## New Jersey pairs lead in Blue Ribbon

Four players from New Jersey held down the top two spots in the Blue Ribbon Pairs after the first two qualifying sessions.

In first place with a score of 2113.5 were Robert and Gail Van Ekeren of Plainsboro. Right behind them, with 2110.38, were Jay Korobow and Alexander Allen of Princeton.

Two couples held down the next two spots -- Lew and JoAnna Stansby of Castro Valley were less than one matchpoint out of second, and Stephen and Kerri Sanborn were fourth, about 50 matchpoints behind the Stansbys.

Last year's winners, David Berkowitz and Larry Cohen, stood 60th in the field after the first day of play.

## Directing prodigy working last NABC

Karen Cooper, a tournament director since she was 15 years old, is retiring from full-time work at the ripe old age of 29.

With plans to marry next summer and her eye on a career as a teacher, Cooper will direct only in the Toronto area after the Fall NABC in San Francisco.

Her "retirement" will end a string of 20 straight NABCs she has worked since the summer tournament in Boston in 1990.

"It's time to move on," said Cooper, who will wed Junior player David Levy of Montreal in June. They met during the 1993 Summer NABC in Washington

Chilcote, of Cleveland OH, is playing with Zeke Jabbour and Billy Eisenberg, Boca Raton FL; Fred Hamilton, Fresno CA; Tommy Sanders, Nashville, and Russ Arnold, Miami. Arnold and Jabbour are seeking their third straight victory in the Senior KO.

They defeated the team captained by Michael Flanagan of Westlake Village CA. Flanagan and his wife Barbara were playing with Stephen Mager,

## Piltch elected ACBL president

Howard Piltch of Andover MA, District director from District 25 (New England), was elected president of the ACBL for 1997 by the Board of Directors last week.

Piltch has been a very active member of the Board. He has served as chairman of the Tournament Committee for two years and was chairman of the Education Committee for one year. He has displayed a vital interest in the ACBL's insurance problems and has been responsible for major savings in this area.

Piltch is a licensed real estate and insurance broker, but nowadays he works as a bridge professional. He is a highly successful player with about 13,000 masterpoints and more than 125 regional championships to his credit.

He is a regular among the lecturers to novice players at North American Championships. His subjects cover such areas as "Shape, Beautiful Shape" and "Balance, Baby, Balance!"

He is married -- and now his wife Barbara is a bridge player too. They have a pact -- each is supposed to increase their masterpoint holding by 10% per year. Howard already has his 1300, but Barbara still has about three points to go.

They have two children -- Joseph 23 and Robert 14. Three dogs and two cats round out the household.

Piltch got into bridge in a rather strange way. He was visiting his parents in Brookline MA when he got a call from three old friends. "We've discovered the greatest game," they told him. "Come on over and play. We're playing for five cents a point."

That didn't sound bad. He had heard that bridge

## Teaching gift bears fruit

Three years ago, Thomas McDow of Rock Hill SC wanted to honor his late mother in a way that would pay homage to her love of bridge.

To do that, he and Bernard Warshauer, then a member of the ACBL Board of Directors, arranged for bridge teacher Jerry Helms to travel to Yale University in New Haven CT to teach the *Club Series* to a group of students.

Helms actually did double duty with the student group. He taught them the beginning bridge lessons -- and he gave them the Teacher Accreditation Program (TAP). In other words, he taught them bridge and how to teach it.

Now, four former Yale students who took the lessons, along with at least a dozen second-generation bridge students from Yale, are playing at the Fall NABC in San Francisco.

McDow's mother would have been proud.

## Closing in on 8000

San Francisco 1997 was closing in on the 8000-table mark as we passed the halfway mark yesterday. The table count now is 7899.5. This is well ahead of San Francisco 1990, which had 7179 tables at this point.

There is no question about it -- the 1997 tournament will surpass 1965 (11,198) and 1981 (11,377). The target, of course, is the 1990 event (13,239).

## 4NT -- a tough question

Hugh Ross was really worried. What would he answer if his partner, Peter Nagy, bid 4NT -- Kay Card Blackwood? What would YOU respond with two key cards, the queen of trumps, a useful void and a useless void? This was the deal from the first qualifying session of the Blue Ribbon Pairs:

Nagy took pity on his partner and never bid 4NT. This was their auction:

Ross made 12 tricks when he guessed the clubs wrong. That didn't earn him much of a matchpoint score -- some declarers got to 7♥ doubled and made it -- but Hugh was tremendously relieved that he didn't have to respond to 4NT.

## A big help -- 'here's how it's spelled'

Tournament Director Karen Cooper was shaking her head Tuesday after an encounter with a gentleman whose mind apparently was more focused on endplays and squeezes than real life.

