Mark Blumenthal is winning again



Mark Blumenthal had many years of stardom ahead of him in 1977. He was already an ACBL Grand Life Master and World Life Master. He had already finished second in the Bermuda Bowl twice. In 1977 he had won the Vanderbilt and also the Mott-Smith Trophy.

And then it happened. He had open heart surgery – three operations. Something went wrong and he slipped into a coma for 30 days. His brain was partially deprived of oxygen for a while, so when he regained consciousness he discovered he had lost the use of part of his brain. When he tried bridge, he discovered that he no longer had the superlative skill that he enjoyed before the operations.

He went 25 years without winning a pair event,

Nickell rolls to Vanderbilt win

The Nick Nickell team broke open a close match in the second quarter and went on to a 158-77 victory over the Richard Pavlicek squad in the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams.

It was the second victory in the Vanderbilt for Nickell, Richard Freeman, Bob Hamman, Paul Soloway, Eric Rodwell and Jeff Meckstroth. The team won for the first time in 2000, although individual team members have multiple wins in the Vanderbilt.

Pavlicek’s team, essentially a pickup squad with two relatively unfamiliar partnerships, were impressive in making it to the final round. Pavlicek played with Lee Rautenberg, Mike Kamil, Barnet Shenkin, Bob Jones and Martin Fleisher.

The underdogs led 31-28 after the first quarter, but Nickell surged ahead with a 49-7 second set. A turning point in the match was a deal in which Kamil and Fleisher reached a makable vulnerable

Stretch marks

It's axiomatic that you stretch to bid vulnerable games at IMPs. This deal from the first round of the Jacoby Open Swiss Teams proves that the payoff is certainly worth the risk, particularly when the defense is not crystal clear. Barry Rigal was the declarer.

West started with the ♥K, not best for the defense. Rigal won the ♥A, cashed the ♥Q and went to dummy with the ♦A. He cashed the ♦K and ruffed a diamond. Next came a heart ruff, the ♣A and a diamond ruff with the ♠K. A second heart ruff followed, leaving this position:

Rigal led the 13th diamond from dummy, and East was in a position to defeat the contract by ruffing with the ♠6. If Rigal overruffed, West would also overruff and return a trump. The ♠A Q would collect the rest of declarer's trumps and the ♥10 would be good at trick 13. If Rigal discarded the ♣J instead, East could pick up dummy's singleton ♠J and play the ♥10, allowing West to ruff with the 10. East's other high trump would take the last trick.

East erred, however, by discarding the heart, and when Rigal discarded his ♣J on the good diamond, West was forced to ruff. From that point, Rigal could not be prevented from taking one more trump trick to get home with his game. Plus 620 was a 10-IMP gain since North-South played 3♠ making three for plus 140 at the other table.

Rigal could have assured the contract at the point where he played dummy's fourth diamond if he had discarded his ♣J instead of ruffing.

Going home, but not by choice

Heather Waterworth, the enthusiastic new player featured on the front page of the second Friday Daily Bulletin, left for home in Toronto this morning, but only because she couldn't change her plane reservation for a third time.

Originally scheduled to depart on Friday, she changed her flight to Saturday and then to Sunday. Also, her boss at the golf shop where she works was clamoring for her to return, so she reluctantly departed after playing about 20 sessions and racking up more than 17 masterpoints, including 10 golds.

Red Ribbon correction

A late correction in the Red Ribbon Pairs moved Albert Horng and Mitchell Snyder from 14th to 11th place overall. Paul Gelb and Margery Gould dropped from 11th to 12th, Je Wang and Kuang-Wei Chiang fell to 13th, and Paul Spear and Betsy Downs now are in 14th place.

"If they had led the ♦J, I would have had no play," said Howard Piltch. "But I took advantage of my chances when West started with a club."

The opening club lead rode to Piltch's jack. He led a trump to the ace and then came back to his hand to take his top clubs and ruff a club. After cashing the ♥K, the ♠A and the ♦A, He led a spade to West's king. He ruffed the spade return and led his ♦Q. West had to ruff this and give Piltch his 10th trick with the trump jack. Plus 790.

