ACBL Looks toward online bridge

At their meetings here in Cincinnati, the ACBL Board of Directors authorized ACBL management to investigate the possibility of the ACBL offering an online bridge game. The Board has authorized management to conclude an agreement if one can be negotiated within established ACBL financial guidelines.

Why is the ACBL looking towards direct participation in online bridge? ACBL already sanctions two other online bridge clubs, OKbridge and Microsoft's Internet Gaming Zone. So why take this next step? Actually there are several reasons:

- Online bridge is bringing lots of people into bridge. The ACBL wants to enjoy a direct relationship with new players that can attract them to sanctioned face-to-face games and other products and services.
- The ACBL is more motivated than current providers to provide information about clubs near players' homes, upcoming tournaments in their

Jim Murphy clears 10,000-point hurdle

When Jim Murphy of Chesapeake VA went to the regional at Hilton Head a couple of weeks ago, he needed 23 points to go over 10,000 masterpoints. He accomplished this with ease – as a matter of fact, he would up with 93 points for the tournament. He actually went over the top in the very first event – he finished third in the Knock-out Teams with David Adams, Colby Vernay and Barry Schaefer as teammates.

Adams has been his most frequent partner over the years, but he also has had good partnerships with Ben Pope, Brian Schoenfeld and Ed Lewis.

Cappelletti, Hicks plunder Open Pairs I for huge win

After posting a 72% game in the first qualifying session, followed by a 55.5% effort, Mike Cappelletti and Larry Hicks were surprised to find themselves in second place going into the second day of Open Pairs I.

Taking no chances in the final, they put together a series of "smokin' results," as Cappelletti put it, to run away with the event. They followed a 68% game in the first final session with 61% in the second final. Their margin of victory over the runners-up – Doug Simson and Walter Johnson – was 213.7 matchpoints, nearly three boards.

Their game was so dominating they would have won even without their huge carryover from the first day.

Cappelletti, who lives in Red Bank TN (Chattanooga), and Hicks, of Coquitlam BC (Vancouver),

Sort them into suits!

Yesterday a goodly number of players new to bridge tried their newfound skills in the 0-5 game. Since duplicated hands were being used, the players were asked to sort the cards into suits. When they asked what that meant, the directors explained about spades, hearts, diamonds and clubs. After the sorting, the director noticed that all the cards at one table were in one pile.

"Did you sort the cards?" the director asked.

"Yes, we did, and we made sure there were 13 spades, 13 hearts, 13 diamonds and 13 clubs. They were all there, so we put them all together and shuffled them."

Starting times

The default starting times for NABC events for NABC events will be 1 p.m. and 7:30 p.m., effective in the summer of 2001. The host organization can request different starting times, but the request must be at least 12 months in advance of the tournament. The ACBL will take such requests under consideration, but the final decision will rest with the ACBL.

After the ♥10 lead and RHO's 9 at the first trick, Jon Greenspan, South, of New York City was unhappy because he thought he might have given the opponents a road map by starting with 1♦ instead of jumping directly to 3NT over the opening bid. Desperate for winners, he won the ♥Q since ducking would be helpful only if RHO's original hearts were five to the ace-king.

Looking a bit more deeply, Greenspan decided that West might have led a spade if he had four or more of them, so that meant East had at least five. Furthermore, if the opening lead was from 10-third, K-10-x or A-10-x, then West had to have some minor suit length. Therefore finessing the ♦J and playing for diamonds to be 3-3 probably would fail.

So Greenspan crossed to the ♠A and led the ♠8, losing to West's jack. The defenders cashed three heart tricks, but South won the spade switch and played the ♣Q, covered by the king and simultaneously pinning the 10. A neat intrafinesse situation that led to 3NT, bid and made!

Overcoming bad splits

Jerry Goldfein found a nice way to bring home the bacon in his delicate slam.

6♦ looks like a fine spot, but the 4-0 trumps and the 8-1 club split are potentially very awkward to overcome.

