## Sides, Borok win Silver Ribbon

Bill Sides and Eli Borok squeaked out a win in the Silver Ribbon Pairs last night by a margin of about 1/3 of a board.

"It couldn't happen to two nicer guys," said Borok jokingly. Sides and Borok scored 1228.91 matchpoints to 1214.93 for runners-up Dudley Brown and Richard Budd. Top on a board was 39.

The winners had qualified easily, coming in fourth of 180 pairs. They were third after the first final session.

Sides, a Burbank CA resident, is a former vice president of Union Bank who now teaches bridge. Borok, of Los Angeles, is a retired CPA and the former principal partner in the Cavendish Club West.

The two have played rarely in tournaments -- maybe about six times -- and play primarily in money team games where partners rotate. They describe themselves as good friends who attend UCLA basketball games together.

## Hays is Grand LM

G. Gard Hays of Veradale WA, who won two nationally rated men's events in the Sixties, has become an ACBL Grand Life Master.



Hays, a salesman and District 19 board member, won the 1961 Life Master Men's Pairs and the 1964 Men's Pairs.

He still remembers the first win. "I was playing with Max Manchester," he said, "and we won the event and Max was elected ACBL president the same day. It was quite a day."

She spotted the hundreds on the floor as she got off the elevator on the fourth floor. She immediately turned the money over to Security, even though it meant missing Bill Root's lecture. When asked if she thought about keeping it, she replied, "I was tempted, but it wasn't mine. It just wasn't mine."

Both Nancy and David were invited to the Daily Bulletin office to meet each other and have their picture taken. David told her that her action was wonderful, that it made everyone he told about it feel a lot happier.

## Take chances when the odds favor you

You don't win North American championships by pussyfooting around. You've got to take some chances -- the key is to take chances when the odds are in your favor. Watch Open Pairs I champions Geir Helgemo of Norway and Tony Forrester of Great Britain on Board 24 from the first final session.

Both Helgemo and Forrester passed the first time around, but Helgemo tried a takeout double on his second turn. He had the ideal distribution even though he had only 9 hcp. After North leaped to the spade game, Forrester concluded quickly that the save was with the odds. On defense against 4♠ he knew declarer was not going to get any surprises in the trump suit, and with so many clubs Forrester did not expect to get more than one trick in that suit. Probably the ♥K would be a trick, and it was likely that his partner had a diamond trick. But that was only three tricks, so 4♠ was a likely make.

Now what about 5♣? Partner probably had only one spade, and the ♥K probably would be a trick. So it was likely that he would lose a spade, two hearts and a diamond, assuming Helgemo had some kind of favorable diamond holding. In time much shorter than it has taken to write this, Forrester decided on the save.

If he had been doubled, he would have received a good score because 5♣ goes down only two tricks -- minus 300. But North wasn't satisfied with a penalty -- he wanted his game. He took the push to 5♠, and Forrester's assessment proved accurate -- declarer had to lose one trick in each side suit. This was worth 100 matchpoints on a 103 top for the champions.

## Goodwill message

How pleasant it is to hear a player call, "Director, please" -- instead of a shouted "DIRECTOR!"

Why not extend that courtesy to our caddies? Don't you think "Caddy, please" has a rather nice sound?

Remember that Reno is the first NABC for some of our players -- and it's also the first NABC for many of our caddies.

# He don't get no satisfaction

In a first-round Vanderbilt match, our opponents were not going to give Doug Heron the pleasure of executing an endplay.

Heron reached 3NT from South after a 1NT rebid and new minor auction. On a heart lead, he put up the jack from dummy and ducked East's king. East returned a heart, and Doug won in hand. He drove out the ♣A, and West returned a third heart instead of shifting to a spade. This allowed Heron to win and cash all the clubs, leading to this ending:

East still had to find a discard. Rather than give Heron the satisfaction of endplaying him with the 13th diamond, he pitched a diamond. That let Heron cash four diamonds for his contract, but at least East didn't get endplayed!

# Lucky just is not enough!

You hold:

♠ 3 2 ♥ Q J 8 7 4 ♦ 5 4 ♣ A 8 7 5.

Not a lot but enough in our system for a two-suited 2♥ opener. Left-hand opponent bids 2♠, partner bids 4♥ and right-hand opponent bids 4♠. After two passes, partner's double ends the auction.

