81st Summer North American Bridge Championships

Demirev and L'Ecuyer champs in Wernher Open Pairs

Nikolay Demirev of Arlington Heights IL and Nicolas L'Ecuyer of Montreal QC put together two strong final sessions – 58% in the afternoon and 61.36 % in the evening – to win the Wernher Open Pairs.

Their score of 2168.91 was about two-thirds of a board ahead of the second-place pair, Alan Kleist of Cheverly MD and Tim Crank of Cincinnati OH. Top on a board was 64.

Demirev and L'Ecuyer won their first championship as partners – the Lebhar IMP Pairs – at the Houston NABC in March.

It was the fifth North American championship for Demirev, who placed second in the von

The original No. 2 seed, captained by Shawn Quinn, will face the No. 4, Lisa Berkowitz, in the final round of the Wagar Women's Knockout Teams today.

Playing with Quinn are Renee Mancuso, Pam Wittes, Cheri Bjerkan, Rozanne Pollack and Peggy Sutherlin. They beat the team captained by Geeske Joel 100-86 in Wednesday's semifinal round.

The Berkowitz team had an easy time with the Lynne Schaeffer squad, winning 197-102.

Berkowitz is playing with Joann Glasson, Linda Lewis, Val Covalciuc, Betty Ann Kennedy and Cindy Bernstein.

Nos. 5 and 6 out of Spingold Knockout

Two more high seeds are out of the Spingold Knockout Teams as No. 5 Steve Garner and No. 6 Martin Fleisher fell in the round of 32.

Garner and the John Schermer (No. 28) were tied after 64 deals at 129. Schermer (Neil Chambers, Michael Polowan, Jacob Morgan, George Mittelman and Robert Lebi) won the eight-board playoff 28-14.

Fleisher was ahead of the French team led by Romain Zaleski 121-102 but suffered a 46-14 loss in the fourth quarter. Zaleski is playing with Jean Quantain, Albert Faigenbaum, Dominique Pilon, Franck Multon and Marc Bompis.

In other action, No. 1 Carolyn Lynch had a scare against No. 32 Victor Markowicz, winning 113-110. It was close match throughout, as Lynch held a 14-IMP lead with a quarter to go, holding on as Markowicz won the final set 42-31.

Bridge will be center of attention in Philadelphia in October 2010

A few months ago, ACBL and United States Bridge Federation officials combined forces to attract a world bridge championship to American soil. The opportunity was there because the 2010 World Bridge Series scheduled for St. Petersburg,

Russia, had fallen through.

The dream has become a reality as the 2010 world championships, a truly "open" tournament, is scheduled for Philadelphia Oct. 1-16 at the downtown Marriott Hotel.

USBF President Bill Pollack says he can't wait.

"We have been made to feel really welcome in Philadelphia," Pollack says. "We chose the city because we won't be just another convention."

Unlike other world championships, there is no qualification for participants. All events are open

and transnational, meaning players from different countries can play together.

All play will be behind screens, and WBF masterpoints will be awarded to participants. There will be an ACBL regional tournament running concurrent with the world championships.

The tournament will also feature a daily vugraph show with expert commentators plus a Daily Bulletin.

The playing schedule has a wide variety of events, from the Mixed, Open, Women's, Senior and IMP pairs, the Rosenblum (open teams), McConnell (women's teams) and Mixed Teams. The schedule is more "European," meaning play ends early enough for participants to enjoy a leisurely dinner.

The WBF also notes that it is likely the tournament will feature a World Youth Bridge Team championship.

Pollack says another city was in the running for the tournament, but city officials in Philadelphia, in particular Mayor Michael Nutter, have made it clear the tournament will be a big deal for the city. Pollack says the city plans to erect banners along major streets during the two

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Big seeds drop in Mini-Spin 1 & 2

It was not a good day for the higher-ranked seeds in the **Mini-Spingold I (0-5000) Knockout Teams**, as the Nos. 1, 2, 4, 6 and 8 seeds all bit the dust.

Roselyn Tuekolsky's top-seeded team was defeated by Lorraine Cable's crew 203-97. Robert Roman's No. 2 team lost 139-92 to Steven Shaye's squad. Gary Donner (No. 4) and his team was mangled 240-44 by Morrie Kleinplatz and Co.