His teammates defended 6♥ doubled in the other room and beat it five tricks – plus 1400. So Piltch and Co. gained 2190 points, worth 19imps.

When to double your partner

The bridge players in Arcadia LA were trying to start a new bridge club, and a bridge club operator from Monroe came by to help. While he was there, he played in a game, and this was the bidding on the very first hand:

"Wait a minute," said the visitor, "there's been an infraction here." All three women had no idea what he was talking about. "Well, you can't double your partner's bid," he said.

All three women spoke up together. "That was a good bid. We do that all the time. It shows a real good hand and tells you to get the heck out of spades."

Another 'real man' – 23-trick swing

Canada's Barry Harper (second the past two years and third in 2000 in the Richmond Trophy race) wasn't going to tell us about the first hand, but the Zeke Jabbour article, "Real men don't need real stoppers", was like the gauntlet being thrown down.

Earlier in the week in a knockout match, he held

The bidding started Pass-Pass-3♦, both vul at IMPs, so of course he bid 3NT, and everyone passed.

LHO made the comment "I know this can't be right" as he led the ♦K (Harper of course thought it looked very right for East-West).

RHO knew Harper and thought "that lucky so-and-so has bid 3NT with the queen-small of diamonds and might just make this stupid hand because diamonds are 8-1".

We all know what it's like when you get a fixed idea about a hand. Thinking that way, he discouraged diamonds with an upside down 9 (hoping it was also a mild spade suit preference in case partner had the ♠K-J-10-x and the ♣A).

LHO saw his partner's ♦9 and Harper's queen and thought partner had opened with A 9 7 6 5 4 in third seat, and declarer had the queen-jack-10 of diamonds. So he shifted to a low spade. North-South took 12 tricks for + 690 instead of East-West collecting the first 11 tricks!

Harper also had a stopper encounter against opponents he knew (and who knew him) at last fall's Phoenix NABC.

After his partner's 1♣ opening and a 1♥ overcall, he bid 1NT on a normal hand, but with only the jack-4-2 of hearts. Hearts were raised and when opener bid 2NT, Harper carried on to 3NT.

The opponents' hearts were Q 7 3 opposite A K 10 9 5. When the 3 was lead to the king, RHO was concerned that Harper had bid notrump with queen-small of hearts (there seems to be a theme here), since jack fourth was not possible. So he tried the ♥A. LHO unblocked the queen and suddenly jack-4-2 opposite opposite 8-6 was not only a stopper, it was a trick!

Technicians should note that if the opponents lead fourth best against notrump, you should play the 2 from jack-4-2, but if they play third best, you should falsecard with the 4.

Clearly Italy's Fulvio Fantoni, World Open Pairs champion, is also a subscriber to this theory. Playing in Friday evening's board-a-match with Betty Schuler, Harper and Marilyn Hemenway Fulvio held

♠ Q 6 5

Notice that the diamond holding is identical to Harper's heart holding above. After 1♠ from partner and a 2♥ overcall, he bided his time with a negative double. His LHO bid 3♦ and when RHO returned to 3♥ he deduced that there was no diamond fit on his right, so he bid 3NT. His partner's diamond holding was much better than the hand above – he had the 9-7! Luckily he was right about his RHO's lack of a diamond fit since the opponent's suit was K Q 10 8 6 5 3 and stiff ace! After the ♦Q lead he endplayed his RHO to go +630 and win the board against -620 at his teammates' table.

Like an open book

Once in a while you see the whole deal unfold before you at trick one. This deal from the second final of the Open Pairs was a classic example, although I did need a little help along the way.

