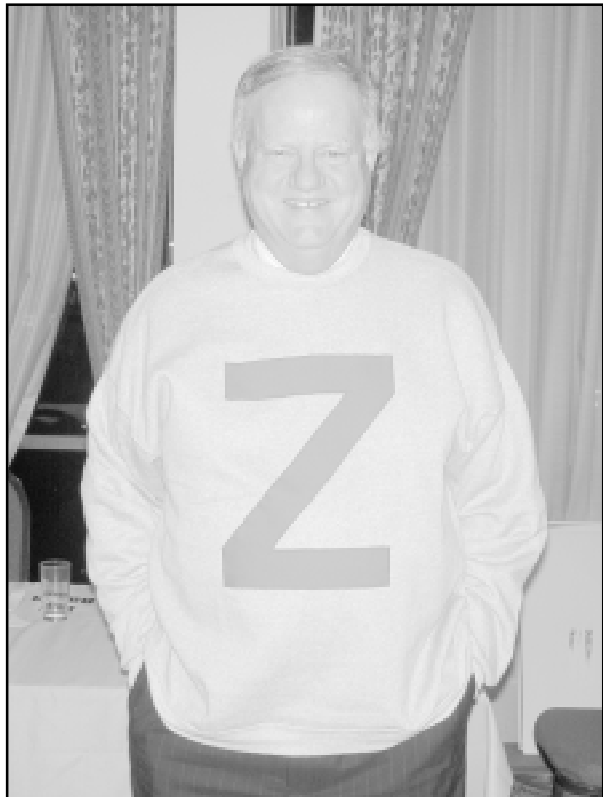

John Ashton — first victim of the "Z"

Z is the Scarlet Letter for directors

Remember Hester Prynne? She was the woman in Colonial times who had to wear the Scarlet Letter. Hers was an A. Tournament Director JOHN ASHTON felt that directors who make a serious mistake also should be forced to wear a Scarlet Letter. He chose "Z". Why? That's a story in itself.

Last year at the Spring NABC in Kansas City, the unthinkable happened – teams playing in a key Vanderbilt match discovered that both pairs of each team had played all the boards in the same direction! There's no solution other than to have the teams play all over again, even if it means playing until 4 or 5 o'clock in the morning.

GARY ZEIGER didn't put the boards out, but somehow he was assigned the role of culprit, and he's been taking a monumental teasing ever since. Of course he's in good company – some of the all-time great directors like Maury Braunstein and Phil Merry have been guilty of the same faux pas.

So that's why Ashton chose Z, and he saw to the production of the Z shirt. It's a gray shirt with a huge red Z emblazoned on the front. The shirt was ready for

the first culprit.

Guess who the first culprit was? None other than JOHN ASHTON! He failed to assign staff for a Compact Knockout event. When he donned the shirt his face was as red as the Z on his shirt.

That made us wonder – what kinds of embarrassing and humorous situations have beset tournament directions over the years? Here's what we learned when we talked to a few TDs.

DY-REK-TOR!! When DIANNE BARTON-PAINE heard that call when she began directing as a tiny 18-year-old back in 1961, she knew what she was going to hear even before she got to the table: "I don't want a caddy. Get me a director."

Clearly Dianne knows what is important. She fell at home, opening a gash in her head. She drove to the Emergency Room – but she stopped at the bridge club on the way to tell them she'd be right back. It took a while for the hospital staff to stop the bleeding, but once the blood flow was under control, Dianne went straight back to the club and

Sanborn-Berkowitz lead Mixed Pairs

Kerri Sanborn and David Berkowitz held a lead of more than a board after two qualifying sessions of the national Mixed Pairs. Sanborn, of Stony Point NY, and Berkowitz, of Old Tappan NJ, scored 2126.38 matchpoints on a 64 top. That was nearly 74 matchpoints more than Lee Rautenberg, Boca Raton FL, and Janice Seamon-Molson, Hollywood FL.

In third place were Paul and Linda Lewis of Vashon WA, followed by Daniel Suty of Houston and Tina McKim of Garland TX. In fifth place were Linda Webb, Fargo ND, and Richard Ekstrum, Crystal MN.

What a ball she's having!

Gloria Pollard had played "social" bridge for years before she tested the duplicate waters earlier this year. Friends had encouraged her to try duplicate, but the resident of The Woodlands (north of Houston) didn't consider it until she found herself between jobs a couple of months ago.

