Wooldridge stays hot, wins Silodor with Wolpert

With a first and second in national events at the Spring NABC already in his pocket, Joel Wooldridge added another prize with a third partner, as he and Gavin Wolpert came through with an impressive victory in the Silodor Open Pairs.

The winners' final margin was more than a board clear of the runners-up, Jill Meyers and Jill Levin.

Reminded of his two firsts and one second, Wooldridge added with a smile, "So far - the tournament's not over yet."

In the North American Pairs, Flight A, Wooldridge and Kevin Bathurst came in second. In the Norman Kay Platinum Pairs, he and John Hurd won by nearly three boards.

The Silodor victory was the sixth North American championship for Wooldridge, the fourth for Wolpert, who plays full time and manages his new web site - Bridge Winners (bridgewinners.com).

Wooldridge and Wolpert don't play together a lot, but they are teammates on the Robert Hampton team.

Schuld, Michelin take Whitehead Women's

New partners Diana Schuld and Marjorie Michelin shook off a poor start in the Whitehead Women's Pairs, putting together two good games in the two final sessions to win the event by about 15 matchpoints on a top of 25.

Second place went to Sylvia Moss and Judi Radin of New York City.

Until last year, Schuld was the owner of a bridge club in Lake Success NY, but "it went under water" and she retired from the business. Lately, Schuld says, she has been doing a lot of ballroom dancing. "It's competitive, and I'm competitive," she says.

Michelin is originally from Detroit, now living in Laguna Woods CA. She is an interior designer. She and Schuld were playing together for the first time after playing as teammates previously.

Entering the second day of play in 25th place, Schuld and Michelin posted a 63% game in the first final session and followed with a 59.23% in the second.

Nickell, Cayne fall in Vanderbilt quarterfinal

The team captained by Martin Fleisher, down 20-0 after the first six boards of the fourth quarter, won the next 10 by a score of 53-3 to march into the semifinal round of the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams with a 131-108 win over the No. 2 seed, Nick Nickell.

Also rallying to victory was the Chinese squad led by Meng Kang, 176-149 victors over Seymon Deutsch. Originally seeded No. 41, Kang was involved in an appeal that wasn't settled until about 3:30 a.m. Friday. The decision left them as winners over the George Jacobs team.

The opening set against Deutsch on Friday did not go well for the Chinese squad. Deutsch won 58-4 and held a 37-IMP lead at the halfway point. With a quarter to go, Deutsch was still ahead 136-114. Kang won the fourth quarter 62-13.

In the other matches, the Joe Grue squad, originally seeded No. 21, took care of the James Cayne team 177-150, and No. 3 seed John Diamond dispatched Mary Ann Berg 148-111.

Today's matchups pit Kang against Grue and Diamond against Fleisher. The Fleisher squad finished second in the Vanderbilt in Reno last year.

Pennsylvania pair wins Red Ribbon in a squeaker

Ten-year partnership Brad Barry and David Amsterdam decided to "warm up" before playing in the North American Pairs. Two days later they are the winners of the Bean Red Ribbon Pairs.

The pair, Barry of Phoenixville PA and Amsterdam of Wayne PA, were 15th after the first day of play. They scored 65.21% to move into second and followed with a 57.16% game in the evening to move into first. Their score of 1444.38 (including carryover) was less than 3 matchpoints

Galt House Parking

In order to receive the Galt House parking discount, you must do the following:

Self Parking - \$7

Players who drive in each day: Show your convention card at the concierge desk in the lobby of the Galt House to receive a parking validation ticket. You will need to pick up a ticket each day of the tournament. If you leave during the day and come back, you will need to pick up a new ticket. Your parking validation ticket is good for 17 hours (for example, 8 a.m. to 1 a.m.).

Galt House guests: Your room key will be used to go in and out of the parking garage. Please be sure to tell the front desk agent that you are with ACBL.

Monitoring

At this and future North American Championships, ACBL will be monitoring NABC+ events with visible, real-time cameras. The images will be recorded and will be available for later official inspection and review.