The quarterfinal round will be played today.

In the Mini-Spingold II (0-1500) Knockout Teams, the No.2 seed led by Peter Boyd-Bowman got the boot from Eric Hendrickson's squad, 184-101. Michael Berard's No. 3 team exited the event after losing 122-102 to Julie Zucker's team. No. 4 Jennifer Gu and her squad lost to David Grabiner's team 128-114.

In the semifinal, Victor Hsu's team will face Grabiner, while Zucker will face Hendrickson.

ACBL bans electronic devices in national events



The ACBL Board of Directors approved a comprehensive ban on electronic devices for all national level events, but not regional or Intermediate Newcomer contests:

Electronic devices, excluding health related equipment, capable of sending or receiving communication, including but not limited to, headphones, earphones, cellular phones and minicomputers: (1) shall not be allowed in the playing areas, adjacent hallways, restrooms or accessible break areas; and (2) shall not be used during a session.

These restrictions shall apply to all pairs, team members, captains, coaches, recorders and kibitzers and shall apply throughout any actual playing session or segment.

A violation of this policy shall result in a disciplinary penalty of one full board (or 12 IMPs at that form of scoring) for the first offense. A second offense shall result in disqualification from the event for the pair/team.

Kibitzers violating this policy shall be removed from the playing area for the remainder of the session.

Participants in the following contests will be reminded not to approach the playing area with a personal electronic device in their possession, even if the device is turned off: all flights of the Grand National Teams, the von Zedtwitz, Bruce and Young Life Master Pairs, the Spingold Knockout Teams, both Mini-Spingolds, the Wagar Women's Knockout Teams, the Truscott/USPC Senior Swiss Teams, the Wernher Open Pairs, the NABC+ Fast Pairs, the Mixed Board-a-Match Teams, the Open Swiss Teams and the National 199er Pairs.

Getting rid of losers

When playing a suit contract, you should get a count of your losers as soon as the dummy is tabled. If your loser count is too high and your contract is in jeopardy, you must find a way to get rid of enough



losers so that you can make the contract. I suggest you use the **T3 Formula**

T1 = Trump 'em!

If you can arrange to ruff one or more losers in the dummy, you will be performing a miracle: turning losers into winners sounds very much like turning water into wine. Using this method might mean you have to delay drawing trumps. Usually, in a 5-3 fit (dummy holding three-card trump support), you will not be able to pull trumps and still have enough left to ruff all your losers. Get the ruffing done first, then pull trumps. You may hear some of my local students at this NABC chanting "Shortness in the Dumm-ee!" Ruffing in the long trump side (usually that's the declarer) does not gain you anything except maybe control of the lead. Look for ruffing in the short trump side, not the long trump side.

T2 = Toss 'em!

With a lopsided suit that has an extra winner in dummy, use it to toss a loser from the declarer's side. Two synonymous terms for this technique are sluffing and pitching.

T3 = Take a Finesse!

It's not a coincidence that this is the last of the Ts. Experts hate to finesse because, in general, it only works half of the time. The first two Ts above (trumping and tossing) take priority. Although I try to avoid finesses, many times the first two Ts aren't possible. Most newcomers and intermediate players see the finesse first and are so darned proud of just recognizing it, that they feel obliged to see if it works.

If you do have to rely upon a finesse to make

your contract, lead towards the card you wish was a winner. You usually shouldn't lead wish cards, rather you lead toward them. Will you ever lead a wish card? Yes, but only when holding three touching wish cards (e.g., Q-J-10) opposite a higher honor (the ace). Note that the touching wish cards don't need to be in the same hand. The real question should be: If I lead the wish card, would I be happy to see the next opponent cover it? If the answer is yes, then it's probably the correct play. It also depends on how many tricks you need from that suit. Run through it mentally before actually doing it. Keep in mind there are no rewind controls at your disposal if you change your mind mid-play.

