Breed, Quinn triumph again in LM Women's

Mildred Breed and Shawn Quinn have won their third consecutive Life Master Women's Pairs title, using a powerful finish in the second final session to win the event by two boards.

Breed and Quinn have multiple national victories and world titles to their credit, including the World Women's Olympiad crown from Maastricht in 2000.

The Texas-based partnership scored 1206.89 matchpoints to top the field of 72 pairs. In second were Barbara Nudelman and Jayne Thomas, both former members of the ACBL Board of Directors, who posted a final tally of 1131.62.

Third and fourth places were extremely close. Tobi Sokolow and June Deutsch eked out the third place finish with 1120.50 over Susan Wexler and Margie Gwozdzinsky who finished with 1120.05.

De Young tops 10,000

When Bernace De Young of Aventura FL looked at the scoreboard after the first qualifying session of the Life Master Women's Pairs, she was doubly happy. First, she and partner Ellen Melson were leading the field. But more important, she had won enough masterpoints to go over the 10,000 barrier.



De Young's highest finish in a North American event was in the same event - she placed second with Ellasue Chaitt in the LM Women's in Cincinnati.

Although she is a lawyer and a member of the Florida bar, bridge is her full-time occupation. "I teach bridge on a full-time basis in the Miami-Fort Lauderdale area, and I also play professionally."

She got her start in bridge when she was studying for her law degree at the University of Miami. "The local bridge club was just across the street, and some of my fellow students played there. They talked me into going one time - and that's all it took to get me hooked."

De Young credits Russ Arnold and Annette Barrett for her success in bridge. They took me under their wings back when I was a beginner - when I had only about five points. They took me to tournaments and they were always willing to talk bridge with me. I learned a lot from them."

Her biggest fan is her mother, Alice Brunsting of Stuart FL. "She has always been in my corner. The amazing thing is that she has just taken bridge - at the age of 80!"

Americans win lots of medals in Pairs

In addition to the gold medal earned by the squad captained by Rose Meltzer in the Bermuda Bowl (see yesterday's edition), other U.S. teams were medalists at the recent world championships in Paris.

The U.S. won a gold medal in the Seniors Bowl. The winners were Grant Baze-Gene Freed, Joe Kivel-Chris Larsen and John Onstott-Garey Hayden. They defeated Poland 108-72.

In the Transnational Open Teams, a U.S.-Brazil team defeated a French team for the gold medal. The winners were Eddie Wold-Geoff Hampson, Mike Passell-Michael Seamon of the U.S., and Brazilians Gabriel Chagas-Diego Brenner. Malcolm Brachman was the non-playing captain.

In the Venice Cup, the USA II team earned a bronze medal, defeating Austria, 165-110.5. The bronze medalists are Joan Jackson-Petra Hamman, Mildred Breed-Shawn Quinn and Robin Klar-Kay Schulle.

The winning U.S. Senior team also earned recognition as the top-scoring Senior squad in the Transnational Open Teams round-robin, and Irina Levitina, who lives in the U.S., was a member of the top-ranked mixed team in the final TNOT round-robin standings.

From law studies to Non-LM win

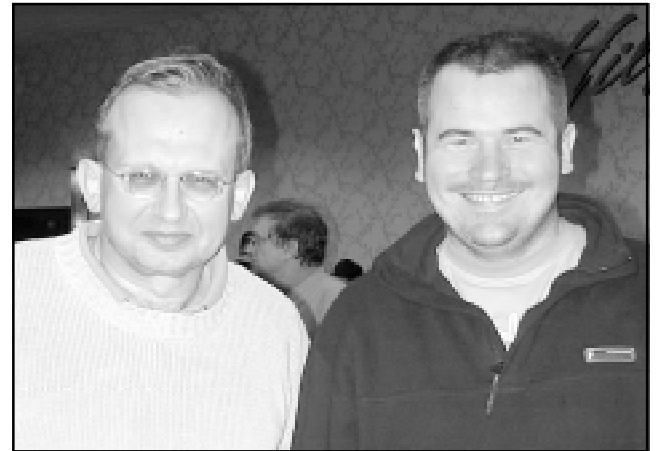
Aaron Craig, 28, of Los Angeles and Max Minzner, 25, of New York City, who began their partnership while they were law students at Yale in 1999, today reign as Non-Life Master Pairs champions. They climbed from the middle of the pack to fifth after the first final session, then jumped to the top in the last session with their second consecutive 59% effort.

