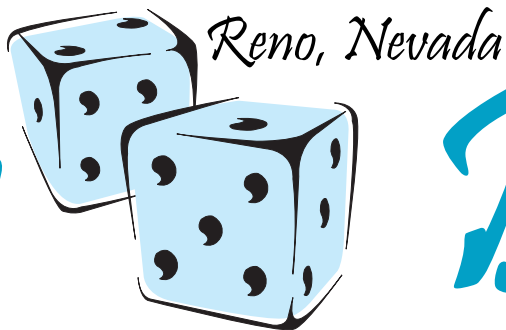

Celebrating Bridge Week

It's official: the United States House of Representatives has declared March 21-27, 2004, as Bridge Week in North America (BWNA). Rep. Harold Ford Jr., who represents the Tennessee district where



the American Contract Bridge League is headquartered, Nevada Gov. Kenny Guinn and Reno Mayor Robert A. Cashell Sr. have issued proclamations in honor of the week-long celebration of our game.

BWNA will be celebrated during the spring North American Bridge Championship each year to help focus national attention on bridge and to provide a bit of fun for our members.

Berkowitz and Cohen win Silodor Open Pairs

Larry Cohen and David Berkowitz put together two strong sessions in the final of the Silodor Open Pairs 1 to claim victory in the four-session contest. The pair scored 64.10% in the afternoon session and backed it up with a 65.95% in the evening to finish on top by almost four boards. Their final score was 1879.47.

In second with 1682.61 was the St. Louis-based pair of Roger Lord and Jacqueline Sincoff.

This is the ninth NABC win for the Berkowitz-Cohen partnership (and the 19th for each individually), yet the duo has been plagued by several near-misses in recent years.

"We were first after five rounds in the Blue Ribbons, but faded in the last set, and we've been first after three rounds in other four-session games, only to see our lead evaporate. It's been a running

joke," said Cohen, laughing. The most painful near-miss for Berkowitz and Cohen, however, occurred in the World Open Pairs in Lille where a deadly final round cost them the gold medal.

"We've finally managed to be in first place when an event was actually over," joked Cohen.

The scholarship is awarded annually to a player under 13 (Flores was named the recipient before his 13th birthday) who demonstrates not only talent but a positive attitude and an interest in getting other Junior players involved in bridge.

Flores is a seventh grader at Haughton B. Lee School in Portland OR.



At the crossroads

Andrew Robson, playing with Rita Shugart, found his way to most of the matchpoints on this deal from the first qualifying session of Open Pairs I.

On the helpful lead of a low club, Robson's jack scored, but he still had only eight tricks. He made the natural play of coming to the ♠A, and when South dropped the jack he was at the crossroads. Playing a diamond might set up the opponents' suit. Leading a heart to the 10 or the 8 would be painful if he guessed wrong. Giving up a club (assuming the 5-1 split to be virtually a 100% bet) might well leave him short of entries to set up the suit.

Robson found the best solution at both single-dummy and double-dummy when he advanced the ♥J from his hand. In practice there was a fair shot that South might forget to cover. As it was, North took the ♥Q and was immediately endplayed. He exited with a diamond, and Robson won cheaply in dummy. Then he cleared the spades and brought home 10 tricks.

Ralph Cohen making slow recovery

Missing from action at this tournament is Ralph Cohen, former CEO of the ACBL and a top-flight player. He weathered countless operations over the past few years and was back at the bridge table as soon as possible. Recently he had to undergo surgery again, this time for lung cancer. He is making a slow recovery. He also is trying to regain some of his lost weight. He tried playing bridge at the local club last week but decided he needed to wait a little longer to get back into the game.

'I play to keep my brain strong'

The main reason Glenda Pestoni of Redding CA plays bridge is "to keep my brain strong." She was sipping some wine and eating some cheese at yesterday's Newcomer reception with her partner, Rebecca Raab, also of Redding.

"So many people have brain problems when they get older, and I don't want that to happen to me. So I'm going to play bridge as much as I can as hard as I can to keep my brain active and strong."

Raab is amazed at what a good job bridge does to keep a person humble. "Just when you think you know something, you find out there's more to it. Every time!"

This is their first visit to a North American tournament, but it won't be their last. "We're having great fun," said Pestoni. "This is a really exciting adventure."