Dummy
♣ Q 6 2

Declarer
♣ A 8 3

Leading the ♣Q from dummy, would you be happy if RHO covered with the ♣K? You'd just get the one trick you started with! A better play would be to lead the ♣3 toward the queen, hoping LHO had the missing king. He could take it now or later, but your ♣Q would be good, giving you two club tricks instead of one.

Dummy
♣ Q J 10

Declarer
♣ A 8 3

If you led the ♣Q from the dummy, would you be happy to see RHO cover with the king? Absolutely! Now your ♣J and ♣10 are promoted, giving you all three club tricks.

Thinking bridge

Dlr: South ♠ Q 8
Vul: Both ♥ 4 3 2
♦ K 6 5

Opening lead: ♦Q – slightly stronger lead than the ♣K with three touching honors versus two touching honors.

Bidding commentary: North normally passes an opening bid with 5 HCP, but not this time. The ♠Q is worth an extra point facing at

least five spades in the South hand. South, with the next thing to a 2♣ opening, jumps to game, worrying slightly about missing a slam! Ha, ha!

Play commentary: When a queen is led through a king in dummy up to a known strong hand, it is as sure as death and taxes that the ace lies over the king. As declarer, play low from dummy and play low again if the suit is continued. You are hoping third hand has A-x.

Defensive commentary: After cashing three diamonds, and assuming East winds up on lead, East shifts to the ♣J. If West winds up on lead, he shifts to the ♣K.

Play commentary #2: South has lost three tricks and needs to find East with the ♥K to make the contract. As it is likely that East has more than two hearts, declarer must plan on taking two heart finesses. Translation: Two dummy entries are needed. They are there – if declarer is willing to take a risk. Declarer must lead a low spade to the eight, hoping West has the ♠J. Success! Now the ♥K still has to be with East. It is! Declarer can finesse hearts twice and make the contract. The point is that it is worth a risk to go down an extra trick if the reward is making your contract. Play to make!

Succeed by misguessing

On this deal from the second final session of the von Zedtwitz Life Master Pairs, your best chance for your contract is to misguess the key suit (hands rotated).

You play 4♦ on a highly competitive auction and receive the lead of the ♥J. East meanly wins the ♥A to play a low spade. You foolishly misguess. West wins your ♠J with the queen and returns a low spade, apparently not expecting to be able to cash the ♥K. East falls from grace after winning the ♠A to play a third spade. How can South have four spades and not have bid them?

You pitch your heart loser and reflect that East's re-raise with only three hearts must imply short diamonds. So you lead the ♦K, run the jack and live happily ever after.

Later, you reflect on the fact that if you have guessed spades correctly, you would have been very tempted to lead the ♦K and a diamond to the ace. Now when you try to run the clubs, West ruffs in and cashes his major winners for down one!

Monitoring

At this and future North American Championships, ACBL will be monitoring NABC+ events with visible, real-time cameras. The images will be recorded and will be available for later official inspection and review.

By general monitoring of the session and participants' behavior, ACBL has another source of information that may be useful in determining facts and settling issues arising from some types of ethical and behavioral complaints or actions. Please summon a director if a problem occurs at the table.

This procedure is intended to assure everyone that the playing field is level and that misbehavior will not be tolerated.

A bridge too far

Before we start, let's just accept that the Daily Bulletin is not large enough to deal with the analysis for this deal.

At the table, we defended 3♣ doubled for plus 800, so we were not tested to play 3NT. When Michael Rosenberg told me that play was "interesting," we sat down, expecting hard work, and we were right. Play 3NT on a club lead to the jack and queen.

Let's look at simple lines. If you play the ♦A and a second diamond, East will win and play a low club back – and you are dead. If you duck a diamond at trick two, West wins and again a club is ducked. Your best bet is to unblock spades and lead a third club. East cashes out the clubs and exits with a heart. Whichever hand you win in, you have no timing for a squeeze.

The winning line is to return a club at trick two. The defense must duck (winning and shifting to a heart exposes West to a throw-in with the fourth spade to give you a third heart trick. Declarer crosses to the ♠A and plays a third club. East wins and cashes a fourth club in this position:

If East cashes a fifth club, West will eventually be thrown in with hearts to lead spades. If West keep his ♥2 to keep from being thrown in, declarer can cash his spades and throw West in with a spade to concede the ninth trick in hearts.