As of the afternoon session Tuesday, Pollard was the leading masterpoint winner in the Intermediate/Newcomer games at the Spring NABC – and she was having a blast.

Pollard, a managing director in financial services, joined the ACBL in January after a trip to the Conroe Bridge Studio. She played in her first tournament in Houston in January, and she came in first in the first game she played. "That was really exciting," she said.

At the Houston NABC, Pollard has played with her husband, Ray, experiencing his first tournament, and Billy Sampson, who introduced her to duplicate.

"She is the one who dragged me to the studio and got me started," Pollard said.

Said Sampson: "I scared her to death telling her all about the rules and regulations."

Pollard is anything but scared now, having played eight sessions at the NABC and planning on more. "I'll be coming back," she said. "It's fun. This is great!"

No longer intimidated

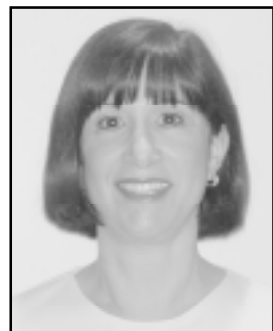
She admits to feeling a bit intimidated. After all, it was her first duplicate game ever. And it was the Houston North American Championships!

Susan Kestenbaum of Huntingdon Valley PA had just joined ACBL and had zero masterpoints. She had played a few sessions online with Jim Flint of Zillah WA, and she agreed to play as his partner in Houston. In four events, she racked up more than eleven red points.

They played in a stratified pairs game Saturday night and came in second in the 0-750 section. The next day, they teamed up with Brian Duran and Steven McDevitt from Massachusetts in the stratified two-session Swiss teams and placed second in the D stratum. Then Monday night, she and Flint placed first overall in the 200-300 pairs with a 62 percent game.

Yesterday she played with Hal Smith of Hastings NE in the 61 Stratified Open Pairs. They finished third in Strat C.

Kestenbaum no longer feels intimidated and looks forward to playing more duplicate. And then of course there's the NABC in Philadelphia in the spring of 2003.

Out of the mouths of babes

Boye Brogeland of Norway was faced with an interesting problem on this deal from a Vanderbilt match.

West started with two top spades, and Boye ditched a club on the second. A third spade went to East's queen as Boye sluffed his other club. Back came a trump, and Boye cashed four rounds. West's discards were quite interesting – a low club followed by the ♣K! It

appeared that West had to protect the diamonds. Accordingly Boye led a diamond to the 10 and ruffed a spade. Next came a diamond to the king followed a club to West's ace. West had to lead away from his diamond queen and Boye had his contract.

P.O. Sundelin of Sweden, who was kibitzing, told Boye he would have played differently. He would have finessed the ♦10 and immediately led a club. West would have to win. Declarer could control any return and cross to dummy with the ♦K where all the clubs would be good.

Gavin Wolpert, the star Junior player from Canada, got into the discussion at this point. He would have made the contract the easy way, he said. After winning the ♥A, he would have finessed the ♦10 and cashed the ♦K. Then we would have drawn the rest of the trumps, cashed the ♦A and given up a diamond. Nothing to it!

You win the king and immediately play a heart to the ace and ruff a heart. You enter dummy with a trump, both following, and lead a third heart, upon which East discards a spade. Now what? Thanks to Eddie Kantar for the problem.

Kantar's answer: Win the diamond lead in dummy and start on hearts. You must try to avoid a diamond loser before the opponents build up a trick in that suit.

Assuming someone wins the ♥A and returns a diamond, you win and discard a diamond from dummy on your long heart. Now lead a club before you ruff a diamond, just in case someone has 4-5-2-2 distribution and discards a club on the diamond ruff, later getting a club ruff.

Take half credit if you ruffed a diamond before leading a club. The easy part was supposed to be leading hearts immediately.

Notice to players

As of the 2002 Summer NABC in Washington DC, the free distribution of printouts of defenses to Mid-Chart and Super-Chart methods will cease.

The policy, to be strictly enforced, will require that pairs playing certain Mid-Chart and Super-Chart methods have the defenses with them at the table. Any pair without the defenses will not be allowed to play methods for which the defenses are required, such as the Multi 2♦.

