## Morris out front in Open BAM

A foursome captained by Robert Morris of Houston TX will start play today in the Victor Mitchell Open Board-a-Match Teams with a lead of about three-quarters of a board.

Morris is playing with Steven Cooper, Fort Collins CO; Allan Falk, Okemos MI, and Peter Friedland, Cupertino CA.

Their carryover of 6.15 puts them .74 ahead of Barry Rigal, Alex Ornstein, Jeff Aker and Glenn Milgrim.

The four-session event concludes tonight.

The team captained by Geeske Joel starts play today in the Marsha May Sternberg Women's Board-a-Match Teams with slim lead over two squads just a quarter of a board behind.

Joel, of Palo Alto CA, is playing with Tobi Sokolow, Austin TX; Jill Meyers, Santa Monica CA; Jill Levin, Lake Ariel PA; Debbie Rosenberg, New Rochelle NY, and Janice Seamon-Molson, Hollywood FL.

Tied for second third with two sessions to play are teams captained by Kyoko Shimamura of Tokyo, Japan, and Daniele Gaviard of Paris, France.

## Tucker maintains focus on recruiting young players

Concentration is a key to success at bridge – and that may explain why Patty Tucker, an expert bridge player and ACBL's youth coordinator, has yet to take her eye off the ball as she strives for new and better ways to promote bridge to young people.

At the Fall NABC in San Diego, she is distributing a flyer about the newly created Foundation for the Preservation and Advancement of Bridge. It's a 501(c)(3) organization – meaning contributions are tax deductible – whose purpose includes inspiring more young people to play bridge.

Trustees of the foundation are Bob Hamman, president; Steve Beatty, vice president; Allan Falk, Sheri Winestock, Lynne Schaeffer, Jay Baum and Tucker. Tracey Yarbrow is secretary.

Tucker's flyer describes the success of this year's Youth NABC, the second tournament for players 19 and younger, and points to the 2010 Youth NABC scheduled for New Orleans next

## Gates, Buffett named 2010 Honorary Members

Bill Gates and Warren Buffett, whose love of bridge prompted them to donate \$1 million to help promote teaching the game in schools, have been selected as the 2010 ACBL Honorary Members of the Year.

The recipients of the honor each year are chosen by vote of the ACBL Board of Directors to acknowledge long and meritorious service to bridge.

The two titans of business – Gates is the founder and chairman of Microsoft and Buffett is chairman and CEO of Berkshire Hathaway, a conglomerate holding company – have made no secret of their love of bridge over the past several years.

Gates is often seen at ACBL tournaments and even occasionally at a world championship. Buffett, who lives in Omaha NE, doesn't travel to tournaments, but he is known to play bridge online about 12 hours a week.

Both have expressed their support for the game of bridge and the many benefits it has for old and young alike. In 2005, the two announced a grant of \$1 million to fund efforts to teach bridge to school children.

In a news article in USA Today that year, Buffett touted the benefits of bridge over poker, which seems to have seized the imagination of more young people. Said Buffett: "There's intellectual development involved and working as partners with people. If a lot of kids are exposed to bridge, a number of them are going to benefit in a very significant way."

ACBL Board Members Joan Gerard and Al Levy were co-chairs of the Honorary Member Committee. Gerard said the committee unanimously selected the recipients for 2010.

"It took less than a minute for unanimous board approval," said Gerard. "We couldn't think of two more deserving people who have contributed to the betterment of bridge in so many ways – giving us publicity by speaking about bridge so lovingly, but playing bridge as often as they can and getting such enjoyment from it, by their willingness to devote time to talk with our Juniors and finally to donating \$1 million to be used for promoting bridge in schools."

Gerard added that "thanks must also go to our good friend, as well as Warren's and Bill's, Sharon Osberg, who not only plays bridge with

both of them but encourages them to help the ACBL in the promotion of the game."

Osberg, an executive with Wells Fargo & Co. and a two-time world champion at bridge, has been playing with Buffett for nearly 20 years.

The two new Honorary Members, of course, are well known around the world for their accomplishments in business, and in early 2009, Forbes Magazine listed Gates and Buffett and Nos. 1 and 2, respectively, on the list of the world's richest people. In 1999, Buffett was named the top money manager of the 20th century in a survey by the Carson Group.

Gates' and Buffett's interest in bridge is well documented, and just last summer, Gates attended the Summer NABC in Washington DC, taking time out from his schedule to visit with participants in the second Youth NABC. It was one of the highlights of the tournament for players 19 and younger.