The play is actually far more complex, but this is the gist of the salient details.

Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the ACBL Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

Duck – so no dinner!

An English idiom is “duck or no dinner,” meaning “all or nothing.” The Australians say “Sydney or the bush.”

In our four-way Spingold Knockout Teams match, it was Steve Bloom who produced the duck, and it was we who had no dinner. His play won the match for his team, and so we got no dinner because we had to prepare for our evening match.

Bloom reached 3NT as South after West had bid hearts. The lead of the ♥K put him in a perilous spot, but East's ♥J was a welcome sight. Bloom ducked the ♥K, then the ♥Q, East discarding a low spade. West then shifted to the ♣9, ducked all around.

Now Bloom played for West to be 2=6=2=3, with a diamond honor. He cashed his clubs and spades, went to the ♦A and had reached this ending.

Bloom ducked a diamond to West, who was endplayed to concede the rest. East, with 5=1=3=4 shape, might have done better to pitch a club at trick two. Declarer might now duck a spade, not a club, imagining West to be 3=6=2=2, and that would be fatal.

Twelve not thirteen

North promised four-card support and a singleton somewhere for his pre-emptive bid of 4♠, and you gambled on a making the small slam. How do you plan to make 12 tricks after West leads the ♦K and partner produces quite a favorable dummy? Both opponents will follow to the first round of trumps.

Solution

It may be tempting to crossruff for 12 tricks, but you would need a miraculous lie of the unseen cards for that line to succeed. Instead, you should aim to set up dummy's club suit. Suppose the full deal is:

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After winning the first trick with the ♦A, you should draw one round of trumps with the ace. Once both defenders follow, you must abandon trumps for the moment and play a club to the ace. After ruffing the second round of clubs with the king of trumps, you cross back to dummy with a trump to the 10 to ruff another club with the ♠Q. The fact that West has only one club on the given deal makes ruffing clubs with high trumps essential.

Next you play your remaining trump to dummy's jack, drawing West's last trump. Dummy will now hold ♠ 8 and ♣ 9 8 6 5 and you will concede a club to East's king. You will ruff whichever red suit he returns with dummy's remaining trump and claim the contract as dummy's remaining cards are three club winners.

Another point to consider is that your contract was for 12 rather than 13 tricks. As you were told that the trumps were not 4-0, this plan catered to clubs being 4-1. (If they were 3-2 you would have made all of the tricks on the recommended line.)

The Facts: The director was called at the end of the auction and again after the play was completed. West hesitated before bidding 3NT, and North hesitated before passing 3NT. East said he bid 5♣ because he judged that North's hesitation implied a strong side suit.

The Ruling: The director judged that the 5♣ bid was demonstrably suggested by West's hesitation and that pass was a logical alternative (Law 16).

Per Law 12C1(e), the result was adjusted to 3NT by West down two, E-W minus 200 for both pairs.

The Appeal: E-W appealed the director's decision. South was the only player who did not attend the hearing.

East said that after a 30- to 40-second hesitation by North, it became clear to him that North had a second suit to lead. That authorized information made it more likely to be correct to bid 5♣. Partner must have the ♠K, so North's spades are weak and he must have a strong side suit.

N-S said that if that was the case it would suggest a pull to a slam try or 4♣. Also, East might pass 3NT at matchpoints. If partner can win the opening lead and had the ♣A, you would score better in 3NT.

The committee determined that West's hesitation was between 10 and 20 seconds.

The Decision: The committee judged that, after North's hesitation over 3NT, pass was not a logical alternative. With the East hand's distribution (3=1=1=8) and all of the bidding, it was clear to pull. Therefore, the table result of 5♦ doubled by West making five, E-W plus 750 was reinstated for both pairs.

