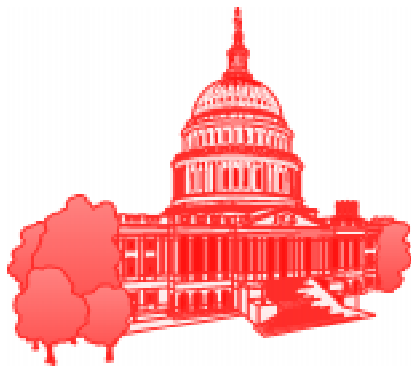

## Marcia Katz always has a helping hand

"May I help you?" Marcia Katz probably says those words a thousand times a day — she's part of the excellent volunteer staff that works at the registration/information/prize desk here at the DC NABC. Even if you don't know her by name, however, she's easy to spot. With her flower-bedecked straw hat and her friendly, knowledgeable attitude, Katz handles all manner of player questions as if she's been doing this her whole life.

Marcia Katz, however, has a secret — this is her first NABC, and only her second major tournament to attend. The first, this year's record-breaking Gatlinburg regional, so impressed Katz that she decided to try the Summer NABC as well.

So in April of this year, Katz, of Knoxville TN, contacted the DC NABC tournament chairman, Margot Hennings, with an unusual request.

"I wrote Margot and asked if she wanted an *amanuensis* — a Greek term my mother loved to use, meaning 'a slave with clerical duties'. If Margot wanted me to work for a few weeks, I was happy to come to Washington and help out."

Hennings agreed, so Katz wrote a cousin in the DC area to ask if she could stay for the duration of the tournament. When her cousin said yes, Katz finalized her travel plans.

How is it that Katz knows so much about DC? Where restaurants are? How to find a certain street? What monuments are best to visit? What times they are open? The answer is that Katz used to live in DC, a credential that makes her a valuable part of the staff.

It may surprise some that despite Katz's chatty, personal style — she intersperses directions to sites around the city with DC-related trivia — she is a retired associate professor from the University of Tennessee in the Department of Nuclear and Radiological Engineering.

"Power plants," Katz says, with an almost dismissive shrug. "Bridge tournaments are much more fun."

The #9 seed — the very tough international squad of Jack Coleman, Grant Baze, Adam Zmudzinski, Cezary Balicki, Andrew Gromov and Aleksander Petrunin — was shot down by the team of Robert and Cindy Bernstein, Sally Wheeler, Buddy Hanby, David Lindop and Richard Oshlag, 128-109.

Also, the #14 seed of Joan Stein, Eddie Wold, Marc Jacobus, Geoff Hampson and Eric Greco met an early exit when they were upset by the four-man team of Michael Shuster, Jeff Goldsmith, Varis Carey and Henry Bethe, 102-94.

Another strong international team — Billy Eisenberg, Richard Coren, Drew Casen, Lee Rautenberg, Dano DiFalco and Gabriella Oliveri — was knocked off by John Lusky, Randy Pickett, Allen Kahn and David Rosenberg, 115-102.

In second with 113 is the team of Don Stack, Tom Kniest, Jim and Corinne Kirkham, Jon Brissman and Robert Schwartz. Qualifying third was the team of Sherrill Headrick, Derald Keetch, Bob Bratcher and John McDaniel.

The defending champions — the team of Mike Levine, Zeke Jabbour, Russ Arnold (replacing P.O. Sundelin), Arnie Fisher, Randy Pettit and Allan Siebert — are tied for 5th-7th with 102 VPs.

The cutoff score for qualification was 80.

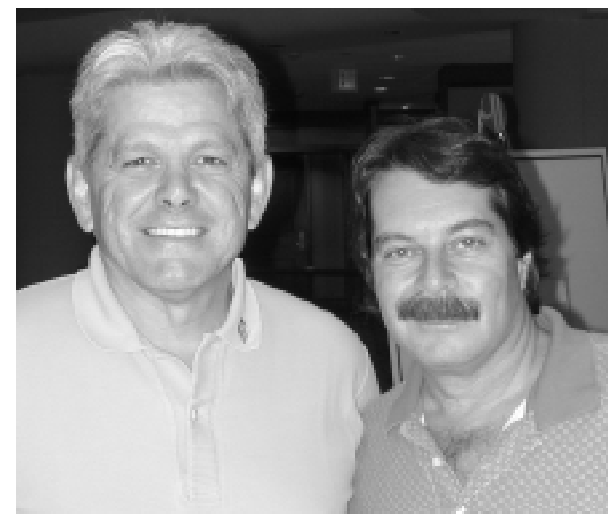

providing them with a good time and a fun partner. Of course we get feedback from a lot of the winners as well."