In 2006, Buffett sponsored the first Buffett Cup, a challenge match modeled after golf's Ryder Cup, in which teams from Europe and the U.S. face off in different competitive formats. The first Buffett Cup took place in Dublin, Ireland, the second in Louisville KY. Next year's challenge match will be in Wales.

Gates and Buffett are regular Internet players. Gates's online name is Chalengr. Buffett goes by T-Bone.

# JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

Dear New Player:

As you've discovered, the tournament managers and chairs have done an outstanding job of having lots of events for very new players. I can tell how successful their efforts have been by the desperate and poignant e-mails I've been getting from those of you who are new to bridge and especially new to duplicate. Thank goodness you've got me to help you wend your way through the arcane world you've found yourself in. Read on.



"Hi Marti! I just started to play duplicate bridge this past summer and I love it! I especially like playing with the boxes as it makes the game atmosphere much quieter than party bridge. I do have a problem though. This morning, there was an absolute flurry of Stop and Alert cards all over the table. What's that all about? Thanks for any help you can give me." – Rueful Renee.  
*Hi Renee! I am so very glad you are having a good experience and enjoying the duplicate world. It is indeed filled with strange, arcane symbols and language, not to mention the people. Here's a quick explanation of those wretched cards.*

The Stop card is used by some people and not by others. It is used to let everyone at the table know that you are about to skip a level of bidding, and that everyone should slow down their pace, and take time to think about what the bid means.

There's a little more to the explanation. If someone makes a jump bid and the next person passes very quickly, it could communicate to the passer's partner that the passer holds nothing. If the next person takes a longer time before passing, it could communicate that he had a decision to make ... By using the Stop card, no unauthorized information will be passed, because good hand or bad, the next person will slow down.

Now, are you ready for some information that even some experienced players don't know? If a person makes a skip bid, with or without the Stop card, the next player is obliged to slow down before making a call. You don't need the Stop card! The next bidder should slow down anyway.

If you use Stop at all (and you sure don't need to), you should use it when your skip bid is weak

(you open a weak two) or strong (like when you jump to 2NT). You can't use it to show a bid is weak rather than strong. Don't think people haven't tried it, but the director will be over with a flyswatter if you do.

One thing to remember – you either always use the Stop card or never use it. You are not permitted to employ it some times and not others.

Now, the Alert card. When a bid is used in an unusual way, the opponents are entitled to know it's an "unnatural" use. Unlike the Stop card, which the bidder uses, the Alert card is used by the bidder's partner. We are never allowed to explain our own bids. (Well, you're going to have to explain them later, for sure!). Most people just say "Alert" rather than using the card. Be sensitive if someone is hearing-impaired ... then you need to use the card.

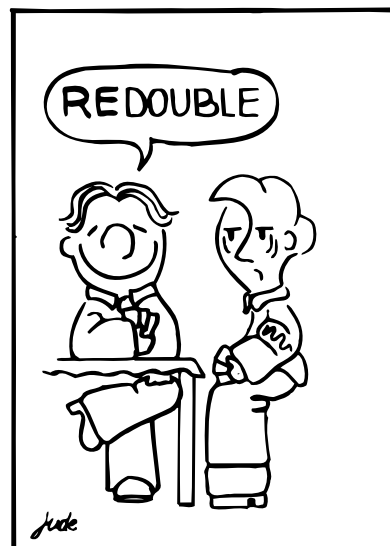
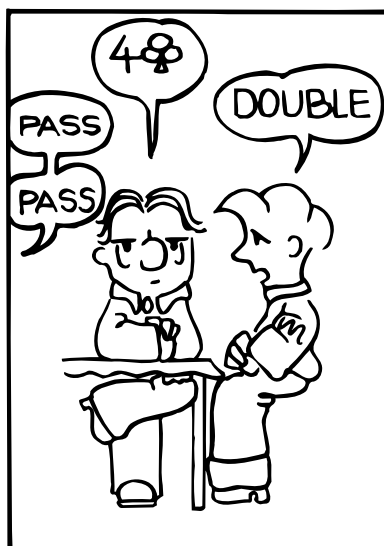
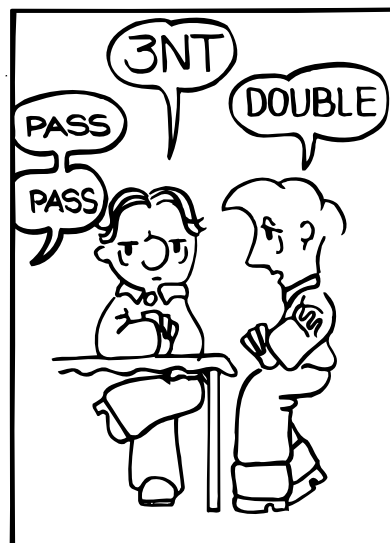
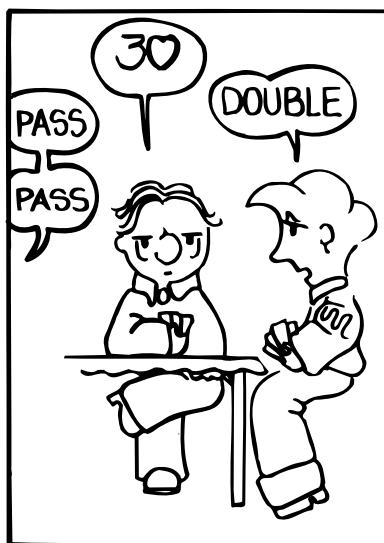
There are many Alertable bids, and it can drive you nuts. The good news is that at your level there are very few. The best way to identify them is that they are printed in red on the convention card. Conventions and strange bids must must must be Alerted. Jump bids don't.

