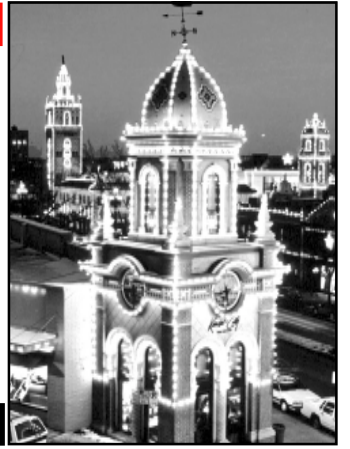




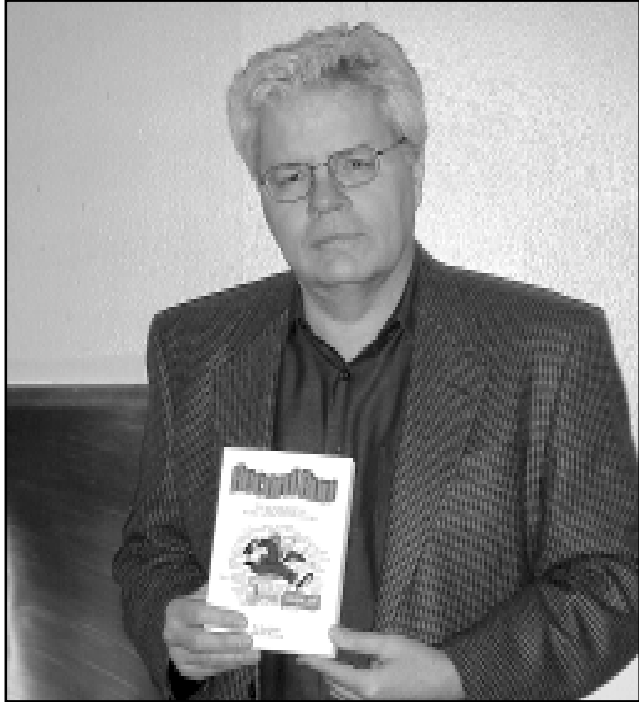

Here's how to break Barry Crane record

(Jim Barrow will be at Randy Baron's book desk at the Hyatt today from 7 to 7:45 p.m. to autograph copies of his new book.)

What do you have to do to break the Barry Crane Top 500 record? Nothing to it. Just . . .

- Travel 93,000 miles
- Play with 216 partners and teammates
- Play 18,504 hands
- Compete in 729 sessions
- Compile a 58.86percentage in pairs
- Stay in 48 different hotels

Well, that's how Jim Barrow of Lake Charles LA did it in 1999. His record run added up to 3584.26 points for the year, erasing Grant Baze's longstanding record of 3270.

A little-known fact – 1999 was not Barrow's first attempt to set a Top 500 record. He smashed the old mark in 1980, scoring 2371 points – but he chose the wrong year. Barry Crane was backing Ron Andersen that year, and it always was tough to top anyone Crane backed. Andersen also broke the record that year, scoring more than 2700 points.

1999 was a tough year for Barrow – all he could think of was bridge and whether he was on track for his goal of scoring more points than anyone else ever had. But 2000 perhaps was equally tough – he worked with Kay Blake, also of Lake Charles, to chronicle his activities en route to setting a new masterpoint standard.

The result is *Record Run*, an interesting book that is a day-by-day journal of his journeys through 1999.

New Vanderbilt plan is all knockout play

A new method of setting up first-round play in the Vanderbilt was used yesterday. In the past, three-way matches were used to reduce the field to a workable number (a power of 2). There are inherent flaws in three-way matches. The new method utilizes head-to-head matches all the way.

Yesterday there were 97 teams entered in the event. The #1 seed, the Nickell team, was given a bye. Then 15 groups of four teams were set up. Two teams in each four-team group played head-to-head for 32 boards. The winners automatically qualified for the second round and had the evening off. The losers in each group played a 32-board match against each other, with the winner advancing and the loser eliminated. As a result, 45 of the 60 teams advanced.

The remaining 36 teams played head-to-head 64-board matches, with the 18 winners advancing.

