## Late charge earns Red Ribbon for mother, son

With two rounds to go, LaToss and Brandon Carpenter were in fourth place in the Red Ribbon Pairs, nearly 30 matchpoints out of first. Thanks to near tops on each of the last four boards, the Whitehouse TX pair – mother and son – are the new Red Ribbon champs.

They finished 48.5 matchpoints (77 top) ahead of the runners-up, Mike Nadler of Richmond Hill ON and Gur Baykal of Scarborough ON.

The mother-son combination have been playing together since Brandon, 19, was recruited as a lad of 6 to fill in a home movement. By the time he was 8, he was telling his Mom, "I can bid my own cards."

"He could, too," says LaToss, who teaches junior high school in Whitehouse, about two hours east of Dallas. Brandon is attending Tyler Junior College.

Shugart (Andrew Robson, Tony Forrester, Paul Chemla) fell, 144-136, to Mark Gordon (Richard

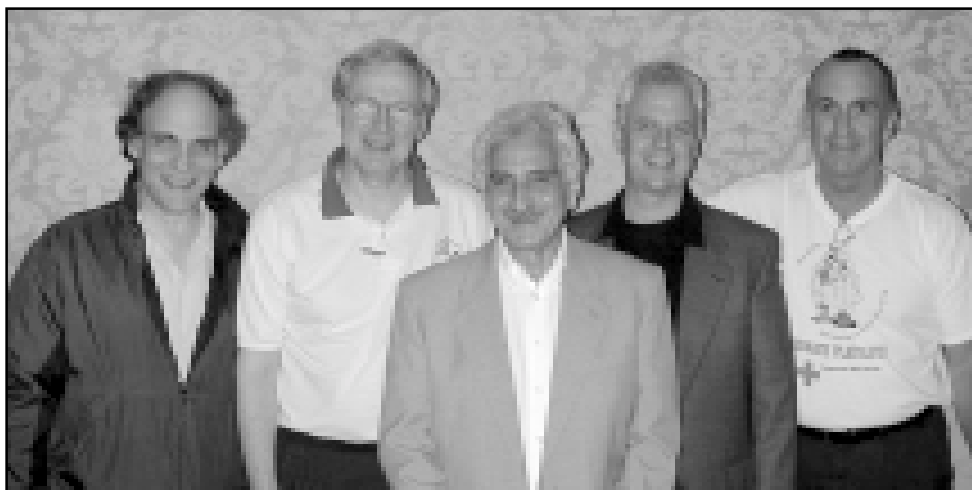

## Levine triumphs in Senior Swiss

The team captained by Mike Levine came back strong in the evening session to take top honors in the NABC Senior Swiss Teams. His teammates were P.O. Sundelin of Sweden, Zeke Jabbour, Arnie Fisher, Randy Pettit and Allan Siebert. Pettit became a Grand Life Master with the win.

They needed the strong finish because the team captained by Tom Smith, tied for 16<sup>th</sup> going into yesterday's play, climbed consistently throughout the day and wound up only three Victory Points behind Levine. Playing with Smith were Richard DeMartino,

John Sutherlin and Ron Gerard.

Levine led going into yesterday's matches, but a disaster in the third match dropped them down to sixth place. They still were sixth as the evening session started. But they won all four matches (12-8, 19-1, 17-3 and 15-5), and that was enough.

These players have an outstanding record in Senior events. Levine and Jabbour have won the Senior Knockouts five times and this was their second victory in the Senior Swiss. The other team members also have had many Senior successes.



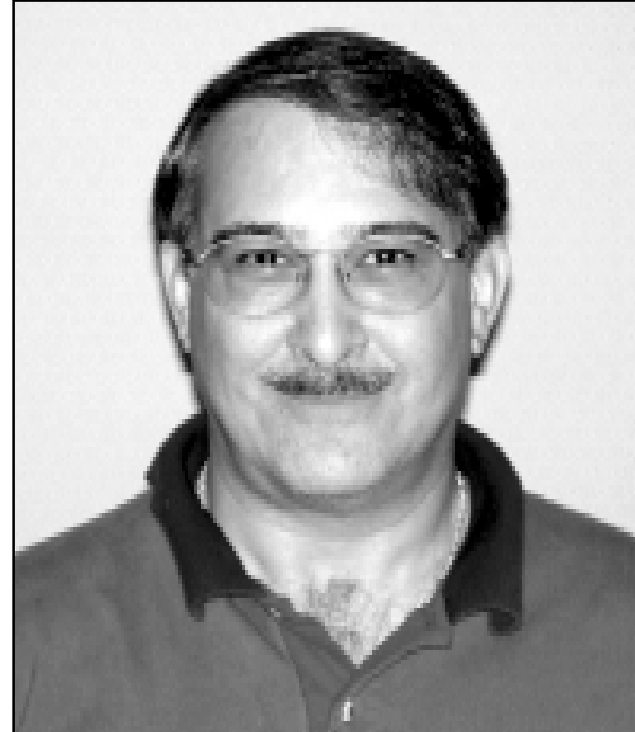
## Patricelli's latest life as TD suits her best

## BridgeBrowser analyzes millions of hands, plays

If you would like to know how experts have handled millions of play situations, BridgeBrowser is the thing for you. The program has the largest database of bridge data, according to Stephen Pickett, who spent a year building the database. According to Pickett, most of the top 500 players in the world are members of BridgeBrowser.

