a trick but facilitates the rest of the defense.

East won the ♠9 and had nothing but hearts left to play. Ozdil put up the ♥J and ran the ♣7 and had four club tricks, two diamonds, two hearts and a spade. Nine tricks made.

Want to play Mid-Chart conventions? Read this first!

Players who wish to use Mid-Chart methods (in events that permit them) must check the ACBL Defense Database for rules governing their use.

If you choose to play a method permitted by the Mid-Chart, you are required to do the following:

1. Pre-Alert the opponents about your method prior to the auction on the first board.
2. Have a complete written description of the method available for your opponents.
3. For certain methods, you must provide your opponents with an approved defense from the database. Visit the ACBL web site at www.acbl.org for details.

ACBL players: help players from outside North America who wish to use Mid-Chart methods to be aware of these rules.

Convention card reminder



Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must

be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the ACBL Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6-board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

Slammin' in the BAM, part 2

Lynn Deas found herself in a quandary on this deal from the second final session of the Mixed Board-a-Match Teams. She decided to take a safety play in the bidding, however, and all was well. She was playing with Bill Pettis on the team that won the event by more than four boards. Deas was South.

South's problem – apart from the fact that her hand was not exactly robust for a first-seat opener – was that she and Pettis had not discussed the meaning of 3♠ in this auction. Was it natural and weak? Natural and strong? A splinter?

Deas thought for awhile and came up with what she considered a safety play in the auction: 4♠. If partner had spades, Deas' two low spades would probably be adequate support. If it was a splinter, he could go back to diamonds.

As it happened, Pettis like his hand so much that he simply went straight to slam. The play was trivial and plus 920 was a clear win on the board.

Slammin' in the BAM

This deal from the first final session of the Mixed Board-a-Match teams was a tricky one to play in 6♠ despite clues that were available in the auction at several tables (East doubles a heart cuebid or West overcalls in clubs).

Say you play in 6♠ on a top club lead. Which hand should you set up? The answer is that the best line is to win the ♣A, play the ♦A and ruff a diamond, play a spade to hand, ruff a diamond, spade to hand, ruff a diamond with the last trump, then ruff a club. Now you draw trumps and can take the heart finesse. If it holds, in the three-card ending, you ruff a club and know that either the club honor will fall or the ♥K will appear on the next round.

As the cards lie, you can make 12 tricks. Incidentally, five pairs out of 26 recorded plus 1430 on this deal in one section.

No phones

Bid Box Alerts and Announcements

When using bid boxes, ACBL suggests that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an announcement, use the announcement word - such as "transfer" - and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or announcement has been made.

The cuebid raise

You are South and you hold:

♠K 7 6 ♥5 2 ♦A Q 8 3 ♣8 7 5 4

West	North	East	South
1♥	1♠	Pass	2♠

As beginners, we are taught to raise partner's overall one level with 8-11 points and to jump with 12-14 points, including distribution. Now that you are all grown up, we strongly recommend a change in strategy.

Let's look at what happens when you bid this the old-fashioned way:

East	West
♠ A K 7 6 5	♠ Q J 3 2
♥ 5 4 3	♥ 9 8 6
♦ 10 9 5	♦ A K Q
♣ 8 2	♣ 9 4

West	North	East	South
1♠	Pass	3♠	All Pass

The opponents quickly take the first five tricks – down one. East had a limit raise and jumped. West had a dog's breakfast and the bidding simply got too high.

Now have a look at the recommended alternative: East, holding a limit raise or better, should cuebid the suit the opponents have bid. This will show 10 or more points and support for partner's suit.

With the above East-West hands, here is how the bidding would go:

West	North	East	South
1♠	Pass	2♣	1♣
2♠	All Pass		Pass

West's 2♠ shows a minimum hand. East will pass at his next opportunity and the bidding will stay happily at the two level.

From now on, with 6-9 points, raise partner's overall one level only. With 10 or more points (called heretofore a limit raise) cuebid the opponents' suit if you have adequate trump support *i.e.* at least three low ones. From now on, this will show a limit raise or better. With the East hand above, you will bid 2♣. This way, if your partner (who overcalled 1♠) has a lousy hand, he may now bid simply 2♠ and you will pass. In the past, if you had responded 3♠ with 12-14 points, you may have found yourselves too high if the overcaller only had 8 points.

With junk (very weak hand) and favorable or equal vulnerability, you have one extra bid at your disposal now. Jump raise your partner's overall to the three level. This is strictly preemptive showing a crummy hand and four-card or longer support.