As play proceeds, I notice that after two rounds of diamonds have been played, I still have one. Have I revoked? Surely not!

No, I can remember what's gone and can only conclude that my original shape was 2-4-3-4. Not a 2♥ opener but 4♠ doubled goes off two for plus 500.

This shows we're lucky -- or are we?

Owing to confusion over the start time, we missed the first round in the Open Pairs qualifying session. The Director very kindly put in a substitute pair who won us the princely scores of ½ on the first board and 5 ½ on the second. Top was 64!

OK, you take your licks but to miss qualification by 40 matchpoints proves my headline. It also proves that you've got to show up on time.

# Scotland's Shenkins join the crowd in Boca Raton

The southern Florida area around Boca Raton is fast becoming a mecca for top-flight bridge players. It is already the home for such greats as Bill Eisenberg, Benito Garozzo, Mike Becker, Al Roth, Zeke Jabbour, Bill Root, Bobby Levin, Michael Seamon, Larry Cohen, Drew Casen, Gaylor Kastle, Russ Arnold, Richard Pavlicek, Bernie Chazen and Richard Reisig.

Kathie Wei-Sender recently bought a home there, and now we learn that Scotland's foremost player, Barnet Shenkin, has decided to live in America -- and of course he chose Boca.

Barnet and his wife Maggie plan to teach and write about bridge. "We've always wanted to get into the American bridge scene, and now we're doing it," said Barnet.

Barnet, who worked in the rug import business (China and India) before switching to bridge full time, has rich credentials. He won the Sunday Times Pairs twice. The first time was in 1976 in partnership with world champion Michael Rosenberg, another transplant to the United States from Scotland. He also has won the Gold Cup, emblematic of the British championship, three times, and the Scottish Cup seven times. He has played in the Camrose -- a competition among Wales, England, Scotland and Ireland, many times and has been on the winning team seven times.

Maggie plays a good game of bridge too. She won her first American championship Sunday when her team finished first in Bracket 2 of the Charity Knockouts.

When you talk to an enthusiast like Barnet, eventually the conversation shifts to bridge hands. His favorite so far was a hand that looked like disaster time. Shenkin put up the queen from his hand and saw partner's singleton king fall under dummy's ace. But the ending was neutral if not happy. Well, at least Barnet was happy because his play did not cost. The deal is Board 24 from the first qualifying session of Open Pairs I.

Shenkin led the ♥Q to declarer's king, and declarer cashed the ♣K, learning about the layout of that suit. Declarer switched to the ♠7, and Shenkin "knew" declarer had three spades -- would he have opened 1NT with 4-2-2-5 distribution? Not likely. So

Shenkin decided, without pause, to muddy the waters by playing the queen. That would give the declarer the chance to go wrong if he actually held three spades.

Naturally declarer called for the ace, and down came Mike Cappelletti Jr.'s king. Now declarer had five club tricks, two hearts, a diamond and three spades. Why only three spades? Because Shenkin still held the 10-6 over declarer's 8-3.

But what happens if Shenkin had played low on the ♠7? No doubt declarer would have let it ride, losing to the king. But then declarer would get the same three spade tricks with repeated finesses.

In retrospect, Shenkin wishes he had followed with the 10. Surely declarer would finesse, losing to the king. Then there was at least a possibility that declarer would guess the rest of the suit wrong and take only two spade tricks.

# What would you bet on a double yarborough?

Many years ago an English lord offered to bet anyone that the bettor would not hold a yarborough any time during the next 1000 hands he played. He made out well with this bet because a yarborough (a hand with no card higher than a 9) occurs only once every 1827 deals.

We don't know what the odds are against two players holding a yarborough on the same deal, but we do know that we had never even heard of one in our lifetime -- until this came up recently.

Imagine North's surprise when West was able to show a powerful hand with his 3♦ jump -- how could West have enough cards to jump? Perhaps double is the best action for North -- clearly West can't take nine tricks, probably only seven. But will South pass with that yarborough? The North player actually went for the game in his side's 4-4 fit.

Declarer was unlucky to happen to hold three diamonds. West led his ♦K, Dummy won and fired back the ♣K. West won, cashed two diamonds and led the ♠K. South gave this a little thought and ducked. West continued with the ♠Q, and declarer won this in dummy. Then she led the good ♠J -- and ruffed it -- she wanted to try the trump finesse. When this dropped the king doubleton from West, declarer escaped for only one down.