Cooper, selling entries to the Blue Ribbon Pairs, asked one fellow for his name so she could write it down. What she heard when he answered was "Bob" and an undistinguishable -- and certainly unspellable -- last name.

"How do you spell that?" Cooper inquired.

Said the gentleman, in all seriousness, "B-O-B" -- followed by the same unfathomable and unspelled last name.

## Ron von der Porten visit

Ron von der Porten, a former star in top-flight ACBL and world competition who has dropped out of competitive bridge for the most part, dropped by the Daily Bulletin office yesterday.

Ron has been living in England for the past two and a half years. Ron is retired, but his wife has a major job in England. He plays some rubber bridge but almost no tournament bridge.

He did play tournament bridge once recently. Bob Hamman went over to England to play in the Brighton team tournament in which 291 teams participated. He asked Ron to play as his partner, and they finished third in this strong international event. It's not as if Ron and Bob were new partners -- they once won the Blue Ribbon Pairs together.

Ron still does quite a bit of cruise bridge work -- he's been involved in that sort of activity for more than 30 years. "It's a different world on a ship," he said. "But the players enjoy spending their on-board time doing something they like. It isn't like tournament bridge at all."

Ron also has long been an expert commentator. He was the chief commentator at the Macallan tournament in London last year. The Macallan is one of the top pair tournaments on the world calendar.

Ron is a strong holdout against five-card major systems. "Players can learn the basics of such systems, but they get all tangled up in their ideas when they try to get beyond the basics. A good four-card major system is still the best -- that's what I play. You can build on this naturally and easily, and you don't need all kinds of conventions and understandings. If I ever go back to writing -- I haven't touched a typewriter in 12 years -- I think I'll write a book on four-card majors. In my opinion, there isn't a single good book on four-card majors on the market today."

## But how do you double?

On a crowded elevator, Chyah Burghard of Rochester MN was ruminating about the Monday afternoon giveaway -- the curvy yellow fruit that comes in bunches.

"All day long," said Burghard, "I wanted to bid one banana."

One of the other passengers was Grant Baze, one of ACBL's top bridge pros. "That," he said, "would have been better than some of the bids I made."

## Charity president is Carol Sanders

Carol Sanders of Nashville, who together with her husband Tom was named a co-Honorary Member for 1997, has been elected president of the ACBL Charity Foundation. She has been a Charity Foundation trustee for eight years and has served as vice president for the past five.

Sanders wants all bridge players to know how much they have done for charity over the years. "Most of our members know that we make large donations to our Charity of the Year. As a matter of fact, we donate \$100,000 each year to these charities, which always are chosen for a two-year term.

"But your Charity Foundation does much more than that -- it makes all kinds of minor grants. Altogether the foundation gives away about \$50,000 in minor grants."

Lots is being done for charity by bridge players, but even more can be done, according to Sanders. "I want to open a door so our players can know what they can do locally. Every club has to run one charity game a year for the Charity of the Year. But every club can also run a second charity game, with 100% of the proceeds going to the local charity they choose.

"Good things are happening with the Charity Foundation, and I want to keep all members abreast of what's going on. We're making lots of progress."

DC. He is close to earning a law degree.

Cooper made a name for herself when she was promoted to regional rank as a TD in 1990, the youngest person ever to achieve that rank -- a record that hasn't been beaten.

Besides developing as a TD -- she was working the Blue Ribbon Pairs Tuesday -- Cooper has become one of the ACBL's experts in working the computer for Pendergraph (vugraph) shows. In fact, she is about to earn a bachelor of science degree in computer science from York University in Toronto.

She hopes to teach math and computer science at the middle-school level in Toronto.

Cooper said she will miss all the friends she has made in the tournament world. "It's been a great job," she said, "and maybe one day I'll come back to it."

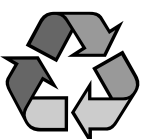
For now, Cooper is looking forward to setting up housekeeping and planning a family with Levy, who will move to Toronto after they marry.

## Quiet captain

Bobby Baldwin of Las Vegas, captain of the winning squad in the Open Board-a-Match Teams, shuns publicity and doesn't like to talk about himself. On the other hand, his partner, Bobby Levin, couldn't say enough about Baldwin's development as a player over the past 18 months.

Baldwin, president of the Mirage Hotel in Las Vegas, was an average player who wanted to improve, so he enlisted Levin's aid. Because Baldwin has so little free time, going to tournaments is impossible. So he and Levin have been playing 15 to 20 days a month on OKbridge on the Internet.

"He's now a tremendous player," said Levin of the former winner of the World Series of Poker. "On his good days he plays as well as any top expert."

Baldwin handled the cards well on this deal from the first final session of the Open BAM.

Baldwin liked his 19 high-card points so well that he upgraded the hand for his 2NT opener, which normally shows 20-21 HCP.