All kinds of sortings are possible. You can bring up all the hands played by such stars as Benito Garozzo. You can find out what usually happens after a player opens the bidding with, say, 1♥. You can even find out what resulted after Garozzo personally opened 1♥. You can check to see the most likely result when you use a Multi, a Bergen raise or a notrump interference bid. The possibilities seem to be endless.

You can also check every hand on the database trick by trick or even card by card. You can study all manner of end positions. The program has tremendous speed – it can search 10,000 records a second.

Many of the hands were downloaded from OKbridge play, and others came from various individual experts. Four years of hands have filled 3.5 gigabytes – quite an impressive collection of data that can be used for so many investigations. Check your registration bag – there's a flyer for BridgeBrowser in it that shows one way in which the database can be accessed.

The team – Moore, Ari Greenberg, Lisa Liberati, Chris Lubesnik, Kevin Bathurst and Randolph Hammock – never looked back, winning the championship the next day.

This was the deal that jump-started their comeback.

North's double seems dubious. He apparently was counting on partner for a strong heart holding. At any rate, Moore won the opening spade lead in dummy with the ace and played a heart. Moore went up with the king when South played low, dropping North's singleton ♥J. Moore could have secured an overtrick by playing a diamond at trick three, but he got out of his hand with a heart, allowing South to switch to clubs before the ♦A was dislodged. The defense had four tricks but no more and Moore scored up plus 530.

Another dubious penalty double. Perhaps East was counting on West for more than just a string of hearts. 4♠ was impregnable and Bathurst eventually scored up plus 590 for a momentum-changing swing.

His handling of the slam on the following deal indicates that perhaps he should have been in a higher event. Wilmot was playing with Helene Bauman of Arlington VA.

North led the ♠Q, taken in dummy with the ace. Wilmot immediately played a diamond to the jack in his hand. Noting the fall of the ♦10, Wilmot cashed the ace. If the suit had broken no worse than 4-2, he would have been able to play two more rounds of the suit to make 12 tricks in a walk.

North discarded on the ♦A, however, but Wilmot did not panic. The information from the bidding helped him with his expert line of play from there.

He cashed the top hearts in dummy and played a spade to his king. This was the position with seven tricks to go:

Wilmot cashed the ♥K, pitching a club from dummy, and South was caught in an unusual position. A club discard did not actually give up a trick since Wilmot had to discard from dummy before South did, but South was in a pickle anyway. A diamond discard was out of the question – Wilmot could then have entered dummy with a club and played the ♦K and another diamond, setting up his 12<sup>th</sup> trick that way. So South had to discard a club.

Wilmot then played the ♣A and a club to dummy, cashing both high cards in that suit, exiting elegantly with the ♦7. South won the ♦9 but at trick 12 was sitting with the ♦Q 6, looking at dummy's ♦K 8.

At the other table, East-West had an accident, stopping in 2♠, making four – a 13-IMP gain for Wilmot's team.

## Deal of the Day

# Let's stop in game – No, let's bid a grand

We have all been pushed higher than we would have climbed under our own steam. Most often, we are pushed into a game. Seldom do we try to stop in game and then end up inviting partner to bid on at the SEVEN-level, but that is exactly what happened to Canada's Dianna Gordon on one of the wildest hands seen in the Wagar Women's Teams event so far. This was the full deal and auction at the table where the Canadians held the North-South cards:

Gordon passed as the dealer and Sharyn Reus opened with 1♥ on the North cards. Gordon responded with a fit-showing jump to 3♦, and now West entered the fray with 4♣.

The most charitable description I can find for Sharyn Reus's 4♥ bid is "timid", and Gordon would no doubt have settled for game had East/West not competed further. Indeed, when East raised to 5♣, Gordon did nothing more encouraging than push on to 5♥. When West took yet another bite, though, Reus re-evaluated and advanced to the small slam, showing her diamond fit at the same time. Still East was not done.