After this NABC, you may print out the defenses from the ACBL web site – www.acbl.org – or purchase a copy from the ACBL Product store for a nominal fee. The printouts will not be as readily available as they are at this tournament.

Double Double Renounce

“Why you don’t play more diamonds?” Sam Lev might have demanded of me if I failed to find the winning defense against a spade contract on today’s diagrammed deal. “You must give double renounce.”

Lev’s mangled grammar and curious European phrasing do nothing to detract from the quality of his analysis. What Lev calls a “double renounce” is known in America as a “ruff-sluff.” A ruff-and-sluff, also known as a ruff-and-discard, occurs when the defense leads a suit that both declarer and dummy are void in. A ruff-sluff is usually advantageous to the declarer, and is therefore avoided by the defense at all costs. Consider the following four-card ending:

South, declarer in a spade contract, holds the lead in dummy in the four-card ending. Rather than take a losing diamond finesse, declarer exits with the ♥Q. West takes South’s king with the ace and must either lead a diamond from the king or give declarer a ruff-sluff. If West exits with a heart declarer discards a diamond from one hand and ruffs in the other.

In that classic example, the ruff-sluff allows declarer an additional trick. In certain rare cases, the ruff-sluff is the best defense. Consider this position:

In this position, declarer exits with a club and whichever opponent wins the trick must give either a ruff-and-discard or open up the diamond suit. In this unusual position, the ruff-and-discard (double renounce) is the only winning defense, for a single diamond discard from either hand still leaves declarer with a third-round diamond loser. By contrast, if the defense plays diamonds, declarer can avoid a diamond loser altogether.

Back to the diagrammed deal, defended in spectacular fashion by Pollyanna Pearce. Polly led a diamond, won by East’s ace. East was Brian Glubok, your reporter on this deal and the proud parent, with Polly, of a four-year-old son, Brian Pearce Glubok, who has visited the tournament and will probably be a bridge player himself within a few years.

East continued diamonds, hoping partner might be able to ruff. Declarer won the diamond king, all following, and played a heart toward dummy’s singleton queen. Polly rose smartly with the ♥A and made the key play: the ♦J, offering declarer a ruff-and-discard.

With no side-suit losers to discard, declarer ruffed in dummy and led the jack of trumps. East rose with the ace on the first round, leaving the following position:

East played a fourth round of diamonds, offering declarer a second ruff sluff. This was the only defense to hold declarer to nine tricks. If East ducked, declarer would rise with the king and crash the ace and queen together.

Truly a rare defense: not one, but two ruff-sluffs, a double double renounce.

It’s not often a perfect textbook hand is dealt at the table. This one from my first-round Vanderbilt match had everything — bidding, play and defense. I was playing with District 16 Director Dan Morse.

East-West might have competed to 4♦, which they make by leading a spade toward the jack. As it turns out, they did well to defend.

West led the ♥2, showing an odd number. When East won and shifted to the ♦Q the heart suit was almost certain to lie as it did. I ruffed and started trumps from the top. East won the first trump to continue diamonds and I ruffed to draw the remaining trump. My plan was to hook against the ♠K-J of spades, ruffing the ♦A to return to my hand. I pitched two spades from the dummy and then found dummy was squeezed on the last trump — I had to discard a heart to retain my chance of making the contract. When the ♠10 lost to the jack East was able to return the ♥J and collect 200.

Do you see my mistake? The finesse against the ♠J was never necessary — I can squeeze West instead. I pitch a heart on East’s second diamond return (a spade would also work), return to my hand with a diamond ruff, and lead all my trumps. This will be the position as I lead the last trump

If West discards a spade I pitch a heart and lead a spade to the queen to take three spade tricks. If West discards a heart I throw a spade and duck a heart to West.

Did I mention defense? Certainly! If East can foresee this position, a tall order, he can ensure a plus score by returning a spade at trick two.

Two Hearts Canopy

In Monday’s board-a-match teams, the Anglo-Austrian-American combination of Mark Horton, editor of *Bridge Magazine*; Sascha Wernle & Jovi Smederevac, current members of the Austrian Open team, and the famous Rabbi Leonard Helman out of Sante Fe was in awesome form, scoring 20/24, for a winning 83.3% session.