West	North	East	South

Your hand as South might look something like:

♠8 6 ♥A 8 7 6 ♦7 6 5 4 3 ♣9 2.

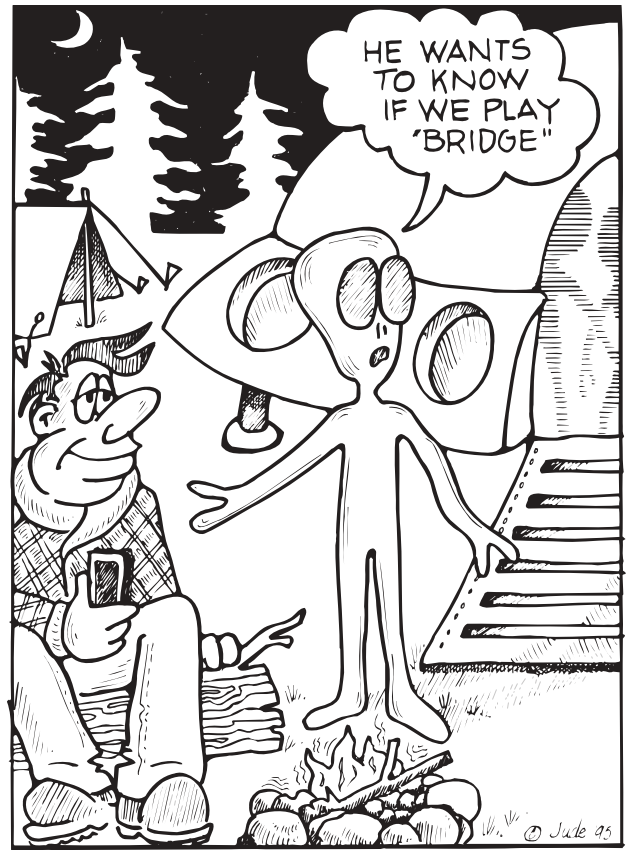
Responding to partner's opening bid when right-hand opponent has overcalled

A similar concept applies in the following situation:

South holds:
 ♠K Q 7 6 ♥5 3 ♦A K J ♣J 8 7 5

West	North	East	South
	1♠	2♥	3♥

If you as South had bid 3♠, this would now be preemptive (see above response to partner's overcall as it is similar in concept) so the only way for you to show a limit raise or better would be to cuebid the opponents' suit.

If North has a minimum opening bid, he will now bid 3♠ and with the above hand, you will raise to 4♠.

If, however, your hand was
 ♠K Q 7 6 ♥5 3 ♦A J 6 ♣J 8 7 5,
 you would pass if partner bid 3♠.

Your cuebid promised only a limit raise, and when that's all you have, you must cooperate when partner declines to bid game.

Thinking bridge

Opening lead: ♥J.

Bidding commentary: North has a 17-point balanced hand with a good five-card suit facing a strong 1NT opener. If this isn't enough for slam, what is? The one who knows goes. Certainly North is the one who knows.

Lead commentary: If you are lucky enough to have an honor sequence to lead against a slam contract, don't look a gift horse in the mouth – lead it! A spade lead is from outer space.

Play commentary: For declarer, this is the basic formula for notrump play:

(1) Count your sure tricks outside of the suit you plan to establish (clubs). You have one spade, three hearts, and four diamond tricks for a grand total of eight. This total tells you how many club tricks you need (four).

(2) What is the best play for four tricks? If clubs break 3-2, there is no problem, so no need to concern yourself with irrelevancies. Concern yourself with a relevancy, a 4-1 club division.

The best play for four club tricks is to cash one high club and then lead low to the jack. This play produces four tricks no matter which opponent has Q-10-x-x. (Play it out with the suit face up on a table if you are having trouble seeing it). Had the contract been 7NT, five club tricks would be needed and the best play for five tricks is to cash the A-K and hope the queen drops.

Profits from doubles

Danny Miles of Toronto and Daniel Korbel of Waterloo ON came in fifth overall in the Wernher Open Pairs thanks in part to a couple of deals involving doubled contracts.

The first is from the first qualifying session and was reported by Roger Lord of St. Louis MO.