"We went to the lesson that Audrey Grant gave," said Raab. "She is an incredible speaker. After listening to her, all you want to do is learn more bridge and play more bridge."

The women took up bridge three years ago and took Easybridge! lessons from Bill Moon and Bill Kelley. "Those lessons just sucked us in," said Raab. They play at the River City Bridge Club once or twice a week. "Just once a week right now," said Raab. "It's income tax season and that's our work."

Each of them carries a bag full of bridge publications everywhere they go. "We never get tired of learning new things," said Raab.

Only one thing worries Pestoni. "Do I still have enough time to become a good player?"

District 20 through the years

District 20 is a sprawling area that includes 28 Units in northern California, Oregon, Vancouver WA, northern Nevada, two counties in western Idaho and Hawaii.

The district got its start when the Pacific Bridge League merged with ACBL in 1956. The seven Western districts were called the Western Conference and the conference operated all regionals in the area until after 1970.

District 20 was formally organized in 1970 and today is governed by a Board of Directors that includes each unit president plus the elected ACBL officials.

The district has been host to eight NABCs: Portland in 1965, 1970 and 1986; Honolulu in 1975 and 1983; and Reno in 1989, 1998 and 2004.

District representatives to the ACBL Board of Directors have been Max Manchester, Larry Jolma, Bob Lix and Jade Barrett.

Max Manchester

Manchester (1914-1969) lived in Portland where he was executive secretary of the Oregon Public Employees Retirement System. He served as ACBL president in 1962 and as chairman of the Board in 1960 and 1961.

Manchester was named ACBL Honorary Member of the Year in 1964. He and Gard Hays won the Men's Pairs in 1961.

Hays, interviewed at the Reno NABC in 1998, recalled that win. "We won the event and Max was elected ACBL president the same day. It was quite a day."

Larry Jolma

Jolma (1916-1996), also a Portland resident, represented District 20 on the ACBL Board of Directors for 30 years. He was ACBL treasurer for three years and served as chairman of the finance committee.

A Gold Life Master who won almost 4000 masterpoints, Jolma won regional tournaments in the Sixties, Seventies and Eighties.

He was captain of the all-District 20 team that won the NABC Men's Teams in 1967. His teammates were Gary Stark, Jim Dunlap, J.R. Patterson and Tom Bussey.

A member of the ACBL Goodwill Committee, Jolma was past president of the Portland Unit and was a member of the board of directors of the Western conference.

Bob Lix

Lix, a retired Air Force colonel who lives in Brownsville CA, became the district director when Jolma died in May 1996. He completed the remainder of Jolma's term and won election in 1998.

A graduate of the University of Missouri, Lix earned a Master of Business Administration degree from Harvard Business School. He retired after a 22-year career in the Air Force.

Lix and his wife Sally are longtime members of the ACBL Goodwill Committee. They served as partnership co-chairman during the 1998 Reno NABC.

Lix resigned in November 2002 and was succeeded by First Alternate G. S. Jade Barrett

Jade Barrett

Barrett, a resident of Vancouver WA, is a Diamond Life Master in the ACBL and the ABA. He has won more than 60 regional titles and several ABA national championships.

He has been active as a coach and non-playing captain of U.S. Junior teams. He is the chairman of the North American Youth Bridge Foundation, organized to distribute sponsorship money in support of Junior activities.

Levintritt Trophy for Silver Ribbon Pairs

Competitors in the Silver Ribbon Pairs — open only to players who are at least 55 years old and who have pre-qualified by placing first or second in a regional- or national-rated senior event — are battling to win the Levintritt Trophy. The event got under way today.

Last year's event was won by two players from St. Louis — Roger Lord and Alan Popkin — whose margin of victory was 16 matchpoints (51 was top).

On this deal from the last round of the event, Popkin made a deceptive play at trick one that paid off handsomely later on.

South led the ♠2 and Popkin, who wanted to be in dummy to play hearts up to his hand, inserted the jack and followed with the 10 when North played low.

A heart went to the 6 and king, and Popkin stopped to reconsider his game plan when South discarded.

Popkin played the ♠Q to the king and ace and continued with dummy's second heart. North played the jack and Popkin won his queen.