Having been quite prepared to stop in game a couple of rounds of bidding ago, who can

blame Gordon for inviting the grand slam with a pass of 7♣, showing her void? Reus realized the full potential of her hand now and duly accepted the invitation. Unfortunately for the Canadians, there was no making grand slam available to them, South having bid diamonds first and North having opened in hearts. West doubled 7♥, Lightner style, and duly received her diamond ruff to defeat the grand slam: NS minus 100. East/West were therefore well rewarded for the aggressive competition in the auction.

Fortunately for the Canadians, their East/West pair allowed their opponents far less room to explore the deal. This was the auction at the other table:

Once Francine Cimon opened the West hand, the opposition were always on the defensive. North led a heart and declarer had no trouble wrapping up 12 tricks: EW plus 750 and 12 IMPs to the Canadian team.

## Digital Data Answers

Questions on page 2

1. Bridge Baron, developed by Tom Throop in 1979, and currently in version 11 for Windows and Macintosh.

2. Meadowlark Bridge, developed by Rodney Ludwig of the US. Technical difficulties with the program at this time have prevented Meadowlark from participating this year.

3. With instructional software such as those mentioned, one gets constructive lessons and predealt hands that aim to help raise the level of one's game. The programs in the WCBC are designed to think, and thus raise the level of one's game against other computers and humans.

4. Q-Plus, developed by Hans Leber of Germany, lost to Bridge Baron in Albuquerque, GIB in Bermuda, and was nipped on the last board of the final at Maastricht by Meadowlark Bridge.

5. As detailed in the book, "Man Versus Machines" by Marc Smith, some two years ago, Zia Mahmood faced seven computer programs in a series of matches

6. Q-Plus. On some online sites robots — also

known as 'bots' — are used to fill a table if need be.

7. GIB, developed by Matthew Ginsberg of the US. GIB was invited to participate this year, but declined, saying other promotional events prevented his appearing.

8. Omar Sharif, whose name graces a program for the PC ("Omar Sharif on Bridge") and Macintosh ("Omar Sharif's Bridge Deluxe").

9. Al Levy, ACBL District 24 Governor, proposed the annual competition in 1996, and the first WCBC was held at the Albuquerque NABC in 1997.

10. "Chess is a game of perfect information and therefore a deterministic game. Bridge is a game of incomplete information and therefore a game of probability." — quoted from Al Levy's report on the Maastricht WCBC in the *International Computer Games Journal*, December 2000.

The final match takes place Friday between Jack and Micro Bridge. Meet the faces behind the computer programs and maybe we will even see the likes of Zia and other top pros play against the computers. More to come on that note!

### Appeals Case 2

**Subject:** Unauthorized Information

**The Facts:** 3NT made four, +630 for N/S. The opening lead was the ♠A. The Director was called after the hand was over. He determined that N/S played runout bids after 1NT is doubled, so North's bid was in error and he had UI from the Alert of his bid. Without any Alert, North should have been delighted to face his hand as dummy. When asked about the double of 1NT, East said it showed the majors. The contract was changed to 3♦ doubled down four, +1100 for E/W.

**The Appeal:** N/S appealed the Director's ruling. The double of 1NT was not Alerted. During screening it was discovered that the E/W agreement was that a double of a strong notrump was for penalty but the meaning of double over weak notrump was undiscussed. North thought their agreement was that 2♣ was a relay to 2♦ and that he could rebid 2♥ over 2♦ to show an invitational hand in hearts. He believed that his strong hearts dictated that he should not pass 3♦ doubled. If hearts were breaking badly, he could lead hearts through West. The correct N/S agreement (2♣ was minors) was clearly marked on both convention cards. North also stated that his reason for passing 3♦ undoubled was that he believed he was ethically constrained. An inspection of E/W's convention card revealed no distinction between defenses (Cappelletti) to strong and weak notrumps. West stated that he knew their agreement was that double was penalty and he chose that call to make the auction difficult for N/S.

**The Panel Decision:** The Panel decided that the primary issue was whether any of North's peers would consider passing 3♦ doubled to be a LA. When polled, six Flight C players were provided with the correct information regarding the Alerts and responses to questions. None of the six would have passed 3♦ the first time and were evenly divided between bidding 3♥ and 3NT. None would have considered passing 3♦ doubled. Once again the choice was between 3♥ and 3NT with 3NT being the majority choice. Based on this input the Panel decided that despite the UI, a pass of 3♦ doubled was not a LA. The table result of 3NT made four, +630 for N/S, was allowed to stand.

"Susan is what every director wants to be," says Johnson.

Patricelli doesn't visit the White House very often any more, but she loves the latest version of her busy life, working 340 sessions a year as a director, including all the NABCs and traveling now and then for fishing trips with significant other Jim Cleary from their home base in Bloomfield CT.

Bridge has been a part of Patricelli's life since she was a child, but it was a while before it took on the magnitude it occupies in her world today.