Miles' double was card showing, and Korbel judged well to leave it in. Lord, declarer, was impressed with Miles' defense. Miles started with the ♦A, switching to the ♠A at trick two, then continuing with a low heart. Korbel won the ♥A, following with the ♠K and another spade. Lord was able to take a discard on the ♣A, but with no trumps in dummy he ended up losing seven tricks – one diamond, two spades and four hearts – and was three down for minus 500. That worked out to 23 out of 25 matchpoints for the Canadians.

In the second qualifying session, Miles was on the receiving end of a penalty double and he had to play skillfully to take advantage of a slip by the defenders to emerge with a good score (hands rotated).

Dbl All Pass

East's pushy 4♠ opener goaded Miles into his own aggressive bid. West knew what to do with that bid but both defenders erred in the play, and Miles took full advantage.

West started with the ♦A, switching to a spade at trick two, obviously hoping for a ruff. Miles played low from dummy and took the ♠7 with the ace. It was looking grim for him – down three seems inevitable – but he soldiered on, playing a low heart from hand.

West played the ace, not a fatal error in itself, but as play developed West had reason to regret the decision.

After winning the ♥A, West played the ♦K, everyone following, then the ♦Q. East could have assured three down and plus 800 for his side had he ruffed the ♦Q, but he discarded. The reason East needed to ruff is because Miles, instead of ruffing, discarded the ♥J. Had East ruffed the ♦Q, Miles would have had to overruff to keep East from being in to cash a good spade.

When Miles discarded the ♥J on the ♦Q, West continued with the ♦10. Miles ruffed, played a club to dummy's 7 and called for the ♥Q. East covered, Miles ruffed, then reentered dummy with the jack to play the good ♥10 to discard his losing spade, allowing him to get out for minus 500, a great score considering that East-West are cold for at least 10 tricks in 4♠, 11 if declarer guesses right in trumps.

Making overtricks

On this layout (rotated) from the Mixed Board-a-Match second final session, 6♠ is quite reasonable. In many matches, of course, a win on this board is going to hinge on how many overtricks are made in 4♠.

If West leads a top heart honor, declarer wraps up 12 tricks and thinks no more about it. But how should you play on a diamond lead?

The right play, I believe, is to cash the ♠A in case an honor drops from West. (Then you might look at playing for restricted choice in trumps.) When both defenders follow low, play a club to the ace, ruff a club, cash the ♠K, ruff a diamond and now lead the ♣J from dummy.

Should you run it or finesse? It's clear to run it: when West played low on the first round of clubs, he can't have K-Q-x.

Plus 510 was the result achieved by only four of 26 pairs in the BAM final.

East won the king and cashed the ♣A K, but what could he do now? If he returned his trump, declarer would win and dummy would be high. So he played a club for the ruff-sluff. Hirschman ruffed in dummy, pitching a spade from hand, and played the ♦10. Whether East ruffed or not, declarer had the rest for a 12-IMP pickup when 4♥ went down at the other table.

The Facts: East-West had agreed to play NAMYATS (four of a major is a weaker hand with a long suit and four of the respective minor is a stronger hand) and had written it on their card. East on this hand decided to make a strategic

underbid, knowing that NAMYATS was on the card and that West was a passed hand and probably did not hold the values for slam exploration. The 4♠ bid was Alerted and explained according to the partnership's agreement.

The Ruling: It was judged that when East became aware that her partner thought she held a weak hand (from the UI of the Alert and explanation), this now demonstrably suggested a 6♠ call. It was judged that double was a logical alternative (LA), but that pass was not a LA. Therefore, the table result was adjusted to 6♥, doubled, down two, minus 500 North-South in accordance with Laws 16A and 12C2.

The Appeal: East-West, the only players to attend the hearing, contended that their bid was properly Alerted and explained. The partnership (which played roughly once a month) had a detailed and well-documented system file. Since East was willing to give up on slam possibilities facing a passed hand, she strategically deviated from the agreement. East claimed that there was no infraction. She was merely using her own bidding judgment (by which she indicated that she thought that 6♥ might make). Her partner's lead-directing call was facing her length, and the ♦K was clearly waste paper. Had the ♣A been with South (which was where the auction implied it would be) a club lead would be necessary to beat the slam.