I won the club lead in hand as North ducked his king correctly. I led the ♥9, and, just as I hoped, South hopped up with the ace and cashed the ♦A. He led another diamond to 9, king and my ruff. Now the stage was set. I crossed to the ♠K, passed the ♣10, cashed the ♦Q and led a trump to the king and ace. This was the ending as I led that trump::

South is caught in a genuine ruffing squeeze. South actually pitched a heart, letting me ruff out the hearts. But a spade discard would have been equally lethal – I would have ruffed out that suit instead.

World Transnational Teams

It's not often you get a chance to participate in a world championship. The qualifying teams for the Bermuda Bowl and Venice Cup are very limited. It is possible, however, for you to participate in this year's world championships in Monte Carlo this fall.

Your opportunity is called the 4th World Transnational Open Teams Championships – open to players from different countries. The WTOT will be played during the second week of the world championships and will have separate rankings for Senior, Women's and Mixed Teams.

Anyone in good standing with his national bridge organization may apply for entry in the WTOT.

The event begins Nov. 11 and concludes Nov. 15. The early qualifying stages will be Swiss teams (10-board matches, three or four matches per day). The knockout semifinal round will be Friday, Nov. 14, and the final Nov. 15.

The WTOT will be open to teams eliminated from the round-robin stages of the Bermuda Bowl and Venice Cup and from the Seniors Bowl. Those teams will enter the WTOT at no charge.

Ken Cohen, who finished second in Open Pairs II in partnership with Dan Gerstman, read the distribution correctly on this deal from the second final session. That enabled him to squeeze his right-hand opponent in three suits and make his contract.

When West led the ♣9, he instantly read this as a singleton – “There could be other reason for this lead based on the auction,” Cohen said. This rode to his jack. He cashed the trump king and led to the ♥A in dummy. He called for a spade, and when East played low, he put in the 10 and won the trick.

When he now drew the last trump, East was in trouble looking for a discard. He discarded a diamond, his best hope. Cohen cashed the ♠A, led a club to the ace and ruffed a spade.

“Now I knew righty started with a 4-2-2-5 distribution,” said Cohen. “I played a diamond to the ace, dropping the king, and led a spade, pitching a club from my hand. Righty was endplayed – he had to play a club to my king-10.”

Very good – but what if East had split his spade honors the first time the suit was led?

“If that had happened,” said Cohen, “I could easily have set up dummy's fifth spade for my 12th trick. This was an important hand for us because the third-place pair was close behind us.

Surprise!

Henry Bethe and his teammates had lost their first two matches in the NABC Open Swiss, and they had only four Victory Points. Imagine their surprise when Geir Helgemo and Chris Compton sat down at one of their tables, with John Sutherland and John Mohan at the other. Bethe's losing streak continued.

Unmakable contract proved to be makable

Richard Pavlicek and his teammates had one minor complaint during the course of the Vanderbilt: they kept playing Ron Smith. On Wednesday it was Ron Smith of Hixson TN for the Foster team, and Thursday it was Ron Smith of San Francisco for the Cayne team.

On the first of these occasions, Bob Jones gave a remarkable demonstration of the art of making an “unmakable” contract. He landed in 3NT, which was due to be defeated by any lead except an implausible ♦Q.

The opening lead from, who else, Ron Smith, was the ♣9, which in his methods promised the 10. The queen won in dummy and East unblocked the jack. The ♦J was led for a finesse, and West held up his queen after a brief but revealing hesitation.

South called for a low spade and won with the jack when East played low. Jones felt sure that West started with four diamonds since he would not have held up the queen with three. That suggested that West had begun with nine minor-suit cards, and there was a ray of hope if that player held the ♥A. South cashed the ♦A and reached this position:

South led his ♥6, and if West had seen what was coming he would have grabbed his ace. When he routinely played low, Jones won with the queen and executed his brilliant plan. He cashed the ♠A, led a heart and carefully discarded a diamond. All his clubs were needed.

Now it was ping-pong in the minor suits. After winning the ♥A, West cashed the ♣A and led the ♣10. Jones won with the king and exited with his last club, making his game by forcing West to lead a diamond at the finish.

The Pavlicek team gained 12 IMPs when 4♠ failed by one trick in the replay.