West led a low heart to the 5, 8 and A, and Baldwin played the ♠A and a spade to dummy's queen.

Next, Baldwin played the ♦10, inserting his queen when East played low. West won the ♦K and stopped to consider the information he had to that point.

West knew South had seven points in spades but only four in hearts.

With the ♥Q, Baldwin probably would have cashed that card. West could also place South with the ♦A Q, which added up to only 17 HCP. West therefore concluded that South had to have the ♣K to be able to open 2NT. Deciding against cashing the ♠A, West exited with the ♥J to dummy's king.

Baldwin took full advantage of the chance for an overtrick. He ruffed a heart, cashed the ♦A and played the ♦9, letting it ride and pitching a club from dummy when West played low. Even if West had covered with the ♦J, Baldwin's ♦7 would have been good because the ♦8 in East's hand was blotted out.

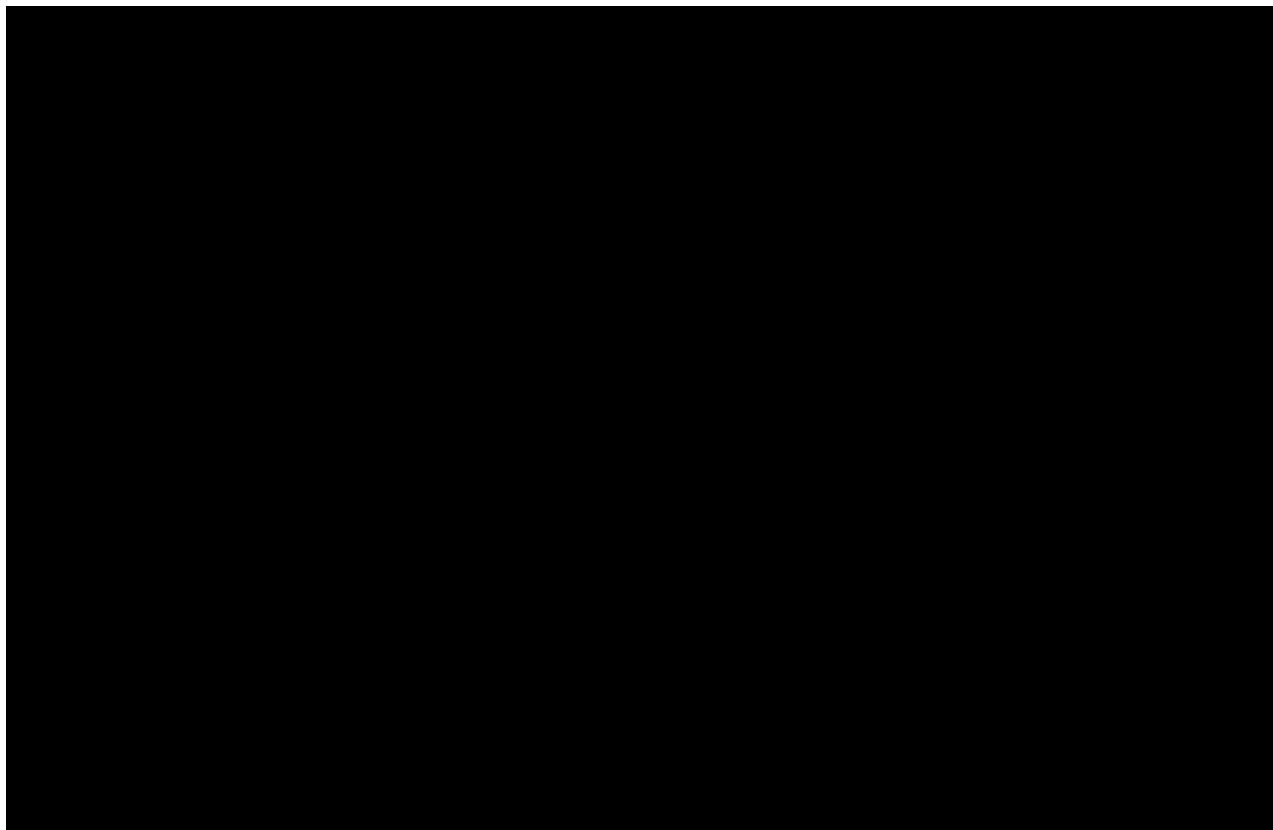

## Fine card reading

Joanna Stansby produced an excellent piece of card reading in the Women's Board-a-Match final. Fortunately for her it was in an event where an extra overtrick translated into a valuable result -- half a board as it happened.