Next came a club to the queen and Popkin cashed the ♣A. When Popkin came off dummy with a spade, North — believing from the earlier spade plays that Popkin had started with the ♠Q 10 doubleton — discarded. Popkin won the ♠9, returned to dummy with a diamond and played the ♠8. No matter what North did, Popkin could not lose more than two tricks.

Plus 450 was good for 39 out of 51 matchpoints. More importantly, had Popkin made only 10 tricks, he and Lord would have been second in the event since plus 420 was good for only 20 matchpoints and their margin of victory was only 16.

The Silver Ribbon Pairs, which consists of two qualifying and two final sessions, has been won by four members of the ACBL Board of Directors: Joan Remy Moore, District 12 director, playing with Helen Shanbrom in 1993; Virgil Anderson, District 15 director, playing with Jayne Thomas, now a Grand Master, District 9 director, in 1994; and Jim Kirkham, District 22 director, playing with his wife Corinne in 1999. (Anderson was ACBL president at the time and the only "sitting" president to win an NABC event.)

The winners will have their names inscribed on the Levintritt Trophy and will receive a certificate of recognition.

The trophy honors Peter Leventritt of New York, ACBL president in 1954 and assistant treas-

urer 1945-46. He served as president of the Greater New York Bridge Association and the Card School of New York, which he co-founded.

Leventritt (1916-1997) pioneered the use of the Schenken System in partnership with its inventor, Howard Schenken. He represented North America in the Bermuda Bowl and placed second in 1957, 1961, 1963 and 1965.

Mallela, South, was playing with partner Alan Greer. Mallela clearly believes that matchpoints is not for the faint of heart, so he blasted to slam.

West led a trump and Mallela took stock. He clearly needed to ruff at least one of his potential heart losers in dummy, and to do that he would need to pitch some of dummy's hearts on the diamonds. He decided, therefore, to win the opening lead in dummy with the ♣9 and take a first-round finesse in diamonds.

When that worked he drew one more round of trumps and then cashed the ♦A K pitching hearts from the dummy. Next came the ♥A, a heart ruff, and a spade ruff in the closed hand. Mallela finally extracted the remaining trump from East and claimed, conceding a heart on the end.

They celebrated by finishing sixth in the B/C/D Open Pairs. That gave Poulter more than enough gold points to become a Life Master.

Edward Sutcliffe of Sonoma CA won one bracketed knockout and tied for third in another, giving him more than enough points for his gold card. He had two partners in these events – **Doug Allan** of Manassas VA and **Dale Rodgers** of Fort Lauderdale FL. Their teammates were **Rosemary Reitz** and **Jack Hillner**, both of Ventura CA. The KO win was dramatic. Down 23 at the half, they outscored their opponents 59-2 in the second half to win by 34.

Collene Makteniaks of Alpine Meadows CA also went over in the bracketed knockouts. Her partner was **Leonidas Makteniaks**, and their teammates were **Elaine** and **B.J. Jordan** of Austin TX.

Swiss miss

This deal came up in our one-session Swiss Teams on Friday night.

♠ —
♥ A Q 8 3
♦ A Q 5
♣ A Q J 9 7 4

It is hard to avoid playing slam, although the odds of making 12 tricks are little better than 50%.

6♣ is simple to play – clubs either split or they don't. You can bring home the slam if the ♣10 drops or if the ♣K is doubleton onside. But how do you play 6NT?

On a neutral heart lead you win hand and take an immediate club finesse, perhaps hoping that it loses. If it does lose, you get to run clubs from the top, making 12 tricks if the clubs behave or if the diamonds break 3-3 – or there may be a minor – suit squeeze.

But what if the ♣Q holds? Best, I think, is to give up a club, allowing you to get most of your minor suit chances. However, you have a choice: should you lead the ♣J (proving to be a hero if East has the doubleton ♣10, or looking like a goat if West started with the doubleton ♣K)? Or should you lead a low club to cater to the doubleton king and paying off to East's doubleton ♣10?

Perhaps the answer lies in what club spots are played to the first trick. If either opponent follows with a high-looking club spot, play him for the appropriate doubleton.

So that (eventually) brings us to the key point of the deal.

When declarer leads a club to dummy at trick 2, West should drop the 8, tempting declarer to lead a low club from dummy next.

Conversely if East had begun with ♣10 8 6 3 and a doubleton diamond, East should drop the ♣8 to persuade declarer to try the ♣J next.