The Facts: 2♠ went down two, +100 for N/S. The opening lead was the ♣7. The Director was called at trick three. Declarer played a low card from dummy to trick one "in tempo" (N/S said almost immediately) and North then thought at length before playing the ♣10. East won the ♣J and led the ♥Q. South won with the ♥A and returned the ♣K. East believed that South knew his partner had the ♣A because he had thought before playing the ♣10. E/W also said that North had broken tempo before his second pass, so his partner knew he had some values.

South said he had difficult decisions to make because he was endplayed both times he was in. He had led clubs at trick one so he decided to continue them as the lesser of evils at trick three.

The Director allowed the table result to stand because North was entitled to think at trick one about his defense, even when declarer plays relatively quickly from dummy. No inference could be taken from a pause for thought before third hand played to the first trick. Since there was no unauthorized information South could play whatever he wanted to the third trick.

The Appeal: E/W appealed the Director's ruling. East said that North hesitated for about 30 seconds before his final pass and hesitated again for 30 seconds before playing to trick one. West agreed with both time estimates. East also claimed that North played to trick one "with particular emphasis."

E/W was an experienced partnership with both players having about 10,000 masterpoints. N/S both agreed that North's hesitation in the bidding and the play each lasted about 30 seconds. They disputed the statement that North's play to trick one was made with any special emphasis. South said he continued clubs as the "least of evils" believing he was endplayed.

N/S had 1800 and 1300 masterpoints.

The Panel Decision: The Panel believed it was significant that South shifted to the ♣K rather than continue with a small club at trick three. This suggested the presence of unauthorized information, since there was no real advantage gained by playing the king and it could have been very wrong if declarer started with the doubleton ♣AJ.

Three players were consulted and all ducked the ♥Q at trick two. When asked what they would have played had they won the ♥A, two of them said they would play the ace and another diamond and the third said he would continue with a low club, but did not think this was a clear-cut play. All three believed that a 30-second hesitation by North was significant and suggested that North had ducked the ♣A.

Four players in the 1000-2000 masterpoint range were consulted. All four played the ♥A and then played the ♦A and ♦Q. Two of them believed that 30 seconds by partner at trick one suggested that he had ducked the ♣A; the other two believed it meant nothing. The Panel decided that the 30-second hesitation by North at trick one did constitute unauthorized information which demonstrably suggested the line of play adopted by South.

Since most of the consulted players who were N/S's peers said they would have played the ♥A followed by the ♦AQ, and since that would have led to an overtrick, the contract was changed to 2♠ made three, +140 for E/W (Law 16).

said NABC Chairman John Marks.

Despite the short time to prepare, Marks said, members of the organizing committee were stellar, producing a tournament long on fun and short on glitches.

"Everything I've heard from players has been complimentary," said Marks, who did his chairman duties while attending to his regular job as a mechanical engineer in heating, air conditioning and ventilation.

Several members of the organizing committee from the 1996 Spring NABC in Philadelphia signed on again in 2003.

Mark was especially complimentary of the Grovers, "who were really terrific," and Kay, "who did a fabulous job with entertainment."

Danny Sprung, Marks said, "practically ran the two casino nights by himself."

Marks also praised the ACBL staff, in particular Nancy Foy and Jeff Johnston of Meeting Services.

That's like the Blumenthal of old.

Bridge is secondary for Blumenthal these days. "My principal activity is watching my stocks go down. I also run some fantasy baseball leagues and I teach English to Russian immigrants at the Jewish Vocational Services in Chicago.

"I keep track of my children too. Erik, 24, travels all over the world, but he has applied for law school. He does some work with the public defender in Portland, Oregon. He's done most of his traveling in the wilds of Central Asia - he even hiked the Silk Route. Laura, 21, goes to Portland State and she also sells cat toys and games."

How does bridge today compare with the good old days?

"It's not as exciting as it used to be. But it sure is good to see the people. I'm seeing lots of my old friends, and it's great to see them again."