By general monitoring of the session and participants' behavior, ACBL has another source of information that may be useful in determining facts and settling issues arising from some types of ethical and behavioral complaints or actions. Please summon a director if a problem occurs at the table.

This procedure is intended to assure everyone that the playing field is level and that misbehavior will not be tolerated.

JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

In the homestretch

You're coming into the homestretch, aren't you? You just have today and tomorrow to gallop to all the fun you can. And you will...you have special lectures, special events and dozens of bridge events.

If you haven't already tried team events, do so. If you haven't tried a midnight game (and are actually up at that hour!), that's an experience in itself.



There's a saying that "on any given day, any horse can win," and my husband, Gary, and I proved that the first time we played in a midnight game. We were beginners, the bridge equivalent of 2-year-olds, with fewer than 5 masterpoints, and we were at the Las Vegas NABC, I forget the year. Gary convinced me that I could play one more session. "Come on, Honey. It will be fun." (So many times in my life I've fallen for that line, rarely with good results!)

We signed up for Midnight Speedball, where you have to play a board every five minutes. We weren't the least worried about the five minutes; we didn't play well, but we sure played fast. We showed up in the right place at the right time, and were horrified to see that all the Semi-Big Horses were also entered, and most of them were surrounded by an entourage. And they had all been to the bar first. Oh, had they been to the bar. (Notice I'm not naming names here, folks. Get me privately for that.)

Gary and I were semi-paralyzed with fear (partly because I had never played with six kibitzers at the table. It was like the circus had come to town...) and were very timid with our bidding. Not the Semi-Bigs, tho'. They were bidding up a storm. Gary and I caught on fast that if we just kept quiet and then double their contracts we could rack up a few nice boards. Our strategy worked and at the end, we had come in second. Several of the S-Bs gave us some looks as if to say, "How dare those second-rate horses beat us!" Ha! On that night, the long-shots won.

This also reminds me of a story. When Edith McMullin was head of I/N for ACBL, she would go to the dining room very early for breakfast so she could get a head start on the day. She noticed that at dawn, the dining room was filled with the real Big Horses... who had all obviously just been jogging or to the gym, and were breakfasting on fruit and whole-grain breads and oatmeal, and talking about how they could improve their games. She called it the Breakfast of Champions.

The only place success comes before work is in the dictionary.

Another very important lesson I learned at the racetrack is that in the horse world, your reputation is everything. Just like the bridge world, which is also small and arcane, everyone knows everyone, and no one forgets anything. Ever. I would hear my dad talking about how, with that person you could do business on a handshake. But the other guy...don't buy a soda from him without a notarized receipt.

In the bridge world, reputation and respect are right out front too. For example, there's a player who occasionally shows up at our club. This person prides himself that he only has his bid 50% of the time. The rest, he's making what he likes to refer to as "tactical" bids. No one takes him seriously as a player, only the newest uninitiated people will be his partner, and when he announced that he had become a director, people ran from the room so they could laugh.

What impresses people in the bridge world? Besides big winners? For one thing, a less-experienced player gains a lot of respect just by taking lessons, by asking the advanced players how they would run the race for a particular hand, by watching and imitating the finest ethics and manners. People watch how you treat your partners, how you act when you trip up on a hand, how you act when you obviously take a



top from someone. Your reputation is being built every day.

Earlier I said that no one ever forgets anything. Here's proof. The first time I ever played at a club, I was looking for an icebreaker, and I saw a notice for Swiss Teams on the bulletin board. "How long," I asked a woman, "will the Swiss be in town?" This was in 1989. Recently I heard someone say, "Remember the time Marti wanted to know how long the Swiss would be here?" Everyone laughed. Folks, it's been 22 years. C'mon, gimme a break here!

So today we've looked at two racetrack truisms: On any given day, any horse can win, and not only is your reputation everything, no one forgets anything. Tomorrow you will get your last lesson from the racetrack. Meantime, let me know how it's going and stay out of the bar! mronemus@comcast.net

Thinking bridge

Opening lead: ♥ 3.

East plays the ♥K. Plan the play.