The winners outdistanced runners-up Bill Filip of Stuart FL and Warren Williams of Wilton CT by 3.52 points (11 top). In third place less than a point behind were Stephen Tu of Milpitas CA and Steve Chen of San Jose CA.

Craig and Minzner haven't played much together this year because of the cross-country problem, but both were in Los Angeles last year and they played frequently. They play a reasonably standard two-over-one system.

When asked if the victory made them Life Masters, they laughed. "It's entirely possible that we could be back next year to defend our title," said Craig. He learned bridge from his dad, but his high school friends

Gawrys, Pszczola top LM Open Pairs

The Polish pair of Piotr Gawrys and Jacek Pszczola posted a strong second final session in the Life Master Open Pairs to claim victory in the two-day event. It was the first NABC victory for both players, although they each have an impressive list of tournament victories from international play. Pszczola (peesht-CHO-la) won the 2001 Cavendish Invitational Pairs and is also the reigning World Pairs champion. Both events were won with Polish expert Michael Kwiecien. Gawrys won the World Teams in 1984 and was second in the Bermuda Bowl in 1991. Gawrys has also won the Cavendish Pairs (1991).

The duo posted a final score of 2215.86 to edge Zia Mahmood and Sidney Lazard who were second with 2192.52. Zia has won the LM Open twice before (1990, 1991).

In third with 2180.38 were Mike Passell and Michael Seamon who flirted with the lead throughout yesterday's two-session final.

The Asian connection

A quick perusal of the results pages of any Daily Bulletin will reveal the names and hometowns of bridge enthusiasts from around the world. The increasing participation in the NABCs by players who reside outside North America is a well-documented trend.

European players have been well-represented at the NABCs for some time, but a new demographic is emerging: an increasing number of players from Asia, especially Japan, are showing up in force at ACBL's premier events.

Haruko Koshi and Yoshiyuki Nakamura are part of a group of some 30 Japanese participants here in Las Vegas. Koshi is a member of the Executive Committee of the Japanese Contract Bridge League. Nakamura, Koshi's partner in the Life Master Open Pairs, is the JCBL's top masterpoint holder, and has frequently represented Japan in international competition.

Sometimes you have to break the rules

Third hand high? Up to a point.

The East-West field in the evening Life Master Open Pairs qualifying had a pair of hands that disputed the general theory of third hand high.

Board 14 ♠ 7 5 4
Dlr: East ♥ A Q 9 4
Vul: None ♦ 7 6
 ♣ K Q J 5

♠ Q 8 ♠ J 10 6 3 2

Our opponents reached 3NT after North had used Stayman facing a weak notrump. That persuaded Jill Levin to lead a heart, and declarer made the correct technical and psychological play of a small heart from dummy (this wins if I have Jxx or 10xx without the ♥8). Even on the actual lie of the cards, I had to remember to break the third-hand-high rule and put in the ♥8. When declarer won the king and played a club to the king and ace, I shifted to the ♠2, hoping to give the impression that spades would split 4-3.

Now declarer was in hand and had to decide how to tackle diamonds. If he led to the ♦10, he would go down in embarrassing fashion if the ♦A was onside. Jill would clear spades while I still had the ♦A as an entry. So after cashing a couple of clubs, declarer played a diamond to the king. Down one.

On the next round our opponents passed the South cards on Board 18.

South tried to make up for his initial pass by jumping to game when North opened 1♠. He responded a forcing 1NT, then jumped to 3NT when North rebid 2♥. On a low diamond lead, declarer's best legitimate shot is to play the ♦8, hoping East has Qxx and blindly follows the third-hand-high rule. Note the difference at trick one. If East plays the ♦Q, declarer ducks a club and claims nine tricks. If East puts in the ♦9 instead, declarer makes only six tricks! East gets in with a club to lead a diamond through, and South is toast.

Cover an honor with an honor? Up to a point.

