Turks Top Blue Ribbon Pairs

A pair of players from Turkey have become the first players from that country to win a North American championship.

Salvador Assael and Nafiz Zorlu topped the field in the six-session Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs. The duo posted a final score of 2105.71 to narrowly edge Steve Landen of Rochester Hills MN and Pratap Rajadhyaksha of Powell OH, who finished with 2100.06. Landen and Rajadhyaksha won the Open Pairs at the Cincinnati NABC in 1999.

In third was the father-son partnership of Ken and John Kranyak of Bay Village OH. The Kranyaks scored 2097.38.

Assael and Zorlu have represented Turkey in international play for many years. Zorlu is a businessman who has played in six European championships and three Olympiads. He has many Turkish titles. Zorlu is also a past president of the Turkish Bridge Federation.

Assael is a retired broker who has played in five Zone 1 (Europe) championships and two Olympiads. The pair has been playing together for 17 years.

Dan Gerstman and Allan Graves, who led after the semifinal sessions, the first final session and throughout much of the second final session, ran out of gas on the last few rounds to finish fourth with 2056.99.

Levine takes Senior KO

The squad captained by Mike Levine was down 16 IMPs going into the final quarter of the Senior Knockouts against the team led by Hamish Bennett, but won the last set 44–16 to win the event.

Levine, playing with teammates Zeke Jabbour, Randy Pettit, Allan Siebert, P.O. Sundelin and Arnie Fisher, defeated the Bennett squad by a final score of 153–141. Playing with Bennett were Gene Simpson, Billy Eisenberg, Jim Robison, Chris Larsen and Joe Kivel.


The runners-up won the first quarter 51–32, but Levine was strong in the second set, pulling to within

2 IMPs. Bennett led 76–74 at the half. Bennett tacked on 14 more IMPs by the end of the third quarter to lead 125–109, but the Levine squad powered their way to victory in the last quarter, winning it by 28 IMPs to win the match by 12 IMPs.

Members of both the winning team and the runners-up have multiple NABC and world titles, especially in Senior contests. The Levine squad has won all of the major NABC Senior events several times.

An important swing occurred in the third quarter where the South players on one deal held:

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Hospices receive Charity donations



Also, the Charity Foundation presented a \$5000 check to the Nathan Adelson Hospice of Las Vegas, the charity recipient chosen by the local NABC tournament committee. Unit 373 (and District 17) Treasurer Tom Shulman was on hand to accept the check on behalf of Adelson.

Tehan, of Los Angeles CA, said, "Hospice programs provide a wide range of services for people in their end-of-life experience. Hospice specialists are expert at managing problems that develop at the end of a person's life."

There are lots of stories about Board 12 from the second semifinal session of the Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs, but the Benito Garozzo story is perhaps the best. Benito was sitting West with Lea Dupont as East. Jacek Pszczcola of Poland was North and his partner was Zia.

Benito, sitting West, of course opened 1♣, and Lea responded 1♥. Benito jumped to 3♣ and Lea showed her other suit. Benito not surprisingly tried 3NT despite the not-so-sure stopper in spades. Lea decided to show her strength and her distribution by leaping to 6♦. Benito wasn't too happy about this with his doubleton diamond and singleton heart, so he "corrected" to 6NT. Jacek knew he could beat that contract, so he doubled. He was right about beating 6NT – it would go down six tricks – 1400– but he was wrong to double.

Benito figured Jacek had to have a strong spade holding to double, so he decided to cut his losses by bidding 7♣. Pszczcola led a high spade. When Benito saw the spade void in dummy, he broke into a smile as wide as the one Giorgio Belladonna had when he played the famous 7♣ hand in Bermuda in 1975 that decided the Bermuda Bowl in Italy's favor. He wrote plus 1630 on his private score.

After winning the first trick, Bob Heitzman continued with the ♥Q. Keith Garber, South, recognized that this meant his partner had a diamond void, so he ruffed and led the ♦J. I also knew North had a diamond void, so I ducked! Now if South continues diamonds I get out for down one. But Keith played the ♣Q. I took the king, passed the ♠10 and finessed to the ♠J.

Now I had no legitimate road to down one, I thought, but I played the ♣A, ruffed a club and played the ♠A, leaving this ending:

I exited with the ♣7. Keith won and played the ♦K! Down two and a full board swing as minus 200 lost the board. Our teammates were plus 170 in 3♥, a great result for them.

Left-hand opponent (West) opened the bidding 1♦ and North bid 4♥. Both South players bid 6♥, but Levine was doubled. 6♥ was cold, so the double cost 7 IMPs in the tight match.