School Bridge LEAGUE: Schools Use Cards to Increase Skills



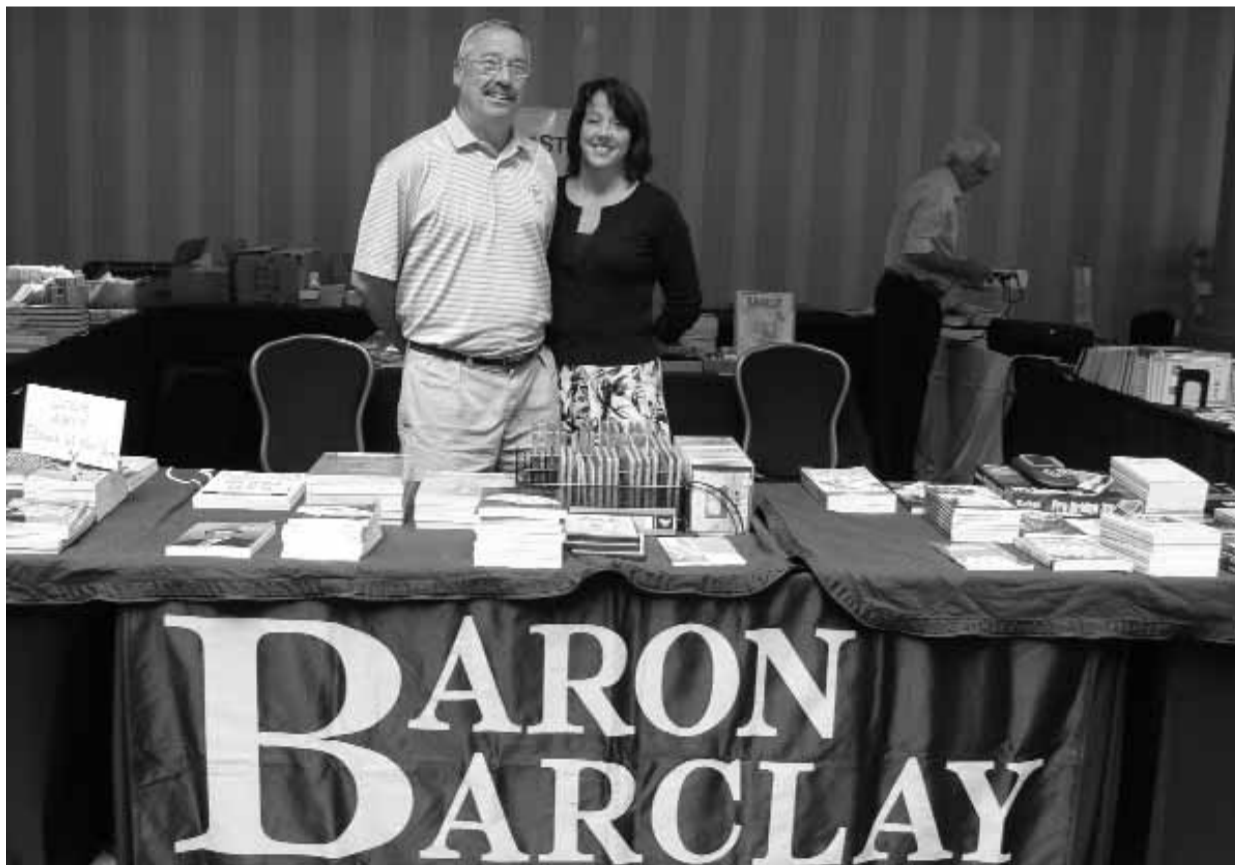
It's a whole new "deal" when it comes to playing cards at school as teachers discover the brain- and skills-building power of the game of bridge.