Chris Willenken, playing with Barnet Shenkin, read this hand nicely, but he needed a little defensive assistance to achieve his coup:

Chris reached 3NT as North after West had overcalled. He got a heart lead, winning with the jack. After cashing a couple of diamonds from his hand (unblocking the 9), he advanced the ♠9, covered and ducked. East cleared the hearts, West taking the ace and returning the suit. Chris won and cashed two diamonds, ending in hand on which East pitched a spade and West a club and a heart. Chris read the ending to be along the following lines:

He cashed the ♣K-A and advanced the ♠10. When East covered (always cover an honor, you know), Chris ducked and East was forced to lead away from the ♠8-6 into Chris' K-7 for a valuable second overtrick. Of course if East ducks the defense has to get two tricks instead of one.

Note – if Chris knew for sure that East had the ♣Q-J, he could have made an extra trick by force. Instead of keeping three spades in the five-card position, he would keep another low club. Then he would cash the ♠K and lead a low club. West would have to split his honors. Then he could be put on lead with a heart and be forced to lead a club away from his queen.

New Life Masters

Wynn Raleigh and Susan Anderson of Salt Lake City both made Life Master playing on the same team, but they weren't partners. Raleigh was playing with Roy Kier of Salt Lake City, and Anderson's partner was Rosalie Gardner of Salt Lake City.

Another pair of teammates are now Life Masters, but they didn't make the grade together. Ellen Meyer of Austin TX, playing with Dean Truair, also of Austin, went over the top in the afternoon match of the Bracket 8 of the Bracketed Knockouts. In the event, her team was the victor, and that gave Truair enough points to join her in the Life Master category.

Kaye Folsom made the grade in the Bracketed Knockouts where she was playing with Jerry Brown, Lorna Stock and Carol Grover.

Stanley "Stash" Pietrewicz of Scottsdale AZ also earned his gold card in the Bracket Knockouts. His teammates were N. Kohler, S. Adelson and S. Peters.

Conrad Johnson of Arlington Heights IL, who needed only .11 of gold, went over in the Bracketed Senior Knockouts.

Marjorie Millay of Federal Way WA got the 9.7 points she needed in the Bracketed Knockouts. Her partner was Alison Carter of Puyallup WA. Their teammates were Miriam and Peter Roos – all the way from the other end of the country, Randolph MA. They met at the partnership desk.

Joyce Nauen of Sun City West AZ, won Bracket 9 of the Welcome to Las Vegas Knockouts, earning enough points to get her gold card.

ABA/ACBL Pairs event

This monster has many fiery tongues

Board 24 from last evening's pair games featured a hand with 30 — count 'em 30 — high-card points. Here's how ACBL Counsel Peter Rank, playing with Kent Mignocchi (a member of the recently crowned World Junior Championship squad) handled the monster:

Mignocchi won the opening heart lead in dummy (East playing the jack) and played the ♠A, uncovering the 5-0 break. Despite this annoyance, however, Mignocchi brought home the contract with a trump coup and some good guesswork as to East's distribution.

When declarer called for another trump from dummy, East erred by rising with the king. (So what is the right play? Keep reading.) East exited with the ♥10 to dummy.

at first preferred hearts, a game they sometimes played 24 hours at a time. But finally his friends got the word and they switched to bridge.

Minzner also got his start in hearts, but bridge took over as soon as he discovered the game. He's now indoctrinating his father in duplicate. "I'm getting out to play at the club about once a week now, and he's discovering it's a more interesting game than rubber bridge."

Bidding ZT

You can actually bid "Zero Tolerance" at the Scottsdale Bridge Club in Arizona.

Yellow Zero Tolerance cards are in the bid boxes and they have had a positive influence on behavior, according to club owner Jan Bricklin.

Players are asked to flash a ZT card to an offending player (or players) when they feel intimidated or abused. If the bad manners continue, the offended players can call the director and get a ZT ruling.

"There are too many new players who are simply afraid to call the director when unruly behavior occurs," said Bricklin. "These cards can be very useful. I think they are a very good reminder."

Goodwill Message

I'm delighted to report that "Caddy, please" is becoming a common call, indicating that players are more considerate of caddies in general.

"We all answer to caddy but we prefer to answer to our last name: Please," says Caddymaster Jackie Matthews.

