A Sept. 11 tragedy in the bridge world

Steven E. Furman of Wesley Hills NY apparently was the only tournament bridge player who was killed in the Twin Towers disaster on Sept. 11. Steven, married with four children ranging from 5 to 11, worked for Cantor Fitzgerald on the 105th floor of One World Trade Center. He was 40 years old.

The tragedy leaves his wife Chava with the task of raising Nisan, 11; Rachel, 10; Naomi, 8, and Menashe, 5. This of course will be a major financial and emotional burden.

Steven was the son of Joyce Lilie and the stepson of Harold Lilie, two ACBL players who have won many events at the North American level.

Steven's family has set up a trust fund for the children's education and support. All donations are tax-deductible.

Meet George Retek, 2002 ACBL President

At the 2001 Summer NABC in Toronto, District 1 representative to the ACBL Board of Directors George Retek was elected ACBL president for 2002. In an interview conducted Sunday morning, Retek talked about his life, his relationship with bridge and his views on the future of the game and ACBL.

Retek, of Montreal PQ, was first elected to the ACBL Board in 1979, making him the senior member of the policy-setting body.



Q: Tell us about George Retek, the person.

A: I was born in 1936 in Budapest, Hungary. I survived the Holocaust and participated in the Hungarian uprising against the Soviets in 1956. In 1957 I immigrated to Montreal, which I consider my hometown.

After earning a Bachelor's of Commerce degree from Sir George Williams University and a Chartered Accountant's degree from McGill University, I have been practicing as a Chartered Accountant for almost 40 years.

My wife, Mari, and I have just celebrated our 30th wedding anniversary, and we have one son, Ralph, who also lives in Montreal. We have two beautiful grandchildren; Justin, 7, and Kayleigh, 6.

Q: How did you become interested in bridge?

A: Originally, it wasn't exactly for the best of reasons. It was 1961, and my roommate, a fellow-Hungarian, came to me one day and said, "This is ridiculous! We are immigrants in a new country, but we don't know anybody and we aren't involved in any social activities. How are we supposed to meet girls?"

Anyway, he had gotten involved at a local bridge club and he needed a partner, so I played with him.

But my connection to the game was much deeper than that, although I didn't know it at the time. My father, who died in 1963, was a bridge player although I never knew it until 10 years after his death. In 1973, I went to South America and I met my father's brother, who was living in Montevideo, for the first time.

While I was there, my uncle revealed to me that he had a great passion, bridge, and that he had won the South American championship. I expressed my surprise and told

Las Vegas 2001 is truly international

Las Vegas 2001 is a truly international tournament. Players from at least 33 nations are competing here. There may be others – sometimes the abbreviations used to denote foreign countries are difficult to decipher!

Europe leads the way with 18 representatives – Austria, Czech Republic, England, France, Greece, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Italy, Luxembourg, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Russia, Scotland, Spain, Switzerland and Wales. Luxembourg is a first-time visitor.

Of course North America has its usual four – Bermuda, Canada, Mexico and the United States.

We frequently have had players from Brazil and Argentina representing South America, but neither nation is here this time. However, there are three South American countries here – Colombia, Uruguay and Venezuela. This is the first visit for both Colombia and Uruguay.

There are three Far East nations represented here – China, Japan and Korea. Approximately 10 Chinese and 30 Japanese made the trip across the Pacific, but many more – another 30 Chinese and 70 Japanese – originally were booked but canceled their reservations after the September 11 disaster. Indonesia usually sends a few players here, and they tried to come but ran into visa problems.

Two Middle East nations are represented here, and one made the headlines yesterday – a pair from Turkey surprised the world by winning the prestigious Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs. The other country is Israel.

Haiti and Jamaica are the Caribbean representatives. As for Oceania, Australia has a large contingent here. Surprisingly, no players from New Zealand have been recorded here.

Nickell in front as Reisinger enters 2nd day

The team of Nick Nickell, Richard Freeman, Eric Rodwell, Jeff Meckstroth, Bob Hamman and Paul Soloway finished the two qualifying sessions of the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams with a score of 36.50 to lead the field of 62 squads.

In second is the team of George Jacobs, Ralph Katz, Giorgio Duboin, Norberto Bocchi, Alfredo Versace and Lorenzo Lauria with 35.50.

Today's semifinal round will feature the 28 squads that survived yesterday's cut. The cutoff score for qualification was 26.60.