Joanna reached 4♥ on the lead of the ♣2 to the queen and king. North shifted to the ♠8, covered all around, and Stansby drew trumps, pitching a spade from dummy. Then he cashed a second top club to learn the bad news. Now a second spade was won by South who exited passively with a third spade - yes, a diamond would have been better. Now Stansby ruffed and played one more trump to reach this ending:

At this point I think Stansby did very well to play her opponents for having failed to find the diamond shift with the ♦K wrong. When she cashed the next-to-last trump she executed a trump squeeze. North was forced to come down to two diamonds. Stansby could cash the ♦A, ruff a diamond and leave dummy high.

## New Life Masters

MARK MICHELI earned his gold card Monday with a 215 session to win the Mike Jones Strat B trophy.

ALEX CAMERON of Kailua Kuna, Hawaii, became a Life Master by placing in the overall of the Senior Pairs on Monday. "When you live in Hawaii, you have to travel long distances to get gold points," said Cameron.

ANGELO SERVINO of Tiburon CA went over the top playing with Richard Manoogian.

RALPH ALEXANDER, also of Tiburon, was partnered by Steve Waldman when he earned his gold card.

NED C. BRUNER of Butte MT earned his gold card in the Stratified Open Pairs on Monday.

BARBARA and WILLIAM MOON of Carruthers CA became Life Masters together by winning Strat C of the Stratified Senior Pairs Tuesday.

## How low can you go?

Alex Ornstein was faced with a tough declarer play problem in the Swiss Teams on Sunday. He reached 5♦ as West and this was what he had to work with:

♠ A 9 7 4 2

♥ A

♦ Q 10 8 5 3 2

♣ Q

♠ 5

♥ J 4

♦ A 7 6

♣ A K J 10 9 5 2

5♦ seems to be the best of the games -- other than 3NT of course! 6♦ would be fine, although a club lead might be a bit awkward.

How do you play 5♦ on the lead of a heart?

Ornstein worked out the best play. He led a small trump, intending to play dummy's 6. When this loses, you win the return, lay down the ♦A and run clubs, conceding a second trump if necessary.

So Ornstein played the ♦2 and put in the 6 -- and South discarded a heart!! Now Ornstein played three top clubs, throwing two spades. North ruffed and played a second heart, but Ornstein ruffed, trumped a spade, cashed the ♦A and led another top club, sluffing his low spade. He lost just two trumps.

## Close calls

When you win the Open Board-a-Match Teams by more than five boards, you're doing a lot of things right. The squad captained by Bobby Baldwin of Las Vegas came up with two strong defensive efforts to avoid losses on these deals from the second qualifying session.

The first features Bobby Levin and Peter Weichsel on defense against a pushy game.

Weichsel led a low club, ruffed in dummy. Declarer led a low heart to his queen, ducked by Weichsel, who won the heart continuation and switched to the ♠J. North won with the ace, cashed the ♦A, ruffed another club to dummy and cashed the ♥K, pitching a diamond from his hand.

Declarer then ruffed a diamond and used dummy's last trump to ruff a club. This was the position, declarer needing two more tricks:

North led a diamond from dummy and Levin ruffed with the 9. Declarer could not gain by overruffing, so he desperately discarded a club. Levin then cashed the ♣A and played the ♥9, promoting Weichsel's ♠Q as the setting trick.

The next deal features a stellar defensive effort by Michael Rosenberg and Zia.

At one table, Levin and Weichsel reached 3NT on the East-West cards. That contract failed by a trick. Although they didn't know it, at the other table Zia (South) and Rosenberg (North) had to find a way to defeat *one* notrump by East.

Zia led a low diamond to the 5, 10 and jack. At trick two, declarer led the ♥6 from his hand to Zia's jack and dummy's king. Rosenberg smoothly followed with the 3! Declarer then played a low heart from dummy, on which Rosenberg played the 9. Declarer, completely taken in, ducked. As Rosenberg was cashing his hearts, Zia completed an echo in clubs, hoping to convince declarer that he held the king.

Zia, of course, was also having trouble making discards, so he ended up having to throw one of his diamond winners, but the defenders still ended up with four heart tricks, two diamonds and a spade for plus 100 and an unlikely push.

# Low-key Barry Rigal builds high-profile reputation

Of all the accomplishments in his bridge career, Barry Rigal may be most proud of the accuracy of his predictions as a vugraph commentator in North American and world championships.

On many occasions, other panelists have laughed at his forecasts only to eat their words moments later when Rigal's predictions come to pass before their eyes.

Consider this scene from the Bermuda Bowl in Santiago, Chile:

*East, a Brazilian, is on lead against 5♣ doubled. He leads the ♥K, seeing a singleton heart in dummy.*

*East holds the ♣A J doubleton, West the singleton ♣K. Some of Rigal's fellow panelists scoff when he predicts that East will shift to the ♣A, dropping partner's king. It happens.*

*The contract is still beatable as long as East doesn't play a spade away from his king, but Rigal is right there with that prediction as well. Again, he is right. The absolutely impossible contract is made, and Rigal has guessed each improbable step.*

Although vugraph commentary is pretty much a high-profile role, for the most part Rigal -- a transplanted Brit -- goes about his job as a bridge journalist and player in a decidedly low-key fashion.