Bidding commentary: Your redouble after a takeout double to your right is *not* an SOS redouble. On the contrary, it shows a strong hand in the range of 18 to 20 high-card points with at least five diamonds. With 18-19 HCP and no

five-card suit, try 1NT to show partner you are still alive and well. I'm not sure whether this is standard fare or I have just made it up!

Your redouble affords North the opportunity to compete to 2♦, assured that your side has at least half of the HCP plus an eight-card diamond fit. After the 2♦ bid, neither East nor West has anything sensible to add.

Defensive commentary: East-West do best not to lead spades, though they may not know it. If they do, it makes it easier for you to lose but one spade trick having a dummy entry to take a second spade finesse if necessary.

Play commentary: It can't hurt to win the opening lead and exit a club, hoping for a spade shift. However, if the defenders cash their heart tricks and are clever enough to play a club and a club, forcing you to ruff, you must attack spades. Cross to the ♦Q and lead a spade to the jack (higher equal). Assuming West wins, West is in a bit of a bind. A spade return ends everything as you have the A-10. If West leads a trump, play the nine and hope that will be a second dummy entry to take a second spade finesse. If West leads a heart, discard a spade from dummy, ruff in your hand, and then play the ace and ruff a spade.

Electronic Device Policy

1. For all NABC+ rated events at NABCs: Electronic devices, including but not limited to, phones, cameras, PDAs, and others capable of sending or receiving electronic communication are excluded from the playing areas during any session of play. This does not apply to health-related equipment.



2. For all events at an NABC other than a NABC+ rated event: Except for health-related equipment, or by permission of the Director-in-Charge of the tournament, cell phones, audible pagers or similar equipment may not be operated or operable in any manner in the playing area

during a session of play. Any such equipment must not be visible during the session. Sponsoring organizations of other ACBL-sanctioned events are encouraged to adopt a similar policy.

3. These restrictions in numbers 1 and 2 above apply to all pairs, team members, captains, coaches, play recorders (except those designated by ACBL) and kibitzers and are in force throughout any actual playing session or segment of play.

4. A violation of any of the restrictions in numbers 1 and 2 above will result in a disciplinary penalty of one full board (12 IMPs at that form of scoring) for the first offense. A second offense will result in disqualification from the event for the pair/team. Kibitzers violating this policy will be removed from the playing area for the remainder of the session.

Zia makes a double escape

In the nail-biting finish of the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams match between the Nick Nickell and Lou Ann O'Rourke squads, Zia was let off the hook on two occasions.

Roger Bates led the ♥Q, taken in dummy with the king. Rodwell played a diamond to the jack, and Bates won the queen. He could not continue hearts without giving up a trick, so he exited with a club. Rodwell went up with dummy's king, taken by Eddie Wold with the ace. A spade was returned to the 10, jack and queen. Rodwell cashed the ♠A, pitching his losing heart, and claimed nine tricks.

North led the ♣K. Zia ducked, and North continued a second club. Zia won in dummy and led a heart. North won and switched to the ♦8, won by South with the king. The ♣Q followed and Bas Drijver had to pitch.

A heart pitch would have led to an easy three-trick set when South could play a trump through. North would win, play a heart to South's ace for a heart ruff and still make two more trumps. North pitched a diamond, however, and when South played a second diamond Zia was able to escape for down 2, enough to win the match by 3 IMPs.

Even after the diamond pitch the defense could have played a trump through declarer and obtained down three. Originally, the board was scored as down one then changed to down two. Down three would have won O'Rourke 3 IMPs instead of losing 3 and they would have won the match by 3 IMPs

On board 62, South missed a chance for a brilliancy.

Wold led the ♦5, and when Jeff Meckstroth played how from dummy, Bates inserted the 10. Meckstroth won the ♦J and played on trumps. When that suit split favorably, he claimed plus 110.

North led a club. Zia won in dummy, led a diamond to the king and played trumps. South won the trump ace and forced dummy with three rounds of hearts. Zia pulled trumps, but North had no entry for his long hearts and Zia was able to establish a long diamond trick by conceding two diamond tricks to South.