The Decision: The committee questioned East about her exploitation of NAMYATS, asking such questions as whether her hand would be a NAMYATS 4♠ bid in first or second seat. She said that it would not be; it would be a 4♦ bid. The committee determined that by East's reasoning, her bid was an intentional deviation from the convention and that she would also have bid 4♠ in third seat with much weaker (defensive) hands. Since a player is allowed to deviate from partnership agreements intentionally (so long as the player's partner is as much in the dark about it as the opponents), the committee concluded that no infraction occurred. Therefore, the committee restored the table result 6♠ doubled making seven, East-West plus 1310.

director popular with the caddies, announced her retirement from NABCs. The caddies all wore shirts with slogans aimed at getting Patricelli to change her mind. The plan didn't work, but the caddies stayed on the road, and they've been a peripatetic trio since, traveling in Dupey's mini-van. Ahren and Dupey are brothers from Minnesota, Janicki is from Toronto.

They have had a few adventures along the way. Earlier this year, they traveled to Fort Lauderdale FL just to kick back and relax during the regional in that city. Their plans to vacation were short-circuited, however, when the caddies hired to work the tournament misunderstood when they were told they were through for the afternoon and left for good. The Ames brothers and Janicki worked the whole regional by themselves.

Says Ahren: "It was easy."

Since then, Jayne Thomas, longtime

tournament coordinator in Florida, has put them down to work all her regionals.

Ahren, 27, said the driving isn't bad – they really like the Flying J truck stops – but the price of gasoline lately has been tough on their bottom line.

The long trips are fun, says Ahren, who adds that the trio plans a week off after the Chicago NABC before they head for Omaha NE for a regional. When that's over they will drive to Maryland for the Hunt Valley Regional.

"It's been nice," says Ahren, although he admits he gets tired at long tournaments "and my feet are killing me."

Still, he says, "I like the people and I like the work."

The secret to being a good caddy, he says, "is to listen to the tournament directors about what they need, try to anticipate what they need – and be polite." When it comes to tournaments, Ahren says, "good caddies make all the difference."

Jackie Matthews, the tournament director in charge of caddies at NABCs, has nothing but praise for all her caddies in Chicago but especially for Ahren. "He has been my right-hand man for year," she says. "He is really important to the operation. He comes in every morning at 8:30

All in the timing

On this deal from the Spingold Knockout Teams semifinal match between the Nickell and Jacobs teams, declarer did not count his tricks and then determine the best order in which to time his plays.

Had West chosen to lead a heart honor, South would have had no legitimate chance to make his contract, but West started with the ♥4, an attitude lead by agreement.

Now, with proper timing, the contract is unbeatable. After winning the ♥10 in dummy, declarer finessed in clubs. If it had won, declarer would have been able to develop nine tricks with little difficulty. If the missing honors – ♣K, ♦Q and ♠Q – are all offside and hearts are 5-3 declarer cannot make the contract if he tries the club finesse first.

Is there a play that guarantees the contract after the lead of a low heart? Yes. Declarer has only to finesse in diamonds at trick two. If the ♦J holds, declarer has two spades, two hearts, four diamonds and a club for nine tricks. If the diamond finesse loses and West continues with a high heart, declarer ducks another round, winning the third round of hearts, and takes the spade finesse.

If the spade finesse loses and hearts were 4-4 or 5-3 with West holding the length, declarer still has nine tricks via three spades, two hearts, three diamonds and one club before the defenders can take five tricks.

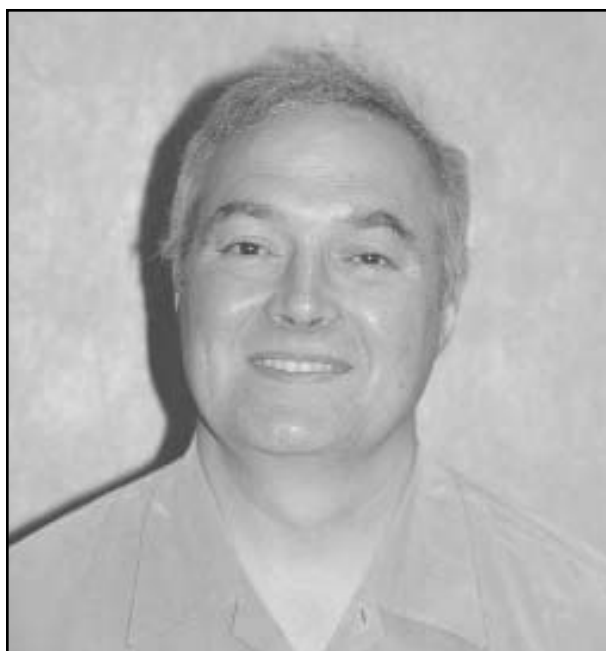
Spend a moment at trick one to count your tricks so that you can establish the order in which you are going to select your options. Even experts go awry at times.