One team had a bye, 45 qualified in four-way matches and 18 moved ahead in two-way matches. That adds up to 64, a power of 2. That means there can be head-to-head 64-board matches all the rest of the way.

Vanderbilt seeds win

The top-seeded Nick Nickell team had no trouble in yesterday's opening round – they were the only team with a bye to today's round of 64.

Nickell (Dick Freeman, Bob Hamman-Paul Soloway, Jeff Meckstroth-Eric Rodwell), winner of the 2000 Bermuda Bowl and the 2000 Vanderbilt, is going for its second Vanderbilt win as a team.

The other top seeds had little trouble advancing Sunday.

An interesting contest today will match Shawn Quinn (Mildred Breed, Michael Whitman-Garey Hayden) against her husband, Joe Quinn (Ira Hessel, Alan LeBendig, William Wickham, Jon Brissman, Sidney Brownstein).

Welcome back, John Fisher

For Dr. John Fisher, playing at a North American Bridge Championship is a return to the scene where he was a mainstay during the Fifties, Sixties, Seventies and part of the Eighties.

“Those were exciting times – qualifying and finals rounds with everybody thrown into the pot. I come home from a tournament now and with all the different events, I don't know who won what,” says Fisher, a retired physician who lives in Dallas.

There are other differences: “Bidding is more accurate and more scientific – that's the major difference. People don't dress up like they used to – they want to be comfortable and I can't blame them.”

Fisher estimates that during his “avid period” from 1953 to about 1985, he attended every NABC. His record is impressive: wins in the Master Mixed Teams in 1964, Vanderbilt in 1965, Grand National Teams in 1975 and (Spring) Open Pairs in 1970, 1971, 1972 and 1974.

Stein-Caravelli scored 2117.50 matchpoints, followed by John and Helen Gustafson, 2085.25; John Fisher-Tarek Radjef, 2058.50; Charles Gray-Jess Stuart, 2031.50, and Ed Lewis-Jim Murphy, 2008.50. These five pairs were the only ones to top the 2000-point mark.

Stripped for action

Having proved myself truly unqualified on Friday, Saturday was devoted to playing the Stratified Pairs. At last I got my chance to do a spot of card reading.

After a routine 1♦-1♠; 1NT auction, my partner, Justine Cushing, put me in 3NT. Slam on the North-South hands is quite possible -- maybe the South hand qualifies for an old-fashioned jump shift -- but 3NT was the popular spot.

On the ♣Q lead, it was obvious to win and play off four rounds of spades. East followed twice and painlessly let go of a small heart and club.

I won the club return and cashed the fifth spade, as East threw another heart. I cashed the ♥A K which wrung a second club out of East. Now it was easy to cash the ♦A and exit with the last club. East could win but had to return a diamond into the K-J at the end for a precious second overtrick.

Partners again

One of the pairs in the Vanderbilt is a rebirth of a partnership that flourished back in the early Sixties. Dan Rotman and Ivar Stakgold are playing together again after a hiatus of more than 35 years.

Not quite enough

Doug Simson and Eric Rodwell finished seventh in Open Pairs I, but this board almost moved them up a place. They were playing against Claude Vogel and Sangarapil Mohan in the final session, and sixth place was up for grabs. Simson and Rodwell found the best defense on this deal, but they didn't gain enough to catch their opponents.

Simson, South, led a low spade, and when declarer played low from dummy, Rodwell's 9 forced the ace. Simson ducked as declarer led a heart to the jack, but he won the ♥K continuation. Simson continued his attack on trumps, leading the queen to dummy's king. After ruffing a heart, declarer tried his luck in diamonds, leading to the king. But Rodwell took his ace and continued with the ♦J to partner's queen. Simson fired back a fourth heart, and Rodwell was able to score a ruff, thanks to partner's earlier trump leads. Declarer still had a trump loser plus one loser in both diamonds and clubs, so Simson and Rodwell scored plus 200 for almost all the matchpoints.