Consider what happens if South had played his ♦Q at trick two! After all the trumps are out and Zia plays a second Diamond, North can win the ♦J, and cash two heart winners. The contract then goes down one, resulting in a 2-IMP loss for the O'Rourke team instead of the actual 6-IMP loss. O'Rourke would then have won by 1 IMP.

Too good to miss

Versatile player finds a role at big tournaments

In the fall of 2009, Nalita Hall showed up in Sao Paulo, Brazil, during the World Bridge Team Championships. She was a long way from her home in the Columbus OH suburb of Westerville.

It turns out Hall was there with a job to do, mostly using her fluency in Portuguese to help as a translator.

Hall is a native of Brazil and a resident of the country until 12 years ago. She was born to an American father and Brazilian mother and lived in Rio de Janeiro. She moved to Ohio because her father had relatives in the Columbus area. She has dual American and Brazilian citizenship.

During her visit to Louisville for the NABC, she had time visit with an old friend from Brazil, former World Bridge Federation President Ernesto d'Orsi. They have known each other since the late Seventies, when Hall traveled from Rio to Sao Paulo for the world championships, helping to organize the tournament.

"She did a great job," d'Orsi said.

A retired psychologist, Hall earned a master's degree in the discipline at the Catholic University of Rio, and she wrote her thesis on bridge and inductive reasoning.

In Sao Paulo at the 2009 world championships, she took WBF officials on tours and translated for them, among other duties.

Bridge Big draws positive comments

The founders of Bridge Big have some big dreams, the most ambitious of which is to organize Internet bridge tournaments for serious-money cash prizes.

A demonstration at the Galt House Hotel on Friday didn't draw as well as founders Rene De Waele and Nira Talova had hoped – and there were some problems with Internet connections – but they remain optimistic that they will succeed in giving bridge a shot in the arm.

One of their most enthusiastic proponents is Zia Mahmood, who took part in the demo and proclaimed afterward that other players who showed up “gave us some very positive feedback.”

Zia believes that the cash-prize aspect of the Bridge Big plan will take bridge to where poker is now – or at least pretty close.

The demo, he said, “was the beginning. They will solve the technical thing.”

De Waele and Talova, who are married, plan to start beta testing of the online game in mid-April. Through Friday, they had signed up 150 testers through an appeal in the Daily Bulletin.

If you are interested in being a tester, visit bridgebig.com for more information.

Zia said the success of the effort will boil down to “the way you score it and security. If the security is handled, it will work.”

Bridge Big's developers have invested a lot of time drawing up a system to protect the field from

players who might want to take unfair advantage. As outlined in the Daily Bulletin on Thursday (issue No. 7), the security system is solid.

“We want to lower the chance of cheating to near zero,” said De Waele. “There is a solution that people can live with.”

Talova pointed out that playing on Bridge Big, which is browser-based, requires no downloads or anything more than just going to bridgebig.com.

De Waele said the beta phase will include some cash-prize tournaments.

Bridge Big is expected to go online for official business some time during the summer. They are working toward having a total prize purse of \$30,000 for the top finishers in the debut tournament. Down the road, if all goes well, the winning player in one of their tournaments may take home \$100,000 or more.

De Waele said the idea for Bridge Big entered his mind 10 years ago, mostly because he was bored with playing poker online – and considers bridge a vastly superior game. The idea was to find a way to give bridge the same allure that poker has.

De Waele and Talova are hoping players will offer constructive criticism and suggestions for improving the product.

Hero or goat

Richard Oshlag of Memphis found himself as West in 3♣ after a Michaels auction in which North had stayed remarkably silent.

The defenders played the ♦K, ♥A, ♦A and a third diamond. Oshlag ruffed high in dummy, drew three rounds of trumps, ending in hand, then ran the diamonds. This was the ending with South still to discard:

♠ 8	♠ A Q 7
♥ Q J 7	♥ –
♦ –	♦ –
♣ –	♣ 10
♠ 6 2	♠ K J (10/5)
♥ 8 4	♥ 10 9
♦ –	♦ –
♣ –	♣ –

This position is a one-suit squeeze. South can afford to unblock twice in spades (or declarer ruffs a heart and plays the ♠Q from dummy to endplay South. He can't afford to keep two spades and two hearts or declarer sets up spades. So South pitches a heart, and declarer can now ruff a heart and exit with a low spade, making or going down two.