And all four players had a hand to talk about.

# Add Anne

Anne Hoffman of Peru VT, a longtime supporter of Junior bridge, has been named to the Junior Team Trials Committee by chairman Bobby Wolff.

Hoffman's name was accidentally omitted from the report of the Junior Day meeting on Saturday.

## Defenders can't defend Mixed Pairs

The 1997 Mixed Pairs champions won't be back to compete for a second title. They're still in the Vanderbilt.

"Assuming that we're both knocked out, we'll defend," Phyllis Quinn had said earlier. Well, neither was knocked out.

Quinn and Wafik Abdou won the title last year in Dallas, thanks in part to a wrinkle that Abdou found in the second final session. A wrinkle is a rare secondary squeeze that forces the opponents to choose between a throw-in and an unblock, each of which costs a trick.

Abdou (West), declarer in 4♥, received a low spade lead. He played dummy's jack, which held.

"I could have made things easier on myself if I had ducked a club at trick two," he noted. "Then I could ruff a club in dummy. But it all worked out."

After cashing a high heart, he led the ♦Q -- low, low, king. North led another spade. Abdou won his ace and led the ♥J. North showed out, and declarer ducked to South's queen.

When South shifted to a low club, Abdou couldn't afford to duck -- if West won the club, he could give South a spade ruff. Abdou went up with his ♣A and cashed two rounds of hearts and the ♦A.

When Abdou cashed the ♠K, North was winkled. If he pitched a diamond, that suit would run. If he discarded a low club, Abdou would cash the ♦9 and throw him in with the ♣Q, collecting a diamond on the end. (Note that South can't overtake the ♣Q without setting up Abdou's jack.)

Finally, if North discards the ♣Q, Abdou would overtake the ♦9 with dummy's jack and lead up to his ♣J. Plus 620 was worth 53.5 of 64 matchpoints.

### Rockwell Trophy

The Mixed Pairs is a four-session event with two qualifying and two final sessions. The Rockwell Trophy, donated by Helen Rockwell in 1946, is presented to the winners.

The record-holder in the Mixed Pairs is Sidney Silodor, who won the event five times -- including 1955 and 1956 with Helen Sobel. John Crawford won the event three times -- in 1948 and 1949 with Margaret Wagar and in 1959 with Dorothy Truscott, the first time they had ever played together. Winners and runners-up:

## Rich tradition makes 70th Vanderbilt special

The Vanderbilt Knockout Teams, which gets under way today, will be celebrating its 70th anniversary. The list of winners and runners-up through the years reads like a Who's Who in Bridge -- or a Bridge Hall of Fame roster.

Howard Schenken won the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams 10 times. John Crawford had nine wins; B. Jay Becker, George Rapee and Sidney Silodor, eight; Norman Kay and Oswald Jacoby, seven, and Edgar Kaplan, six.

Seven women have won the Vanderbilt a total of eight times: Mrs. Sidney Lovell and Caroline Taylor, who tied for first-second in 1928 when the Vanderbilt was played as a board-a-match teams; Josephine Culbertson, 1930; Helen Sobel, 1944 and 1945; Ruth Sherman, 1953; Carolyn Levitt, 1962, and Edith (Kemp) Freilich, 1963.

Sobel and Freilich are the only two women in ACBL history who have won all three major open championships: the Vanderbilt, Spingold and Reisinger. In fact, only 41 players throughout ACBL history have won all three.

### Defenders on hand

On hand for the 1998 Vanderbilt will be four defenders from the winning squad in 1997: Richard Schwartz, Mark Lair, Paul Soloway and Bobby Goldman -- plus new teammates Chip Martel and Lew Stansby.

Principal opposition is expected from three other squads:

- Grant Baze, Tipton Golias, Adam Zmudzinski, Marek Szymanowski, Marcin Lesniewski and Cezary Balicki, 1997 Spingold winners.

- Bart Bramley, Sidney Lazard, Howard Weinstein and Steve Garner -- 1997 Reisinger winners -- plus Geoff Hampson and Eric Greco.