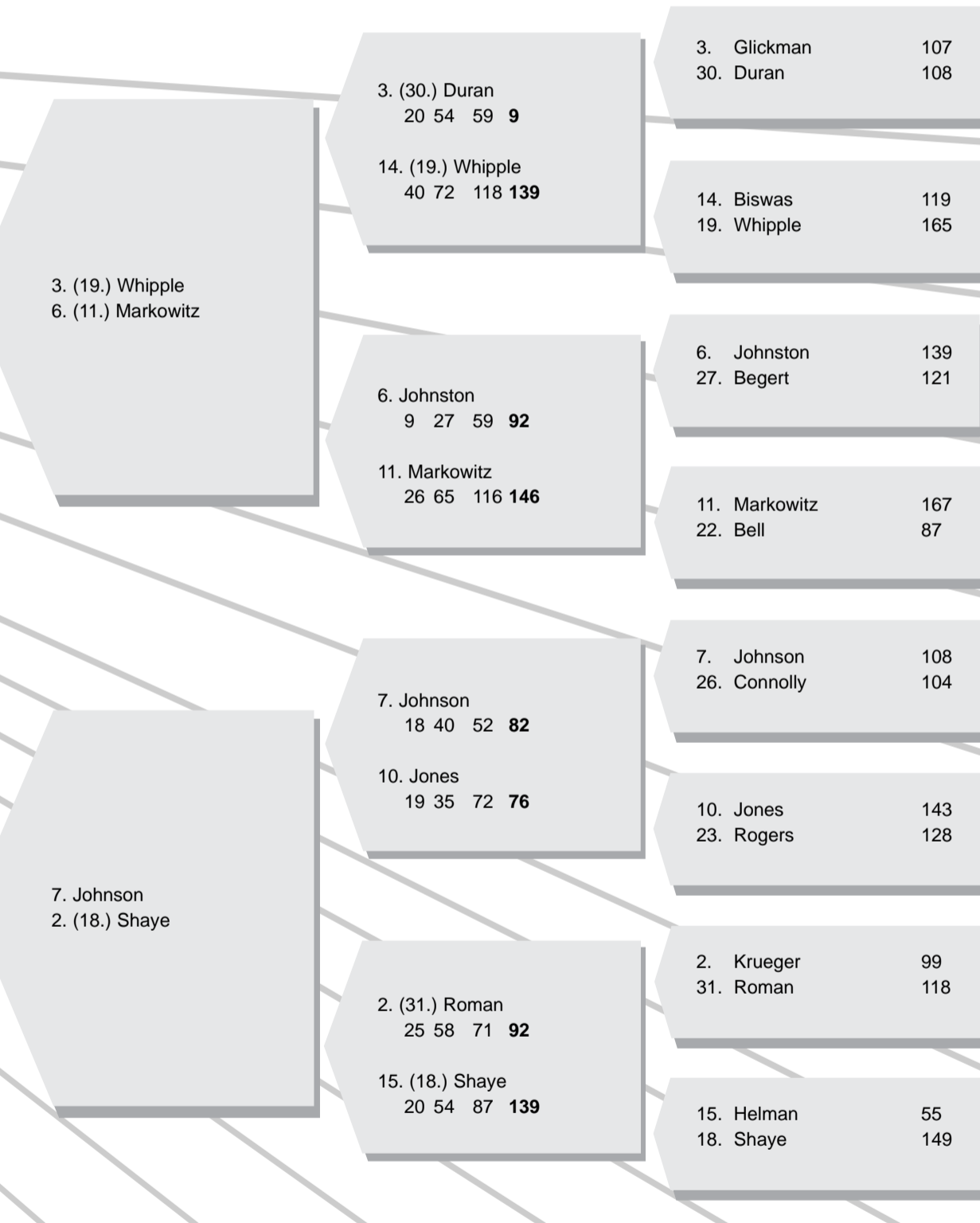

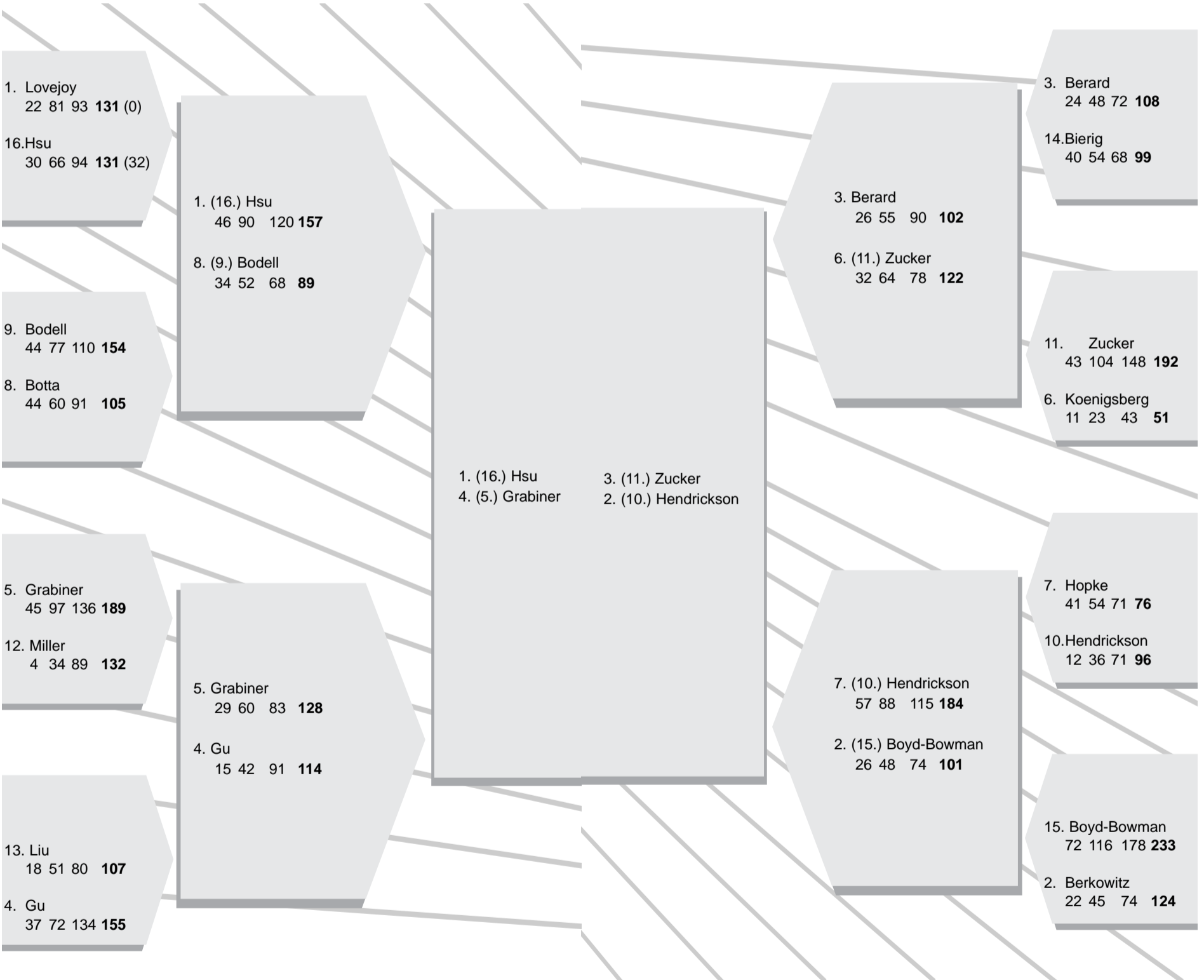

An unusual squeeze developed on this deal from the second session of the Saturday A/X Pairs (board #29, hands rotated). My partner was Richard Reizman.

To my INT contract, West led the ♥J to the queen and king. East switched to the ♦7, ducked to the jack, and West exited with the ♣8 to the king and ace.

I led the ♥8, which held the trick, and then the ♠J, not covered. My reasoning was that West, who had chosen dummy's suit for his opening lead, probably did so because he did not want to lead from his honors in the unbid suits.

Next, I cashed dummy's three good hearts and ♠K, noting East's drop of the ♠10. The position at trick nine was:

Hand diagram showing cards in each hand. Spades: ♠ 9 (West), ♥ (East), ♦ 10 9 (West), ♣ 9 (West). Hearts: ♥ (West), ♦ K (East), ♣ Q (East). Clubs: ♣ A 8 (West), ♥ (East), ♦ K (East), ♣ Q (East).

I led dummy's club to my ♣Q and West was forced to either give up his spade guard or bare down to the singleton ♦A. He chose to discard the ♦Q, which allowed me to exit with the ♦K.

At trick 12, West had to lead a spade into my ♠A8, but because dummy had the ♠9, I was blocked from winning the second spade in my hand. However, West had been forced to give up his diamond queen, so dummy's ♦10 took the last trick. Making 10 tricks was good for 23 of 25 matchpoints.