Here's a caution about Alerts: You must not explain the reason for the Alert unless someone asks you to.

Stop identifies a bid that is a jump, Alert identifies a bid that is not what it appears to be. Does this help? Or have you run screaming from the room?

I don't want this worrying you, Renee. I want you to remember that whenever you aren't sure what's going on, you have the right to ask. If you don't get the meaning of a bid, ask the bidder's partner. There are no secret agreements in bridge, so ask away.

Here's your bridge tip for the day. Put together a little supply kit for the games, especially if you are playing in knockouts. Socks (if you don't normally wear them) ... I



know, that sounds strange, but cold feet can be very distracting ... a couple of apples, aspirin, antacids, extra pencils, a good book (in case you need to leave the room but can't just leave), photos of grandkids (great icebreakers) and some power bars. I used to believe in traveling light, but the older I get the more I appreciate having little "comfort" things with me.

And finally: "What's the difference between a crazed serial killer with a chain saw and your bridge partner?" Answer: "You can reason with the serial killer."

## Thinking bridge

Opening lead: ♣5.

**Bidding commentary:** West's 2♦ jump overcall is weak, the equivalent of a weak two-bid opener. The rest of the bidding is normal.

**Defensive commentary:** After winning the first two clubs, South shifts to the ♥J. When declarer plays low, North must not win the ace.

Instead, North signals encouragement with the ♥8, indicating a high honor. North intends to use the ♥A to capture declarer's king. Aces were meant to capture kings and queens, not 2s and 3s. If North nervously takes the ♥A, declarer loses one heart trick instead of two.

**Play commentary:** After winning the ♥Q, West draws trumps and leads a spade to the jack. South needs the ♠A to justify an opening bid as it appears that North has the ♥A.

After winning the ♠A, South plays the ♥10, and the defenders collect two (not one) heart tricks along with two clubs and a spade to defeat the contract one trick.

This heart position is worth noting. North assumes from the lead of the jack that West has the king. If West has the king,

North almost always saves a trick by not taking the ace, but rather waiting for partner to regain the lead and lead through the king. The idea is to get something for your money when you have an ace and the king is to your right.

summer. "Young players have discovered the joy of competition," the flyer notes. "It's up to use to keep this spirit going."

You can find the flyers at the Youth for Bridge Table on the second floor of the Harbor Tower near where the regional events are being played.

So far, she says, the hard work aimed at attracting more young people has paid off. Youth membership is up 20% over the same period last year at 682. Junior membership is up 14% at 1052.

Even more encouraging, Tucker says, is that new programs aimed at recruiting young bridge players "are cropping up all over the country."

Tucker says she often receives queries from people who want to start programs but don't know where to begin. "I know what to do," she says. "I can show them the first step."

Tucker is available for consultation at 404-735-4779.

Looking to the third Youth NABC next summer, Tucker says she is still seeking a sponsor for the Youth NABC Swiss Teams, which award \$1000 scholarships to each of four players on the winning squad.