L'Heureux doesn't just work at the desk. He also wanders around the building, and when he sees somebody he partnered, he stops to ask how things are going.

He's been doing this work for a long time — he was partnership chairman at the 1993 Washington NABC, and he does the same kind of work at Mid-Atlantic regionals.

Working with him yesterday afternoon were Steve Rothman and Doug Douglas. Steve is a local who also worked at the 1993 NABC. Doug is a volunteer from Pennsylvania who came by to offer his services early in the tournament.

Steve is amazed at some of the questions he hears. Here are some examples:

"I have 57 points. How did I get them?"

"Have you seen my wife?" There's a follow-up

on this one. The man mentioned that his wife had been on a train that arrived three hours late. One of the players waiting for a partner had been talking to a woman who told him her train had been very late. He told the man where this woman was, and, sure enough, it was his wife.

Other lines include, "I was told if I did something I could get something."

"Hi. I need a partner for life."

Do the partnership people get many complaints? "Of course we do," said L'Heureux. But I like what Doug says about this: "Some people are going to complain even if you use new rope."

*Kantar's answer:* This one could get sticky if clubs break 4-1. True, you have 13 tricks if they break 3-2, but what if they don't?

If you play clubs at once, East wins and plays a heart and now you are in an untenable position if West has the ♥K. The same would be true if West had four clubs and returned a heart. If East had both the king and the jack, or if you misguessed, you would lose an ice-cold contract.

The solution is to duck a club at trick two. If East wins and returns a heart, win the ace, enter dummy with a spade, discard your heart on the ♦A and reenter your hand with a club, claiming the balance.

The idea is to keep an extra hand entry in case clubs are 4-1. (Those of you who crossed to the ♠Q, discarded a heart on the ♦A and then played clubs hoping that the player with four clubs did not have a third diamond, were at least thinking, albeit sideways.)

## Sure there's a squeeze, but which opponent?

Mike Becker, East, noticed early in the play that his chances were good for 12 tricks. The problem was which opponent should he attempt to squeeze. The hand was played in the Life Master Pairs final.

Becker's 2NT response to the Drury 2♣ was unusual, but he knew the doubleton queens would be helpful if partner had a little something in each suit. With two aces and a king in the other suits, his partner had no trouble raising to 3NT, a contract missed by the vast majority of the field.

Becker let the opening heart lead ride to his queen and then cashed one spade to make sure the suit would run. Next came the ♣Q, taken by South's ace. South reverted to hearts and Becker won the ace.

Now he had lost a trick and could take all the rest of the tricks but one – the right setup for a squeeze. He saw that he could squeeze South if he had the ♦K – he also would have to protect his ♥J. Becker would cross to the ♣K and run spades, coming to a two-card position. On the next-to-last trick South would have to make a losing discard from ♥J and ♦K-x.

If North had the ♦K, Becker could get his 12<sup>th</sup> trick via a Vienna Coup.

Which to try? Becker decided to see if he could get some help from his opponents. He led a second spade and sure enough, North played an encouraging diamond. So it was the Vienna Coup. He crossed to the ♦A and ran the spades. This was the position as he led his last spade:

South had to keep the ♥J so was forced to discard a club. Becker pitched the heart, and now North had no discard available. No matter what he did, Becker had the last two tricks for plus 490. That was worth 64.5 matchpoints out of a possible 65.

## Diamond master

Roger Bates and Chris Willenken crossed swords here – and Bates came off the better. After a simple auction of 1NT-3NT, Bates (South) received the ♥J lead and immediately passed the ♦8. Willenken (East) ducked it, thereby doing his best to get his name in the papers. Now if declarer repeats the diamond finesse, he goes down.

But Bates knew his defenders were capable of the ducking play from any holding that included the jack. The opening lead made it relatively unlikely that West had four diamonds to the jack, plus who would want to fall victim to such a play? You'd never hear the end of it!

So Bates rejected the second finesse, playing diamonds from the top and emerging with 10 tricks.

Nicely defended – but it was Bates who got to have his name in the "highly commended" column.

## Underleaders Anonymous

Some people just can't resist underleading their aces to get a ruff. On the following deal from Saturday's Bracketed Knockouts, defender Joe Wallen of Fredericksburg VA took it to the extreme:

Wallen, South, led a low club to partner Randy Beckham's queen. Beckham returned the ♦J (suit preference) and Wallen ruffed. A spade to the ace allowed Wallen to score another diamond ruff. Down two, plus 100 for North-South.

This was an 11-IMP gain for Wallen's team since their teammates bid and made 5♦ at the other table.