- The always-dangerous team captained by Nick Nickell: Richard Freeman, Bob Hamman, Bobby Wolff, Jeff Meckstroth and Eric Rodwell. The squad put together a fantastic run in the mid-Nineties -- four consecutive Spingolds and three consecutive Reisingers, capped off by the 1995 Bermuda Bowl -- but they have yet to win a Vanderbilt.

### Vanderbilt donated trophy

The Vanderbilt Trophy for the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams was donated in 1928 by Harold S. Vanderbilt, who won the event in 1932 and 1940.

The Vanderbilt was contested annually in New York -- as a separate championship -- until 1958 when it became part of the Spring North American Championships.

Vanderbilt winners receive replicas of the trophy -- a practice initiated by Vanderbilt from the first running of the event and perpetuated by a \$100,000 trust fund administered by ACBL under the terms of Vanderbilt's will.

On display at ACBL Headquarters in Memphis are replicas donated by the families of Caroline Taylor, who won the Vanderbilt in 1928, and Helen Sobel Smith, a Vanderbilt winner in 1944 and 1945.

Here's a look at Vanderbilt action through the years:

- Oswald Jacoby won his first Vanderbilt in 1931 and his last in 1965. B. Jay Becker won his first in 1944 and his last in 1981.

- Two father-son partnerships have won the Vanderbilt: Oswald Jacoby and son Jim in 1965 and B. Jay Becker and son Michael in 1981.

- Edith Freilich and Billy Seamon are the only sister-brother partnership to win the Vanderbilt. Their team won in 1963 -- the last year a woman won a major open team championship.

- The only "three-peat" in Vanderbilt history

came when B. Jay Becker, John Crawford, George Rapee, Howard Schenken and Sidney Silodor captured the championship in 1955, 1956 and 1957.

- The first Vanderbilt was played in 1928 and the rank of Life Master was created in 1936. At that time, the first 10 LMs could claim 16 Vanderbilt titles and nine second-place finishes.

"I appreciate the fact that bridge has given me my best chance to express myself," said Eisenberg. "I am also glad to be able to give something back to the game that has done so much for me."

Gail Greenberg said that the Dorothy Truscott's bridge accomplishments speak for themselves. To show something of Dorothy's character, Gail told about what happened in Boston during the Women's Teams. "We were in the finals on vugraph in a long and tight match, and the worst possible thing happened -- the match ended in a tie. At first we were going to get our sleep and play off the next morning. But then the other team changed their minds and insisted that the playoff take place immediately.

"It seems that someone had pointed out to them that we were a team of grandmothers, and that we wouldn't have the stamina for an eight-board playoff. Well, the long and short of it is that we won, and it was almost entirely due to Dorothy's perfect set. She beat them almost single-handedly. We finished at 4 a.m. and Dorothy and I agreed we'd take the day off. I did, but when I went downstairs in the afternoon, there was Dorothy at the table, playing as hard as ever."

"We showed them about grandmothers," said Dorothy as she took the podium. "I really enjoy bridge. I enjoy it when I win and I enjoy it when I lose."

Henry Francis pointed out that Dave Treadwell has been playing bridge for 67 years -- and telling jokes most of that time. He told of the time Jim Becker gave a heart raise on three jacks, and Dave went all the way to six, where he was doubled. "You're always telling jokes -- can't you take one?" asked Becker as he put his hand on the table. But as usual Dave had the last laugh -- he made his doubled contract. Dave was named to the Hall of Fame via the Blackwood Award, which honors players who make outstanding contributions to bridge outside of bridge expertise.

Dave said he was glad that the friends who said he made the grade posthumously were wrong.

Each of the new Hall of Famers was given a copy of the March *Bridge Bulletin* with his or her picture on the cover.

When Norman Kay rose to talk about Roy Green, he started, "I don't have time to tell you all Roy's done. I'm amazed at how much he has accomplished in such a short time. This will be the last time he will visit us as CEO, but I'm hoping we'll see a lot of him as a player. Roy is a gentleman through and through, always impeccable in his appearance. Roy, I want you to know how much we all appreciate you and what you've done."

Roy answered by saying, "My wife Mary and I are looking forward to playing more bridge than ever. And I really appreciate all the support I have received from all of you through the years."