She says the Youth NABC Open Pairs scholarship (\$2000) is covered by Baron Barclay Bridge Supply, and Phil Gordon is back as sponsor of the \$1000 scholarship for the player chosen for the Sportsmanship Trophy.

## Cell Phones and Electronic Devices: Know the Rules

• *If you're playing in a national-level event:*

All electronic devices are banned from the playing area.

"Electronic devices, excluding health-related equipment, capable of sending or receiving communication, including but not limited to, headphones, earphones, cellular phones and minicomputers: (1) shall not be allowed in the playing areas, adjacent hallways, restrooms or accessible break areas; and (2) shall not be used during a session.

These restrictions shall apply to all pairs, team members, captains, coaches, recorders and kibitzers and shall apply throughout any actual playing session or segment.

A violation of this policy shall result in a disciplinary penalty of one full board (or 12 IMPs at that form of scoring) for the first offense. A second offense shall result in disqualification from the event for the pair/team.

Kibitzers violating this policy shall be removed from the playing area for the remainder of the session."

Participants will be reminded not to approach the playing area with a personal electronic device in their possession, *even if the device is turned off.*

• *If you're playing in a regional or Intermediate-Newcomer event:* Turn those phones and pagers off.

"Cell phones, audible pagers or any similar communication equipment may not be operated or operable in the playing area during a session of play at NABCs except for health-related equipment or by permission of the director-in-charge of the tournament or event."

Players must be ACBL members whose service fees or dues are current in order to compete in any of the following nationally ranked events: Nail Life Master Open Pairs, Smith Life Master Women's Pairs, Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams, Keohane North American Swiss Teams, Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs, Mitchell Open Board-a-Match Teams, Marsha May Sternberg Women's Board-a-Match Teams and the Senior Knockouts. The entry fees for these contests are \$20 per player per session.

Players must also be current ACBL members to play in the Mini-Blue Ribbon Pairs, Miles Non-Life Master Pairs or National 99er Pairs. The entry fee is \$17 per player per session.

Regional championships are \$16 per player per session for ACBL members, \$18 for non-members.

All other events are \$15 per player per session for ACBL members, \$17 for non-members.

## Devious defenders

There are a lot of devious defenders out there. If you don't believe me, look at what happened to one declarer (hands rotated).

Dlr: West ♠ J 8 5 2  
Vul: E-W ♥ 10 7 4 2  
♦ K 10 9  
♣ K 5

♠ A Q 9 3  
♥ A J 9  
♦ A 7  
♣ A 8 6 4

(1) Both majors, not game forcing.

The opening lead is a low diamond, and dummy's 9 wins. A spade to the queen wins, and you play three rounds of clubs. West produces the ♣Q on the second round and pitches a heart when you ruff the third round. Now a diamond to the ace is followed by a second club ruff as West lets go of a diamond. The ♦K is ruffed by the ♠10 and overruffed by you with the ace. This is the position:

♠ J  
♥ 10 7 4 2  
♦ –  
♣ –

♠ 9 3  
♥ A J 9

So far, West has shown up with five points in the minors. What to do next?

At the table, you surely can't blame South for leading the ♥J from hand, assuming West to be 2=3=6=2. This was the full deal:

Look at Glenn Eisenstein's duck of the ♠K, plus the discard of a low heart. When he was allowed to score the ♥K, he cashed the ♠K and led a diamond to tap out declarer and score his trump and diamond winners for down one.

## Marsha May Sternberg Women's B-A-M

Play in the Marsha May Sternberg Women's Board-a-Match Teams enters final play today. At stake: the Marsha Sternberg Memorial Trophy, honoring the player who died in 2001 after a six-week battle with cancer.

Her husband, Dr. Jim Sternberg of West Palm Beach FL, donated the trophy.

The winners of the 2007 contest were Lynn Baker, Karen McCallum, Kerri Sanborn, Irina Levitina, Lynn Deas and Beth Palmer.

Marsha Sternberg was a former *National Enquirer* associate editor and the first female writer for the tabloid. Sternberg, once reported to be the highest paid female journalist in America, left the *Enquirer* in 1989 and married Sternberg, a radiologist and bridge enthusiast. She joined ACBL in 1990 and became a Life Master in 1997.

Sternberg was outstanding in many fields -- she was an excellent pianist and a sailing instructor. She was also very successful in golf and tennis.