## False economy

Steve Bloom showed me a neat hand where he had missed a subtle point in the ending. The point is that you have to be careful not to be too thrifty with your resources.

♠ Q 8 5 4 2

Playing 2♠ you get a club lead and continuation as East echoes. You ruff the second club, play a diamond to the king and pass a diamond to East's ace. Back comes a heart – you win with the queen as West encourages. Now a third diamond to West's queen as East pitches a club, and a heart back to East's ace lets you win the third heart in hand as West follows with the jack. This is the ending:

♠ Q 8 5 4  
 ♥ —  
 ♦ J  
 ♣ —

♠ A 10 7

When you lead the ♣J, West covers and you ruff as East follows. You can now safely assume that East has the ♠K – otherwise West probably would have doubled 1NT. Furthermore East probably has precisely a 3-4-2-4 shape and is down to three trumps and a heart. So the key is to lead dummy's diamond and ruff it as East discards his heart. Then you can lead your fourth club. West will follow and East will be endplayed when he overruffs dummy. If you pitch your club on the ♦J, you will have to guess whether to lead a spade to the 7 or to the 10 in the three-card ending.

Bocchi's offshape 1NT opener did not deter Chang and Moss, who bid briskly to the spade game. Bocchi cashed two high diamonds but that was it for the defense and a mundane plus 450 was recorded.

The opening lead was obviously critical. Smith apparently interpreted Schuett's 5♣ bid as a lead-director, so Smith started off with the ♣K. Lauria ruffed and claimed when the ♠K popped up from the North hand at trick two.

That was plus 1310 for Jacobs. Instead of gaining 11 IMPs for plus 100, Moss lost 13.

## Spingold trivia

- Louis H. Watson (*Watson's Play of the Hand at Contract Bridge*) was a member of the winning Spingold teams in 1932 and 1935.

- B. Jay Becker and son Michael are the only father-son combination to win the Spingold. Their victory came in 1972.

- Edith Freilich and Billy Seamon are the only sister and brother to win the Spingold. Their 1963 team included Russ Arnold, Harold Harkavy, Al Roth and Cliff Russell.

- Bob Hamman is the all-time leader with 12 wins in the Spingold. Bobby Wolff and Howard Schenken have won the Spingold 10 times.

- Oswald Jacoby also won the Spingold 10 times: in 1932, 1933 and 1937 for the Asbury Park Trophy; in 1934 and 1936 for the Masters Teams-of-Four and in 1938, 1939, 1945, 1950 and 1959 for the Spingold.

- Helen Sobel won the Spingold five times, the first time in 1944 and the last time in 1960.

- The last woman in a Spingold final was Luella Slaner in 1983.

Freeman won the open club lead with the king and cashed the ♠K. Next came a club ruff, and he led a heart toward the king. West took his ace and returned the ♠J, not the best choice. Freeman ruffed this in dummy and cashed the trump king, dropping the queen from West. He cashed the ♣A and ruffed a club. He played the ♠A-Q and East had to follow. At this point he put East in with the last trump, and East had to give Freeman his 10<sup>th</sup> trick with the ♦K. That was worth all 51 matchpoints.

## That first board can be crucial

The very first board out of the box often swings a lot of IMPs. See if you can finish on the right side of the swing here.

Well, playing back a diamond would be right if partner has a singleton or if he has led from K-x-x – and besides what harm could come to you?

Alas, that is not the full story.

When you return a diamond, declarer ruffs and leads the ♠A followed by the ♠J. Whether partner wins or ducks, declarer strips the clubs and exits in trump to your partner. That forces a red-suit play that gives South his 10<sup>th</sup> trick.

P.S. – If you played back a diamond, you at least avoided a swing – it was a flat board at 420 in our match.

## Modern preempts

Mel Colchamiro showed me a couple of hands from the Swiss Teams event a couple of days ago to demonstrate how preempts have suffered from inflation – just like everything else in life.

Colchamiro opened 3♥ at favorable vulnerability in his first example – and his LHO had a strong balanced hand including ♥A-K-Q-J-8! Colchamiro wound up defending 6♦, down one on the heart ruff holding ♠K x ♥10 9 x x x x ♦x ♣x x x.

In the next match Colchamiro opened 2♠. This time his LHO held ♠A Q J 9 x x ♥A K x ♦Q ♣A x x. He sat for 2♠, down three – plus 150 for a flat board. Mel's teammates collected 140 in 3♠.

## Spingold history

The Spingold Master Knockout Teams, first known as the Challenge Knockout Teams, was contested for the Asbury Park Trophy in the early days.

The runner-up team in the regularly-scheduled portion of the event had the right to challenge the winners to a playoff. This right was never utilized.