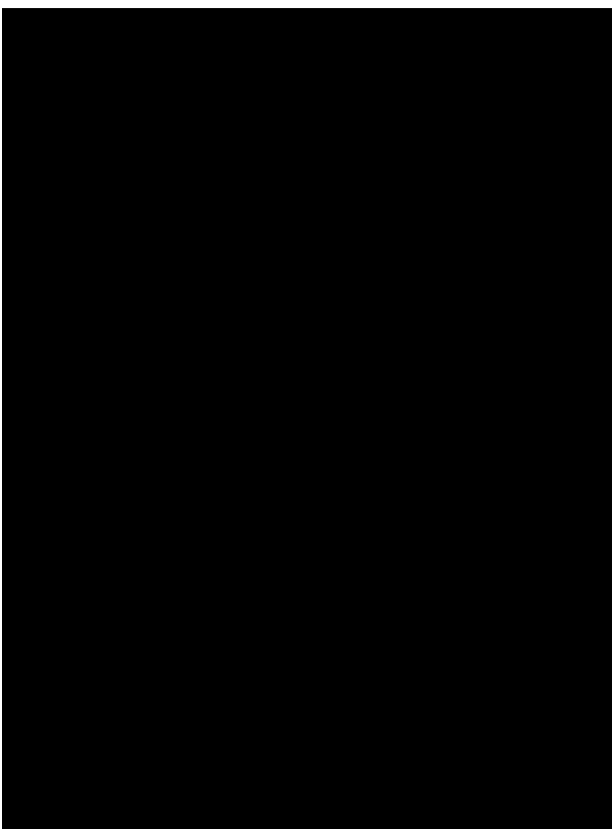
Even at that, his bridge career is steadily expanding and his reputation growing.

Now a staple on vugraph panels whenever he is available, Rigal is also a prolific writer for English-language bridge magazines -- including the ACBL *Bridge Bulletin* -- a regular and important contributor to the *Daily Bulletins* at NABCs, author of several books and an accomplished player.

That's quite a resumé for someone virtually unheard of in the U.S. until a couple of years ago.

Rigal, 38, lived all of his life in the center of London -- in the same house his grandmother moved into after her marriage in 1925 -- except for four years at Oxford University.

Curiously, at Oxford he studied Latin and Greek for the first two years, classical Hebrew for the second two. It's curious because the profession he took

up was as a CPA.

By the time he left Oxford, Rigal had a lot of bridge experience under his belt. Rigal learned the game at age 12, just about the time he had made the decision that he wasn't going to realize his first competitive ambition -- that of being a world-class table tennis player.

Luckily for him, Rigal fell in with a pretty good group of bridge players, including Tim Cope, who regularly represents South Africa in international competition.

Rigal discovered duplicate at age 16 and learned to love that variation. "It's rather intoxicating," he said, "to find that you're good at something."

At Oxford, the bridge crowd was not as strong, but Rigal kept working to improve and, on his return to London, found himself in good company again.

Rigal and his regular partner for seven years, Peter Czerniewski, won every event that mattered in Great Britain at least once.

Rigal wrote his first magazine article in 1984. His books include *Test Your Bridge Judgement* and *Step-by-Step: Deceptive Declarer Play*. A sequel about deceptive play by defenders is on its way, as is a book he has written with Bob Hamman. Rigal has also helped expand and update a reissue of a Terence Reese classic, *The Expert Game*.

After he qualified as a CPA in 1983, Rigal worked for Price Waterhouse in London for four years before joining Conoco, the American oil company, in their tax department.

Such an occupation may sound dry, but Rigal treated it as a kind of sport. As an accountant for Conoco, Rigal was trying to make sure Conoco paid the minimum in taxes, while his counterparts with the government were trying to see that the company paid the maximum. "It was very much a game played between gentlemen," he said. "I liked the challenge of it."

When Conoco decided to close the London office and move it to Aberdeen -- "an inaccessible, cold, dank place in the northeast corner of Scotland" -- Rigal decided it was time to move on.

A lover of theater, movies and fine restaurants, Rigal said, "I didn't fancy moving to a place with one theater and two cinemas."

Rigal had met and formed a friendship with Sue Picus in 1987 when she spent 18 months in London on assignment from her company. When Conoco pulled the rug out from under him in 1994, Rigal moved to New York, where he shares an apartment with Picus. He spends a lot of his time there playing and teaching bridge and writing about the game.