Active ethics

Rae Dethlefsen of Reston VA was cited for actively ethical play by an opponent in Saturday's Strati-Flighted A/X Pairs.

Dethlefsen was declarer on a particular deal and was busily conducting a crossruff. The defenders conceded with a few tricks left to play, but Dethlefsen noted that the defense was entitled to a trick at the end.

While Dethlefsen's actions are to be commended, they were also legally required. Players are reminded that they may not claim tricks that they cannot legally win, even if the opponents concede them.

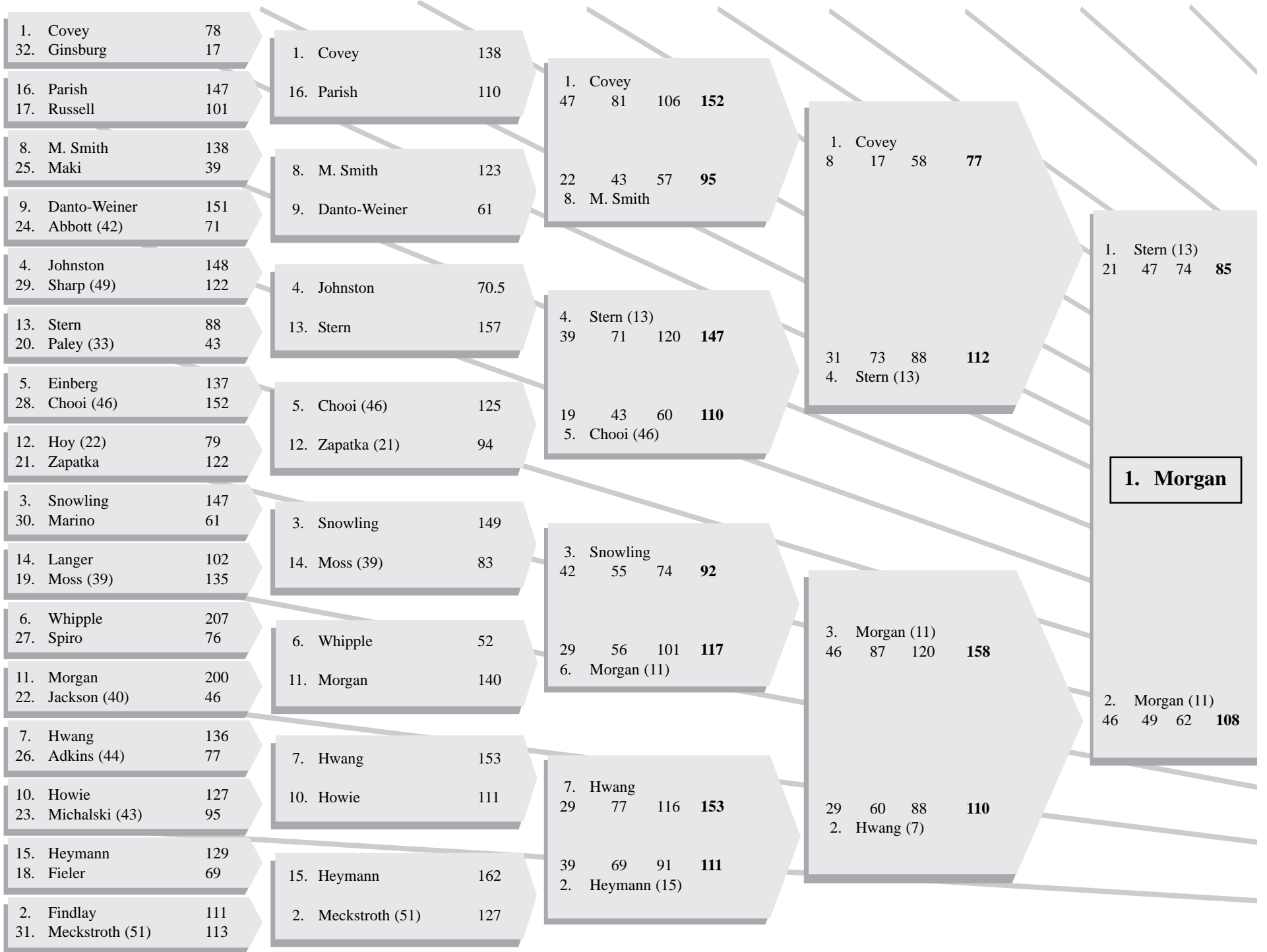

You, as dealer, are vulnerable, the opponents are not and you are playing IMPs. If you pass, the opponents will bid and make a game. If you open the bidding, the opponents will take no bids. What is your choice?