Oshlag felt he could not risk the play, so he settled for the simple spade finesse – down one.

In retrospect, Oshlag decided that his best play would have been to ruff a heart with the ♣A early, then cross to the ♣J, ruff a heart, draw trumps and run diamonds – an unlikely dummy reversal that nets two diamond tricks, six club tricks and the ♠A.

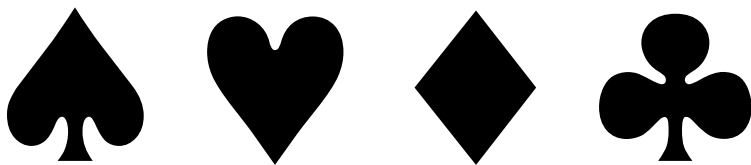
A view from abroad

It is very attractive to come from overseas to the U.S. to play in the major national events such as the Vanderbilt and the Spingold. The standard is as high as a world championship and to pit your wits against many of the world's best players appeals greatly. It is a pity, then, to come halfway around the world and be knocked out of the Vanderbilt on the first day or after the Round of 64.

Would it be feasible to hold a secondary event, such as the Vanderbilt Plate (Consolation) for the teams knocked out? That would give overseas teams a chance to play at least two days against other top teams. The schedule could be something like this:

Day 1:	Reduce the field to 64 teams Vanderbilt Cup (VC) Vanderbilt Plate (VP)
Day 2:	Round of 64 Nil
Day 3:	Round of 32 Round of 32 (1) 64-board matches for those knocked out in the Round of 64 With fewer than 32 teams wishing to continue offer extra places to those knocked out on Day 1, with priority to those teams who lost by the lowest margins
Day 4:	Round of 16 16 from VP Rd of 32 + 16 from VC Rd of 32 play a 32-board match to reduce to 16 for evening session Rd of 16, 32-board match to produce 8 winners. If fewer than 32 teams in session 1, qualify 16 teams to the evening session by winners and those who lost by the narrowest margins.
Day 5:	Round of 8 8 from VP Rd of 16 + 8 from VC Rd of 16 play 32-board match to reduce to 8 for evening session Rd of 8, 32-board match to produce 4 winners. If fewer than 16 teams in today's session 1, qualify 8 teams to the evening session by winners and those who lost by the narrowest margins.
Day 5:	Round of 8 8 from VP Rd of 16 + 8 from VC Rd of 16 play 32-board match to reduce to 8 for evening session Rd of 8, 32-board match to produce 4 winners. If fewer than 16 teams in today's session 1, qualify 8 teams to the evening session by winners and those who lost by the narrowest margins.
Day 6:	Semi-finals 4 from VP Rd of 8 + 4 from VC Rd of 8 play 32-board match to reduce to 4 for evening session Round of 4, 32-board match to produce 2 winners. If fewer than 8 teams in today's session 1, qualify 4 teams to the evening session by winners and those who lost by the narrowest margins.
Day 7:	Final 2 from VP Rd of 4 + 2 from VC Semi-final play 32-board semi- final match to reduce to 2 for VPlate final, 32-board match. If only 2 wish to contend, play 64-board VP final. (If 3, eliminate in session 1).

When using bid boxes, the ACBL requires that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an Announcement, use the Announcement word (such as "transfer") and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or Announces a bid must make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or Announcement has been made.

With the increased use of electronic scoring devices, it is incumbent upon players to properly check and verify scores that are entered at the table. Scoring errors have resulted in numerous changes in qualifiers, event rankings and even event winners. Please take the time to make sure the scores have been entered correctly so as to minimize the number of scoring corrections that are necessary.