Born and reared in West Hartford CT, Susan Schaffer was educated at Smith, one of the exclusive "seven sisters" colleges in the East. Her major was English literature. She married Robert E. Patricelli in 1961 and moved to Paris while he studied as a Fulbright Scholar. While in France, Patricelli taught English to French people and worked as an interpreter for a French radio station.

Back in the U.S., the family moved a lot, including several stints in Washington DC. Two children – Thomas and Alison – also kept her busy, and she worked some as a technical editor for a management consulting firm that did business with the government.

Although she knew bridge from her family and "threw cards" each day as a college student, Patricelli didn't get serious about bridge until one day in the late Seventies. A woman she had met through the League of Women Voters suggested they visit a duplicate club in Hartford.

It was an eye-opener for Patricelli, who discovered a whole new world, mostly of very serious bridge players. Her friend was put off by the intense competition, but not Patricelli. "I loved it from the first hand," she says. Although she rarely plays these days, she is a Silver Life Master with about 1700 masterpoints.

After she discovered duplicate, "I played as often as possible," Patricelli says. Eventually, she was asked to teach some classes and to take over some of the games at the Hartford Bridge Club (where she later met Cleary).

While Patricelli felt she was limited in what she could accomplish as a player, she believed from the first that "I could be a good director."

She took Edith McMullin's class for TDs who work with intermediate/newcomer players. Patricelli eventually moved into regular games, working her first regional in Rye NY under Sol Weinstein, veteran TD who is one of the Directors-in-Charge at this tournament.

"Solly is the hardest and best task master you could have if you want to be a good tournament director," she says.

She recalls that in her first session at the Rye regional, she was assigned to work a Flight A open pairs. One of her rulings was appealed, she recalls, and she nervously awaited the outcome. She was elated when her ruling was upheld by the appeals committee. "I loved it," she says. "They weren't going to knock me down."

She says one of her secrets in rulings situations is to have no pre-conceived notions. "It's a blank page every time you go the table," she says. She also reminds herself frequently that "the bridge player is the customer and we are the business."

With a smooth, confident but not intimidating style, Patricelli has proved that she can handle any situation. She credits Doug Grove, co-DIC with Weinstein at the Toronto NABC, with helping her learn. "Every time Doug heard I hadn't done something -- like a cross-over movement -- he would tell me to sit down and do it and he would explain it to me if I needed help. It was a great way to learn at lot of different things."

Peter Marcus is another TD who has been a huge help to her, Patricelli says. Before she became a director, she says, she had never seen a computer -- anywhere. "When you're computer-illiterate and Peter Marcus is your friend -- Oh, thank you, God."

Far removed from her life in high political circles, Patricelli will leave the Toronto tournament and head for Maine, where she and Cleary will fish on a quiet lake for the better part of five days.

When that's over, it will be back to the bridge world. Says Patricelli: "Bridge is great. Even if I won the lottery, I wouldn't leave."

East-West bid to their maximum spot, 5♠, and Stratton, South, doubled because Cuthbertson, North, had shown considerable strength by leaping to 4♥ on his second turn. But Cuthbertson knew that the prospects of a set were not good – he had a fistful of hearts and his partner had raised the suit. So he ran to clubs, the suit bid and rebid by his partner. Stratton corrected to 6♥, a fine save since North-South had to lose only two spades and one diamond for minus 500. Clearly East-West can make 11 tricks on a club lead, 13 tricks on any other lead. It turned out to be a major gain when their partners took advantage of a partnership misunderstanding and defeated 3NT doubled seven tricks.

The championship is organized by Al Levy, who represents District 24 on the ACBL Board of Directors.

## Table count still healthy

With four days to play, the 2001 Summer NABC stood at 11,041.5 tables - 9.2% above estimates for this point in the tournament. Not counting the mid-night game, the tournament added 1681 tables Wednesday. An average of slightly more than 1200 tables per day through Sunday will boost the final table count to more than 16,000. The last Toronto NABC, in the summer of 1992, finished with 16,680 tables.

## IMP Pairs scoring change

For the first time since the IMP Pairs began in 1987, the two-day national event will be scored across the field, IMPing each score against each other score.

That will make for some very large scores - pluses and minuses. For example, if you and your partner conspire to crash your ace and king of trumps together on defense against a vulnerable slam and declarer makes it, you can expect the slam swing to be repeated over and over for a huge minus. The maximum swing per comparison, however, will be 17 IMPs.

Before this year, individual scores were obtained by comparing them to a datum, a number representing "average" on the board after high and low scores are thrown out. With the change in scoring this year, the event will be scored the same way as the Cavendish Invitational Pairs.

The IMP Pairs begins today with two qualifying sessions. The two final sessions will be Friday.