Osofsky called attention to three outstanding Goodwill members who have died recently -- Dick Shaver, the 1997 Goodwill Member of the Year; Bernard Warshauer, for many years the representative of District 7 on the ACBL Board of Directors, and Judy Tucker, who was stricken

**The Facts:** There was an agreed break in tempo before South passed 4♥. The ♠2 opening lead was won with dummy's ♠A. Declarer next played a heart to South's Ace, who then led the ♦5. North won the Ace, declarer playing the six, and returned a diamond. At this point E/W called the Director, who allowed play to continue. After the play the Director returned and ruled the table result would stand.

**The Appeal:** E/W appealed the ruling. They suggested the break in tempo promised high cards and suggested South would not have a singleton Spade. This made the defense of returning a diamond much easier.

**The Decision:** The Committee decided the table result would stand. If East held three spades and at least two diamonds, then it was probable he would try for discards on the clubs before playing a trump. The low diamond lead from South (the J, 10 and 9 are missing) indicated he held the ♦K. If South wanted to ruff a spade, he would have led a high diamond. Finally, if East had a 3-6-2-2 distribution, South could lead a club after winning the ♦K. This would lock declarer in dummy, and North would still win the ♠K.

The Committee then considered whether the appeal had substantial merit. The ♦5 lead at trick three strongly implied holding both a high diamond honor and spade length. This is a standard carding agreement that many players have and all experts assume. East is a player of such skill that he should have looked at the hand before bringing it to Committee and realized that there was no bridge logic to the appeal. Therefore, the Committee decided to retain the deposit.

## District 20 through the years

District 20 is a sprawling area that includes 28 units in northern California, Oregon, Vancouver WA, northern Nevada, two counties in western Idaho and Hawaii.

The district got its start when the Pacific Bridge League merged with ACBL in 1956. The seven Western districts were called the Western Conference and the conference operated all regionals in the area until about 1970.

District 20 was formally organized in 1970 and today is governed by a Board of Directors that includes each unit president plus the elected ACBL officials.

District 20 has been host to six NABCs: 1964, 1970 and 1986 in Portland, 1975 and 1983 in Honolulu and 1989 in Reno.

District representatives to the ACBL Board of Directors have been Max Manchester, Larry Jolma and Bob Lix.

### Max Manchester

Manchester (1914-1969) lived in Portland where he was executive secretary of the Oregon Public Employees Retirement System. He served as ACBL president in 1962 and as chairman of the Board in 1960 and 1961.

Manchester was named ACBL Honorary Member of the Year in 1964. He won the Men's Pairs in 1961.

### Larry Jolma

Jolma (1916-1996), also a Portland resident, represented District 20 on the ACBL Board of Directors for 30 years.

A Gold Life Master with almost 4000 masterpoints, Jolma won regional tournaments in the Sixties, Seventies and Eighties. He was captain of the all-District 20 team that won the NABC Men's Teams in 1967. His teammates were Gary Stark, Jim Dunlap, J.R. Patterson and Tom Bussey.

A member of the ACBL Goodwill Committee, Jolma was past president of the Portland Unit and was a member of the board of directors of the Western Conference. He was ACBL treasurer for three

years and served as chairman of the finance committee.

### Bob Lix

Lix, a retired Air Force colonel who lives in Brownsville CA, became the new district director when Jolma died in May 1996. Lix was elected first alternate director in 1990 and re-elected in 1993.

A graduate of the University of Missouri, Lix also earned a Master of Business Administration degree from Harvard Business School. He retired after a 22-year career in the U.S. Air Force and has since managed a warehouse of agricultural products and started a federally chartered bank.

A past president and member of the board of directors of the Marysville (CA) unit, he was District 20's executive secretary for several years before his election as first alternate director.

Lix and his wife Sally are both longtime members of the ACBL Goodwill Committee. They are serving as partnership co-chairman during the Reno NABC.

## Seven represent ACBL at Generali Masters

Seven ACBL players -- boasting 17 world titles among them -- will compete in the Generali Masters April 16-20 in Ajaccio, Corsica.

The 80 best players in the world -- 52 men and 28 women, representing 28 countries -- will compete for \$50,000 in cash prizes. The men will play 102 boards while the women will play 84 boards over the three-day competition.