Some of the more interesting hands are interspersed through the book. However, the book dwells primarily on how he reacted to the daily turmoil of bridge, bridge, bridge. Altogether he played in three North American championships, 41 regionals, three sectionals and eight club games. Most of the time he played two sessions a day, but there were frequent days on which he competed three times, adding a morning knockout to the two sessions in the afternoon and evening.

Barrow is here in Kansas City. He was invited by several players to compete in the Vanderbilt, but he sees this as a year for relaxation -- "now I'm doing a lot of fishing." So he's playing in the Silver Ribbon Pairs.

What was it like to chase the record?

"It was a miserable experience. I worried about masterpoints all the time. I worried about whether I was meeting my goals. I worried about the bad start I got. I worried.

"The trouble was I had a tiger by the tail. Once I got started I couldn't let go. It's a debilitating experience."

With whom did he earn most of his points?

"I got about 900 with David Adams, 800 with Jim Robison and 600 with John Potter. But many others helped me along the way."

But the Year of the Record Run and the Year of the Book are over. It's time to go fishing.

He won the McKenney Trophy (now the *Barry Crane Top 500*) in 1972 and remembers that Crane, the masterpoint guru who usually determined who won the race in those days, was determined that Fisher would win. "The year I won, he drove me with a whip. The minute he thought I was slowing down, he cracked that whip."

The last time he played "serious bridge" at an NABC, says Fisher, was the 1990 Spring NABC in Fort Worth. He's playing here in Kansas City in the Silver Ribbon Pairs with Tarek Radjef of Dallas.

Most of the time, however, Fisher is content to play in tournaments in Texas and Shreveport LA (with long-time friends Betty Ann and Jack Kennedy). He retired from practicing medicine in 1993. "Now I play bridge, travel and dine and wine with friends."

Happy St. Pat's Day for directing staff

Jim Tritt and Richard Meffley, winners of Open Pairs I, grabbed most of the matchpoints on this deal from the second final session.

If South leads the ♠K, Tritt has 12 top tricks – six diamonds, five clubs and the ♠A -- for plus 490. When North sacrificed at 4♠, Tritt doubled.

Meffley led the ♦10 and Tritt won his ♦Q and ♦A. He continued with the ♦K as South followed and Meffley scored his ♠10. The defense still had the ♠A and two clubs to come for plus 500 and 70.5 out of 77 matchpoints.

Unblocking

Meffley made a simple but effective – and often overlooked – unblocking play on this deal from the first final session.

Meffley (South) opened 1NT and played it there. West led a low spade and Meffley ducked in dummy. East won his ♠J and Meffley carefully unblocked the ♠8.

East shifted to the ♣Q, ducked all around, and continued with another club, won with the ace. Meffley led the ♠10: queen, ace, 5. Now he played a diamond to his jack and led the ♠2: West still held the ♠9 6 but dummy held the ♠K 7 -- and Meffley had two more spade tricks.

Three spades, one heart, three diamonds and one club was good for plus 120 and 57.5 matchpoints out of a possible 77 matchpoints.

Four trump tricks make the difference

Varis Carey and Henry Bethe, who finished second in Open Pairs I, found a neat defense to defeat 3♥ on this deal from the first final session. However, it is clear that declarer's play was far from perfection.

Bethe, South, led a low diamond to the jack, and declarer quickly cashed the king. Then he crossed to the ♣A and pitched his last club on the ♦A. After ruffing a club, he led a trump to the jack, and Carey took his queen. He shot back a diamond, ruffed with the 3 and overruffed by Bethe with the king. Bethe shifted back to clubs, ruffed by declarer.

He led the ♠J, ducked, but when he continued with the 10, Bethe won and gave partner a spade ruff. Carey led another club, setting up Bethe's trump 10 en passant. Down one as the result of taking four (!) trumps and the ♠A.

Yes, declarer certainly could have done better. After taking the first two diamonds, he could lead a trump to the jack and queen. North probably would fire back a club to dummy's ace, but declarer would win and cash the top diamond to get a club pitch. Then a heart to the ace would limit the defense to just two trumps and the ♠A, making four.

Change of plan

Our opponents found a way to the 5-2 diamond fit rather than the 5-2 heart fit in the first qualifying session of Open Pairs I. It led to a fascinating end position.