P.S. – The way the cards laid at the table, East had ♣10 8 3, so dropping the ♣8 to persuade declarer not to continue the attack on clubs was also his best strategy.

Overbid, overplay

When both partners fall in love with their hands, the result can often be a perilously high contract.

Nagy Kamel and Mark Bumgardner, representing District 16, found themselves in a 6♥ contract in the first final session of the North American Open Pairs Flight A.

Kamel cashed the ♠K Q as East followed. When he led another spade, East was finished – if he ruffed with the ♥Q, Kamel would pitch his losing club and win the last trick with his ♥10. If East ruffed low, Kamel would overruff and score his 12th trick. Whatever East did, Kamel would score his ♥10 en passant.

Plus 980 was worth 12 out of 13 matchpoints.

Taking a chance

You don't win North American championships without taking some chances – the key, however, is to take chances when the odds are in your favor.

This deal is from the first final session of Silodor Open Pairs I and features Geir Helgemo and Tony Forrester, the event winners.

Both Helgemo and Forrester passed the first time around but Helgemo tried a takeout double at his second turn. He had ideal distribution even though he had only 9 high-card points.

After North leaped to the spade game, Forrester concluded that the save was with the odds. He expected to win one club and the ♥K – maybe partner had a diamond trick coming. Still, that was only three tricks and 4♠ was a likely make.

What about 5♣? Partner probably had only one spade and it seemed likely he would lose a spade, two hearts and a diamond.

If Forrester had been doubled, he would have received a good score. 5♣ goes down only two tricks – minus 300.

North, however, was not settling for a penalty – he wanted his game. He took the push to 5♠ and Forrester's assessment proved accurate: declarer had to lose one trick in each side suit.

Plus 100 was worth 100 matchpoints on a 103 top.

A message for me?

Hugh Ross and Mike Lawrence played Bart Bramley and Sidney Lazard in the first qualifying session of Open Pairs I.

Most players, looking at that South hand, would pass a 2♠ raise, but Seamon liked his aces and pushed on. He regretted his enterprise when he saw dummy – four losers, only eight tricks. There seemed no chance for 10.

But when the ♥Q was led, Seamon played low from dummy and when the 8 appeared on his right, he smoothly followed with the 9.

This exposed him to a possible quick ruff but West felt sure Seamon would have won the trick if he could. He, therefore, assumed that declarer held a singleton and his partner had begun with the ♥A 8 3. Continuing hearts would permit declarer to establish the king eventually.

So West shifted to a trump, won in dummy. A diamond was ducked to West who, still in the grip of the illusion created at trick one, played a second trump.

Seamon won in dummy, led to the ♦A and played two more rounds of trumps. West, still believing he knew the heart position, discarded two hearts in order to guard against a hypothetical club suit in declarer's hand.

Now Seamon was able to cash three heart tricks, discarding his singleton club on dummy's fourth heart, and establish a diamond trick to make his game.

In the replay, South went down one in 3♠ and Seamon's team gained 10 IMPs.

On this deal from the first qualifying session of the Open Pairs, Diamond was expecting to register an unpleasant minus score, but things did not work out that way.

Bryan's pass of 2♣ suggested club length, and maybe South should have removed to 2♦. But that would have been equally painful.

The opening club lead went to the queen, king and ace. Diamond led a diamond to the queen, ruffed a diamond, led a spade to the queen (North enjoying a quiet snooze), ruffed a diamond, led the ♠A and ruffed a spade. Then he drew all the trumps. Now he could cash dummy's winning ♦A and ♦10, and he must have felt aggrieved that he had to concede trick 13!

That comes to a total of 980. When was the last time you scored this number this way?

Facts: East explained the redouble as indicated above. The actual E/W agreement was that redouble showed a singleton or doubleton ♦A or ♦K. N/S attempted to call the Tournament Director at the end of the auction period, when the correct explanation of the agreement was offered, prior to the opening lead. On the opening lead of the ♠A West scored +130. The TD was summoned at the end of play.

Director's Ruling: West received unauthorized information (UI) from the explanation offered by East, demonstrably suggesting further action after 3♦, pass being deemed a logical alternative. The contract was changed to 3♦ by East, minus 150.