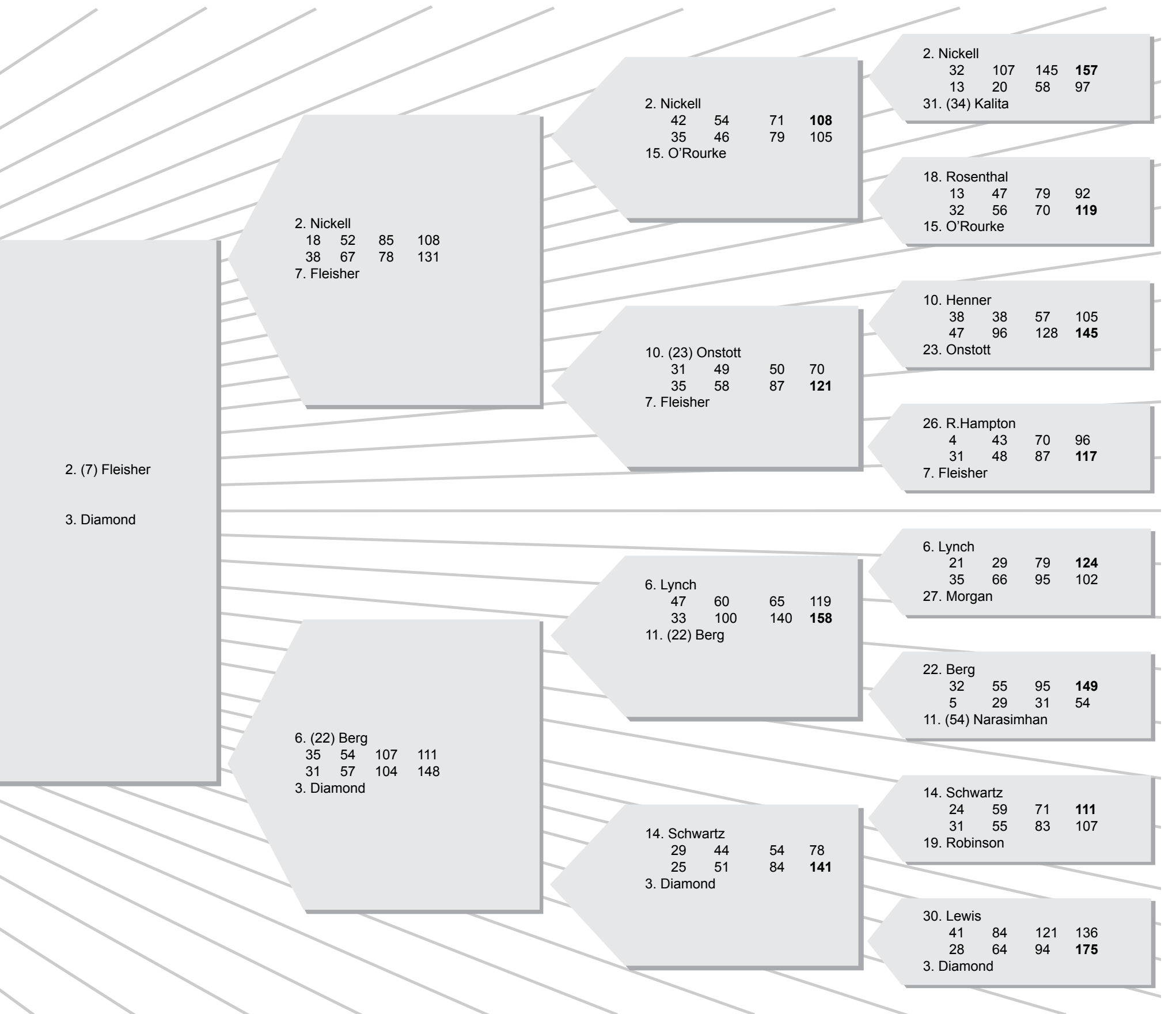

If as West you hear South open 1♥, should you pass or bid 1NT? Opinions are strongly divided, but Alex Ornstein did overcall 1NT, and North-South did manage to get to 2♥. Ornstein wisely did not double and declarer made an early play of a heart to the 9 – down one.

Let's revisit the deal on a passive club lead. South wins in hands, plays a spade to West's ace, wins the club return in dummy and cashes the ♠K, ruffs a spade and carefully cashes the ♦A.