The player on your left opens 1♣ and RHO responds 1♦. Your turn – what do you bid?

The deal came up in the final of the Senior Knockouts. P.O. Sundelin of Sweden, a member of Mike Levine's victorious team, considered 1♣, but thought the hand was too strong for a simple overcall. So he doubled. Is that what you did? If so, what is your opening lead? That's right – your partner passes 1♦ doubled. The full deal:

Arnie Fisher didn't want to bid either of his three-card majors, so he passed, hoping the carnage wouldn't be too great. P.O. cashed a high spade and confidently led a second, but his confidence faded when declarer ruffed. Declarer then led a diamond toward the queen, and P.O.'s confidence started to return – partner would win the queen with either the ace or the king, and P.O.'s jack would win a trick later on. Oh no! The ♦Q held! What's going on here? Declarer then called for another diamond and finessed, losing to P.O.'s jack.

When P.O. returned another spade, declarer ruffed and then paused. Finally he spread his hand, announcing, "Making four, I concede a heart trick." That figures out to minus 440. Believe it or not – Levine's team gained on this board. Their teammates bought the hand for 5♣ doubled and brought the contract home for plus 550 and 3 IMPs.

Please do not give us the cards or leave them on the table before that time.

4. Please do not fill out a card and give it to us, then leave to get coffee, to eat, etc. When we call your name and you are not there, we are unable to get you a partner.

5. If you find a partner for yourself in the "mad-dog crowd," please come and tell us so we can remove your name from the list.

Here's Kantar's solution:

You have this one in your hip pocket. Cash the ♦K (after drawing the second round of trump) and lead a diamond to the 8 if West follows with a low diamond. East wins and is endplayed. If West produces the ♦9 or ♦10 on the second round of the suit, insert the jack, and once again East is endplayed. The contract is unbeatable because of dummy's ♦8.

Goodwill honorees emphasize service

Yesterday we reported that Kay Afdahl of Virginia Beach VA and Sheena Rayner of Bermuda were named Goodwill Members of the Year. Here is what their nominators had to say about them.

Doris Riley of Unit 146 wrote about Afdahl as follows:

"Kay Afdahl moved to our area in the early Seventies. She quickly made friends in our bridge community and volunteered her services. She soon became associate editor of our newsletter, and she also worked as caddy master and assisted with hospitality at the Norfolk Regional and the Norfolk North American Championships.

"She then became tournament co-chairman and was instrumental in relocating our regional to the Virginia Beach waterfront where it has continued to thrive to this day. She helped to revive the spirit of Southern hospitality at our tournaments.

"Then she turned her attention to our local games by organizing a non-profit weekly game with liberal free plays, lavish refreshments, mini-lessons, volunteer directors, guaranteed partners and newcomer involvement. The game was a huge success. Last year the players raised more than \$2000 for the benefit of Hospice Volunteers.

"Kay then embarked on a campaign to introduce bridge in the schools and taught regularly scheduled classes to students at both Norfolk State University and Old Dominion University.

"She has been at least partially responsible for a growing population of new players in our unit. She also has taught director classes, and she is always available to give assistance when asked by other club directors.

"She once served as our Unit Education Liaison and is currently District 6 Education Liaison and ABA coordinator.

"We are proud to nominate her for Goodwill Member of the Year."

John Hoskins, president of the Bermuda unit, had this to say about Sheena Rayner:

"Sheena has been active in all aspects of bridge administration in Bermuda for 14 years without any monetary reward. Among her many duties she has served as president of the Bermuda Bridge Club, president of ACBL Unit 198, regional tournament chairman and, of great significance, tournament chairperson for the Orbis World Bridge Championships in January 2000.

"This latter task involved more than 30 months of work, from the initial meetings with the Bermuda Department of Tourism to the farewell dinner. During that time Sheena generated goodwill aplenty. She attended the Bermuda Bowl/Venice Cup in Tunisia in 1997 to ensure Bermuda being chosen as the venue. She also attended the Olympiad in Lille in 1998 to further promote the Bermuda cause.

"During the entire process, Sheena greeted everyone with a smile. Every problem or complaint whether trivial or critical was tackled with fine diplomacy. At the Championships, Sheena was everywhere. Whether it was a light bulb burning out or a financially stricken team needing billets, she solved the problem. Ensuring that players were treated with the best of care and attention was her top priority.

"The kind of goodwill generated during this event spanned the globe, highlighting Bermuda's unique brand of hospitality. For these reasons we feel Sheena is an excellent candidate for the Goodwill Member of the Year award."