I was playing with Justine Cushing. Our opponents were Richard and Mary Oshlag.

On the lead of the ♠J to the queen and king, followed by the ♠A and a low spade, Oshlag discarded a heart loser. I could ruff but all I collected in due course was one more trump trick.

The interesting defense is if Cushing presses on with the ♠10 at trick three. Obviously declarer has to ruff in. If he ruffs high, I discard, so it looks logical to ruff low.

Overruffing the ♦2 with the ♦3 seems to achieve nothing so it looks better to discard a club and try to obtain control. Now declarer changes tack: he crosses to the ♣A and finesses in hearts, cashes the ♥A and ruffs a heart. This is the new position when declarer ruffs another club to hand:

Now declarer leads a fourth heart and it does North no good to ruff with the ♦K so declarer scores the ♦J in dummy. Now declarer leads the ♠8, pitching his last heart and collecting two trump tricks at the end.

For experts only

When the number 3 seeds met on the first round of the evening session, expert #1 boasted proudly that he had beaten up on expert #2's wife earlier that afternoon. Pride goeth before a fall and a haughty spirit before destruction, they say.

A routine Stayman auction to 3NT saw South lead a club to the 10, a good start for declarer. A low spade to the 8, 10 and king saw North press on with clubs. That let declarer win and lead the ♠Q to South's ace, and she cleared the clubs. Now declarer cashed out the diamonds and needed to view the spades to make the contract.

By this stage, he knew South to be either 3-3-3-4 or 2-4-3-4 and the fall of the ♠8 at trick two was either from A-8 or A-9-8 – in which case South might have played the 9.

Is this a true restricted-choice position? I'm not sure. The fact is that East did take the spade finesse and South was not too proud to win her 9 and cash a club for down one and a clear top.

The words, "Sauce for the goose is sauce for the gander," were left unspoken but echoed in expert #1's ears as he left the table, if not wiser, at least better informed.

1. Somerset Maugham, famous novelist and short story writer, once called bridge "the most intelligent and entertaining card game the wit of man so far has devised." He often used card playing in his settings. He wrote the first play in theater history to feature bridge. In *Three Fat Women of Antibes*, three middle-aged women are looking for a congenial fourth. He wrote the introduction to Charles Goren's *The Standard Book of Bidding*.

His verdict on bridge is memorable. "If I had my way, I would have children taught bridge as a matter of course, just as they are taught dancing. In the end it will be more useful to them . . . You can play bridge as long as you can sit at a table and tell one card from another. In fact, when all else fails – sport, love, ambition – bridge remains a solace and an entertainment."

His observations on the requirements for playing bridge: "The essentials for playing a good game of bridge are to be truthful, clear-headed, and considerate, prudent but not averse to taking a risk, and not to cry over spilt milk. And incidentally those are perhaps also the essentials for playing the more important game of life."

2. Judi Radin. A World Bridge Federation Grand Master, she won the World Women's Pairs in 1978, the World Women's Team Olympiad in 1984, the Venice Cup in 1987 and the McConnell Cup in 1994. She also placed second in the Venice Cup in 1981 and 1985 and the World Women's Pairs in 1990. She is an ACBL Grand Life Master with 14,611 masterpoints.

Osofsky's challenge: extend goodwill to games everywhere

Goodwill Committee chairman Aileen Osofsky is issuing a challenge to members of the Goodwill Committee: extend goodwill to club games plus regional and sectional tournaments.

"One of the ideas of goodwill is to make the new player welcome," she says, "and what better than making people welcome at every club?"

Goodwill committees could be formed at the district, unit and club levels, she suggests.

District 9 (Florida) started its own district goodwill committee about six years ago, says former District Director Jayne Thomas. Each unit president appoints two members each year. The committee now numbers about 50 members.

There's a similar committee in District 16 and the late Ruth McConnell once started a similar committee in District 8.

The national Goodwill Committee was formed in 1955 when ACBL President Jeff Glick — "as part of our intensive, all-out membership drive" — appointed a Goodwill and Membership Committee headed by John Simon of St. Louis.