In 1934, 1936 and 1937, the Masters Teams-of-Four and the Asbury Park Trophy were separate events, providing two sets of winners.

In 1938 the event became the Spingold Master Knockout Teams and a part of the Summer NABC.

At one time, the Spingold was a double elimination event usually lasting nine or 10 sessions. It was scored by International Match Points and was restricted to players with 100 or more masterpoints.

In 1965, the double elimination method was replaced by three qualifying sessions (subsequently reduced to two), followed by single elimination knockout matches. The preliminary qualifying sessions were dropped in 1970.

The Spingold Trophy, donated by Nathan B. Spingold in 1934, and the Vanderbilt Trophy, awarded to the winners of the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams at the Spring NABC, are ACBL's most highly prized trophies.

Spingold (1886-1958), a New York publicist, motion picture executive and patron of the arts, was one of the most influential men in bridge administration from 1937 to 1943.

Born in Chicago, he became a reporter on *The Chicago Examiner*, *The Chicago Record Herald* and *The Chicago Tribune*. Spingold's interest in show business brought him to New York City in the Thirties.

In 1932 he joined Columbia Pictures in a public relations capacity. He was named to the board of directors in 1940 and three years later was appointed vice president in charge of advertising, publicity and development. He became a vice president of the company in 1954.

Active in bridge from its earliest days, Spingold was named ABL Honorary Member in 1936. He was instrumental in effecting a peaceful merger between the American Bridge League and the United States Bridge Association in 1937 and became president of the newly formed American Contract Bridge League the following year.

He served for many years on the League's Board of Governors and Board of Directors. Spingold was also president of the Cavendish Club in New York.

Here's a hand where not only did both sides play in the same trump suit — they both bid to the same level.

In the Closed Room, the Swedes, North-South, bid to 2♥ doubled and were very unlucky to run into a 6-0 split. West led three rounds of spades, allowing partner to throw away his three clubs. Then West gave partner a club ruff. East still had the ♦A and two trump tricks (a trump honor and a fifth trump), for down two, 300 points to East-West.

In the Open Room, South started with a weak notrump and East balanced with a Multi 2♦ bid, showing hearts or spades. West suspected it was hearts.

North led a spade against 2♥. Once again all three clubs went away, this time from dummy! Again a club was led, ruffed in the East hand, and declarer cashed the ♠A. So declarer managed to take the first five tricks. Another diamond lead went to South's king. South cashed the ♦J as partner threw a club, and then led a club, ruffed in dummy (East). That was book (six tricks). At this point, declarer led a fourth diamond, and this ensured he would score a trump trick, for one down. That was 100 points to North-South, a swing of 9 IMPs to Pakistan.

## Zero Tolerance update

The Zero Tolerance program, started in Ontario clubs more than four years ago, is going strong and receiving credit for an exodus of players from intermediate games into open games.

Barbara Seagram, owner/manager of Kate Buckman's Bridge Studio in Toronto, says ZT "has made such a huge difference. We have always provided our less-experienced players with a separate room in which to play, along with their own director. This has made for an expensive but flourishing newcomer/intermediate program. The downside was that the players got so comfortable there that they were petrified of moving into the open game in the big room."

ZT has changed that, according to Seagram. "Over the past two years, the atmosphere has im-

proved so dramatically among the open players that there has been a huge exodus from the intermediate games into the open games. We have had to hand out very few scoring penalties for Zero Tolerance but the fact that the policy is in place seems to keep the players in line and the perception that we are monitoring behavior at all times makes everyone happier.

"The players now never hesitate to report unpleas- antness whereas before they considered it part of the game that they had to tolerate."

Seagram added, "We have had to ask several play- ers to take a vacation from our club. They must be subjected to an interview with us before they are per- mitted to return. The bad ones don't."

## It takes two

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a ses- sion. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a

substantially completed card, the partnership may play only Class A conventions and may use only stan- dard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after conven- tion cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing un- til the restriction is lifted.

In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the dis- cretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circum- stances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

Over North's normal opening 2NT bid, East bid 3♠. This gave Cameron Doner a problem. Double would have produced an easy 500, but the choice of 4♥ certainly was reasonable.

Doner won with the ♠A, cashed the ♣A (West followed with the 3), and played a small heart. When

East failed to follow, Doner played the 9. When West won the 10, he played a second spade, ruffed by declarer. When he played a second club, West followed with the 2. Doner believed him and rose with the king. Next he played a diamond to the king, a diamond to the jack, and the ♦A. He exited with a club to East's queen. On East's forced spade return, Doner was in control in this ending:

Doner ruffed with the king and poor West had to underruff. Then West had to ruff the next club and lead away from his trump queen.