A couple of days before the event they were dining in a restaurant close to the Galleria and spotted a bottle of wine rejoicing in the name of *Two Hearts Canopy*. If you are playing with a couple of Austrians whose system incorporates the Canapé style of bidding where you may have a longer suit than the one you first bid, then you need look no further — it turned out to be a very acceptable bottle — and a portent for the following deal:

East led an unimaginative diamond and declarer won and simply played a low club to the 10 to establish nine tricks for +400.

The auction at the other table took a rather different course:

Although 1♦ might be based on as few as two cards, East had enough support to be able to muddy the waters by bidding 2♥ (*Canapé!*). Although it was easy enough to expose this humorous effort, it led to a spectacular difference in the number of tricks.

East led a spade and declarer took the queen with the ace and ran the ♥J to West’s king. He tried the ♦Q when West switched, and the defenders cleared the suit. When declarer took a second heart finesse the roof fell in and he was down six, -300.

The team intends to take a few bottles of *Two Hearts Canopy* home!

CAREY SNIDER recalls the time that a defender revoked after the defense took the first trick and declarer won the remaining 12. "No penalty," She ruled because the defense didn't win any tricks subsequent to the revoke. Declarer was quite upset, "But I would have played the hand differently if he hadn't revoked," she said.

Back in the days of wet T-short contests, former tournament director JULIE HARDING was urged by her fellow directors to enter one of the contests. "But mine are different sizes," she said. Her friends convinced her to compete anyway -- and she came in first and third.

Phil Wood asked MATT SMITH to have the winner of an event stand to be recognized by his fellow players. "Will Mike Wilson please stand?" he said. Nothing happened. "Mike Wilson, will you please raise your hand?" Still nothing. Matt didn't know that Mike Wilson has only one arm and no legs.

The late PHIL MERRY had several chores to do at the start of the Mixed Teams in Toronto in 1964. Finally he was ready to start posting his tickets. But he couldn't -- they were all pasted together. He laughed good-naturedly and settled down to the task of pulling the tickets apart one by one. Finally he was ready to post his first round. Plus 100, minus 100, plus 100, plus 100, plus 100, minus 100, minus 100 -- every ticket had a score of 100. Not only had one of the other directors, who shall be nameless, stuck his tickets together -- he had even given Phil a false set of tickets.

Back when he was a tournament director, HENRY FRANCIS was having trouble sleeping, so he decided to go for a walk in the wee hours in New York. As he walked along, a Cadillac pulled up and the driver, a beautiful woman, called him over. "Get in," she said. Henry wanted to know what was going on. "I had a fight with my husband and I'm going to show him -- hurry up and get in."

A player was telling a story about how a hand was bid. "He had ace-king fourth in spades and ace-king sixth in clubs and something -- well, his red cards didn't matter. He opens a club and it goes pass-pass-something and he bids a spade. It went two hearts and it went four spades or something. I don't remember the exact auction, but it went round and round and when it . . ." At this point HARRY GOLDWATER broke in to say, "You sound like one of my floor directors."

Another Goldwater story. Charles Goren came to a tournament being run by HARRY GOLDWATER.. He asked Harry where Table One was going to be. "Anywhere you want it," said Harry. "Well, the best place is here in the middle of the room even though it's a strange place for Table One. And can you put a lamp there so I'll be sure to have plenty of light?" "There's nothing in the rules that says Table One has to be in a corner," said Harry. "You sure are nice to me. How come?" asked Goren. Harry had an answer ready -- "If it weren't for you, I'd have to work for a living."

STAN TENCH was severely embarrassed when he called the skip a round too soon and everybody skipped into the boards they had duplicated. Exactly one pair in the whole field noticed.

Just about every director fouls up a board-a-match teams event, and LOWELL ANDREWS is no exception. But he went all other directors one better -- he did it twice in one event. As he made the announcement about restarting the game, he said, "As many of you know, I'm leaving on a bridge cruise right after this tournament. Up until now I had been planning to return."

When is a tie a loss? How about this? CHARLEY MacCRACKEN forgot to pack any ties for his trip to Bermuda, so he borrowed a couple from CHRIS PATRIAS. On the fourth day of the tournament, SUSAN MIGUEL rebuked Chris for wearing such boring ties -- "the only one who wears more boring ties is SOL WEINSTEIN," she said. "You should try wearing great-looking ties like Charley wears."