The appeal: West felt her hand was too strong to pass 3♦, believing game in either notrump or hearts still possible. West stated that it was common for her partner to explain agreements imprecisely. E/W also felt that six tricks in the assigned diamond contract was incorrect. N/S felt that East had shown a near minimum, though they conceded he might be showing a six-card suit. Further, the UI suggests that West try to improve the contract. The committee determined that the redouble showed, by agreement, at most a doubleton diamond but said nothing about the strength of the hand.

The decision: West had already offered to play in a partscore of 3♣. The committee agreed that the UI demonstrably suggested bidding over 3♦ and that pass was a logical alternative. In a 3♦ contract a spade lead was likely followed by a trump switch. Declarer could then play a club to the ace, followed by a heart finesse to secure seven tricks. However, the committee also considered the possibility of declarer playing the opening bidder for the ♣K and taking a club finesse. South could then discard clubs on North's spade winners to secure a club ruff. The committee felt that it was not unreasonable to score seven defensive tricks for down three. The committee ruled 3♦ by East, minus 150, for both sides.

North American Pairs facts and figures

Since the North American Pairs debuted in 1978 as the Grand National Pairs, winners have come from 14 different districts. The districts with the most winners (three times each) are 6, 16, 21 and 25. Districts 10, 11 and 24 are two-time winners.

Only one pair has won the NAP more than once — and they have done it three times: James Griffin and Ken Schutze of Austin TX (District 16).

In 1994, Griffin and Schutze had two below-average games in the district NAP final. They got to play on anyway because the rules stipulated that the defending champions had an automatic invitation to the national final. At the Spring NABC in Cincinnati, they posted their second NAP victory. Their third came in 1999.

The only father—son partnership to post an NAP win were Phil and Eric Greco (17 years old), winners of Flight C in 1991.

Three Canadian pairs have won the NAP, Flight A — Drew Cannell—G. Sekhar, Mark Stein—Boris Baran and Aidan Ballantyne—Gordon McOrmond.

No pair has won Flight B or Flight C and gone on to win Flight A.

Four married couples have been NAP champions, all in Flight A: Helen and Robert Blakey; Jan and Chip Martel; Lisa and David Berkowitz, and Joanna and Lew Stansby.

Four players have held the NAP (formerly Grand National Pairs) and Grand National Teams titles simultaneously: partners Peter Boyd and Steve Robinson (GNT winners in 1984 and pairs champs in 1985); Chip Martel (teams in 1987, pairs in 1988) and David Berkowitz (teams in 1994 and pairs in 1995).

Consider this:

- Nick Nickell & Co. (Nickell-Richard Freeman, Jeff Meckstroth-Eric Rodwell, Bob Hamman-Paul Soloway) are not only the defending Vanderbilt champions but they are the reigning Bermuda Bowl champions as well.

- Rose Meltzer is returning to the site of her first North American championship victory – the 1998 Women's Swiss Teams. Meltzer and her squad (Kyle Larsen, Peter Weichsel-Alan Sontag, Chip Martel-Lew Stansby) are former Bermuda Bowl champions.

- George Jacobs & Company (Ralph Katz, Alfredo Versace-Lorenzo Lauria, Norberto Bocchi-Giorgio Duboin) romped to 4.42-board win in the Open Board-a-Match Teams in New Orleans last fall. They led throughout much of the six-session Reisinger Teams before faltering at the end.

- One of the hottest teams around is Malcolm Brachman, Eddie Wold, Mike Passell, Eric Greco and Geoff Hampson. They won the Reisinger in New Orleans and were 13th in the Open Board-a-Match Teams. In addition, Hampson and Greco were second in the Blue Ribbon Pairs.

The Vanderbilt Trophy

The Vanderbilt Trophy for the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams was donated in 1928 by Harold S. Vanderbilt, who won the event in 1932 and 1940.

The Vanderbilt was contested annually in New York — as a separate championship — until 1958 when it became part of the Spring North American Championships.

Vanderbilt winners receive replicas of the trophy — a practice initiated by Vanderbilt from the first running of the event and perpetuated by a \$100,000 trust fund administered by ACBL under the terms of Vanderbilt's will.

On display at ACBL Headquarters in Memphis are replicas donated by the families of Caroline Taylor, who won the Vanderbilt in 1928, and Helen Sobel Smith, a Vanderbilt winner in 1944 and 1945.

Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.