Rigal has done well in high-level competition in the U.S. His best finish so far was second in the North American Swiss Teams at the 1994 Fall NABC in Minneapolis. His teammates were Jo Ann Sprung and Dorothy and Alan Truscott.

Rigal's first stint on a vugraph panel was in 1987, and he's honed his skills ever since.

"My perception," he said, "is that many vugraph commentators find it difficult to divorce double-dummy analysis from the single dummy that the players are seeing. I try to put myself in the position of the player looking at a single dummy."

Rigal, of course, is a serious player, but not so much so that he overlooks the main reason for playing. "I'm more interested in having a good time."

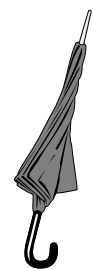

was a lot like whist -- and he knew whist. The most you can score on a hand of whist is seven, so he knew the game wouldn't be costly.

Three and a half hours after he started playing, he wrote a check for \$436. "That was 25 years ago," says Howard. "That money represented the mortgage payment, the car payment, the utilities bill and some of the month's food."

Howard still plays with the same three old friends once in a while, but nowadays Howard is always on the plus side. And Howard considers that game in which he was a big loser a major turning point in his life.

"It was a turning point for me," he says. "There are more people that I care about in the bridge world than I thought possible. I have made some wonderful friends through bridge."

He calls bridge the most wonderful game in the world. "It's a tremendous sport -- you can enjoy it when you're nine and when you're ninety. All you need is a mind and a pleasant disposition to have the time of your life.

"But there is one thing that we must do -- we must set to rest the myth is an old person's game. And it is a myth. Bridge is a totally vital game -- just ask some of our Juniors."

Pilch has many ideas about how bridge can make a major resurgence. Be sure to read his interview in the January issue of *The Bridge Bulletin*. □

**The Facts:** 3♦ made three, plus 110 for N/S. There was an agreed break in tempo by South after East's 2♠ bid. The Director ruled (Law 16A) that there was unauthorized information present and that pass by North was a logical alternative to 3♦. The Director changed the contract to 2♠ made two, plus 110 for E/W.

**The Appeal:** N/S appealed the Director's ruling. Both sides agreed there had been a break in tempo. North did not believe that pass was a logical alternative with a six-loser hand, not vulnerable, at matchpoints. N/S were playing their first session together and had a combined total of approximately 300 masterpoints.

**The Committee Decision:** The Committee decided that even though there was a break in tempo, it was likely from the auction that the South hand would have one or more useful cards. The Committee members did not believe that defending 2♠ was a decision that would be considered by N/S's peers. The Committee restored the table result of 3♦ made three, plus 110 for N/S. The importance of bidding in a relatively even tempo was explained to N/S. They were made aware that a player's breaks in tempo usually transmit unauthorized information which might strictly limit the acceptable options available to his partner.

**The Facts:** The contract was 4♠ by South. After the opening lead of the ♥3, the play proceeded as follows:

At this point, declarer claimed the remainder of the tricks and stated he would ruff (with the ♠5) and draw (what he thought was) the last trump with the ♠K, and run diamonds. Since West would still have had the ♠9, he called the Director. The Director ruled

(Law 70C) that since declarer had not accounted for all the trumps, he might have played his last trump, the ♠6, which would lose to the ♠9. The defense would have then taken (in addition to the three tricks already won at this point) three additional heart tricks and two club tricks. The Director ruled that the result would be 4♠ down five, plus 250 for E/W.

**The Appeal:** N/S appealed the Director's ruling. South stated that because he had thought trumps were drawn, it was unreasonable to make him play his last trump before he began to play diamonds. If that line of play was allowed, West would ruff the fourth round of diamonds, and South would then be able to win two high spades, two ruffs, and three diamond tricks for down three. E/W stated that had play continued, when East did not follow suit on the third round of trump, South might have played another round.

**The Committee Decision:** Law 70C states: "When a trump remains in one of the opponents' hand, the Director shall award a trick or tricks . . . that could be lost to that trump by any normal play" Also, the Laws state 'normal' includes play that would be careless or inferior for the class of player involved, but not irrational". In order to decide how many tricks to award the defense the Committee had to decide if it was "irrational", or merely "careless" for South to play a fourth round of trump. Two Committee members believed that since West had clearly miscounted trumps, as well as his tricks, there was a chance he would carelessly play a fourth round of trumps. Three Committee members believed that when declarer played the ♠K and West followed with the ♠7, it would be irrational for South to then play the ♠6. Therefore, in a three-two split decision, the Committee changed the result to 4♠ down three, plus 150 for E/W.

**The Facts:** After the opening lead of the ♦J, 6♠ went down three, plus 150 for E/W. The Director was called by West after he asked the meaning of the 3♣ bid and was told only that it was a relay to 3♦. He wanted more information. The Director remained at the table while the auction continued. North volunteered that 3♠ was forcing. When asked about 5♣, South stated that he didn't know what it meant.