On the lead of the ♠K, Goldfein won and played the ♦K. If trumps weren't 4-0, he could ruff a club with the ♦Q in comfort. When South won the trump ace and returned a diamond, Terry resisted the temptation to try to ruff a club in dummy. Instead he drew all the trumps and crossed to the ♠Q to advance the ♥J. South covered and Goldfein ruffed. Then he went back to the table with the ♠K and played the ♥A and ♥10. When the 9 fell, Goldfein could use the ♠8 as a late entry to cash dummy's ♥8 for the 12th trick.

Fearful symmetry

Brian Platnick declarer a couple of deals with remarkably symmetric elements. On each occasion, dummy's ♥9 represented a key winner in the ending of a contract of 2♠.

West led a low club to East's ace. East shifted to the ♦K and another diamond. Platnick made the key play of discarding a club at trick three. He ruffed the diamond continuation and played a spade to dummy's ace, followed by a spade to East's king. A second round of clubs followed. Platnick won the ♣K, drew the last trump and played the ♥A, followed by the ♥Q. When the ♥10 appeared, East took his heart the ♥K. This was the ending:

A heart exit would have served no purpose, so East played his ♣J. Platnick ruffed and led a heart to the 9 to score the good ♣9 at trick 13.

On board 29, Platnick was again declarer in 2♠ after a complex auction.

Platnick (South) won the opening ♣Q lead in dummy and played two more rounds of the suit. West won the third round as East discarded an encouraging diamond. Two rounds of diamonds followed. Platnick ruffed and slipped the ♥10 by West, losing to East's ♥Q.

Platnick ruffed the diamond continuation, and

They were surprised and happy to get the trophies – all four plan to display them proudly when they return home. Back home they play regularly together. "We play two or three times a week, and we love it," said Dannemiller. "But the real fun is at the Nationals."

Platnick played the ♠K and a spade to the ace, followed by a heart to the jack. West ruffed and led a diamond, ruffed and overruffed, but at trick 13, East had to lead a heart, allowing dummy to take the last trick. The ♥9 came to the rescue again.

It's magic!

Anticipating the ending

Marvin French could see what was coming on this deal from the second qualifying round of Open Pairs I. And he did something about it that paid big dividends.

French, South, led a spade to partner's (Alice Leicht's) ace, and declarer won the spade continuation with the king. When the six-card diamond suit came down in dummy, French knew he was in dire straits – after being forced to discard on the diamonds he was going to be endplayed. It appeared there was no way he could avoid being forced to lead away from his ♠K.

He saw this immediately, so he took remedial action – his first two discards on the diamonds were the ♠8 and the ♠10. In the end position he was down to the top two spades, the ♥A-J (he had pitched the queen) and the lone ♣K. But declarer didn't know that. Declarer thought French had two spades, the ♥A and the doubleton ♣K. So he led a heart from dummy. Imagine his dismay when French won with the jack, cashed his three major suit winners and set the contract.

"I haven't made that play for 35 years," French said. I did it in New Orleans in 1965, and it worked then, too."

Optimism pays

It is no good resting on your laurels in a pair game. Just because you seem to have received a favorable lead is no reason for declarer not to go for the maximum. On the following deal, the field reached 3NT by West, winning the queen after a diamond lead by North.

Dlr: South ♠ 8 2
Vul: Both ♥ J 7 3
♦ K 9 8 5 3 2
♣ 6 3

After the diamond lead, 10 tricks are easy. What about the 11th? Well, since the defenders can surely build a diamond winner, you are way behind in the race to try for a heart trick. With that in mind, all you need is a 6-2 diamond split with the two top hearts outside. Not much to ask, right?

Just cash out the minor-suit winners, then take all the spades. In the three-card ending, lead a heart from dummy. South must concede your 11th winner. The difference between 630 and 660 was half a board.

play only about once a year. They met in 1988 when Hicks was touring North America playing bridge, and they played together on the North American squad that competed in the World Junior Bridge Championships in Nottingham, England, in 1989.