If you are getting the picture that opening the bidding will result in lots of undertricks for your side, you're on track to the right decision.

Brian Platnick of Evanston IL held the above hand (spots approximate) in the Open Swiss Teams. He passed and heard his left-hand opponent open 2NT. RHO bid 4♦, transferring to hearts, and they played it at 4♥. The game could not be defeated, so Platnick scored up minus 420.

At the other table, South opened 1♥, followed by a takeout double on his left – and three passes (East at the other table was Platnick's wife, Bryna Kra). For those who think a double is a bid, be reminded that it is a call, not a bid. All bids are calls but not all calls are bids.

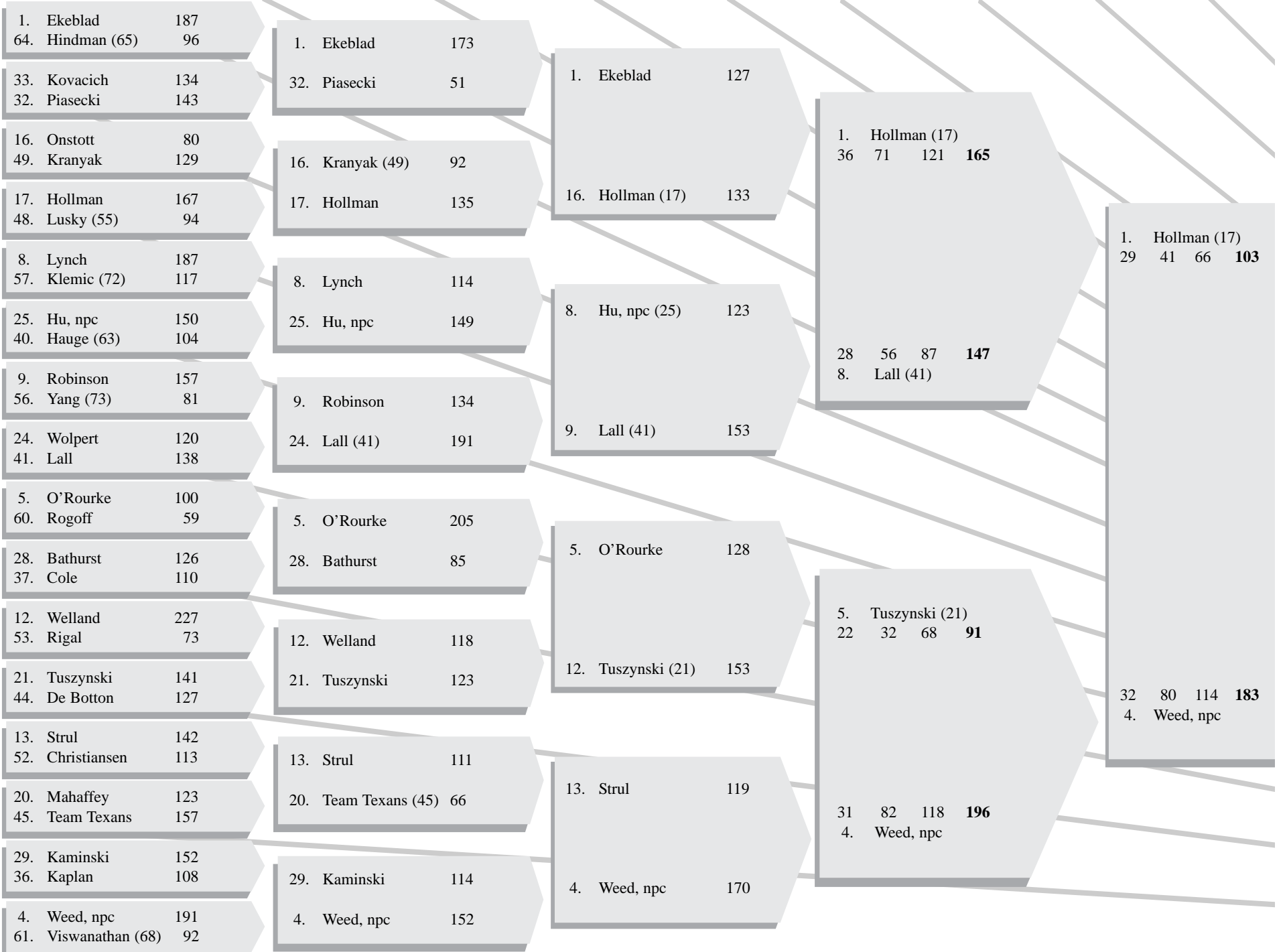

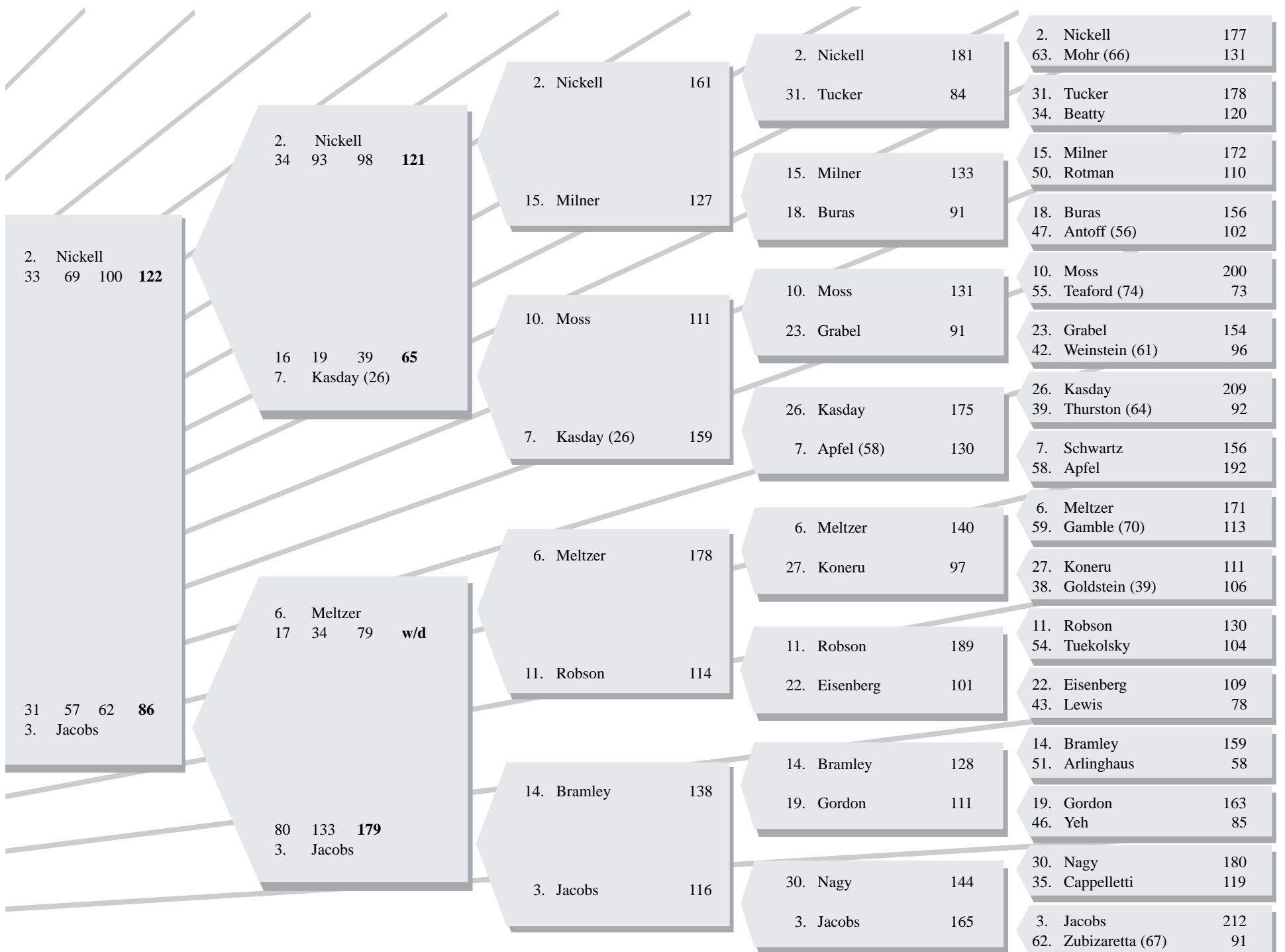