The original committee included one member from each of the nine districts east of the Rocky Mountains "and I know their efforts will be supported by every unit, franchised club and member in the American Contract Bridge League," Glick wrote in *The Bridge Bulletin*.

Committee members were Ethel Keohane, Wellesley Hills MA, District 1; William Joseph, Paterson NJ, 2; Olive Peterson, St. Davids PA, 3; William Holderness, Greensboro NC, 4; J. Roy Boggan, Dayton OH, 5; Grace Grant, Hammond IN, 6; John Simon, St. Louis, 7; Terry Teague, Birmingham AL, 8, and Nate Silverstein, Memphis, 9.

The committee was made permanent in 1957 and Louise Durham of Durant MS was named co-chairman. New committee members were Mary Jane Farrell, Barry Crane, Sam Gold, Agnes Gordon, Margaret Wagar and Oswald Jacoby.

Simon, who remained as chairman, commented: "Playing bridge at tournaments is very enjoyable, but knowing the people next to you and playing in an atmosphere of friendship and good sportsmanship makes it much more enjoyable."

"To promote this friendlier atmosphere is one of the chief functions of the Goodwill Committee."

"We hope to interest more people in tournament bridge by making the social atmosphere of tournament playing more attractive. Our committee . . . will be glad to meet any of the participants and will be especially anxious to hear any suggestions, complaints or just a friendly greeting!"

Forty-six years later, the Goodwill Committee is still hearing suggestions, complaints and friendly greetings. "Goodwill Committee members are chosen because they exemplify the best in bridge," says Osofsky. "I'm very proud to be a part of this committee."

Osofsky recalls that when she was named Goodwill chairman in 1985, "I didn't even know what the Goodwill Committee was. So I talked to bridge teachers, players and club managers about what the Goodwill Committee should do and every group thought I should concentrate on the other people."

Under Osofsky's leadership, the Goodwill Committee has expanded its activities — taking on the promotion of Active Ethics, awareness of the hearing impaired, naming of a Goodwill Member of the Year and support of Junior, Youth and charity programs. The committee also introduced bid boxes and initiated the practice of calling for "Director, please" and "Caddy, please."

The committee now numbers about 2200 members. District directors may appoint two new members each year. The appointments are lifetime and members receive a Goodwill Committee lapel pin.

Calling the Director

Martha McGhee, co-chair of the 1998 Orlando NABC, was IN chairman at the 1992 NABC. This article appeared in the Daily Bulletin at that tournament.

Call the who ...? The Director! It's okay to call the director. If fact, if you don't, you may lose your right to call him later if you are damaged.

The director is the one who sold you an entry, the one who passed out the board, the one who passed out the hand records and said, "Duplicate, please." The director is the one who organized the players and the boards so that everything runs smoothly at the right time, the right speed and the right direction.

The director is the one you need help from if and when an irregularity happens at your table. The director gives rulings pertaining to the "Laws of Duplicate Contract Bridge."

In order for the conditions of the game to be fair, everyone has to follow the same rules. The director is familiar with these rules and is responsible for seeing that they are correctly applied.

The director is also the one who calls the rounds when it is time for you to meet your new opponents. The director puts the results of each board into the computer and posts the computer print-out of results after each session.

When you need a director, raise your hand and call out "Director, please" -- loudly enough for him to hear but not so loudly that it disturbs the other players. When the Director arrives at your table, he will listen to what happened and explain to the players the ruling that pertains to the irregularity.

Some rulings have several options so if you don't understand them fully, don't hesitate to ask for them to be repeated.

Since the conditions at each table must be duplicated as much as possible, all the players must adhere to the same set of rules. The Director's main objective is to make the game as fair as possible for all the players involved, while ensuring that everyone has an enjoyable time.

Irregularities that may happen at your table for which you must call the director: a lead out of turn, an insufficient bid, a revoke, a card missing from a hand, a bid or pass out of turn, failure to Alert an artificial bid, changes of call, disagreements of tricks won, claims with trumps outstanding or disputed claims, bidding errors, etc.

The Director is your friend. Do not hesitate to call him or her. In fact, if you don't call the Director, you may have lost the right to call him later when you discover you have been damaged.