Old-time directors certainly knew how to keep their working hours to the minimum. At a North American tournament in Pittsburgh many years ago, ED CHERONNET and a new director were assigned to a two-section room. "I think the best way to handle this is for you to post the sheets and I'll take the floor," Cheronnet said to the newcomer, who agreed. After the game got started, Cheronnet said he had an errand to handle -- "Please watch the floor for me." The newcomer agreed. As he was heading out the door, Cheronnet turned back and said, "And don't forget to call the skip after the seventh round."

And what about WALTER WILSON? Many old-timers remember this story. Walter drove in his car to a tournament. Afterwards he went home by train, and when he discovered his car was missing, he called the police and reported a stolen car!

Bobby Nail Stratified Open Pairs

Bobby Nail Bracketed Knockout Team

Bobby Nail of Houston, one of the game's most colorful characters, was a force in bridge for more than four decades.

Nail won four North American championships and had 11 seconds. He represented the United States twice in the Bermuda Bowl, finishing second in 1963. He was a Life Master in World Bridge Federation rankings and an ACBL Grand Life Master with more than 10,000 masterpoints.

Born with a rare bone disease -- osteogenesis imperfecta -- Nail spent much of his youth in hospitals. Most people with his disease, he once said, didn't live much past their twenties.

The diminutive Nail -- he was about five feet tall -- made the most of his time. Stories about his adventures and misadventures abound.

During the pair trials for the 1964 World Bridge Olympiad, Nail and Jim Jacoby were playing against upstarts Bob Hamman and Don Krauss -- the eventual winners -- and were performing particularly poorly.

At one point in the match, Nail took Jacoby away from the table for a talk.

"Are you betting on these boys?" Nail inquired of Jacoby, who was appalled that his partner would even ask such a question.

Before Jacoby could sputter out an answer, Nail said, "Relax, Jim. If you are, I just want half the action."

Born in Kansas City, Nail moved to Houston in the mid-Sixties at the urging of John Gerber, another of the game's top players. Nail and his wife, Betty, ran a bridge club in their home. The club became the gathering place for the city's best rubber bridge players.

Nail achieved a reputation as a great player but he was also a bridge teacher and writer. He co-authored *Winning Duplicate*, *How to Play the Hand* and *Revolution in Bridge*. The latter was written with Robert Stucker and described the Big Diamond bidding system they invented.

Nail was on the winning team in the 1962 Team Trials and he won the Men's Teams in 1965, the Life Master Men's Pairs in 1974, the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams in 1967 and the Life Master Pairs in 1974.

Those victories notwithstanding, Nail said his biggest thrill in bridge was in 1948 when he and Ayres Bombeck of Kansas City went to the Summer NABC in Chicago and came in third in the Life Master Pairs. "I didn't have enough points to play in it," he said, "but they let me anyway."

Once in a rubber bridge game, Nail held 10 solid clubs and singletons in the other three suits. In second seat, after the dealer passed, Nail coyly passed -- "I don't know why."

LHO also passed. Now Nail's partner, Cleo Allen, began to study her hand. "Come on, Cleo," Nail was thinking, wishing he knew how to send mental messages. "Come on, Cleo."

Finally she threw the hand in. "Sorry, partner," Allen said to Nail. "Just three bare aces."

The award was created by Sidney Lazard to honor his late son. The first recipient of the award, announced last year, was Paul Soloway. Meltzer will receive her honor at the Hall of Fame banquet this summer in Washington DC.

Zia Mahmood, a member of the committee which selected Meltzer for the award, said there is no more deserving person in the bridge world.

“She and Rita (Shugart) are the best things to happen to bridge ever,” Zia said. “They are a breath of fresh air. Rose’s becoming the first woman to win the Bermuda Bowl (last fall in Paris) is great, and she won with grace and style. With Rose, you see something you don’t see very often at world championships -- her opponents are happy for her when she wins.”

Rose, Zia added, “is a great example of how bridge can be played, and I hope people will take a lesson from that.”

The selection committee was Lazard, Zia and Lew Stansby. Lazard said Meltzer was “on the top of all of our lists. She embodies all that we want to promote.”

Meltzer said she was surprised to be selected but delighted to help promote sportsmanship. “It is so important to the game.”

She added: “Bridge is such a passion with me. I feel very special and honored to be part of the organization. After family and my husband, bridge is my greatest pleasure.”