### Coffin Trophy

The previous trophy for this event was the Coffin Trophy, one of the oldest and most historic trophies in NABC competition. It was retired.

For years there was only one "National" Women's Team championship -- and that was a board-a-match event.

Donated by Charles Emmet Coffin in 1933, the trophy was contested at the "Winter Nationals" in the days when there were only two NABCs -- Summer and Winter. In 1963 the event was moved to the new Spring NABC where it was in play until the format was changed to knockout teams in 1976.

For the next decade, there was no national Women's Board-a-Match championship. Swiss teams had become popular and a Women's Swiss with NABC+ rating was established in the early Eighties. But board-a-match play for women was not dead -- it was just in hiatus for a few years.

The Coffin Trophy was revived at the Fall NABC in Atlanta in 1986 and new life was breathed into women's board-a-match play.

Many experts consider board-a-match the most exacting form of the game. Equal weight is accorded each deal and every trick is important when scoring is board-by-board.

play was completed. The director determined that North's actions noted above were unauthorized information and arose from her body action more than from her tempo.

**Director's Ruling:** The director judged that the UI demonstrably suggested action over inaction, and that a pass after 3♦ was a logical alternative for South. He adjusted the result for both sides, therefore, to 3♦ by East making three and a score of East-West plus 110.

**The Appeal:** North-South appealed the director's decision and all four players attended the hearing. East maintained that North moved her hand toward the bidding box, withdrew her hand, and then reached for and pulled out the pass card.

**The Decision:** There was a factual dispute between North-South and East-West as to whether North reached for the bidding box. There was no dispute, however, that North's pass after 3♦ was in tempo. There was no allegation that North reached for a bid, withdrew her hand, and then reached for a pass.

The committee found there was no UI. With no infraction, there was no basis to adjust the score. The table result of 3♠ by South down one and a score of North-South minus 50 was restored for both sides.

### Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6-board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

## Open BAM concludes today

The squad of Zia Mahmood, Bob Hamman, Eric Rodwell and Jeff Meckstroth captured first place in the 2008 Mitchell Open Board-a-Match Teams, leading the event from start to finish. The foursome won by more than four boards.

In second place were the defending champions, led by captain Aubrey Strul: Strul, Michael Becker, David Berkowitz, Larry Cohen, Lew Stansby and Chip Martel.

### The Mitchell Trophy

Players will be competing for the Victor Mitchell Trophy, which honors one of bridge's most colorful characters -- a champion player, philosopher and mentor to the stars.

Mitchell, a Grand Life Master with more than 10,000 masterpoints, won five North American championships including the Spingold in 1956 and 1959, the Life Master Men's Pairs in 1962 and the Men's Teams in 1962 and 1963. He was named ACBL Honorary Member in 1988 and inducted into the Bridge Hall of Fame in 1996.

### The game

The Open Board-a-Match Teams is a four-session event that consists of two qualifying and two final sessions. It was a men's event until 1990 when it became an open event.

Perhaps the event's high point occurred in 1977 when there were only three winners: Richard Doughty, Ron Smith and Lou Bluhm (plus these players eligible for session awards only: Bruce Ferguson, Sidney Lazard, Leslie West and Irv Kostal).

Lazard was supposed to play with Doughty but after a good first set, Lazard became ill and Kostal took his place for the evening session.

Lazard was better the next day and in his seat for the first final session. Suddenly he toppled over and a call went out for paramedics. They arrived quickly and rushed Lazard to a hospital.

Meanwhile, Doughty had to find another partner and Ferguson was pressed into service. Ferguson, whose team had not qualified the previous day, was technically ineligible but was allowed to play only in the afternoon.

In the evening, Doughty recruited West -- his fourth partner in four sessions -- and the team went on to victory by a margin of two full boards.

## Monitoring

This procedure is intended to assure everyone that the playing field is level and that misbehavior will not be tolerated.

## Bid Box Alerts and Announcements

When using bid boxes, ACBL suggests that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an Announcement, use the Announcement word (such as "transfer") and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or Announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or Announcement has been made.

## Close, but no cigar

I should begin by thanking the ACBL for offering me the opportunity for a new experience. At World, European zonal and domestic level in the UK, I am not yet eligible to play in Seniors events. The number of entries necessitated that the first day be taken up with bringing the field down to an appropriate size for a straight KO event, so that 22 teams had byes and instead played a one-session Swiss on Friday afternoon. That Swiss threw up this deal.