Irina Levitina was also a winner in the Transnational Teams, as she was a member of the highest-scoring Mixed Team in the contest.



Truscott leads NA Swiss

In second with 114 VPs is the team of Steve Bruno, Darrell Keel, Michael Levy and Joe Harris.

The cutoff score for qualification to today's semifinal round was 81 VPs.

Yesterday's action featured eight seven-board matches, scored on the 20-point Victory Point scale.

Norm Gordon of Montreal reported the following deal from the Friday Stratified Open Pairs. Gordon was playing with a pickup partner, Hansi Torczyner of Burlingame CA. Torczyner executed a double squeeze on this layout to bring home her contract.

After South doubled the one-ace response to Blackwood, Torczyner upgraded her diamond honors and bid the slam.

North led a low diamond which ran to the queen and ace. Declarer cashed her club honors (North pitching a diamond and a heart) and exited with the ♦J to South's king. This was the position:

South returned a low heart, won by declarer's ace. The ♦10 was cashed and North, unable to let go of a spade, discarded the ♥10. A spade to the jack held, and Torczyner then played dummy's top spades. South was now pinched out of a heart since he couldn't let go of his last diamond. Declarer discarded her diamond. With both defenders now reduced to one heart each, declarer simply crossed to the ♥K and her last heart was good. Making six.

Note, however, that the defense can do better. In the diagrammed position, South must return a spade to destroy the timing of the squeeze.

A simple answer

When Ralph Cohen and I sat East-West in the first semifinal session of the Blue Ribbon Pairs, this interesting deal came up.

We defended the routine 3NT on the natural lead of the ♥9. Declarer won my ♥Q with the ace and played the ♣A and a club to the king. When the suit split he played a diamond to his queen and Ralph's ace. Now it was tough (though certainly very possible) for East to continue the suit to hold declarer to 10 tricks. Of course if declarer sets up his heart winner before setting up diamonds, we clear the hearts and again declarer is held to 10 tricks. So is there no genuine route to 11 tricks?

The answer is simple for declarer: duck trick one, since you know the ♥K-Q are on your right - now the tempo is on your side for 11 tricks.

Magical Taxi Ride

The first half of the 2001 Bermuda Bowl/Venice Cup was played in the magnificent Stade de France in Paris. The organizers, led by WBF President Jose Damiani, had achieved the almost impossible by relocating the championships from Bali to Paris on a few weeks notice. Transportation was arranged between the host hotel and the playing site prior to and at the end of the playing sessions. Between sessions, however, I had to find my own way back from the stadium to the hotel. The charming French hostess suggested I share a cab back to the hotel with two players who were just leaving.

The players turned out to be one of the finest pairs in the world, Norwegians Geir Helgemo and Tor Helness, who eventually won the silver medal in the Bermuda Bowl.

I asked the pair for an interesting hand, and Helness was kind enough to mention that in the match against Poland he did not succeed in a makeable small spade slam. The key on the deal was to play the following side suit for one loser:

How would you play it? When Helness asked me, I foolishly announced that I would play the ace, without even asking about the rest of the hand. Well, here it is. Even when you see all 52 cards the answer is far from obvious:

Do you believe in magic? That's what it takes to make this contract. Give full credit to Deep Finesse, a software program that solves double dummy problems, for coming up with the solution. This analysis was originally reported by Fred Gitelman in the daily bulletins in Paris:

"There is only one solution. Declarer must ruff the ♦A and immediately ruff a heart in dummy. A trump to his hand, ruff another heart, cross back in trumps and ruff his last heart. Declarer now ruffs a diamond back to his hand, stranding the king of that suit in the dummy! Three more rounds of trumps lead to the following end position:

"When declarer plays the last spade, West discards a diamond and declarer throws a club from dummy. Now a low club is played. West wins but has no good return.

How double dummy is this?

At the point before declarer overtakes the spade to return to hand, he can be sure of the distribution in spades and hearts, and on the auction the diamond position is probably clear as well, so the clubs are known to be 4-1."

Pietro Bernasconi, the master magician, and creator of the par contest problems, who passed away recently, would have been proud of this deal. One just never knows when one can find a masterpiece in a Parisian taxi.

One pip wrong

In our just published book, "The Magic Of Bridge" (which should be available in North America in the next week or so), David Bird and I devote a chapter to the rarest of all squeezes, those involving just one suit.