At this point, the Director instructed that the auction continue and left the table. Before the opening lead was made, South explained that systemically the 3♣ bid showed either a diamond bust or a game-forcing hand with a six-card or longer suit. At this point East called the Director. When the Director arrived, there was a great deal of commotion at the table.

The Director did not take East away from the table to ask if he wanted to change his last call based on the information that South had provided. East stated, however, that he wished to reserve his rights. The Director instructed that play continue. After play was completed, the Director was called again by East who stated that had he known the meaning of all of the bids before his final pass, he would have doubled the final contract. The Director ruled that the table result would stand.

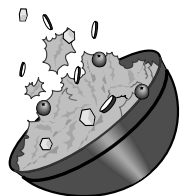
**The Appeal:** E/W appealed the Director's ruling. East stated that if he had the correct information about the auction, he would have doubled the final contract. South had been playing his complicated system for about four years. He stated that he had been teaching his wife (North) the system over the last two years and that there had not been too many partnership misunderstandings. The Committee examined the N/S convention cards and found that this specific auction (2♣ - Pass - 3♣) was listed and described.

**The Committee Decision:** The Committee had to deal with a unique situation in that the Director had not taken East aside to determine if he would have changed his final call had correct explanations been given. The Committee decided, after listening to East and considering that he had doubled 3♦ and had indicated that he wished to reserve his rights, that it was possible that he would have doubled the final contract. The Committee also decided that it was possible that East had enough information about the hand to double in any case if he wanted to do so. The Committee decided to award an adjusted score (Law86B) that consisted of 25% of the IMPs for a contract of

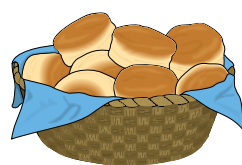

6♠ doubled down three, plus 500 for E/W and 75% of the IMPs for a contract of 6♠ undoubled down three, plus 150 for E/W.

Since North's incomplete explanations had affected East's decision to not double, a 1-IMP procedural penalty (that accrued to E/W) was assessed against N/S.

**The Facts:** The opening lead was the ♥A, after which 6♠ made seven, plus 1010 for N/S. After the play was completed, West called the Director because he was not sure whether the 3NT bid was Alertable. He stated that if it was Alertable, and if it had been Alerted, he might have chosen a different opening lead (a trump). The Director ruled that the result would stand since E/W had not been damaged (Law 40C) by the failure to Alert.

**The Appeal:** E/W appealed the Director's ruling. West stated that he expected the dummy to be a strong balanced hand and he thought that the failure to Alert denied him the opportunity to consider other opening leads. He stated that he had led the ♥A in order to determine the best shift after he saw the dummy. West also stated that he had tried to unobtrusively examine the N/S convention cards, but since they were not in a position that could be easily seen, he was unable to do so.

The Committee examined the N/S convention cards and found that Gambling 3NT was clearly marked. When asked why 3NT was not Alerted, South stated that she did not realize the bid was Alertable, and that this was the first time the bid had been made in their partnership. When asked if he wondered why there had not been any sort of transfer auction, West stated that he really didn't think about it -- he just assumed that 3NT was strong and balanced.

**The Committee Decision:** The Committee agreed that there had been a failure to Alert. The Committee explained to the players that since the failure to Alert was misinformation, Law 47E2 allowed the player to "retract the card he . . . played after a mistaken explanation of an opponent's conventional call . . ." which is what the Director would have communicated to the players had he been (Law 9B1a) ". . . summoned at once when attention . . . drawn to an irregularity." The Committee determined that due to this negligence the damage was not a consequence of the infraction (Law 40C) and allowed the table result, 6♠ made seven, plus 1010 for N/S to stand. The Committee also explained that an opening 3NT bid was sufficiently rare that the player had an obligation to determine the meaning of the call if he considered that information necessary to make an informed decision.

The Committee also decided that since the failure to Alert was an infraction, and since there was no damage to the non-offenders, N/S would be assessed a one-half IMP procedural penalty that would

accrue to E/W for contributing to the disruption that ensued.

**The Facts:** 2♠ doubled by South went down two, plus 300 for N/S. After 2♦ was doubled, North rescinded the Alert and announced that the double was for penalty, adding: "He should have five" diamonds. The Director ruled that there was no damage from the misinformation and allowed the result to stand.

**The Appeal:** E/W appealed the Director's ruling. East stated he predicated his redouble on the likelihood of an E/W major suit fit.