Even if West has the ♦K Q x, he cannot usefully unblock. Declarer crosses to the ♣A and leads a diamond to West. This is the ending:

She possessed a memorable personality characterized by her generosity, her devotion to her family and her passion for the game. Those who knew Yeda will never forget her. She was a strong advocate for the game and for the duplicate club to which she belonged. Yeda McTeague Meniffee passed away in September 2008, at the age of 81.

Jane Weinberg was a devoted daughter, wife, mother, grandmother and civic volunteer. Her many attributes of caring, dedication and belief in helping others made her the loving, wonderful person everyone knew. Some of the organizations in which she was involved were The National Council of Jewish Women, Louisville Section, The Jewish Hospital Guild (of which she was President) and The Louisville Visual Art Association. Jane's love of art, travel and bridge kept her quite busy. Monday and Wednesday afternoons were bridge games with friends, but playing at the Bridge Center was reserved for her husband, Marty. She enjoyed playing bridge on the computer and reading the bridge hand from the newspaper. Jane was a good friend and role model, and she is missed by all of us.

Saturday is Golden Flake Day

Back in 1923, Mose Lischkoff and Frank Mosher had a deceptively simple idea — an idea that grew over the past 80 plus years from two gentlemen and a sack of potatoes into more than 1200 employees and 100 million pounds of potatoes a year. It was Lischkoff and Mosher whose fresh, kettle-cooked potato chips formed the foundation of the snack food company known today as Golden Flake.

In 1956, the company was sold to Sloan Bashinsky who bought the company from his father and uncle. The younger Bashinsky brought with him a hands-on knowledge of the business for,

although he was a charter member of the Board of Directors, he had worked his way up to the top job through route sales and production. One of his first moves was to change the name from Magic City Food Products to the more descriptive moniker: "Golden Flake, Incorporated."

Golden Flake went public in 1968.

Diversifying into insurance, real estate, fasteners and advertising, in 1977 Golden Flake Snack Foods became a wholly owned subsidiary of Golden Enterprises, Inc. Today, this Birmingham - born snack food company serves a 12-state market with an extensive product line. Yet the company's attention to detail, to taste and to what the customers want has not changed in the past 80 plus years. Today, more than ever, Golden Flake upholds that commitment.

Irene Leatherman Memorial Side Game

Irene Leatherman lived in northern Mississippi on a cotton farm and had to drive a little more than an hour to Memphis for her bridge games. Her advice to most partners became known in my family as "grandmother's rule." This rule is much simpler than most of the bridge — when the opponents are in four of a minor, smile and pass.

Ruth White Campbell Stratified Swiss

Ruth White Campbell was Louisville's first Life Master. She ran bridge tournaments at the Louisville Women's Club, Big Spring Country Club, Audubon Country Club and the Louisville Country Club. She was one of the founders of the Louisville Bridge Association and ran games and tournaments for the LBA. She was a Girl

Scout leader and had more than 10,000 volunteer hours at the Veterans Hospital. The week before she died, she ran her final bridge tournament. She was married to Dr. I. W. "Candy" Campbell for more than 50 years, had two children and six grandchildren. She died in Nov. 1991

Sonny Switow Stratified 299er Swiss

Sonny Switow was born in Louisville and attended Washington and Lee University where he started playing bridge. He loved it enough that he taught his wife how to play so that the two of them could play duplicate and participate in the tournaments. He always looked forward to playing weekly with Carl Horne and Lee Thomas.

Fort Knox Gold Rush 750/300 Pairs

The United States Bullion Depository Fort Knox, Kentucky

Amount of present gold holdings: 147.3 million ounces.

The only gold removed has been very small quantities used to test the purity of gold during regularly scheduled audits. Except for these samples, no gold has been transferred to or from the Depository for many years.

The gold is held as an asset of the United States at book value of \$42.22 per ounce.

The Depository opened in 1937; the first gold was moved to the depository in January that year.

Highest gold holdings this century: 649.6 million ounces (December 31, 1941).

Size of a standard gold bar: 7 inches x 3 and 5/8 inches x 1 and 3/4 inches.

Weight of a standard gold bar: approximately 400 ounces or 27.5 pounds.