When my balancing double merely served to push the opposition up one level I did not expect that it had achieved very much. However, David Kendrick led his fourth-best heart to the king and ace and declarer, short of entries to the dummy, decided to put him back on lead by continuing with ♥Q and ♥10 to the jack.

The general idea was sound but its execution proved to be not quite good enough. David thought for a while then played the thirteenth heart, which I ruffed with the jack. Declarer, who had pitched a diamond from dummy, threw another diamond from hand, and I returned my remaining club. Declarer won the ace and cashed the king then ran the ♦Q to my king. I switched to the ♠8 and David won the king then played back his remaining diamond. Declarer rose with the ace and ran the ♠J but had two clubs to lose so was one down for minus 100.

At the other table, Jon Sveindal was left to play in 1♣. He too received the lead of a heart to the king and ace. Jon, however, made the slightly counter-intuitive play of a diamond to the ace, taking out dummy's sole entry immediately, then led a spade to the 9 and king. West could not lead any side suit without helping declarer and could not know that a club was safe. He chose to return a diamond to the king. Seeing that his partner might be in difficulties if he was given a diamond ruff, East instead led a heart through. Jon rose with the ace and exited with the ♥10, and now West was awkwardly placed again. He exited with the thirteenth heart. Jon threw a spade from dummy and over-ruffed the jack with the king. He played the ♠A and ruffed a spade and it was a simple matter to endplay West to ensure two more trump tricks. Nicely played and plus 90 meant 5 IMPs to the good guys.

**A little help from Deep Finesse**

Sometimes Deep Finesse gives you a little push in the right direction: When you see an unexpected result for a contract, you suddenly realize that your calculation of the “normal” result was way off target.

Let’s look at Board 12 from the second Smith Life Master Women’s event:

You’d expect North to open a weak 2♠ at almost every table. South might dredge up a 2NT bid, after which you’d expect North-South to reach 4♠. This will be two down on a diamond lead and one down on a club lead (plus 100 for East-West was average).

The winners of the women’s event, Shawn Quinn and Sue Picus, benefitted from a remarkably trappist performance by their opponents.

The defenders can lead either a diamond or a spade - in which case declarer, after drawing trumps, has seven heart tricks, two aces and can easily build a club trick.

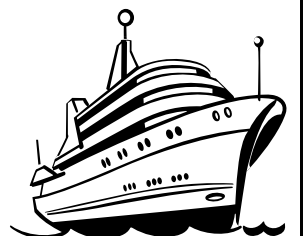
What about a club lead? The defenders take their two top clubs and a ruff, and declarer claims the balance.

So what’s the trick? Deep Finesse tells us nine tricks is the limit in hearts. Suitably admonished, we revisit the deal - how do we get four tricks?

Answer: Ignore the “red herring” of our ♣J, we win the ♣K at trick one and take the immediate ruff without cashing the second winner. Now the spade shift builds our third trick, and we have the ♣A to come.

Incidentally, Quinn won the spade lead and had to decide whether to draw trumps (risking two down if the clubs did not split) or go all out for the contract.

Because North “could not” hold a low singleton club or she would have led it, Quinn played a club. East won and led a low spade to her partner. Now the club ruff was no longer available, and declarer was back to plus 420.

## Jay Magid 1939 – 2009

Jay Magid, a tournament director for three decades, died of cancer at his home in Pleasant Hill CA. He was 69.

Magid grew up in the Bronx, New York. After high school, he earned a degree in optometry from Ohio State University. According to longtime friend and TD Tom Quinlan, "optometry as a profession eventually did not appeal to him." A few years after graduation, Magid landed in the Los Angeles area, where he worked with computers for a company owned by a bridge player.

Through his early career, Magid played tournament bridge with success. He was a Gold Life Master. In the LA area, Magid took up directing at the club level in the mid-Seventies and soon was working at sectionals and regionals. He moved to the San Francisco area in early 1980 to get more work as a TD and became one of top TDs in Northern California. He also helped Quinlan edit the Contract Bridge Forum.

Magid's best work was as a TD, according to Quinlan: "Jay was respected by his peers as fair and impartial — and by many players as well. He always considered his TD colleagues as his 'family.' We gave him the nickname 'Secretary Bird' from his behavioral similarities to the Victor Mollo character, and he was affectionately called 'the Bird'."

He is survived by a sister, Nina Adams of Western Springs IL.