One of the problems in finding such squeezes in real life is that the conditions are so precise that even one card in the wrong place can spoil these potentially beautiful endings. This was the case on Board 2 from the second session of the semifinals of the Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs. If the great card shuffler had been in a more esthetic mood, he would have swapped the ♣9 and ♣3 to produce:

Suppose West led the ♥5, won in hand with the queen. Declarer would count 11 top tricks and hope for diamonds to provide the 12th. After cashing dummy's ♦A and playing the ♦8, covered by the 9 and king, this option would be dashed. Now the only hope would be that West started with the four top clubs or the club suit was as above.

After cashing the four spade winners and the ♥K, these cards would remain:

When the ♥7 is played to dummy's ace, West has no winning option. If he discards the ♣6, declarer can duck a club to endplay West for a lead away from the ♣K. If instead he unblocks the ♣J, declarer leads the ♣7 to the 9, queen and king. Then West has to lead from the ♣ 10-6 into dummy's ♣A-8!

On the actual hand, as South held the ♣9 and East the ♣3. The ending was:



Now declarer always has two club tricks as long as West has the ♣K. Just lead the ♣7 from dummy and duck in hand when East followed with the 3. West had the unhappy choice of winning and then leading away from ♣K for declarer's 12th trick.

Rules for appeals

Players who have an appeal pending are requested to appear at the appeals screening room no later than 30 minutes following the completion of play in the session.

Appellants who fail to appear within this period may have their appeal dismissed or may be subject to penalty. Non-appellants who fail to appear will forfeit their right to provide statements in their own behalf.

Swiss Teams battle for Keohane Trophy

Play began yesterday in the six-session North American Swiss Teams, with semifinal matches on Monday and the final matches on Tuesday.

Players will be vying for the Keohane Trophy, which was donated by Ethel Keohane in 1973 in memory of her husband, William H. Keohane, one of the leading New England bridge personalities.

Bill Keohane was elected in 1972 to a one-year term as District 25's first District Director. He died later that year, just before he would have attended his first Board meeting.

The Keohane Trophy was presented for the Open Individual Championship until it was re-designated in 1995 by the ACBL Board of Directors for the North American Swiss Teams. Keohane was intensely interested in promoting Individual events. New England's renowned Keohane Individual became the largest event of its kind in the world because of the promotional work done by Keohane.

Endless possibilities

Morrie Kleinplatz of Windson ON brought us a truly fascinating hand from the first semifinal of the Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs.

Dlr: West ♠ K 7
 Vul: Both ♥ –

Morrie found a neat way to extract the maximum penalty here. Greg Arbour led the ♣A and gave his partner a club ruff. Morrie, noting that partner led the ♣9 for the ruff, returned a spade to the king and ace. Declarer cashed one top heart and then got out with a spade to South's queen. This was the position:

Morrie saw that he was endplayed, but he found a solution – he led the ♥Q! Declarer won in dummy, but now there was no way for him to get a diamond ruff. Declarer lost the ♣A, a club ruff, a spade, a trump and three diamonds for minus 800.

If Morrie had returned a spade, the suit would have been set up for declarer while he still had an entry. If he led a diamond, dummy's ♦K would score. What happens if Morrie leads his small trump? Declarer wins in hand, draws South's last trump with his ace and puts South in with a spade. South has to put dummy back in business whether he leads a spade or a diamond.

But wait! What if declarer, at trick five, cashes the ♥K and gets out with a trump to South's queen? Once again South is endplayed since he is down to all spades and diamonds. Does it do any good if South gets rid of his trump queen on the king? No, declarer can lead his last trump to South's 8 and allow the 8 to hold to effect the same endplay.

All well and good, but does South have an answer? Yes! He can play his ♥8 on an earlier trick and keep a low heart so that declarer can't put him in.

Great! But does declarer have an answer to this play? It appears so. He can keep the ♥2 in his hand so that he can underplay South's ♥4 and execute the spade-diamond endplay.

But wait! If declarer saves his lowest heart and South plays the ♥8 earlier, the ♥5 can draw South's last trump and hold the lead, since declarer can follow with the deuce. Now declarer can lead a spade to South's 10 and the endplay is in effect again.

In other words, it is possible for declarer to escape for only two down – minus 500.

The Facts: 2♥ doubled made four, +670 for North-South. The opening lead was the ♥K. The Director was called at the end of the play. The North-South convention cards did not have DONT marked on them. North-

South said they had agreed to play it while traveling to the tournament and North had forgotten the agreement. The Director ruled that even assuming an incorrect explanation there was no connection between the infraction and the result: East's penalty double seemed uncalled for. Therefore, the result was allowed to stand.