ACBL participants are: Dianna Gordon, Toronto, who won the World Mixed Pairs in 1982; Jill Meyers, Santa Monica CA, Venice Cup winner in 1993 and 1997; Sue Picus, New York, Venice cup winner in 1991 and 1993; George Mittelman, Toronto, who won the World Mixed Pairs in 1982 and was runner-up in the 1995 Bermuda Bowl; Eric Kokish, Montreal, runner-up in the 1978 World Open Pairs and 1995 Bermudal Bowl; Richard Freeman, Atlanta, Bermuda Bowl winner in 1995, and Bobby Wolff, Dallas, winner of 10 world titles -- the Bermuda Bowl in 1970, 1971, 1977, 1983, 1985, 1987 and 1995; World Mixed Teams in 1972; World Open Pairs in 1974 and World Olympiad Teams in 1988.

## Conditions revised for Knockout Teams

Effective immediately at this NABC, the General Knockout Team Conditions of Contest have been revised.

In knockout play, any player meeting the individual participation requirements will receive the full overall award earned by his team. However, the rules by which an individual player fulfills his participation requirement have changed.

To fulfill the participation requirement, a player must meet each of the following conditions:

1. For any given overall award, a player must play at least 50% of all the boards played by the team at the time he (and the team) earned that award. (As in previous editions of these conditions, no player may play in a match past a time when he is unable to meet this condition.)

2. For any given overall award, a player must have played at least 50% of the boards in the match in which the team earned that award.

3. For a first-place award when the team wins the final, a player must also play at least 50% of the combined boards in the semifinal and final matches.

Combining the logic of conditions 2 and 3 means that a first-place award requires a player to play at least (a) 50% of each of the semifinal and final matches, or (b) all of the final match.

Players are reminded that a player may not enter any concurrent championship event while his team is participating in any match of the knockout.

In practice, this means that a player may miss an entire match without prior permission at any time during the event. However, depending on when a team is eliminated, a player who has sat out an entire match may not be awarded the overall position earned by the rest of his team members.

A chart listing the circumstances which will reduce an individual's position will be posted in the Knockout venues this week.

## Mott-Smith Trophy honors best performer at Spring NABC

The Mott-Smith Trophy is awarded each year to the player with the best overall individual performance at the Spring NABC.

The trophy was donated by friends in memory of Geoffrey Mott-Smith in 1961 and made retroactive to 1958 to include all the winners.

This letter, from Madeline Mott-Smith, appeared in the January 1961 *Bridge Bulletin*:

"On behalf of the family of Geoffrey Mott-Smith, I want to thank ... the ACBL for accepting the memorial trophy in his name.

"I am sure that Geoff would consider this a signal honor, and I am glad that the donors want to commemorate his name for all bridge players."

Mott-Smith (1902-1960) was co-chairman of the ACBL Laws Commission, editor of the *ACBL Bridge Bulletin* 1935-36, a contributor to *The Bridge World*, a writer and cryptographer.

Mott-Smith was one of the first to operate a bridge club and to direct bridge tournaments. He was the director of the annual intercollegiate tournaments and other "par" bridge events.

He worked with Ely Culbertson in the organization of the United States Bridge Association and with William E. McKenney in the early days of the ACBL.

During World War II, Mott-Smith served as chief instructor for the OSS in the training of cryptographers and cryptanalysts.

He authored or co-authored more than 29 books on games and served as games consultant for the Association of American Playing Card Manufacturers.

Mott-Smith was regarded as a great player, brilliant theorist and one of the soundest and most lucid of the early writers on contract bridge.

## A bid that backfired

Specialized bids often gain, but sometimes they backfire. On the following hand from the Vanderbilt, declarer knew his left-hand opponent had started with exactly five spades, and he was able to take advantage of that knowledge. Mike Roberts, the victim in this tale, turned the story in to the Daily Bulletin.

Chris Larsen, South, won the opening spade lead, but right away he faced a problem. He couldn't afford to give up a minor suit trick because the defense would cash four spade tricks. So he immediately led back a spade.

Roberts, West, took all his spades. Declarer sluffed two clubs from dummy and a diamond and a club from his hand. East had no problem up to this point. But declarer won the heart return in dummy and cashed three diamonds, ending in dummy. This was the five-card ending:

When declarer cashed the ♦Q, East had no discard. If he sluffed a heart, the suit would run, and if he threw a club, the queen and king would fall together and declarer's ♣8 would score the ninth trick.