**The Committee Decision:** The Committee decided that East's judgment in redoubling was less than ironclad in that E/W might well find themselves playing in a 6-0 club fit at the three-level and that opposite partner's presumed diamond shortness, a 4-3 spade fit might not

stand up well to repeated trump leads. Furthermore, the Committee was not sure E/W had been damaged, inasmuch as 2♦ doubled might well fail by two tricks.

North was instructed not to give the opponents the benefit of his bridge judgment when asked about his partnership's agreements. (He had stated when asked that this partnership did not have the agreement that the double showed five trumps.)

In summary, the Committee agreed that East took his chances and should live with the result. The Committee allowed the table result (2♠ doubled by West down two, plus 300 for N/S) to stand. The E/W deposit was returned.

**The Facts:** 4NT went down three, plus 150 for N/S. 3♠ was Alerted as a good preempt in spades; 3♦ would be a weak preempt in spades. E/W asked North to provide them with an example of a good preempt and were told that AKxxxxx would be an acceptable suit. After South's hand was disclosed, the Director was summoned. East alleged that had he known that South might hold a six-card suit, he would have doubled 4♠. The Director ruled that the result would stand.

**The Appeal:** E/W appealed the Director's ruling. They stated that they should have been told that the bid might be based on a "shaped" hand and might not be a seven-card suit. East stated that had he been apprised of the possibility that South held a six-card suit, he would have chosen to double 4♠. If South held seven spades, East believed that West might be able to isolate South in the play.

**The Committee Decision:** The Committee deemed North's answer to East's question (regarding the nature of 3♠) to be sufficient; AKxxxxx was both close to the prototype (by agreement) and definitely a valid example. Although E/W contended that North should have said something about six-card suits, the hand that South held (third seat, not vulnerable) was so much better than a "bad" 3♠ preempt (via 3♦) that E/W should have realized its appropriateness and withdrawn their appeal.

Furthermore, the E/W case was the sort of stretch of imagination that a Committee would always regard as self-serving and E/W were both very experienced players. East had a very good hand on the auction and were perhaps as likely to be missing a slam as going down in 4NT. Had East or West wished to know about the possibility of a six-card suit, it was open to both of them to ask a specific question to that effect.

The Committee members considered the E/W case to be without merit and decided to retain E/W's deposit. Furthermore, the Committee deemed E/W's appeal to be abusive of the appeals process and accordingly assessed them a penalty of one-quarter of a board.

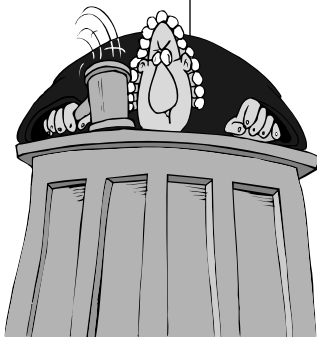

**The Appeal:** N/S appealed the Director's ruling. The break in tempo was admitted to be 25-40 seconds. South stated that the only time a diamond contract could be doubled for penalty would be immediately after the 2♦ bid. They play penalty doubles at the two-level and takeout doubles at the three-level. He stated that the break in tempo was because he was considering bidding 3♥ but was concerned that his partner might think he had five hearts.

**The Committee Decision:** The Committee decided that the explanation of the double of 3♦ was a self-serving statement. The admitted 25-40 second hesitation seemed uncommonly long for a South who "knew" that double was for takeout. Based on this observation, the Committee changed the contract to 3♦ doubled down one, plus 100 for N/S. The combination of the N/S explanation of the meaning of the double, the failure to Alert, and the long hesitation was sufficiently contradictory to convince the Committee to retain the deposit because the appeal did not have substantial merit.

The East player, who arrived late, professed not to know whether there was to be a Committee. He hotly denied that his partnership was notified until the Director showed him his partner's signature in the non-appellants box of the appeal form. In addition, he made his statements between bites of food he had brought with him. The Committee considered a procedural penalty for his conduct, but decided instead to inform him of their concerns.

# Think fast, analyze later

When Lou Reich played against the international player with his bevy of kibitzers, he wanted to give them something to talk about.

East-West have reached a sensible spot, and the opening lead was the ♦2. Reich won the ace and played a heart to the king -- not an obvious line, but look what happened!

Back came a second diamond, of course, and now Reich won the ♦Q, played a heart to the jack and took his club discard on the top diamond. A spade to the king and ace allowed the defense to force declarer for the first time. Reich ruffed the club switch, ruffed a heart and then played the ♠J, smothering the 10 and scoring up 10 tricks.

The offended internationalist could not stop himself from saying, "Did you miss-sort your hand?" But look what happens if declarer rushes to take his club discard. After the three top diamonds and a spade to the king and ace, the defense taps declarer once. They do so again when in with the ♥A, and now declarer can't play any more trumps. He must lead winning hearts, and the defense will score their ♠Q and ♠10. You make only plus 140 instead of 170 with that line.