The Appeal: East-West appealed the Director's ruling. South and West did not attend the hearing. The Screening Director told the Committee that the Directors believed North's statement that he had misbid and as a result there was no misinformation.

However, even assuming an incorrect explanation there was no connection between the infraction and the result. East said that when he was told that North's 2♥ bid showed hearts and spades, he no longer had a way to get to 2♠. He believed there was a reasonable chance his partner held four hearts and his side had the balance of the points, so he chose to double. He backed up his judgment with the ♥K lead.

East was unaware until the Committee's questioning of North that N/S had system notes showing that their agreement was as explained. North said that he and his partner went over DONT as a run-out while traveling together to the NABC. He agreed to play it, though it was too late to list it on their laminated convention cards.

North produced typewritten system notes for the Committee. North said he forgot the agreement to play DONT. He said he was just lucky his partner had hearts rather than spades because he believed he would have been required to pass a correction to 2♠ even if doubled. North had not previously made a DONT run-out error.

The Committee Decision: North's explanation that he misbid was reasonably credible, but became indisputable when he produced system notes to support it. At that point, it was clear there could be no adjustment since misbidding is not an infraction and the explanation of North's bid as DONT (showing hearts and spades) was a correct statement of the partnership agreement.

The Committee rejected the idea of a procedural penalty since North-South obeyed the laws of the game;

North simply misbid. The Committee then considered the merit of the appeal. Based on the knowledge that East-West were known to have possessed when they brought the appeal, the Committee concluded: (1) East-West did not know of the existence of system notes, and (2) they did know that +140 for North-South was achieved at the other table. Since they did not know of the system notes, it was reasonable for them to think that the presumption of misinformation might weigh more heavily than North's explanation of his agreement.

Even assuming misinformation, it was East's bridge judgment that he needed to be "active", and it was his self-described "eccentric" penalty that broke the chain of causality between any imputed infraction and a possible adjustment. Thus, East should not have appealed the Director's ruling.

Further, East could have asked to withdraw the appeal once he became aware of the system notes but did not. Thus, E/W were each issued an Award Without Merit Point.

The Facts: 2♠ went down one, +50 for North-South. The opening lead was the ♥5. The Director was called at the end of the auction. North stated that West had fingered the bid cards before passing over 2♣. The Director ruled that East's double was canceled and the contract changed to 2♣ made three, +110 for N/S.

The Appeal: East-West appealed the Director's ruling. Only East-West attended the hearing. (North-South declined to appear as they had a very poor game.) West stated that he merely held the bid cards for about 2 seconds while he silently reviewed the bidding and then passed. When asked by the table Director why he agreed that he fingered the bid cards, he said he did not hear North's accusation but he did hold the bid cards briefly. He added that North was very soft-spoken.

The Panel Decision: The table Director was asked about West's actions. She said that North had not demonstrated what she claimed West did with the bid cards at the time of the ruling. North chose not to appear even though the hearing was held close to where N/S had played and started immediately after the session. The table Director believed it was possible that West had not understood what misconduct he was agreeing to at the table. Since N/S were not present to support their contentions, the Panel found insufficient evidence of any irregularity to warrant a score adjustment. The table result of 2♠ down one, +50 for North-South, was restored.

The Facts: 4♦ doubled made four, +510 for N/S. The opening lead was the ♠Q. The Director was called after the 4♦ bid. North's hesitation before bidding 3♦ was agreed but South stated that it was not prolonged. The Director ruled that South had shown his values with his previous calls and that pass was a logical alternative. The contract was changed to 3♠ down one, +100 for North-South (Laws 16A2, 12C2).



Carl and Marilyn Bowman made a major push in the second session of the 99er's Pairs that moved them all the way up into second place.

The Appeal: North-South appealed the Director's ruling and were the only players to attend the hearing. South claimed that his earlier bids made it clear that he intended to continue and that North's slow 3♦ bid did not affect his intentions. Furthermore, North would have bid 4♦ if South had passed so North-South were going to act over 3♠ in any case. North-South conceded that North had hesitated 15-25 seconds before his 3♦ bid.