Hicks, with a wife, two children and a job at a courier company, doesn't have time for a lot of bridge these days, but he and Dan Jacobs had qualified to play in the North American Pairs, Flight A, so Hicks was in Cincinnati. The two didn't make it past the first day, and when Jacobs made another date to play in Open Pairs I, Hicks was available.

As it happened, so was Cappelletti, now a full-time professional player. "I didn't even know Larry was going to be here," Cappelletti said.

As Cappelletti and Hicks were accepting congratulations for their win, Jacobs walked by and joined the well wishers. Said Cappelletti to Jacobs: "Thanks for letting him loose."

The win was the first North American title for Hicks, the second for Cappelletti. He and fiancée Shannon Lipscomb won the Mixed Pairs last year at the Spring NABC in Vancouver.

Right after the game, Cappelletti got on the telephone to Red Bank to give future mother-in-law Jere Raymond the good news. Mindful of the ultra slim margin by which her daughter and Cappelletti won the Mixed Pairs last year, Raymond said: "Three boards? Is that better than point-oh-six?"

Cappelletti's answer: "Oh, yes!"

He played professionally back in the Seventies, but he didn't enjoy it. He was working full-time as a computer program analyst at the time. He switched over to teaching, and he found this much more to his liking. When he retired, he found that he enjoyed playing pro with some of the students to whom he had given lessons. "It's a good feeling when you see one of your students becoming better and better with your help," he said.

With a little help from North, Murphy collected 11 tricks on this hand from the first session of Open Pairs I yesterday,

The United States Playing Card Company is the world's largest manufacturer and distributor of playing cards. The company's history is firmly rooted in Cincinnati, Ohio; however its products are recognized globally for their high quality and consistency. Bee®, Bicycle® and Aviator® are synonymous with playing cards.

Congress®, one of the playing cards from the original 1881 product line, is still considered the card of choice by sophisticated bridge players. Likewise, the world-renowned Bicycle® playing card has been in continuous production since 1885. In 1881, the first deck of cards was printed. In 1891, the company became The United States Printing Company. By 1894, the production of playing cards had grown so sizable that it was separated from the printing company and given its own identity-The United States Playing Card Company.

In the 1920s, The United States Playing Card Company operated an on-site radio station, WSAI. Its original intent was to teach bridge lessons and make public announcements. However, programming was subsequently expanded to include news and music. WSAI was eventually sold in the 1930s to the Crosley Radio Corporation and still remains a popular radio station in the Cincinnati Area.

Since 1969, The United States Playing Card Company itself has undergone several changes in ownership. In 1994, a USPC management team, along with several local investors, purchased the company and returned its ownership to the Cincinnati area.

The company has expanded its line dramatically over the years. The product line now includes playing cards for all members of the family and includes many popular licenses in decks and "giftable" tins, such as Coca-Cola®, Harley-Davidson®, Chevrolet®, NASCAR®, WCW® (Wrestling), Budweiser®, Pokemon®, Warner Bros. characters such as Tweety®, Bugs Bunny®, Taz®, Looney Tunes®, Scooby-Doo®, new Powerpuff Girls® and many more including children's games under the Bicycle Kids® name.

Around the world and for many centuries, playing cards have provided an enjoyable pastime. Today this tradition takes on new significance. As an alternative to passive and individual absorption in computer games and television, playing cards encourage mental exercise and social interaction between individual groups and especially providing quality family time together.

St. Patrick's Day parade

Smoking policy

New Life Master

areas, and teachers who can help improve their games.

- Last but not least is the possibility of creating additional revenue, which may keep dues and other fees low.

The ACBL does not have the programming expertise or resources to develop a game of its own. There are already several companies with excellent online bridge games, so the ACBL hopes to establish a business relationship with one of these companies and have that company operate the game. Discussions have begun with leading online bridge services.

If an arrangement can be made with a forward-looking company with a "quality" product, the ACBL, their online bridge games, will evaluate offering both structured games (set start time, playing a set number of boards against many opponents, offering masterpoints, etc.) and unstructured games (play any number of boards against opponents of your choice).