Mignocchi next cashed the ♦A K and ruffed a diamond. When East pitched a club on the third round, declarer had a strong inferential count on the hand: East was known to have five spades and two diamonds. Also, East's heart spots suggested a doubleton, so Mignocchi gave East a 5-2-2-4 pattern.

This was the position:

Declarer crossed to a high club and ran the suit, picking up East's trumps when the defender was forced to ruff in front of the South hand. Well played, for plus 980.

But can East do better? Yes. At trick three, when declarer plays the ♠8 from dummy, East must cover with the 10. To see why this makes a difference, consider the endgame after declarer covers the ♠10, crosses to a high heart and strips the diamonds (East pitching a club). The position will be this:

If declarer now crosses to a high club to run the suit, East will ruff the fourth round. Declarer must overruff but will then be forced to concede the last two tricks: South must lead from the trump Q-5 into East's K-7.

Can declarer succeed double-dummy? (More importantly, will this analysis *ever* end?). Yes! After winning the opening heart lead, declarer must play a low spade from dummy at trick two. This has the effect of preserving a vital entry to dummy late in the play to execute the trump coup against East. Good luck finding that play at the table.

The pair, from Tokyo, discussed the increasing interest of Japanese players in attending NABCs.

"About one hundred players made reservations to attend the Las Vegas tournament," said Koshi, "but more than half canceled after Sept. 11. It would have been the largest contingent of Japanese players ever at a U.S. event. But, many were concerned about safety. My own children tried to dissuade me from attending, but my husband encouraged me to go. He felt it would be safer now than ever before."

Despite the setback from the terrorist attacks, Koshi felt that Japanese players will soon regain their confidence in traveling to North America and will begin appearing in record numbers.

"Many Japanese players enjoy sightseeing in the U.S. in addition to playing bridge. The more cosmopolitan venues are especially attractive to Japanese," she said.

Koshi also remarked that Japanese bidding and play methods, as well as tournament formats, have more in common with ACBL than with other bridge-playing venues such as Europe. This acts as an additional reason for Japanese players to visit North American tournaments.

No exit

Joe Livezey found a neat way to bring home his contract after a defensive slip by the opponents on this deal from the first final session of the Life Master Open Pairs. Livezey was playing with partner Larry Goldberg.

Livezey declared 3♥ after Goldberg's balancing double. East led a low diamond, won by West's king. When declarer ducked the club shift to the queen, the spotlight focused on East. Looking at all four hands, it seems that declarer is slated to lose two spades, a diamond and two clubs for down one. A passive exit (such as a trump) would seal declarer's fate, but East's choice of a second round of diamonds allowed Livezey to scramble a ninth trick.

Ruffing the diamond in dummy, declarer crossed to the ♣A and ruffed his last diamond. The ♥A was next, followed by the ♥Q overtaken in the closed hand with the king. The ♥J extracted the last trump from West (East pitching a spade) to reach this position:

It was clear from the bidding and play that West's pattern was 2-3-6-2, giving East a 4-2-3-4 shape including the ♠A. Livezey knew, therefore, that East had only black cards remaining. On the last trump, East would be forced to let go of a vital exit card in the endgame. If East parted with a low club, dummy's ♣9 would become a trick; if East instead pitched a spade, declarer would play a low spade to the dummy and again build a club trick for plus 140 and a great matchpoint score.

Faster, faster!

Slow play, as opposed to careful or thoughtful play, is discourteous not only to your at-the-table opponents but to the entire field.

In duplicate bridge, a consistently slow pair can delay the entire game by minutes -- that seem like hours.

The Official Encyclopedia of Bridge lists these causes of slow play, some or all of them violations of the Proprieties of duplicate play:

- Delay in coming to the table after a round has been called .
- Discussion of boards previously played .
- Failure to pass at least one completed board promptly, or pass one board if the other has not been completed .
- Inattention during the bidding necessitating frequent reviews of the auction .
- Post-mortems, particularly those involving the player whose duty it is to score the board just played .
- Failure (in the event of an infraction) to accept a director's ruling pleasantly and promptly .
- Blaming previous opponents for present tardiness instead of concentrating on finishing the present deal .

If you take the ruffing finesse through East, however, you get your two club discards regardless of East's spade length.