The Committee Decision: The Committee believed that unauthorized information was present: North's 3♦ was slow and he was clearly choosing among alternatives. The only possibility was a stronger action over South's cuebid. The fact that South had already shown his values did not prevent him from taking further action consistent with his hand and the previous auction. North had shown extra offense and a sixth diamond by bidding 2♦ freely, and competing to 4♦ with the South hand was consistent with the auction without any unauthorized information present. In addition, the Committee agreed with North's statement that even if South was constrained to pass, North would have bid 4♦. The table result of 4♦ doubled made four, +510 for N/S was restored.

The Facts: 3♦ doubled went down two, +500 for N/S. The opening lead was the ♥7. The Director was called at the end of the play and ruled that there had been no violation of Law 73C or 16A. The table result was allowed to stand.

The Appeal: East-West appealed the Director's ruling and were the only players to attend the hearing. East-West described their methods. West said that from his perspective it was likely that East had a balanced 15-17 HCP and that was why he chose his final call.

The Committee Decision: The Committee acknowledged the hesitation and the fact that it made action with the North cards more attractive. The issue was therefore whether there was a logical alternative to pass for North. Considering the level of the event and North's ability, double was still not, in the Committee's opinion, anything like a sure thing. Switch the ♠Q and ♠K and 3♦ would have been laydown. In fact, even as the cards lay the contract was very close to making. On that basis the Committee decided to disallow the double and to consider the appropriate score adjustment for each side. Scores ranging from +100 to +200 were considered for North-South and from -100 to -500 for East-West. It was decided that the probability associated with North passing 3♦ and South reopening with 3♠ rather than double met the appropriate criteria for both sides. The contract was changed to 3♠ made three, +140 for North-South.

Last year's Reisinger: a classic squeaker

Last year's Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams was a classic squeaker with less than a full board separating the top three teams. The team captained by George Jacobs eked out the victory.

Jacobs and his team -- Ralph Katz and Italian aces Alfredo Versace, Lorenzo Lauria, Norberto Bocchi and Giorgio Duboin -- finished slightly more than half a board ahead of Richard Finberg, Mark Lair, Gary Cohler, Mike Cappelletti and Jerry Goldfein. The squad led by non-playing captain Lou Ann O'Rourke (Billy Miller, Curtis Cheek, Roger Bates, Ron Smith) was only a quarter of a board further back.

The Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams, a grueling six-session event played in the tough board-a-match format, is generally conceded to be one of the toughest events on the ACBL calendar.

Last year's event was so tough, in fact, that the Nick Nickell team (Richard Freeman, Bob Hamman, Paul Soloway, Jeff Meckstroth, Eric Rodwell) and the Rita Shugart team (Andrew Robson, Tony Forrester, Geir Helgemo) didn't make it to the final round.

The event is contested for the Reisinger Trophy (the Chicago Trophy until 1965). It is a six-session open team-of-four event scored by board-a-match with two qualifying sessions, two semifinal sessions and two final sessions. It was contested as a four-session championship until 1966.

The event began in 1929 as the North American Open Team Championship and the prize was the Chicago Trophy, donated by the Auction Bridge Club of Chicago. (In 1928, the open team competition was for the Harold S. Vanderbilt Cup.)

The Chicago Trophy was replaced in 1965 by the Reisinger Memorial Trophy, donated by the Greater New York Bridge Association in memory of Curt H. Reisinger.

Reisinger (1891-1964), New York City, was a principal patron of contract bridge and the American Contract Bridge League in the early years of both.

Reisinger was a great-grandson of Anheuser and a grandson of Busch, co-founders of the brewery from which he inherited great wealth. That wealth enabled him to become a stalwart financial supporter of the game, as well as a noted philanthropist on a far larger scale.

In the years when there was often a struggle to meet the League's modest payroll, Reisinger was often called upon and never failed to help with a loan or an outright gift. His support made possible several early contract bridge tournaments, clubs and books.

Among the positions in which he served were director of the United States Bridge Association, president of the Greater New York Bridge Association and chairman of the ACBL. In 1953, Reisinger was named ACBL *Honorary Member*.

him that I had thought that I was the first person in our family to play bridge.

"No!" he replied, "Your father loved bridge."

"I don't remember my father ever playing the game," I said, puzzled.

My uncle then explained to me that when my father and mother had gotten married, she insisted that he give up the game and never mention it to his children. She did this because my father loved to play rubber bridge for stakes that were beyond his means. When I asked where my father had learned to play, my uncle told me that he had learned from his mother (my grandmother)!

So I come from a family of bridge players, although I didn't know it until I was in my mid-thirties.

Bridge has been an important part of my life and has introduced me to some of my best and life-long friends. On the Board of Directors, my very best friend was the late Bernard Warshauer from District 7. Mari and I are still close to his wife Genie.

Also, I have probably the longest running partnership in Montreal with Brian Fraser. I really enjoy playing with him. After we had played several years, I once asked him, "Why do you put up with me?"

He answered, "Because I like playing with a stronger player."

I told him, "That's crazy. You're clearly the better player." But therein was the secret to our long-term partnership: every bridge player wants to play with a stronger partner than himself, and we each believe the other is better.

My philosophy of life, my guiding principles are these: friendship, freedom and love. My friends are life-long, my early life taught me how precious freedom is, and love ... love requires no explanation.

Q: How did you become involved in bridge administration?

A: I started in the Seventies. First, I became the treasurer for the Montreal Bridge League, and later I became the tournament chairman. In 1979, I ran for the ACBL Board of Directors. When I was elected, Mari took over the tournament chair responsibilities for the MBL and did an excellent job for them for many years.

As part of the ACBL Board, I have served as chairman of the finance committee and also as treasurer.

In 1989, I was elected as a representative to the World Bridge Federation. I became the WBF treasurer in 1990, and was elected WBF vice-president in 1998.

Q: Tell us about the upcoming world championships in Montreal in 2002.

A: This is a dream come true for me, a project I have been working on for 15 years. I very much wanted Montreal to host a world championship, and it was very exciting when the site was approved.

Montreal, a beautiful, cosmopolitan city, is one of the least-expensive major cities in the world.

We're expecting some 6000 players to attend, including most of the top players in the world. Montreal will feature a very player-friendly schedule. If someone is eliminated from a knockout event, there is always some other contest he can enter. In addition, there will be a full regional schedule. Full WBF and ACBL masterpoints will be awarded in all events — two sets of masterpoints for the price of one. We believe that this will be the largest world championship ever.

Q: What would you like to accomplish during your tenure as ACBL president?

A: First, I would like the organization to aim for providing greater service at less cost. The ACBL's overhead is extremely high, and with the assistance of the Board and the new CEO, I would like to examine ways to reduce it.

Secondly, I would like to continue our cooperation with the WBF. We must strive to make bridge part of the Olympic games, and we must concentrate our efforts to get the U.S. Bridge Federation accepted by the U.S. Olympic Committee. (The Canadian Bridge Federation has already cleared this hurdle. Through Retek's efforts, the CBF has already been accepted as part of the Canadian Olympic Association as of December 2000.)

Lastly, I'd like to improve the relations between ACBL and the CBF. One situation causing a lot of friction is the exchange rate between the U.S. dollar and the deteriorating Canadian dollar. Canadian members have experienced a large increase in costs due to the exchange rate. On top of that, ACBL costs have risen some in the past several years creating a situation viewed as harmful by many Canadian members.

At the time of his tragic death, Steven was not playing much bridge – he was too busy raising his family. He started getting interested in the game when he was 14. He read a 300-page book about bidding because his stepfather promised to play a game at the local club game if he did. However, there was more to it than that – after he read the book, he had to pass Harold's test. The family giggled and laughed – they didn't think there was a chance Steven could pass the test.

"Boy, were we wrong," says his sister, Jayne Furman of Las Vegas. "Steven aced the test."

Not too long before Sept. 11, Steven wrote an email to his brother Andrew expressing his concern for a New Jersey woman he didn't know who was killed abroad in a terrorist attack. "He talked about keeping the memory of this woman alive," said his brother, "and now he himself is a victim of a terrorist attack."

"Intellectually he was brilliant," said his sister. "Whatever he applied himself to, he could do."

"He was too smart," said Andrew. "He was an asset to anyone who knew him."

His mother Joyce naturally is having a very hard time accepting the fact that her son is dead. Joyce herself is fighting a terrible battle with cancer. "It's been a bad year," she said.

Here's Kantar's answer:

At trick three lead the ♦5 to the ace. Assuming nothing happens, reenter your hand with a trump and lead the ♦9. If West follows, the contract is assured. Play the queen from dummy. If it loses to the king, you have sufficient entries to establish the fifth diamond. If West shows out on the second diamond, run the 9 to East's jack, later running the queen through East's king to set up the ♦10 for a club discard.
